FOUR "A's" STILL UNDEFEATED — BUT BLUES JUST VITAL GAMES TODAY

After the second round of matches, four A Section Teams: University Blues, Old Scotch, De La Salle and Ivanhoe, are still undefeated. But Univ. Blues must count themselves extremely lucky to have scrapped home by a solitary point, after being more than 5 goals down at half-time. Not surprising perhaps, to see some very long and incredulous faces Ormond at the moment.

Old Scotch led comfortably all day for their thirty point win over North Old Boys — one of the season's surprises — big things were expected from that quarter this year.

1977 premiers De La Salle still have not put a foot wrong this year. Perhaps they have early visions of two-on-end. Even a six goal last quarter could not bring Caulfield close to De La.

St. Bernard's looked set for their second win at three-quarter time — when they led by seventeen points. But six goals to one in the final term saw Ivanhoe emerge victorious.

The two new-comers to A Section have acquitted themselves admirably to date — but someone's bubble must burst today when the two meet at Old Scotch (they wouldn't dare play a draw — would they?)

The game between first round losers University Blacks and Marcellin saw the visitors — Marcellin — Break the ice. Can they kick-on from here when they meet De La Salle today?

Old Melburnians remain the only undefeated side in B Section after a resounding seven goal win over Old Paradians.

Other games saw last week's three bottom teams — Parkside, Old Trinity and Monash Blues left themselves to score (comfortably in each case) over Old Haileyburians, Coburg and Fawkner respectively. It seems that the extra week's rest did not serve Coburg favourably. It will be interesting to watch the fortunes of Collegians today. — Maybe our B Section Tipster will have an advantage in future weeks.

Old Melburnians will be looking for three out of three when they visit Coburg today, and thereby hoping to consolidate a finals berth — even at this early stage of the season.

C Section sees three teams yet to be conquered: St. Kilda C.B.C.O.C.; Alphington and Old Brighton; with A.J.A.X and Kew Squaring their accounts to one all. However, one must record a debit balance after today's clash at Victoria Park.

Last week's D Section leader — State Bank was forced to lower its colours when confronted by the powerful Power House "machine". Other winners were Old Camberwell and West Brunswick (both undefeated) together with ninth and tenth teams; M.H.S.O.B. and Country Colleges.

Today's clash between Old Camberwell and Power House must be considered this Section's "match of the day". It should be a closely contested struggle — if form is any true guide.

North Brunswick's twenty-six goal victory over A.M.P. Society sees them maintaining a commanding position at the top of E Section, though, not to be denied Bulleen-Templestowe's twenty-five goal win keeps them within striking distance — together with St. Bede's who scored comfortably over Old Geelong.

It was good to see La Trobe Blacks back in the winning ranks after a run-of outs.

Clayton came down to earth with the proverbial thud last week when they confronted National Bank (also first round winners). Thornbury proved much too strong for University Reds — winning by twenty-two goals.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Another disastrous day for the A Grade tipster and what a fascinating competition A Grade is turning into. Four undefeated sides, two of whom, Scotch and Ivanhoe, have come up from B Grade, and another, Uni. Blues, who were relegation material last year.

Who would have predicted that Old Scotch and Ivanhoe would be the match of the day in the third round. Both are unbeaten and both had great wins last week against North and St. Bernard's respectively. The last time these two met was in the 1977 B Grade Grand Final where Scotch ran out easy winners, but Ivanhoe are obviously a much better side now. They are not a tall side but their pace coupled with typical Ivanhoe determination proved too much for St. Bernard's last Saturday. Scotch have not put a foot wrong in their two games thus far. They are probably the only team with two big, strong ruckmen in Bates and Kefford, key forwards Mason and Sherwen are marking everything that comes their way and their little men are getting an armchair ride. I've been wrong twice about Ivanhoe, but being a stubborn fool I'll tip against them again this week. Scotch to win a tight one.

A six goal deficit at half time would have had Uni. Blues sides of previous years packing up and going home. However, this year's team seems to have more determination than its predecessors. Inspired by a return to form by State centre half-back Simon Trumble, the Blues got up and stayed on top of the latter. They meet a very determined North Old Boys at the Uni. oval today. It's been a while since North lost two in a row and they'll be flat out to register their first win. They're obviously going through a bad trot at the moment, and I think Blues will push them even further down the list today.

Marcellin turned on an amazing form reversal last week to comfortably beat Uni. Blacks. They'll want to improve even further to test De La Salle who are yet to be fully extended. Despite Marcellin's home ground advantage, De La will win.

St. Bernard's were brought back to earth at Ivanhoe last week and will be glad to get back to their home ground for today's visit by the Blacks. Both sides have been hard hit by injuries, with Blacks in particular, without top players in Costello, Birch, Booth and Chris Corder. Blacks don't appear to have the same depth as St. Bernard's and after swearing that I would not tip against St. Bernard's at home again, I can't see Blacks getting up for a win. However, I still maintain that Blacks are a better side than they appear at the moment.

The Ormond-Caulfield clash at Elsternwick Park will result in one of the two climbing off the bottom and I think it will be Ormond. They surrendered a big lead far too easily last week

against Blues and will no doubt have paid the penalty during the week. Crump kicked ten at full forward last week, but has been inconsistent in the past. Naylor, Dove and Murphy are playing well and will be too good for Caulfield despite the 'Fields improved showing last week.

So it's Old Scotch, Uni. Blues, De La Salle, St. Bernard's and Ormond to bring me back up the tipsters' ladder — PETER BRUKNER.

PROFILE

SYD WHITFIELD

Syd's first appearance in the V.A.F.A. was in 1934 when he represented new team Alphington in their first Association match — against Old Brightonians at the school ground in New Street.

He was the Club's delegate from 1937 — when the meetings were held in a Wesley College classroom, and Mr. Jack McCann was V.A.F.A. Secretary (Mr. McCann is now a life member of the Association — Ed.).

Syd was Alphington's treasurer from 1938 to 1940 (when WWII halted the competition) and he "held onto the bits and pieces" until the Club was reformed in 1947 — when he became the Club's Secretary. Syd has attended Delegates meetings "on-and-off" since that time.

His playing career with Alphington finished in 1949 (and included one year with Parkside

— 1946). This was not the end, however. Syd was Alphington's timekeeper for over twenty years, and has acted in this capacity for the V.A.F.A. on numerous occasions.

The eldest of five brothers to play for Alphington, Syd contributed 140 games (all Senior — no Reserve sides then) to the family total of 750.

Syd is a life-member at Alphington, was a V.A.F.A. Vice-President from 1969-77, a member of the Executive Committee from 1971-77 and is currently a member of the Permit Committee. Syd has also been a Duty Officer at V.A.F.A. finals games since 1962.
