



Editorial

"A" BUBBLES BURST

- MARCELLIN and DE LA BACK IN STEP

Again, last Saturday, strong winds and sloppy ground surfaces did not favour many sides. The advent of wintry conditions has brought many early successfuls to a halt. Mud is said to be a great speed-leveller. The "slower" sides are now better able to hold their own against the more "fleet-of-foot".

The bubble burst for both A Section leaders last week when Marcellin recorded a fifteen point victory over top side Old Scotch. By virtue of the recent successes Marcellin are now lying fifth — out of the four on percentage only. They can prove today (against Univ. Blues) whether this was a fluke win or not.

De La Salle returned to the winning list with a resounding fifty-one point victory over University Blues. A scoreless first term made the Blues task almost impossible though they did outscore De La Salle after quarter-time.

Ivanhoe were also back amongst the winners when they scored by nine points over North Old Boys after leading all day.

St. Bernard's moved into fourth place with a comfortable win over Caulfield Grammarians, whose success was short-lived. Against Old Scotch today, St. Bernard's have the opportunity to show how good they are (and thereby perhaps help Peter Brukner out in future weeks).

University Blacks recorded their second win by defeating a disappointing

Ormond (who have now dropped back to seventh). The Blacks came from five points down at half-time to win by fourteen.

Still Old Melburnians continue to "lord" it over all in B section. A goalless third term put Parkside out of the race last week — in a game which was marred by poor goal-shooting from both teams. O.M.'s will, perhaps, try to improve their accuracy with some solid practice today as they enjoy the bye.

Collegians, who seem to be in a depression, fell out of the four when they were well beaten by Old Paradians, who have now moved into second place. Parade have the chance to consolidate against Old Haileyburians today — the loser could well be out in the cold again after this round.

Old Haileyburians (fourth) will, however, be looking for another win after their defeat of Fawkner last week. After being three goals down at the last change they went on to win by eight points.

Although inaccurate, Coburg doubled Monash Blues score, to record their first win for the season (excluding the bye).

St. Kilda — still undefeated — have opened up a two game break on the opposition. Overpowered last week was Old Ivanhoe.

Old Xaverians did it well against number two side A.J.A.X., the final margin being eleven points.

Fortunes fluctuated during the day between Alphington and Old Brighton, with Alphington finally emerging the victors by eight points.

Hampton Rovers took three quarters before they found Kew's measure, but came home with a five goals to two final term.

Geelong are riding high at the moment. After their poor beginning to the season, they are now fifth, after their defeat of Old Carey, and will be looking forward to today's clash with A.J.A.X.

Power House and State Bank returned to the D Section four last week after convincing wins over Elsternwick and Heatherton respectively.

Power House led comfortably all day to win by eighty-seven points, whilst State Bank managed a six-goal win in a game of amazing accuracy from both sides.

Old Camberwell Gram. gained themselves a four point breathing space at the top with their win over Country Colleges.

St. Kevin's Old Boys continue to be second after leading West Brunswick all day. Playing at the school today they will be keen to win again before the "re-unioning" crowd.

M.H.S.O.B. are now fifth after their sixty-nine point win over Univ. High.

St. Bede's relinquished top spot after they were convincingly toppled by Beverley Hills — who ran away with it after half-time.

Bulleen-Templestowe's win over Old Geelong sees them back on top and O.G.

out of the four. Old Geelong's spot has been filled by A.M.P. who scored over an extremely inaccurate La Trobe Blacks.

Brunswick recorded their first win when they accounted for A.N.Z. Bank convincingly, the more so after half-time.

Old Mentonians won narrowly from North Brunswick in a relatively low-scoring game.

In F Section results were symmetrical—the top four won—the bottom four didn't—and the team in the middle (National Bank) had the bye.

The narrowest margin was recorded by Thornbury — against Footscray I.T., followed by Commonwealth Bank over Clayton, Therry over University Reds. The day's "honours" went to Bulleen United with their ninety-three point win over Monash Whites.

Hampton Rovers kicked the sweep in the Juniors to win by twenty-two goals over Geelong.

North Old Boys remain unbeaten, last week scoring over Ormond. University Blues defeat of previously unconquered Old Scotch enabled them to stay with the top bracket, whilst giving North a four-point break.

Ivanhoe accounted for the "Blacks" easily, as did Monash for St. Bernard's. This win put Monash four points clear in fourth position.

Kew's thirteen point victory put an end to De La Salle's unbeaten run. Old Haileybury maintained second spot with a win over Fawkner, after trailing at half-time.

Old Paradians moved into sixth place following their eleven goal win over M.H.S.O.B., whilst Coburg retained third by accounting for fifth place holder Caulfield Grammarians.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION


