Editorial

NEW-COMER SUCCESS THE ORDER OF THE DAY

All-in-all it must be agreed, that the 1978 Season started successfully. There were the usual upsets — and the predictable wins.

Therry C.C.O.B. in Junior 2 acquitted themselves remarkably well when it is considered that they had virtually no notice of their inclusion into the competition. Many club members were still stunned, on Sunday, that they had managed to "get organized" in time. The question of how they outfitted the side is a puzzle yet.

Of course Therry's inclusion came about by the very late withdrawal of **Reservoir Old Boys** following the disbandment of the Club. This has caused the unfortunate circumstance of a bye in B and B Reserve Sections. It has been suggested by some that the B and F Section teams with a bye could get together and play non-competition matches each week. It must be admitted however that much humour (?) greeted this proposal.

Clayton, new club into F Section, has commenced the Season with the proverbial "bang" perhaps indicating that it is not keen to remain in that Section for too long. Forty-nine goals in eight periods of football is not bad going in anyone's language.

Other success — stories last week were written by new A Section clubs Old Scotch and Ivanhoe, who had good wins over Ormond and Marcellin respectively. De La Salle continued on their winning way with a twenty-five point victory over University Blacks.

University Blues proved that they will be a force to be reckoned with in '78 with a run-away twenty-one goal win over Caulfield Grammarians.

B Section new comers did not fare so well, however. Both Fawkner and Parkside were well in their game at three-quarter time but could not withstand last-quarter bursts by Old Melburnians and Collegians. Perhaps experience is the key factor here. B Section is a very different game from C Section — ask any of the Clubs that in past years have not been able to withstand the additional pressures involved. **Coburg** were, of course, forced to "cool their heels" for another week a difficult situation when the Club was more than likely ready and rearing to go to seek revenge for last year's disappointing performances.

New-comer success was the order of the day — in C Section, where three of the four sides were the victors — St Kilda C.B.C.O.C., Old Brighton and Alphington — only Geelong missed out on the four points.

Only West Brunswick could manage a first up win in D Section, (over other new-comer U.H.S.O.B.) with Power House and Old Camberwell proving too strong for Heatherton and M.H.S.O.B. Country Colleges proved our D Section tipster right again when they went down to State Bank at Albert Park — surprising, perhaps, when it is remembered that St Pat's-Monivae was headquartered just up the road.

E Section again favoured the newcomers, with resounding wins to Bulleen-Tempestowe, Old Geelong and St Bede's O.C.

A serious lack of co-operation was exhibited by several clubs when it came to 'phoning scores to the "Herald" or to Press Correspondent Arthur Goudy. Probably the worst offenders were a couple of D Section Clubs (who shall, **at this stage**, remain anonymous) whom Arthur had "to chase" for their final scores — one Club unsuccessfully. There is no need for this to happen — it causes considerable trouble — and maybe more importantly costs the Clubs money.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Three out of five was not a great start to my tipping career. I'll certainly think twice about tipping anyone, even North, to beat St. Bernard's at home. 
because Assumption were playing in C Section Grand Final) Norm has been involved in all Sections except A.


