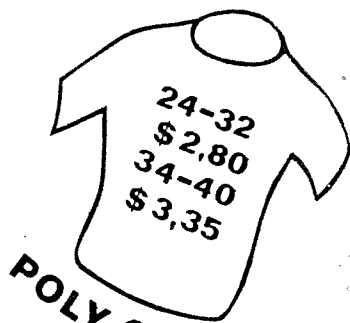

BLUES ON TOP CAULFIELD SCRAMBLE HOME ST KILDA STILL UNDEFEATED

The last round of matches, again played in cold and blustery conditions — although no rain to speak of — produced its share of surprises and upsets. After several weeks as second fiddle to Old Scotch, University Blues have finally managed to wrest the top spot in A Section.

In B Section, Old Melburnians, by virtue of the bye are still two games clear of the field, as are St. Kilda in C Section (still undefeated) and Old Camberwell in D Section. St. Bede's and Thornbury are heading the E and F lists, both a game clear as are North Old Boys in Junior One. Junior Two sees De La Salle and Old Haileyburians sharing the lead.

University Blues moved to the top after their huge win over Marcellin. After their defeat of Old Scotch the previous week Marcellin had been expecting big things from the Blues clash but such was not to be. They trailed all day and were saved from further ignominy only by the Blues somewhat erratic goalscoring — particularly prior to half time.

St. Bernard's looked set for another win in their match against Old Scotch, when they led by fifteen points at half time and by seventy-one points at the final break. But Scotch came back to kick eight goals five in the last quarter to the Saints one-one and ran out comfortable winners by twenty-five points.

Whilst a six goal third term put Ormond back in the game against De La Salle, a disastrous one-goal nine in the final quarter put them out of it again. De La Salle could only manage a single goal in this period, so it must be assumed that Ormond had every opportunity to convert their five point final deficit into a winning margin during the quarter.

University Blacks have plummeted

to the bottom of the list after their dismal performance against North Old Boys. The quarter-by-quarter scores indicate that the Blacks only played one quarter of football. It seems that North have returned to some of the form that took them into the Grand Final last year. This week's "replay" at Elsternwick Park gives North the opportunity to prove whether they are "back" or not.

After trailing by a goal at three-quarter time Caulfield came home the better (aided, undoubtedly, by Ivanhoe's abysmal kicking) to grab the four points by the narrowest margin. After so many weeks in number ten spot Caulfield are now seventh — out of the four on percentage only.

Old Paradians toppled out of the B Section four when they lost by only three points to Old Haileybury — after a keenly fought final term, in which the lead changed hands several times before the final bell.

Collegians moved back into the four when they reversed recent form to score handsomely over Coburg. Eight goals in the first term and ten in the third seem to have completely demoralized

Coburg, who were not able to get into the game at any stage.

Fawkner led Parkside by nearly six goals at three quarter time but seemed to fade in the final period. They could only manage one point to Parkside's six goals seven behinds and this lack of score by Fawkner allowed Parkside to take the four points by eight points.

The previous round bye did Old Trinity no favour when they trailed Monash Blues all day. The final siren saw Monash eight goals ahead. The win places them sixth — out of the four only on percentage.

St. Kilda are riding high in C Section — still unconquered. A ten goal first term saw them off to a flying start against Kew last round. Against a stronger side however they will need to play four quarters of consistent football. Five goals thirteen after quarter time is not really impressive.

Old Brighton seem to have forgotten how to win in recent weeks. Last round they led Old Ivanhoe by ten points going into the final term, but were not able to capitalize and the siren saw Ivanhoe three points up, and four points better off.

A.J.A.X. consolidated their hold on second place with a big win over Geelong, who trailed all day. Geelong did rally a little in the final term, but they were too far behind to close the gap. Perhaps the A.J.A.X. pressure slackened a little after they led by eleven goals at the third interval.

Old Xaverians, perhaps, produced the biggest upset of the section when they downed Alphington by a goal. Inaccurate kicking played some part in Alphington's downfall however. After a slow start to the season Old Xav's are now equal third, but — sixth on percentage.

Carey battled valiantly against Hampton Rovers but could not withstand their final quarter burst and finally succumbed by eleven points (all behinds). Carey's accuracy was one of the day's highlights, together with Hampton's eight goals nine in the final term.

Old Camberwell increased their lead to two games over the field by virtue of their twenty-seven point win over State Bank, who toppled from third to sixth place.

Power House moved up into second place when they bettered West Brunswick by six goals after leading by only three points at three quarter time. Only percentage separates Power House and the four teams below them.

M.H.S.O.B.'s six goal win over Elsternwick has allowed them to move into third place. Elsternwick were off to a strong start but a single behind second quarter saw them lose the advantage and they were never back in the game thereafter.

Heatherton led U.H.S.O.B. all day and their percentage boost enabled them to snaffle fourth spot on the ladder.

In the section's upset, Country Colleges kicked seven goals into the wind to defeat St. Kevin's by nine points. The defeat cost St. Kevin's their place in the four and proved that they must put four quarters together if they are to secure premiership points. Colleges will be looking forward to today's game at home to repeat the performance.

The E Section upset saw Latrobe come back strongly after half-time to defeat section leaders Bulleen-Templestowe by twenty points. St. Bede's led Brunswick comfortably all day and have now moved into the top spot.

North Brunswick returned to the winning list with a resounding victory over A.N.Z. Bank who are struggling in ninth position.

Old Mentonians, after a slow start to the season are now fifth (on percentage) following their good win over A.M.P. Society — still fourth.

Beverley Hills led Old Geelong all day, assisted by very accurate kicking, to consolidate the position near the top.

Comfortable wins to Therry and Bulleen United — over Clayton and Commonwealth Bank respectively — enabled them to stay in touch with Thornbury in F Section.

A game of fluctuating leaders saw National Bank too strong in the final term for Monash Whites whilst Footscray led University Reds all day to record their second win for the season.

The F results were such that the ladder for this section did not change in composition.

North Old Boys accounted for University Blues to maintain their unbeaten record in Junior One, whilst Old Scotch kept in touch with their fourteen goal victory over St. Bernard's.

Hampton Rovers moved into sixth spot after their defeat of Ormond and Ivanhoe are fifth after their narrow win over Monash University. The battle of "wooden-spooners" saw University Blacks record their first win at the expense of Geelong.

Joint-leaders Old Haileyburians kicked the sweep in Junior Two, (narrow-

ly ahead of De La Salle) when they defeated Therry by eighty-eight points.

Wins to the top five in this section meant that the composition of the ladder is unchanged (pending Therry — West Brunswick result still).

Leaders De La Salle acquitted themselves handsomely against Fawkner as did Coburg against M.H.S.O.B., both leading comfortably all day.

Caulfield fought back in the last quarter to down West Brunswick by thirteen points, whilst Kew had to withstand a spirited last term from Old Paradians, who finally were defeated by only four points.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Four out of five was a bit of an improvement and most importantly I have finally broken my "St. Bernard's hoodoo". Old Scotch and Uni. Blues both bounced back after their defeats the previous week but it was North Old Boys who provided the most significant result of the round with a big win over Uni. Blacks.

Match of the Day today is out at St. Bernard's where top team Uni. Blues are the visitors. The Saints looked winners at three-quarter time against Scotch, but faded badly to eventually go down by four goals. A loss today will see them lose their tenuous hold on fourth place, so they will not be lacking in incentive. Nor will the Blues, who are determined to show that they deserve their position on top of the ladder. They had a good win over Marcellin in the last round, but still have to prove themselves against top opposition. If their five State players can come up again this week, they should record another win.

North Old Boys have been waiting all season to avenge their shock 1977 Grand Final loss to De La Salle and today, at Elsternwick Park, they have their chance. North showed they were getting back to something like their best form with a brilliant performance against Blacks and the big win should restore some of the confidence so obviously lacking early in the season. The return of **Shano Maguire** to his rightful position at centre half back has added stability to that line and if goalsneak **Dillon** can continue his good form, they will prove a handful for De La. After their great win against Blues, De La had only Ormond's inaccuracy to thank for their win a fortnight ago and will have to play better. I think North can take another step up the ladder today.

Two last round losers, **Marcellin** and **Ormond** meet at Bulleen today. After great wins against St. Bernard's and Old Scotch, Marcellin crashed badly against Blues. Their form was too bad to be true and I'm sure they'll perform far better today, particularly at home. Ormond are the 'Fitzroy' of the Amateurs. Four games lost by two goals or less have meant the difference between a place among the leaders and a dangerous position in the relegation zone. Their form against De La was good and if they've got their right kicking boots on today they'll outscore Marcellin.

Another pair of last round losers, **Blacks** and **Ivanhoe**, meet at the University. Blacks turned in their worst performance for the year at North last round and could not play as badly again. **Mark Lockie** was their only player that day but he will need plenty of support if the Blacks are to get themselves off the bottom. Ivanhoe led all day last round, but were pipped on the post. That loss cost them a place in the Four and they will be keen not

to slip up again. Much will depend on whether Blacks ruckman **Peter Birch** has recovered from the ankle injury which prevented him donning the Big V last Sunday. Blacks to win a close one.

Old Scotch are at home to Caulfield in the final game of the day and on paper should win. However, Caulfield are very confident of doing well against their old rivals. Veterans **Greg Tootell** and **John Butcher** are playing well and **Rob Cameron** showed some of his teenage form in the Ivanhoe game. Despite their confidence, I can't see them beating Scotch who will be looking for a big win to ready themselves for the big one against Blues next week.

Today's big one will be the clash between Old Paradians and Parkside, at Parade. This should be a beauty.

The home side went down narrowly in the last round, which cost them second place. They will be all fired up to regain that position. The Parkside team will be just as determined to hold on to number 2 spot and consolidate their place in the four with a good win. Paradians will be hard to beat at home, but the stubborn Parkside combination, which will be at full strength, should have enough up their sleeve to win out.

Old Melburnians, after a two week rest, play host to Old Trinity. Unless the long lay-off has made the leaders rusty I can't see Trinity causing them too much worry, so I'll go for Old Melburnians.

Coburg at home to Old Haileybury could be interesting. Coburg will be very desperate to start winning all their home games at least to be in it. Old Haileybury have the taste of finals in their system and will not allow this one to slip away easily. I'll pick Old Haileybury to win a hard game.

Collegians meet Monash Blues at the Harry Trott. This will be another hard one with Collegians keen to get back among the winners and Monash determined to get into the four. Fawkner have the bye which will give them a chance to put some extra miles in those legs and condition themselves to play out the full game. This is a must in "B" Grade and I am convinced this is all that is missing from their game.

I have a reputation with some people at A.J.A.X. for not liking their club; I also lack the admiration of one of their "stalwarts" for never selecting their club to win; accusing their club of being a one (or now, perhaps, two) "man" team and, furthermore, to my personal "disadvantage", I live at Geelong.

As our Editor realizes, it is difficult for me to keep deadlines for our publication and if any aspiring writer wants my job it is up for "grabs". Perhaps **John Brustman** would make a worthy replacement.

It does, however, amaze me that my comments and selections, intended lightheartedly, are taken, by some, so seriously.

Back to the real stuff — and I am not allowed to put my "tongue-in-cheek" — but select A.J.A.X. to win again, this time at Hampton Rovers' expense. **AJAX IS THE BEST TEAM I HAVE SEEN THIS YEAR** and while their coach, **Syd Myers**, has reservations when playing away from the "Park", the talents of their small players, such as the brilliant **Rittermans** and number 69 — **Henry Bluzer**, will hold, for them, second place.

Geelong strikes the "match-to-be-won" — the traditional duel with "Refreshment Record-breakers" Old Xaverians.

Geelong has not hit its straps and is struggling but can still make the four. But should it lose today, I see its chances of playing in the finals as remote.

Geelong improved its direction two weeks ago and showed plenty of fight against fleet-footed A.J.A.X. I select it to win at home in a close one and further predict the day to be a crowd-pleaser from start to finish.

Old Carey have improved as I tipped, but will not bother undefeated St. Kilda — but be careful St. Kilda, it is hard to finish champions — just ask North Old Boys!

Old Brighton has slipped in recent weeks, but will consolidate its hold on third place by accounting for **Kew**.

Old Ivanhoe and Alphington provides a poser. I tend to lean towards Ivanhoe, only because of the home ground advantage.

If my predictions are anywhere near "spot-on", tonight will see eight teams all with a chance of playing in the "C" Section finals. This is tremendous for both the sport and the competition.

The **Country Boys** certainly came to town with a bang to spoil the St. Kevin's reunion celebrations. **Maurice Beaumont** tells me the **College Boys** are building to peak form and strength. Form appears to vindicate Maurice's judgement and with a peculiar pleasure I select **Country Colleges** to score their first ever home and away victory against **West Brunswick** (I can jump on the bandwagon as quickly as that other, more widely read tipster).

Two Southern sides meet at **Elsernwick** when **Heatherton** are their visitors. **Heatherton** on paper have a slightly better record. With no great confidence I select **Heatherton**, purely on the score of their 1978 record.

Melbourne High School Old Boys are host to **Power House**. These two sides have not met since 1974 (B Section). Many titanic tussles have been played between the sides over a generation. **Power House**, now restored to second place, will be anxious to maintain this position.
