VICTORIANS DEFEATED — BUT NOT DISGRACED VALUABLE LESSONS LEARNED

The Western Australians are out to prove that they are a force to be reckoned with in Amateur Football, as the preparation and work that they put into the match against Victoria last Sunday showed.

They had been training together for over eight weeks for this match. They were fast and vigorous and their backing up was truly something to see. Almost all their handballs found a

The Victorians were unlucky to lose though. After a nervous start, with all players trying hard. Victoria gained the lead but finished the first quarter with a high number of behinds on the board. As the team settled down during this quarter, some great football was played. Bourke and Lockie were good in defence and Sleeman was the driving force on on the forward line. The W.A. defence showed their style and attitude, however, when Priestley, with his many fine leads, always managed to find himself at the bottom of a heap of players. This style of play was soon evident all over the ground.

The second and third quarters were fairly even, with fast, vigorous football from both teams. The match was of a high standard and was an exciting game to watch — with Western Australia starting to move the ball away from the packs better than the Victorians.

The last quarter was played in similar style. Victoria snatched back the lead early then W.A. gradually caught them again and regained the ascendancy. Victoria, with good defence from Ian Cordner at centre half-back, attacked from there and regained the lead. The West levelled the score again and then went to a one-point lead. A kick out-of-bounds on the Victorian back-line allowed the West to score a goal which was followed by two more in two minutes. Victoria rallied with a goal, but in the darkness of the Perth day, time ran out. It was only these three quick goals at the end of the match that won it for Western Australia.

Summing up: The Western Australian team is a threat to the other States, Their attitude is strong and they must be favoured for the Perth Carnival in 1982.

The trip to Perth last week-end was well worthwhile. We now know what is required for the Perth Carnival. The grounds are huge, well-grassed, with a spongy, tiring surface.

The Victorian team last Sunday played their hearts out. Every player contributed his best and the Coach, John Fisher, and selectors were pleased with their efforts, although some

positions will have to be strengthened for next year and the Carnival in 1982.

New players in the team, Cooper, Tunbridge, Dobbie, Lockie, Kaufman, Mike Greene and Hibbins, have a great future in the Victorian Amateurs.

UMPIRES' CORNER

It has often been the subject of much debate among football followers on how far the umpire actually runs during a match. A survey carried out by Ross Smith (ex St. Kilda and former Hampton Scouts player — Hampton Rovers' Under 19's) on ten senior list V.F.L. umpires (using the two umpire system) indicated that an umpire runs approximately 7.3 miles (11,750 metres) per game. Such variables as wind and weather conditions, the time of the seoson, the fitness of both players and umpires and the standard of the game will obviously influence these distances.

The study showed that on average the umpire runs backwards one mile (1610 metres), jogs 3 miles (4,940 metres), runs (strides) 2.9 miles (4,680 metres), and sprints 0.4 miles (624 metres) per game. The type of running demanded of the umpire during a game shows that the umpire runs over relatively short distances with the majority being between 10 and 40 metres, Sometimes the umpire is found to run up to 110 metres in a single dash. On average the umpire makes 46 running efforts each quarter of a match, totalling 184 efforts for a game. So you can see that field umpiring is a very demanding endurance type activity.

No study has been made of field umpires under the single umpire system, but an educated guess is that they cover about 9 miles a game.

How far then, does a player run? A study carried out in Perth on senior players shawed that a "wandering" centre man covered approximately 8 miles per game, whilst a half back flanker covered some 6 miles during the same match.

These studies underline the fact that Australian Rules football is the only sporting code in which the umpires have to be as fit as or fitter than the players in their games.
