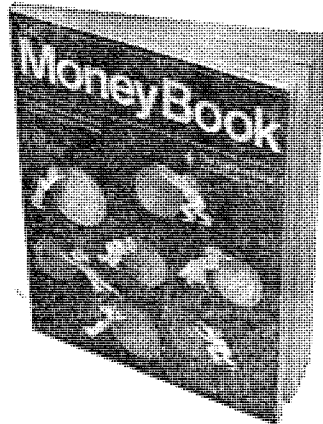

# BLUES CLEAR "A" LEADERS HAILEYBURY JUNIORS UNSEAT DE LA

Last Saturday's honours must undoubtedly go to Old Haileyburians in Junior 2. They recorded the mammoth tally of 259 points and won the game against Caulfield by a mere thirty-five goals two behinds. (If your club's records — or memories — show higher scores could you please let me know. It is thought that O.H.'s score is not a V.A.F.A. record but confirmation is required.)

In A Section, North Old Boys won their revenge when they topped De La Salle by two goals. The day's surprise came when Caulfield led Old Scotch nearly all day and won by six points. Ormond and Marcellin changed places on the ladder when Ormond won by four goals. Ivanhoe have slipped back into the four after their good defeat of University Blacks. A ten goal third quarter from University Blues saw them emerge comfortable winners in their clash with St. Bernard's and go a match clear at the top of the table. However Old Scotch will be keen to close the gap again when they visit the Blues today.

Old Melburnians showed no ill-effects from their two-week break and proved too strong for Old Trinity during the final quarter. Old Paradians faltered during the second quarter but Parkside were unable to capitalise and their fifty-seven point defeat cost them their place in the B Section four. Old Haileyburians ran away from Coburg after half time to record an eight goal victory. Inaccuracy contributed to Monash Blues' eight goal defeat by Collegians who seem to have steadied after their mid-round slump.

In C Section, all four at the top won and other winner Geelong, have moved into fifth spot (on percentage). Hampton Rovers again gave a fine display of accuracy but it was not enough to topple A.J.A.X. St. Kilda trailed Old Carey by five goals at three quarter time but put on eight goals eight in the last term to snatch victory. Old Brighton hung on to win by the narrowest margin against Kew, whilst Alphington led Old Ivanhoe all day to win by fourteen points.

State Bank regained their spot in the D Section four when they defeated St. Kevin's by twenty points. M.H.S.O.B. were no match for Power House after

half time and trailed by nearly ten goals at the final siren. Inaccuracy cost Heather-ton the points in their game against Elsternwick, whilst Country Colleges led West Brunswick all day. Old Camberwell maintained their break over the field with a twenty-two goal win over U.H.S.O.B.

The only close game in E Section was that between St. Bede's and North Brunswick, which resulted in a four point win to leader St. Bede's. Beverley Hills, Bulleen-Templestowe, Old Geelong and Old Mentonians each led all day to record comfortable victories over La Trobe Blacks, A.M.P. Society, Brunswick and A.N.Z. Bank.

F Section points went to Footscray, Commonwealth Bank, Thornbury and Bulleen United, each of whom won handsomely — over Clayton, Therry, Monash Whites and National Bank respectively. Bulleen United slipped into second spot after their win and Therry's loss.

North Old Boys are still undefeated in Junior 1. Last week it was St. Bernard's who succumbed to them; as did University Blacks, Hampton Rovers, Geelong and Old Scotch to Ormond, University Blues, Ivanhoe and Monash University, all by (un)comfortable margins. Scotch, however, did manage to hold second spot, on percentage, only going down by sixteen points.

Old Paradians' seven point win over Fawkner provided the closest Junior 2 contest. Kew were successful over M.H.S.O.B. by six goals, De La Salle over Therry by five and Old Haileybury over Caulfield by thirty-five. Coburg had the dubious honour of winning by walk-over against West Brunswick. O.H.'s huge win enabled them to unseat De La from the top of the list, on percentage.

# Inaccurate Victoria too Good for S.A.

Despite its incredibly sloppy goal shooting, Victoria's 12 goals from 43 scoring shots was sufficient to take it to a narrow but comfortable 13 point win over South Australia at Elsternwick Park two weeks ago.

It is an amazing statistical fact that Victoria with 18 more scoring shots than S.A. and one major score less in the final goal tally, was able to make such hard work of what should have been at least a ten goal Victorian win.

Victoria's kicking for goal was so haphazard that it took until the third quarter to arrest the lead.

Allan Naylor (Ormond) was my best Victorian player. During the first half, when Victoria struggled, he was outstanding and was the side's corner-stone. He rucked superbly all day.

South Australia had first use of the strong following breeze and jumped away to a good start. Victoria were taking time to settle down and appeared to lack system. South Australia were coming straight down the ground and full forward **Nick Fielke** drew first blood with early goals. Fielke went on to finish the day with five goals, not reflective of the performance of Victorian full back **Ray King** (St. Bernard's) as at least two came from free kicks which were not his responsibility.

Victoria, after its slow beginning, gradually muddled its way to the front and established itself a ten point lead by three quarter time. It now looked a Victorian win — with the guessing game "by how far?"

Coming home with the wind, Victoria could only manage a miserable 2 goals 12 behinds. South Australia, by contrast, managed a conservative 3 goals 3 behinds against the breeze.

However, despite the inaccuracy, the win was not without merit. South Australia are always hard to beat and this year's clash was no exception. Victoria showed it had superior talent and the win was attained by a splendid team effort with all players making a contribution.

Best players were hard to single out — about half the side netted, individually, 15 to 18 kicks with a tally of 20 being the side's most prolific effort.

Victoria was well served on the half-back line by **Joe Doolan** (St. Bernard's). Doolan was constantly a spring-board for Victorian forward moves.

Centre half-forward and vice-captain **Ian Cordner** (Old Melburnians) was Victoria's best goalkicker, finishing the day with three. Cordner dominated in the air and on several occasions gave the game that much needed touch of class with some superb marks.

Veteran interstate campaigner, **Bruce Bourne** (Ormond), again showed he is no spent force in interstate ranks. Bourne, a valued asset to any side because he can play anywhere, assumed a changing half-forward role when Michael Yeo dropped out. He played an important part in the Victorian win.

**Mike Welch** (North Old Boys) was a perfect example of how the interchange system can work successfully. Welch was most productive when on the ground.

**Ian Davis** (Geelong), in his customary place in the centre, was, as usual, "spot on" with his disposal and was able to exert influence on the Victorian team effort.

Skipper **Greg Wade** (St. Bernard's) led his team well while **Mike Sleeman** (University Blues) was a dangerous player to South Australia's defence.

South Australia's trophy for Victoria's best player went to **Joe Doolan** while Victoria's opposite number was awarded to South Australia's **Paul Heets**.

Victoria has now won four of the seven encounters between the states since 1972. Two of the South Australian victories were at the elusive Carnivals. Victoria's last Carnival success was in 1967. I feel that our talent may have developed sufficiently to restore to us our prestige at the Carnival in Hobart next year.

**Peter O'Donohue** is moulding Victorian teams into distinctive combinations. His success will, however, not be complete until we have captured a Carnival victory.

# Team-building Tassie Swamped by Vics

A "younger than last year's Tasmania was thoroughly trounced by a totally superior Victorian number two side at Elsternwick Park two weeks ago.

The Victorian team possessed sufficient talent to do equally as well as the number one team which followed up with a win over South Australia.

Outstanding player on the ground was Old Melburnian ruckman **Rowan Brown**.

Brown dominated proceedings from first bounce to final siren and further emphasised his effectiveness by kicking four goals.

Victoria was most successful during the second and final quarters when assisted by the breeze. In the second term it demoralised any glimmer of Tasmanian hope when it stormed goalwards and rattled on an impressive, if slightly inaccurate, 7 goals 9 behinds; the last quarter yielded a similarly crushing blow — 9 goals 11 behinds.

Victoria had no weak links. Every player contributed but some were more prominent than others.

Defenders **Bruce Corben** (Ormond) and **Jon Long** (Caulfield Grammarians) were impassable on the half-back line and repelled any promising Tasmanian forward opportunities.

In the heavy scoring department Old Brighton's **John Priestley** and **Chris Moore** of Monash Blues were outstanding, finishing the day with five goals apiece.

**Bernie Dunn** (De La Salle), playing his first game for Victoria, established himself for future selection while **Roger Paul** (Old Haileyburians) was in identi-

cal circumstances and seems similarly assured.

Although they battled their way and never shirked any issue, the Tasmanians did not pressure the Victorians in any way.

Victoria was well led by captain **Ian Rice** (Collegians) and vice-captain **Simon Costello** (University Blacks) and coach **Bernie Sheehy** deserved his first-up success in interstate combat.

**Rowan Brown** won the trophy awarded by the Tasmanians for his faultless display in the packs and strong marking around the ground.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

More surprises last week with three of the top four going down and North and Caulfield continuing to show improved form. Today sees the end of the first round of matches and the continuation of the battle for fourth place.

Match of the day, in fact, match of the season thus far, sees the two top sides, Blues and Scotch, do battle at the Uni. oval. Scotch have been the glamour side of A Grade this year after dominating B Grade in 1977. Coach Laurie Aghan, the umpires' friend, has instilled the discipline and enthusiasm missing from Scotch sides of the past and he's sure he's got the best side in A Grade. Laurie won't have taken too kindly to his team's surprise loss last Saturday and today we will see a very determined Scotch side. While Scotch have taken all the limelight, Blues have been going along quietly, winning all but one of their games and steadily improving. Last week they inflicted on St. Bernard's their heaviest home defeat ever, and in so doing destroyed the myth that they couldn't handle wet conditions. There will be a big crowd at the Uni and I think they will see a win to the Blues.

Ivanhoe travel to Elsternwick Park to meet De La Salle, full of confidence after a good win last week. It's been a long time since Ivanhoe have been in the Four in A Grade and they won't give up their position easily. They meet a De La side whose form since their big win against Blues has been disappointing. They had a lucky win over Ormond and then lost to North last week. However, I think they might have a bit too much experience for the youthful 'Hoies.

After seeing Caulfield in the first game of the year, I thought they would be struggling to avoid relegation. Just to show what a good judge I am, they have now won four games and a win today could get them into the Four despite their woeful percentage. John Griffiths is starring whenever his medical duties allow him to play, but even without him they will be too good for the disappointing Blacks who seem to have a fair amount of the play each week, but can't kick goals. Caulfield will win.

Ormond play St. Bernard's at Koorang Park. Ormond are a better side than their position on the ladder suggests and despite the fact that they say they prefer a bigger ground, their home ground is a decided advantage. 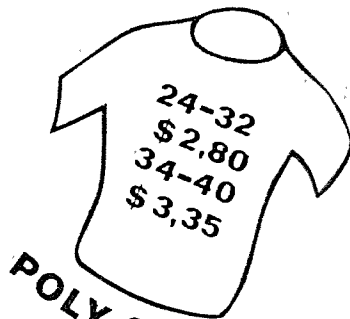
