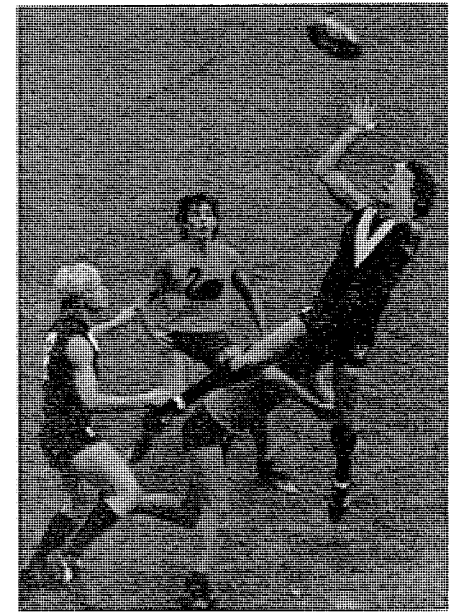

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Ormond play host to St. Bernard's O.C. this afternoon. Ormond gave O.M.'s quite a bit to go on with two weeks ago, but they will have to improve by going more directly to goals. Their task will be made easier by being on their smaller home ground, but they will have to rely on Bourne getting a few goals, with Smale and Crump doing more damage. St. Bernard's went on their winning way again with a clear win over Blues. They always spread the goals between quite a few players, which makes the "Saints" an easier combination for coach Gus Mitchell to change around. St. Bernard's to score the four points.

Marcellin meet University Blacks out at their College oval. Marcellin proved too strong for AJAX in the last round and will certainly be looking to maintain that record for their second in a row today. They have too many good players to keep down for all the season and they now appear to be getting back to the speed of A Division. Blacks, however, will want to stay in touch with the final four, but have at this stage dropped back to two games behind same. Price (Marcellin) and Chris Cordner (Blacks) will certainly have interesting ruck duels and their result will pave the way for the small men, Dillon and Perrett, respectively. In a very close game when I think the winning margin will be less than a goal, I'll go for Blacks.

University Blues play North O.B. today at the University. Uni. Blues after two defeats in three weeks, have suddenly dropped from first to third position and will certainly not want to miss out again. Today Coach Alan Salter will have pounded the boys and I feel that a response will be forthcoming, although the high-marking side may be dented a little, especially as the grounds are getting heavier. North O.B. have had two wins in two weeks after not being disgraced three weeks ago against De La Salle. The Northerners will be out to prove they are not as bad as they have been made out to be this season, and get themselves well clear of the relegation zone. In another close match, Blues should win, but they cannot afford to have too many receivers.

Ivanhoe and AJAX play at Elsternwick Park today. Ivanhoe missed by two goals to beat North O.B. last outing, and today play their first for the year at "headquarters". With Balcombe in front of goals, Bye and Cowan in the ruck doing well, they, I feel, will acquit themselves well today. AJAX have played at

Elsternwick Park twice before during this year and failed both times. They must be starting to think it a jinx ground, but I am sure coach Sid Myers will have other thoughts. AJAX let me down again last game, but I think they can do better. AJAX to win, although I wouldn't be surprised to see Ivanhoe reverse the result of their earlier encounter this year.

De La Salle, A Section leaders, take on Old Melburnians down at the O.M.'s ground. Old Melburnians have won their last three games, but only one of those with any authority. Today will be a big test for them. Brown has been doing a fine job in the ruck, and with Thoren playing well in the middle and Pisarski at full back, there could be a few stumbling blocks for the De La's. De La Salle, on the other hand, have Mike Green to take on the ruck work and Murphy and P. Greene to deal out the opposition, plus many others. The last time these teams met De La Salle handed out a lesson, and unless the O.M.'s knuckle down to a bit of solid football then the result will be the same. The all-round strength of De La Salle to prevail.

B SECTION

Today sees the start of the second half of the season. If the trends of the first half season continue then the top four sides and the bottom two sides are now clearly evident.

The great improvers, Monash Blues, travel to Albert Park to engage Caulfield Grammarians. The students have gathered momentum and if unsuccessful in their finals' quest they will at least have a major say in who does play. Rodger is the focal point for Monash attacks. Rarely does he fail his team mates. Olds, McKenzie, plus the ever-reliable Moore and Anderson, are all lifting Monash by their winning play. Caulfield needs victory to stay in touch with the Section leaders. For scoring opportunities the Grammarians rely on Kanis, Fletcher and D. Matthews. Seldom are all covered simultaneously. Watson, by his consistent play, is the main worry for the Monash players as they seek victory. Today overall talent and strength will see Monash Blues to victory.

Two of the disappointing sides of the season meet when Old Paradians visit Parkside. The loser of this game must have a "limited tenure" on future B Section membership. At home Parkside are never easy to defeat. Added to this is the Paradian inability to win away from home. (The 1978 Final against Parkside was their last away win.) Today if Parade play a direct game and if Brian Grills can outruck Arnold, the Paradians could well be on the road to victory. As Parkside captain Jones has seven times been listed as a "Red Devil" best player, he will need close checking by the Paradians. The Joneses, along

with the **Howells** and **Harveys**, will prove troublesome players to the **Paradians**. Architects of the anticipated **Paradian** victory could well be the consistent **Peter Symes**, **Paul Johnston** and **Sam Assetta**.

Kew has had a better half season than has the other 1980 promotee, **C.B.C. St. Kilda**. Today these sides meet at **Murrumbidgee**. There **Kew** will encounter some difficulties before winning the game. The "Hawks" have strength all around the ground — **Ken Rowlands** in defence, **Don Fletcher** in the centre, and **Wayne Blay** up forward. Added to this is more strength around the ground, viz. **"Munro" Walker**, **Bruce Smith**, **Rocco Zerbi**, and **Tony Hayes**. The Saints will rely on **"Ox" White**, **Terry Dynon**, and the consistent **Crottie** for their drive. Their major downfall may be the fact that they have no established and reliable forward to score goals.

Old Scotch make their initial long journey to **Fawkner**, where the tactical battle of the coaches, **Laurie Aghan** and **Dennis Groves**, will be a highlight. **Busst** (**Fawkner**) will have a busy afternoon if he is to nullify **Meadows** and **Mason**. The **Scotch** runners will be confined on narrow **Mutton** flanks. However, **Marx**, **Bubb** and **Morgan** should create enough opportunities for victory. The **Scotch** rucks and defenders will need to be constantly alert to prevent **Chard** booting a bagful of goals. The elusive **Mark Stapleton** and **Peter Smith** will become dangers to **Scotch** once the ball hits the ground. **Scotch** is my selection because of its players' greater reliability and consistency.

The main game today sees two evenly matched top sides, **Old Xaverians** and **Collegians** clash. Having viewed each side during the past three weeks I can foresee a close high standard game. Each side has talented forwards with centre-forwards **Tim Bennett** (**Collegians**) and **Curtain** each being able to win the game off his own boot. In the centre, interstater **Ian Rice** (**Collegians**) will be opposed by the consistent **Corcoran**. Roving duels between **Vale** and **Adgemis** (**Xavier**) and **Hibbins** and **Laussen** will be hard fought and thrilling to spectators. The key to this game and maybe to **B** Section success in 1980 lies in the ruck duels. I doubt if **Collegians**, even with **Basilille** and **Cook** fully fit, can hold the talented **Xaverian** trio, **Noonan**, **Burne** and **Brimacombe**. These dynamos should control the ball enough to insure a **Xaverian** victory.

C SECTION

Last week's results were not very good for your tipster and it seems I should adopt the tactics recommended, and no doubt practised, by **Alan Salter** from **University Blues**.

The "giant killers" from last week meet each other today at **Keysborough**. **St. Kevin's O.B.** defeated the **B-T's** with accurate kicking, while **Old Haileyburians** ran away from the **Rovers**. Perhaps **St. Kevin's** win was better because it was out in **B-T** territory, even

though **Haileybury** won by the bigger margin. Despite **Haileybury** being at home again I am going for the visitors to maintain their contact with the four.

Geelong had a good win last week, and await the arrival of **Bulleen-Templestowe**, who have not yet made this trip. I can assure the **B-T's** it is certainly an experience and even if they win the game they will lose the after-match entertainment stakes. Nevertheless the game is the important issue and while the **B-T's** will want to avenge their first-round defeat, they will be overcome by **Geelong** on the **Queen's Park Oval**.

It is understandable that last week's 68-point defeat frustrated many of the **Old Trinity Grammarians**, but as long as they have that attitude they will have no hope of achieving victory in the shadows of the **College**. **Coburg** won their first encounter and are a much better side at home; therefore they get the nod.

M.H.S.O.B. were thrashed by **Geelong** last week and today they play host to **Old Camberwell Grammarians**, who just scraped in against **Coburg**, which in itself is no real recommendation. With **"Swaoper" Wallace** and **"Mad-Dog" Graham** in form I think the **High** will avenge their first round defeat.

The form of **Hampton Rovers** appears to be patchy in that in the last three games they have beaten **B-T's** (in the four) and gone down to two sides outside the four. While **"Tregga" Tregear** has done well in notching up 200 games, his experience would not match that of **Old Brighton Grammarians** coach **"Bustling" Bill Brown**. **Tony Gedy** is rucking well for **Brighton** and he now has some interstate experience. I fancy **Brighton** at home.

D SECTION

The top four sides have that settled look about them at the half-way stage of the year, but the battle to avoid relegation is starting to "hot up".

Today, **Heatherton** are at home to **Old Ivanhoe Grammarians**, and at the moment their rock-bottom form is sending them down into the relegation zone. **Old Ivanhoe** are not exactly firing themselves, having lost their last three games, although their last game saw them put up a good performance against **St. Bede's**. **Heatherton** have the home ground advantage, and a win over **Old Ivanhoe** first up, but I do not think they can put up a match-winning performance today.

Power House, after losing their last three games, visit **St. Bede's O.C.**, who, after losing their first game of the year, have gone from strength to strength, with their only other losses being to **Alphington** and **Old Carey**. **Power House** have to get over their thrashing from **Alphington** last game, and it will not be an easy task, for **St. Bede's** will be out to consolidate their third position on the ladder. I cannot see **Power House** repeating their earlier win of the season, but they will not be very far behind at the final bell.

Country Colleges followed up their win over **Beverly Hills** with a good win over **State Bank** last game. They are now showing much better form than a couple of weeks ago, but they have to travel to **Alphington** today and try and defeat the **Section** leaders. **Alphington** have crushed the lower order sides this year, and they will be out to win by a greater margin than the seven goals when these two sides last met. Even though **Country Colleges** will be confident after their last two wins, I cannot see them really troubling **Alphington** today.

Beverly Hills, who were going for their third consecutive home win, faltered in the second half against **A.M.P.** to lose narrowly. Today they visit **Old Carey Grammarians**, who yet again showed top form to annihilate **Heatherton** last game. **Old Carey's** forward line is functioning perfectly, with all players scoring goals, and the defence is starting to put four quarters together, which makes them a very hard side to beat. Whilst **Beverly Hills** have improved since their first game thrashing, so have **Old Carey**, which adds up to an easy win to **Old Carey**.

TEN YEARS ON: A TRIBUTE TO DES. TUCK

May 9, 1970, saw the introduction to Amateur Football of Rev. Br. Des. Tuck, whose game for Assumption Old Collegians against Hampton Rovers netted him 5 goals in a best on ground performance.

That season Des. appeared in 11 games, including the First Semi-Final. From his ten home and away games he scored 23 best and fairest votes (seven best on ground and one second best). Against Old Carey he was injured early and left the ground at half-time. This surely was consistent play. In addition he booted 28 goals.

Season 1971 saw Des. play nine games. Fifty-one goals came from his boot in these games, some of which saw him selected in defensive positions! Umpires judged him best on ground four times and second-best once. Veteran umpire Alan Bishop had a worrying time awarding votes when Assumption played Footscray Institute. Des. at full forward booted 11 goals (as boundary umpire I chased many into the nearby Yarraville Gardens). From centre half-forward young Renato Serafini booted five and passed many more to Des. In a line-boll decision, Umpire Alan awarded three votes Serafini; two votes Tuck. The extra vote would have won Des. the C Section best and fairest on a count-back, as events turned out at the end of the season.

Season 1972 was the most successful in the Assumption O.C. fourteen season membership of the V.A.F.A. Des. Tuck played eighteen games, in which he added 95 more goals to his total to easily win the C Section tally. From his sixteen home and away games

he won votes in eleven to finish second for the third consecutive season in the V.A.F.A. best and fairest.

Duties and commitments as a Marist Brother virtually sent Des. into permanent retirement after 1972; however, he made two B Section appearances in 1973, including a seven goal tally against Old Scotch. Thus moved into retirement the man whose talents were arguably the best ever seen in eighty-nine V.A.F.A. seasons. His career statistics read 40 matches and 185 goals.

What strong points did this gentle giant possess? Scrupulously fair, the six foot three blond could compete with small men on the ground and outmark most ruckmen. A quick mover, he was gifted with uncanny ball sense and his prodigious kicking regularly covered half the field. This statement is not exaggeration, as many players and supporters from 1970-72 C Section sides will confirm. I can speak as a suffering boundary umpire who was often caught out of position by a Tuck kick

A very successful coach of schoolboy sides in Marist Brothers' Schools in Victoria, Western Australia and South Australia, Br. Des. is now Director of Sacred Heart College, Somerton Park. Many times during his Adelaide posting he has renewed friendship with the V.A.F.A. State groups.

Those of us privileged to have been part of this cameo V.A.F.A. career will carry memories of the big blond No. 55 in the Assumption colours as long as we can think football.
