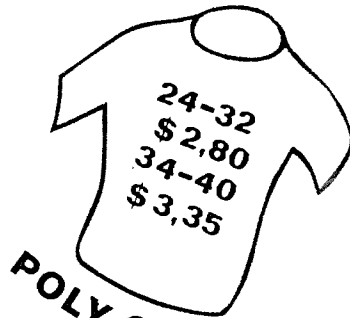

## Editorial

# A DAY OF UPSETS! — ST. BERNARD'S TAME "DE LA" OLD MELBURNIANS SUPREME IN B

Perhaps the best way to describe last week's round would be as a day for upsets. A look at the quarter-by-quarter scores breakdown also indicates that, for the first time, weather conditions played an important role at many grounds. Variable winds and relatively high temperatures (for May) made accuracy difficult and tested the stamina of many. It seems that some were, in fact, beginning to wilt by the commencement of the final term.

One of the biggest upsets must have been the win by lowly St. Bernard's over joint A Section leaders De La Salle on the Malvern Collegians own ground. De La led by two goals at half time, nine points at three-quarter time, but went down by eleven points, and so St. Bernard's slipped into fourth position.

Marcellin led Caulfield Grammarians by eight points at the last change but could only manage one goal one as against Caulfield's three goals eight in the last term — to see Caulfield score by eleven points and thereby record their first win for the season. Unfortunately for Marcellin they strike St. Bernard's at Essendon today — a tough game for a team currently struggling to hold on to A Section.

Old Scotch and University Blues recorded solid wins over University Blacks and Ivanhoe respectively. Scotch's greater winning margin, however, has seen them take top spot away from the Blues for the first time this season.

North Old Boys held Ormond at bay to open their account for 1978. North began slowly and trailed Ormond at the short break, but took command thereafter. Perhaps the unfortunate accident involving Reserves player John Maguire provided a needed incentive to win at North. Apparently John has a badly broken leg and will be out of football for some months. Commiserations John, and may you be back in the fray as soon as possible.

Old Melbournians were off to a flying start against Collegians and led by five goals at quarter-time. In the second term Collegians came back and trailed by only seven points at the half-way point. The stage looked set for the close struggle that had been anticipated. However, Collegians were out-pointed from then on and Old Melburnians ran out easy, five goal victors. The defeat sees O.M.'s as undisputed B Section leaders and Collegians "languishing" in fourth place — on percentage.

Old Haileyburians, after their strong win over Old Trinity Grammarians, have moved into second position with Parkside — by virtue of the bye — are holding third.

Despite inaccurate kicking (or maybe because of it), Monash Blues survived a desperate last quarter bid by Old Paradians and "hung-on" to win by two points (their own score for the quarter, in fact).

Fawkner opened their account, and lifted themselves into seventh place with their big win over Coburg. Fawkner will be looking forward to today's clash with Collegians. With Fawkner's renewed confidence, the result may not be the foregone conclusion it seemed.

The other big match of the day will see Old Haileyburians at home to Old Melburnians — another second versus top clash for the Section. Maybe the wilds of Keysborough will be Old Melburnians undoing — certainly conditions down there can be bleak!

## Editorial cont. —

In C Section last week St. Kilda C.B.C.O.C. summarily disposed of joint-leaders Alphington, whilst Old Brighton Grammarians won comfortably over Hampton Rovers. As the saying goes — "And then there were two". Today sees these two pitted against each other, the battle-ground will be to Old Brighton's advantage and come five o'clock tonight: "Then there was one." — It takes a braver person than I (notably Jim Fidge) to predict who the "one" will be:

A.J.A.X. in third spot on percentage from Alphington, after their win over Old Carey last week will be eager to convert this break to one of four points plus percentage when the two "A's" meet at Albert Park today. Equally Alphington will be looking to re-assert themselves as a major force in the Section again, the Brothers Ritterman will be keen to do well both for A.J.A.X. today and to enhance their chances of gaining final Interstate selection.

Old Xaverians capitalized on a three point lead at three-quarter time to score their first for the season — over Kew, whilst Geelong also notched their first win — defeating Old Ivanhoe Grammarians by fifteen points.

Major upsets occurred in D Section last round, with previously undefeated West Brunswick and Old Camberwell Grammarians going down and U.H.S.O.B. scoring its first win — over Power House.

State Bank converted a five point "orange-break" lead into a ten-point victory over Elsternwick, and now see themselves in second position (on percentage).

The 1977 E Section Grand-Final replay saw the result duplicated. After leading by five points into the last term, West Brunswick could only manage two goals to Heatherton's five. Thus Heather-ton again emerged victorious.

After leading by only two points at half-time St. Kevin's ran all over Old Camberwell to record a sixty-two point win in one of the day's major upsets. This indicates that perhaps St. Kevin's at home on their open, Burnley ground

may still be a force to be reckoned with.

The Power House "machine" as it has been termed faltered again last week, and on its home ground. University High came from behind at half time to win by three points and thus record their first win. The question is — are U.H.S.O.B. better than at first though — or are Power House not so good? (A poser for Norm to deliberate on over the coming weeks.)

At Western Oval, in "blustery" conditions the inconsistent, but more accurate Country Colleges recorded their second win — this time over M.H.S.O.B. Maybe Norm Nugent equates with Lou Richards where Country Colleges are concerned. — Today may tell.

Whilst both still undefeated St. Bede's have managed to wrest top spot away from Bulleen-Templestowe each scored by nearly one hundred points last week — over A.M.P. Society and A.N.Z. Bank respectively.

Old Geelong's defeat of Latrobe Blacks has seen them consolidate their place at the top, behind Beverley Hills who scored the upset of the day over North Brunswick and thereby relegating North to ninth.

Old Mentonians won convincingly "the battle of the zero" against Brunswick and have moved into eighth place.

Commonwealth Bank were a mite disappointing against Thornbury — scoring only one goal after the first quarter.

Equally disappointing, since the first round, have been Clayton, who went down, again, this time to University Reds.

Therry scored by ninety seven points over National Bank whilst honours for the day went to Footscray who emerged victorious by twenty goals.

North Old Boys and Old Scotch still reign supreme in Junior One — after Monash University removed University Blues from joint lead. Ormond consolidated their place with a strong win over St. Bernard's. Hampton Rovers scored over the Blacks to record win number one and so join Ivanhoe.

Big wins all round characterized

Junior 2 — headed by Coburg's mammoth twenty-nine goal win over Therry. Kew scored by sixteen goals (over West Brunswick); Fawkner by thirteen (over Caulfield Gram); Old Haileyburians by

twelve (over M.H.S.O.B.). The section leaders, De La Salle, however, could only manage a seven goal victory over Old Paradians. Maybe, some upsets to come here.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

First loss for De La Salle and another big win for Old Scotch were the highlights of Round 4. De La faltered against St. Bernard's who turned on an amazing reversal of form after their dismal performance the previous week. There was no such faltering though by pace-setters Old Scotch. They started slowly against Blacks, but kicked 19 goals to 5 after quarter time to take over top place from Uni. Blues.

Today's big game is the clash most followers of A Grade have been eagerly awaiting all season. It sees **Old Scotch** at home to **De La Salle**. This is the big test for Old Scotch. If they win this one then they must become firm favourites to emulate the Black's feat of 1974 of winning the A Grade premiership in their first year up from B Grade. De La will put more pressure on Scotch than any other side they've met this season and it remains to be seen whether their skilful game will fall apart or not. De La will bounce back after their loss last week and **Bernie Sheehy** will be very keen to bring Scotch down to earth. However, I think Scotch will win. They have a tight backline, high-scoring forward line and some prolific kick-getters in **Marx, Tallent** and **Anderson**. De La's strength is their backline, but I can't see them holding Scotch to a losing score.

Every **Blues/Blacks** game is like a Grand Final for those playing and today's encounter will be no exception. These games are invariably of a high standard and are renowned for surprise results. On form one would have to go for Blues. They have not lost a game yet and are very keen to regain the top spot they lost last week when they failed to press home their advantage against Ivanhoe. Their forward line is functioning well, but their lack of ruck strength might prove costly, especially as Black's ruckman **Peter Birch** has not been beaten this year. Blacks will improve on last week's dismal showing, but I still think Blues will win a desperate struggle.

**Ormond** play **Ivanhoe** at **Elsternwick Park**. Both sides were disappointing last week. Ormond expected to win at North, but gave the home side too much start and were unable to peg them back. Ivanhoe started the season well but have lost their last two. They are lacking the big men to counter **Naylor** and **Bourne** and despite their pace and enthusiasm I can't see them downing Ormond.

If it wasn't for **St. Bernard's** I would be leading the tipsters' tally instead of languishing near the rear. They have been very inconsistent and are obviously having trouble motivating themselves after some years at the top. Today they are at home to **Marcellin** who hit rock bottom last week with a loss to Caulfield. They can only improve on that form but I have to go for **St. Bernard's** to consolidate their place in the Four.

**North Old Boys** finally broke the ice last week and today should make it two in a row by beating **Caulfield**. Last week was a must for **Caulfield** and they responded well to the challenge with a good win. They don't seem to play as well away from home and they meet a North side determined to rise up the ladder. North to win.

This week's selections are — **Old Scotch, Uni. Blues, Ormond, St. Bernard's** and **North Old Boys** — **PETER BRUKNER**.

## B SECTION

As **Brian Lauder** was unable to make his selections this week, "Ed" is going to "have a go".

The first match of the day sees **Old Haileys** awaiting the arrival of **Old Melburnians** at the open spaces of **Keysborough**. It is a vital game for both (looking forward to September), but the **Cordner** combination should be able to nullify the home-ground advantage and so allow **Old Melburnians** to maintain their unbeaten run.

**Fawkner**, fresh from last week's victory over **Coburg**, travel to the **Harry Troit** to do battle with **Collegians**. Whilst **Fawkner** will be up on confidence and **Collegians** down (after their relatively poor display against O.M.'s last week), I feel that **Collegians** will be too strong and too desperate. Experience gained in the higher grades should allow them to regroup successfully. **Fawkner** are still gathering this experience — and every game helps.

**Old Paradians** should be too strong for **Coburg** — even at **De Chene Reserve**. **Coburg** are in the "horrors" at the moment and must be looking desperately for a win. Their having struck the bottom of the ladder this week may provide some incentive — but the **Bundoora** boys will be equally determined to stay within reach of the four. So it's **Old Paradians** to take the points. (Sorry Norm, hope I don't "jinx" you!)

The final game for this round sees **Parkside** welcome **Old Trinity Grammarians**. Swayed by **Brian's** faith in his club, and by the relative ladder positions of each, I see **Parkside** emerging with the points — and so cementing the advantage gained from last week's bye. Their game against **Bulleen United** at least provided them with solid match practice (if not with a win).

**Monash Blues** have the bye (let's hope they use it wisely — perhaps a game against the Whites, who have the F Section bye).

## C SECTION

Only **Old Brighton** and **St. Kilda** remain undefeated after four rounds, while further down the list, **Kew, Hampton Rovers, Geelong** and **Old Xaverians** all have managed one win and so head the luckless **Old Carey**. This year's C Section is particularly even. However, the top four — **St. Kilda C.B.C.O.C., Old Brighton Grammarians, A.J.A.X.** and **Alphington** — have already established themselves in "the four" and the task is going to be difficult for the lower teams to displace them.

Who will remain unbeaten after today's **Old Brighton-St. Kilda** clash?

**St. Kilda** have **White**, whose duel with **Brighton's Warnock** will provide the highlight. Both teams have competent spearheads in **Drinan** (St. K.) and **Priestley** (O.B.).

This is a very hard one to pick: I lean towards **Old Brighton**. Their better rovers in **Shepherd** and **Jones**, and the fact that they are playing at the beach will narrowly give them the points.

**Old Ivanhoe** played well, particularly in the third quarter, last week, when they concentrated on correct delivery — directed to experienced full-forward **Tim Robinson**. **Robinson** has size on his side and his strong marking will worry all opposing full-backs.

**Hampton** appear to have slipped, so I lean toward **Old Ivanhoe** on its home ground.

**Old Carey** won't be accomplished enough to notch its first win over **Old Xaverians**, but you can be sure that **Carey** will not surrender the four points without a mighty struggle.

**Alphington** slipped for the first time last week and are a trifle unfortunate to strike **A.J.A.X.** today. However, if **Alphington** plays close, it could reduce the effect of **A.J.A.X.**'s pacy small players. Scores could be tight at the final siren, but I favour **A.J.A.X.**

**Geelong** visit **Kew**, where it managed some big wins four or five years ago — and so dispelled the legend that it never played well at **Victoria Park**.

Following its taste of victory last week, **Geelong** will be keen to reproduce that result. On the other hand, **Kew** will be keen to rebound from last week's upset. I predict that **Geelong** will be a shade too strong on the day.
