Editorial

JOSTLING IN "THE FOURS" ST. KILDA — ST. BEDE'S — THORNBURY TRIUMPH

Last Saturday's bleak and blustery conditions were in keeping with some of the match results recorded. The hopes of several clubs were dashed when May 6th successes were followed by May 13th disappointments. However, looking on the bright side, for other clubs, the reverse situation was true and so hopes have been raised for this week's round.

Old Scotch continue to rule A Section after their win over De La Salle. De La led Scotch at each of the three changes (by a diminishing margin) but could not go on with it in the last term and saw Scotch kick six goals to their two.

De La Salle have now lost two on end and today face University Blues (junior partner to the A Section leadership). The Blues struggled against the Blacks last week, but much of the difficulty would have been overcome had the forwards been more on target. With fourteen scoring shots in the final quarter the Blues must certainly have had the opportunity to wrest top spot from Scotch — but could only capitalize on four occasions.

The champagne at St. Bernard's quickly went flat when they were visited by Marcellin. Perhaps, inaccuracy was again the key factor, particularly in the first and third quarters.

Marcellin will need all the added confidence last week's win should have instilled when they confront Old Scotch today. Rumour has it that Marcellin are a much better side at Bulleen, today gives them the chance to prove the truth of this.

Caulfield have won two — on end now having defeated North Old Boys by four points last Saturday, they will be keen to do it again today when they journey to St. Bernard's — just as "St. B's" will be out to regain the prestige of two weeks ago.

Ormond have moved into fourth spot with their twenty point victory over Ivanhoe, who, after their early successes, have now slipped to seventh place.

Old Melbournians further consolidated their place with a resounding victory over Old Haileybury who have now dropped out of the four.

Parkside are now riding high in second but, as happened in the last two weeks, number two plays number one. (One could be excused for thinking that the "fixture-preparer" had psychic powers where B Section is concerned.)

Old Trinity Grammarians will be glad of this week's bye to help them re-establish their momentum, after going down to Parkside.

Collegians, too, are teetering slightly at the moment after their five goal defeat at the hands of Fawkner, who now seem to have realized what B Section is all about, (and justifying Brian Lauder's faith in them.)

Old Paradians have quietly slipped into third place with their solid nine goal win over Coburg. This week they are host to Collegians in what should prove to be a desperate struggle. It is certainly a vital game for both clubs. The loser must drop out of the four.

The C Section match of the day was just that at half time with scores level. But six goals ten, to two-five thereafter saw St. Kilda emerge comfortable winners. Perhaps Brighton can blame

their single point third quarter for much of their defeat. The two teams seemed too evenly matched for one to lead the other a break of more than a goal or so.

A.J.A.X. moved into second place with a solid win over Alphington, though greater accuracy in front of goal could have increased the margin further.

Old Ivanhoe are in the four following a ten goal win over Hampton Rovers, whilst Geelong and Old Xaverians proved that they may still be forces to be reckoned with after their victories over Kew and Old Carey respectively. Geelong however have what must be considered the easier match this week, so they will be hoping to achieve a four point break on Old Xav's today.

D Section saw a couple of upset wins — the most notable being M.H.S.O.B. over State Bank. By virtue of their defeat State Bank have dropped out of the four, as have Power House after they were defeated by St. Kevin's. Power House can also lay much of the blame on poor goal-shooting.

Old Camberwell and West Brunswick exchanged "rungs" on the ladder after the Grammar boys fifteen goal victory over the Magpies.

Elsternwick scored comfortably over U.H.S.O.B., whilst Country Colleges' goal-less first quarter enabled Heatherton to run out four goal victors and put C.C.'s into relegation territory. D Section must surely be the original "Tipster's Nightmare".

St. Bede's emerged victorious from their clash with previous joint leaders Bulleen-Templestowe in what appears to have been a tense battle for three-quarters.

North Brunswick returned to the winning list with a fifteen goal win over Brunswick. The Northerners seem to have stabilized again and will be out to regain their earlier supremacy.

A.M.P. Society and A.N.Z. Bank recorded upset wins over Old Geelong

and Beverley Hills, but both of the losers have retained "four" places.

Old Mentonians defied La Trobe Blacks last half bid to emerge by eleven points after a goal-less third stanza.

Thornbury reign in F Section after their four goal win over second place holders Therry. National Bank came from behind at three-quarter time to score by five points over Footscray and are now "knocking on the door".

A fourteen goal to nil third quarter saw the Commonwealth Bankers run-away winners over University Reds, and enabled them to move into third spot.

Bulleen United bounced up again after their victory over Parkside to score premiership points over Clayton — winning by seven goals.

Junior Section honours this week go to North Old Boys after their mammoth two hundred and three point win over Geelong. North only lead Old Scotch on percentage however, after Scotch held Ormond scoreless in the final term to win by fifty points. Only one point separated the two at three-quarter time.

After leading by two goals at the last change, University Blues scrapped home by only three points against St. Bernards. The clash of the Universities — Monash and the Blacks saw Monash lead all day to win by ninety-four points. Ivanhoe "got home" by eight points over Hampton Rovers after a tight battle all day.

De La Salle are still undefeated in Junior 2 — winning comfortably over M.H.S.O.B., — but are pressed by Old Haileybury, who scored convincingly by over Kew.

Coburg needed three quarters before they were able to assert themselves against Old Paradians, whilst Fawkner led West Brunswick comfortably at each change.

Caulfield by virtue of their win now have a game break on Therry and will be looking for a big win soon to boost their percentage.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Every time I think I have A Grade all sorted out, I'm forced to revise my thinking. Last week it was Marcellin and Caulfield ruining my tipping record with narrow wins over St. Bernard's and North Old Boys respectively. If anyone can give me the key to St. Bernard's form I will reward them well. I'm sure Gus Mitchell would love to know also.

The only consistent feature of A Grade this year has been the total dominance of Old Scotch. Five convincing wins have made them hot favorites for their first A Grade flag since 1934.

Once again, today's round has a number of interesting games. Match of the day is at De La Salle where the home side is host to Uni. Blues. These two sides have had many close struggles since their B Grade days in 1975, with honours about even. De La have lost two in a row and must be worried about their apparent inability to reproduce their premiership form. Blues, on the other hand, have won all their games although they have had to fight hard on a couple of occasions. They showed real courage last week to overcome a 4 point deficit at three-quarter-time and steamroll the Blacks with only 14 fit players. They have had a crippling run of injuries over the last couple of weeks, but their lesser known players have risen to the occasion and kept them on the winning list. Today is their first big test for the year and every opposition team will be watching closely to see how they fare against De La's pressure football. They will win if they show the same desperation as last week.

Marcellin are at home to leaders Old Scotch. Complacency is the only thing that could cost Scotch this game. They won well last week despite a number of their stars from previous weeks being down on form. Most pleasing aspect from Scotch's point of view was the good form shown by former A Grade Best and Fairest winner Mick Bates and his clash with Marcellin's big ruckman Price will be a feature of today's game. Scotch are due for a loss, but I can't see it happening today.

Today's game against Ormond at the University is a vital one for Blacks. Another loss would have them facing relegation, while a win is essential if they are to keep in touch with the leading division. Blacks had the game won at three-quarter-time last week, but faded in the last quarter. As I have said before their fitness is suspect. They rely heavily on ruckman Peter Birch and have a good backline led by Simon Costello and Mark Lockie. If today is a big game for the Blacks, then it is just as important for Ormond, who are keen to make it two wins in a row for the first time this season. Ormond always have trouble at the Uni, and I can't see them improving their record today.

Ivanhoe and North Old Boys should have an even struggle at Elsternwick Park. North's resurgence came to a sudden end last week when they lost a close one to Caulfield, while Ivan-

hoe found Ormond a little too strong. Ivanhoe's lack of height may tell against them in the finish and I'll go for North.

Three times I've picked St. Bernard's to win and three times they've lost. Twice I've picked them to lose and on both occasions they've come out and won. Lou Richards has got nothing on me! Everyone at St. Bernard's will be delighted to know that I'm tipping against them this week. My spies tell me that Caulfield are really running hot at the moment. They've picked up some good young players and after looking relegation certain for a fortnight ago they are now talking confidently of a place in the Finals. It's early days yet, but they'll take another step towards achieving that aim today at St. Bernard's.

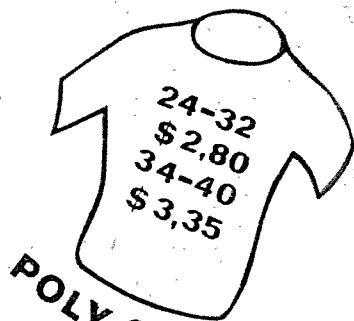
