## Editorial

### OLD SCOTCH IN WITH AVENGEANCE — DE LA SALLE OUT OLD HAILEYBURY JUNIORS STEAL SECOND

And so to what many refer to as "the business end" of the season, as we enter the finals round of matches. Today is truly make-or-break. First semi-final losers are out; second semi-final winner move up a section and the other two live on to fight it out next week.

Last week's highlights must surely have been the meteoric rise of Old Scotch in A Section — a twenty-six goal victory saw them move from fifth to second place — and the huge percentage "coup" staged by Old Haileyburians in Junior Two which enabled them to snaffle second position from incumbent De La Salle.

De La Salle, A Section, went down to North Old Boys and as a consequence finished fifth, two points out of the four.

In B Section, although the results were not foreseen by some the positions in the four did not change — though confidence may have plummeted.

Geelong's loss to Old Xaverians (in C Section) cost them the double chance and means that they must face their victor again today.

St. Kevin's defeat of State Bank, in D Section, combined with Melbourne High's cliff-hanging one point victory over Power House meant that State Bank finished in fifth place — out on percentage. In fact, the Bankers had a bad day all round. Their Reserves' three point loss cost them second place.

E Section leaders Bulleen-Templestowe and St. Bede's changed places when St. Bede's were defeated by North Brunswick whilst La Trobe Blacks secured the fourth spot with a timely win over their opposition again today — Beverley Hills. St. Bede's Reserves reversed the Seniors' result and must go into today's re-run with a confidence-edge over North Brunswick.

Similarly, Therry and Commonwealth Bank (F Section) had a preview of today's game last week with Therry emerging with the points — and boosted confidence. They were not so fortunate in the Reserve Section, where they were defeated by the Bank — and displaced from the four by University Reds.

The Junior One four did not change with all four sides recording good wins. Disappointing that Geelong, who struggled so hard to secure their four points should have thrown them away again so quickly.

Coburg in Junior Two, were also unfortunate that West Brunswick should forfeit for a second time as it robbed them of the opportunity to have a good work-out going into the finals.

Commiserations to those teams who will be joining a lower section next year — and in particular to Marcellin in A Section — the only one to have two teams being relegated. My Spies tell me that their game against Ormond last week was first class — and that they could easily have troubled any of the teams currently in the four.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

The home and away part of the season has now concluded and at last the tipster picked a reasonable number of winners. Perhaps that will augur well for the Finals. Still last Saturday's results didn't fail to produce some drama with De La Salle falling out of the Final Four and Old Scotch rocketing from fifth position to second.

Caulfield Grammarians and Marcellin will be the two teams to leave "A" Division. Marcellin must regret their poor early season form as they were playing on well at the end of the year.

Uni. Blues retained top position with a strong win over St. Bernard's. Saints battled hard all day and were hoping for a victory to farewell their coach, G. (Gus) Mitchell, who is retiring from the coaching position, but this was not to be. Congratulations, Gus, on your long and distinguished career with St. Bernard's.

North O.B., more pacy and more determined than De La Salle, deserved their victory. Commiserations must go to De La Salle, who held a position in the Four for most of the season.

Ormond and Marcellin fought a desperate battle at Ormond to decide which team would be relegated. Both teams showed great courage and desire and the game was tight all day. It was unfortunate that one team must lose and in this case it was Marcellin. However, on the form shown by Marcellin towards the end of this season, one would expect to see them back in "A" Grade very soon. Uni. Blacks continued their late winning run by defeating Ivanhoe. But alas and alack, it was all to no avail and the Blacks have found themselves in sixth position with a lot of hard-luck stories to tell. More consistency will be required next year if Blacks are to become finalists in 1979.

Old Scotch showed magnificent form and kicked the sweep for the year in defeating Caulfield Grammarians. Their mammoth win lifted them from fifth position into second position, thus giving them the vital double chance. Somewhat of a surprise from a team who could be described as almost lucky to be in the Finals. Caulfield Grammarians, after a very disappointing season, find themselves in "B" Division.

Today, the First Semi-Final finds Ivanhoe playing North O.B. This is certain to be an exciting game. Both sides had their bright and dull patches during the season and both know that for the loser of this game it is the last match of the season. I believe that the weather and condition of the ground will affect the result of this game. If the conditions are wet and muddy, I believe they will suit Ivanhoe, whereas if the conditions are relatively dry, they will be more advantageous to North O.B. However, I believe that North's greater experience in "A" Grade Finals should carry the day and I am tipping them to win the First Semi-Final —

## B SECTION

Wow. Talk about a "fizzer"!

I did not pick one winner last week.

In all fairness, who would have expected Old Melburnians and Old Haileyburians to be rolled. If they were racehorses they would be swabbed. My congratulations to the winners. It's a great way to finish a season.

Today we see the start of the big ones. At the Melbourne University Oval, Old Paradians take on Old Haileyburians in the First Semi-Final. Last Saturday, Paradians turned on a great game to topple Parkside. At Keysborough, Old Haileybury slipped up and allowed Coburg to take the points. How much importance can be placed on this result is hard to determine.

Old Haileybury have run out winners in their two meetings with Paradians this season, but finals are a different story. Parade coach, Brendan Danaher, has developed a team which is well balanced with a very even strength all around the ground. They can apply pressure for a full 100 minutes and play particularly well under heavy conditions. The condition of the ground surface could have a big bearing on the result.

Old Haileybury, like Old Paradians, play a game right out, with tough players who do not shirk the issue. Haileybury coach, Mike Porter, has his players running on well with a big emphasis on handball. His team is not as even as Paradians, but has more brilliant players in certain positions.

The centrelines are evenly matched but O.H. should win in the ruck duels. It will be a close game but I think Haileybury's better marking will see them emerge as winners. Whichever way it goes, both teams have had a great season, so I wish them both the best of luck — BRIAN LAUDER.

## C SECTION

This year's Final Four took a final round reshuffle as form teams, Geelong and Old Xaverians clashed to determine which plays which in the First Semi-Final.

Geelong's unbeaten run was halted and because of its weaker percentage, slipped to third. St. Kilda, with a sound win over Old Carey, regained second place whilst A.J.A.X. reversed my last week's declaration that Geelong, not A.J.A.X., were entitled to be premiership favourites.

A.J.A.X., with a fine win over Hampton Rovers, are favourites but only shade any one of the other three teams at this stage.

St. Kilda Old Collegians meet A.J.A.X. today in the Second Semi-Final, with a win each for the season.

On June 17th, A.J.A.X. inflicted the first St. Kilda loss for the year — and the margin was 11 goals. The return game saw St. Kilda reverse the result — that margin was 17 points.

A.J.A.X. have lost four games for the season — Old Brighton (16 points), Old Xaverians (11 points), Geelong (39 points) and St. Kilda (17 points) — all "away" games.

St. Kilda Old Collegians have lost five — A.J.A.X. (65 points), Geelong (5 points), Hampton Rovers (14 points), Kew (2 points) and Old Brighton (30 points). And it is interesting to note that of all sides in the finals, St. Kilda has been the only one to record any real slump — four of its five defeats have occurred during the final 8 rounds!

St. Kilda has plenty of versatility around the ground with an abundance of Delaneys, a ruck star in White, but Robinson is their only consistent goalkicker with a moderate season tally.

A.J.A.X. plays brilliantly at Albert Park — that cannot be questioned. Their form at Geelong showed class, particularly in the first quarter. The Monash oval may be more to their suiting than to St. Kilda. The Rittermans must not be allowed to roam wide if St. Kilda is to have a chance. And with damaging players such as Komesarook, Lemish and Kalmus, A.J.A.X. can control most situations.

It is rather awkward picking winners any time let alone a crucial and tight final series. All teams in the finals, except fourth team Old Xaverians, have beaten each other once. "Old Xavs" have not yet beaten St. Kilda.

Question is, will they get a chance? I don't really know! I think (no hope) not!

However, I'll select A.J.A.X. to be the first team to win promotion if only because its form in recent weeks has been more predictable than St. Kilda's.

Game number two is also interesting. Geelong and Old Xaverians again, but this time not at Yarra Park where Geelong, over the years, has seldom performed well. (In about 20 years I recall only one win there by a Geelong side against either Old Scotch, Old Paradians or Old Xaverians.)

Old Xaverians will be stronger this week with the return of Brimacombe, O'Sullivan and Cooksley. It would therefore seem likely that I should concede it the honours today because of this influx of talent.

Geelong has beaten Old Xaverians once — by 91 points before the complete turnover of "Xaverian old-stock" that brought about twelve new faces to last week's line-up. Their coach, Jack Batten, has them playing much more determinedly than some of the University sides with which he was once associated. And he has deserved the success his club has achieved — 12 wins from 15 starts.

Geelong has been doing everything right — and eight successive behinds in the last quarter that put it down for the first time in eleven games can be hardly termed all that disastrous. However, it did not like losing the double chance by a paltry 4 per cent. Like Old Xaverians, their record of 13 wins from 15 starts has also been outstanding.

The return of Russell Coad and Shane Dowling will be Geelong bonus points, should all go well.

Coad, Geelong's most influential ruckman, was sadly missed last week. And Old Xaverians ruckman, Noonan, was allowed to take over completely, although young Ramsay Taylor tried superbly to kerb him. Noonan may be the key today — and I agree with Old Xaverian promoters that he must rate a Victorian team

chance. Certainly in the past, lesser players have "got the nod"!

Another keen duel is expected between Geelong half forwards Graeme Linkø and Siera-kowski, who will perhaps one day be "declared" and have his name entered in this publication.

The Geelong West Oval will not provide an advantage to either side.

Geelong coach, Laurie DeGoldi, has done a splendid job in revitalising Geelong. Sure, the game will be tight, but I expect Geelong's overall brilliance and greater experience to prove too strong on the day.

However, if it allows itself as many errors as last week, Curtain and others could curtail Geelong hopes.

## D SECTION

Today the proven top sides contest the major round in Yarra Park. The Second Semi Final, with the express promotion, should see a fiercely fought clash between Power House and St. Kevin's. Both sides have proven themselves during the season. Both sides have reliable forwards, namely Sykes (Power House) and Hannan, who are each capable of kicking a winning score.

The big men of Power House, Parry and Bredyk, could prove the key to success by winning the ball first to feed smaller players like Stafford, Evans and Coloe, who then move the ball quickly to give Sykes the opportunity to contest with one opponent.

For St. Kevin's, Les Radford and Peter Hart supply a wealth of experience as well as talent. Allan Olie, the St. Kevin's coach, will be anxious to erase all memories of last season's final's debacle by having his players contest fiercely and by winning the ball first. For St. Kevin's to be successful they will have to move the ball quickly and keep it out of the air to prevent big Power House players marking.

I don't believe St. Kevin's will be able to nullify Power House for one hundred minutes and therefore I select Power House to win and promote themselves to 'C' Section.

The sudden death First Semi Final will be equally as fierce a contest. Old Camberwell Grammarians, on the one hand, have fallen from leadership of the Section over the past few weeks. Their early good form has carried them to fourth place on percentage. On the other hand, Melbourne High School Old Boys have completed a steady run home and have a one point victory over Power House as their latest triumph. Adams and Martin have proven reliable avenues to goal for the High School Old Boys, whereas Old Camberwell have to rely on resting rucks and rovers to boot their goals. Melbourne High's smaller players such as Flegeltaub and Peatling win the ball repeatedly around the ground and send it forward for scoring opportunities.

I believe that Melbourne High School Old Boys have the greater experience among their players as well as the better form to warrant me selecting them. Old Camberwell Grammarians, for three seasons, have been a leading 'D' Section side. They have not been able to build themselves up to clinch the decisive final

games so Peter Hutchinson will have to prove himself the "miracle worker" to have his side carry on today. My selection is Melbourne High School Old Boys.

### E SECTION

The two outstanding teams of the Section meet today in the Second Semi Final, and trying to pick the winner is not easy. Both finished with 15 wins, but St. Bede's, with their lapse last Saturday lost top place on percentage.

St. Bede's won both clashes during the season, but neither victory was clear cut. In the first, it was only slightly straighter kicking that made the difference, while in the second, although the margin was bigger, Bulleen-Templestowe had only seventeen men on the ground for a substantial part of the game.

Both clubs have a similar style of game and have scored prolifically during the season. The key to today's game will be the performance of the backlines — the club that can exert the more effective pressure on the opposing forwards will be the one to advance to the Grand Final.

It is for this reason, because I believe that St. Bede's have the slightly more proficient defence, that I'm selecting them to win narrowly. To do so, they will really have to be on their game to be able to shut out some of Bulleen's effective forwards like Tenace and Quaffle. Last week St. Bede's had a tough match which I'm sure would have been useful in snapping the side out of its lethargy. Bulleen-Templestowe, on the other hand, have enjoyed a series of one-sided games leading up to the Finals and their backs have encountered little pressure. For this reason, St. Bede's to adapt more quickly and to take out a close one.

Beverley Hills did little to improve their poor away-from-home record last week, but that result didn't matter. Today, for the one that counts, I think they'll reverse the decision. Both teams have been inconsistent at times during the year, and as both had players who were 'rested' or unavailable last week, it's difficult to find pointers for today's outcome. La Trobe's biggest problem however has been its inability to kick high scores, and a great deal of responsibility will weigh on their backline today. To win, they will have to keep Beverley Hills down about 3 goals a quarter, and frankly I can't see them doing it. Beverley Hills to advance to the Preliminary Final.

### F SECTION

First Semi-Final between Therry C.C. and Commonwealth Bank at Oval 11 should enable Therry to reach the Preliminary Final without a great deal of trouble, although I would be very surprised if it became as easy as last week's game. The Bankers gave themselves a terrible handicap to overcome because of their poor showing on their own ground in the preview and it would take a very good team indeed to get out of this situation.

Second Semi-Final between Thornbury and Bulleen United at Oval 14.

This should be a good match; each team with one win against the other and both at full strength. I am aware that Thornbury were at a disadvantage when they were beaten at Bulleen with several good players unavailable, but beaten they were by a strong, determined and talented team. Both sides can attack from their backlines. Thornbury have an advantage in the air and have a reasonably direct approach to goal. Oval 14 is nothing to shout about and it may be more to the liking of the Berries. I fancy Thornbury today, but the game will go, most certainly, to the team which refuses to allow its opponents to run wild and watches those moves starting from the half back line. I've no doubt that both sides have made a study of their opposition; if they haven't done so then promotion as runners-up is the best to be hoped for. My best wishes to both sides for a good game.
