

Editorial

MATCH - WINNING QUARTERS — ACCURACY THE KEY EDITOR'S ERROR AMENDED

First of all, my apologies are extended to Collegians. Last week's editorial named Old Melburians as the only undefeated team in B Section. This is of course incorrect. A win, a bye and a win to Collegians means that they too are undefeated — they are in fact heading B Section at the moment. To the President and Members of Collegians please accept my apologies.

University Blues seem to have recovered some of their equilibrium at the expense of North Old Boys. North led at the first change but a ten goals to one second term from the Blues saw them eight goals up at half time. North were not able to get back into the match thereafter and the Blues went on to a fifty-two point victory.

Old Scotch confirmed that they are a force to be reckoned with this season after their resounding ninety-six point win over Ivanhoe. The chance for Ivanhoe to re-establish itself as a strong contender comes today when they confront the Blues at Warringal Park.

University Blacks had a good win over St. Bernard's to kick them off for the season, and are now riding in sixth position. Their clash today with Old Scotch will give all a good opportunity to see how good they are. If they can win, then they cannot be discounted as - a potential threat.

De La Salle continued their winning run with an eight goal victory over the hapless Marcellin. After leading by four points at three-quarter time Marcellin were overrun in the final term — managing only one goal to De La's ten. It

is to be hoped that Marcellin have not forgotten how to win in a tight struggle.

The game between Ormond and Caulfield Grammarians saw Ormond emerge victorious — thus recording their first win. Only an eleven goal final quarter saved them however. My spies tell me that Ormond were a bit "Scratchy" and that although they won well they were not convincing. It appears that more work still is required for them to consolidate on this performance.

In B Section (as mentioned earlier) Collegians and Old Melburnians are still undeafeated. Today's clash should be worth watching. Both recorded convincing victories last week over Old Trinity and Coburg. Form predicts a close tussle today, and perhaps the home-side advantage may be the deciding factor. At present, "location" seems to be the only difference between the two teams.

Old Paradians notched up win number two at the expense of Fawkner — again the final quarter was decisive with only a goal separating the teams at the beginning of this term.

Much to the delight of our B Section tipster Parkside recorded a healthy win

over Monash Blues and lifted themselves into third position. Perhaps the bye for them is ill-timed but it is good to see that they have organized a game against Bulleen United - both sides must benefit more from a proper game than from an intra-club "scratch match".

Old Brighton and St. Kilda C.B.C.O.C. are still riding on the crest of a wave in C Section, after wins over Geelong and Hampton Rovers. Though St. Kilda just made it. How Hampton Rovers must be regretting their solitary behind (kicked in the third quarter). Fourteen goals one behind is remarkable kicking - but fifteen goals straight would have seen them tie.

A.J.A.X. led Kew comfortably all day to record their second win, as did Alphington (after a slow beginning) over Old Carey. However, Old Ivanhoe kicked seven goals in the last quarter to come from 3 points down to win well over Old Xaverians.

Power House should have put in a solid week of kicking practice after their defeat at the hands of Old Camberwell. They certainly had the chance to win - kicking two goals six behinds to Old Camberwell's four — one in the last quarter and having 33 scoring shots to 24 over the game. Accuracy certainly pays dividends.

West Brunswick still remain unconquered after a two goal win over M.H.S.O.B. Today they have the opportunity of avenging last year's Grand Final defeat when they welcome Heatherton to Ransford Oval. Heatherton scored convincingly over St. Kevin's last week, though, and will be keen to make it two in a row.

Elsternwick's "resounding" win over Country Colleges saw them rise from tenth to sixth position. More goalkicking practice required at Colleges!

State Bank moved into fourth position with a good win over U.H.S.O.B. who are vet to gain points.

The E Section match of the day -North Brunswick and Bulleen-Templestowe - must have been a beauty, with Bulleen-Templestowe emerging victorious by the narrowest of margins. --- Again accuracy won the day.

Other winners were St. Bede's (still undefeated); A.N.Z. Bank; Beverley Hills and Old Geelong — all of whom scored comfortably.

Unfortunate events discovered during last week, will make North Brunswick more determined than ever to win today over Beverley Hills. We admire the Club's honesty and wish them luck in future weeks.

Games are too hard to win just to be given away through carelessness. Registration Secretary, Cliff Bastow, appreciates prior checks - they save him time in the long run, as he does not spend time searching for

names that are not there.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

Four out of five last week was a bit of an improvement, but once again St. Bernard's proved my downfall. The A Grade teams are starting to sort themselves out, but there are still a number of unanswered questions. The biggest question right now is just how good are Old Scotch? A well respected Amateur foothall personality told me last Saturday that whoever beats Scotch will win the flag. However I think I'll wait a few more weeks before I jump on the fast growing bandwagon. The other big question mark lies over Uni. Blues who are undefeated but are still to meet their main opposition.

At the other end of the list there are a few unfamiliar names. Who would have predicted that three of last year's finalists North, St. Bernard's and Ormond would have won only two games between them.

This week's games are a tipsters nightmare. Match of the day, I suppose, is at Elsternwick Park where Uni. Blacks will attempt to bring Old Scotch's winning run to an end. I've said all year that Blacks were a better side than they had been showing and last week they proved me right with a solid win at St. Bernard's, Costello and Booth have returned after injuries and with Al Fisher controlling the centre they will give Scotch their biggest test thus far. Scotch on the other hand can't be faulted. Marx is picking up a million kicks in the centre, Sherwen and Mason are playing well on the forward line while **Bates** and **Tallent** are doing a fine job on the ball. This should be a great game of football as both sides are strong in the air and like the open spaces of Elsternwick Park. Blacks will stay with Scotch for most of the game, but lack of fitness will tell in the end.

De La Salle and St. Bernard's meet in a replay of last year's Preliminary Final. De La are cruising along nicely without setting the world on fire. Ivanhoe had a disappointing day last Saturday when they were crushed by Scotch, but it would appear to be no disgrace to be beaten by Scotch at the moment. North Old Boys play Ormond at home and both sides will be desperate for a win to keep themselves within striking distance of the lead-
