VICS SPARKLE TO HOLD WEST END CUP

With a wonderful team performance the Victorians retained the West End Cup played for annually against South Australia - 16.10 to 12.8 The selectors. S.A. won the toss and chose to kick with a reasonably strong wind. Victoria won the game in the first quarter when all the elements of play that a coach asks for were present — first to the ball, determination, straight through, scouting, talking, running, tackling, smothering, leading — and all shown by every player. Cooper and Dobbie were already well on top on the wings and with Davies and Costello showing great strength in the packs to get the ball out, the half forward line, with Blay always in the play, was constantly driving the ball forward. When S.A. went forward, Lockie was superb in the back pocket, with brilliant clearing dashes and driving kicks to position. S.A's style was surprising as they continued to drive the ball forward with long kicks, only to be outmarked by Burne and Cordner. This change of style was mainly due to Victoria's strength, tackling, and backing-up which never let S.A. get balanced. At the first change Victoria led 6.4 to 2.1.

The Vics. soon put another goal on the board with a snap by Kauffman, then strong shepherding by Blay allowed Murphy to run through and drive forward a long kick which bounced

through an open goal. Priestley who was playing well at f.f. but not getting value from his kicks, handpassed to Kauffman who goaled. S.A. began to show more determination and with their rucks playing strong football they often drove the ball forward only to see the superb defence led by Pisarski, repel the attacks. Victoria had relaxed in the last ten minutes and at half time scores were 10.8 to 3.2.

S.A. goaled within 30 seconds of the start of the third quarter as a result of two strong marks, then good handball and they had another. S.A's captain, veteran Ross Haslam, then goaled from the pack. The S.A. defence with Ian Harrison, all Australian in 1976 & 1979, now at c.h.b., and Thomas on the flank, had tightened. Victoria came back with an exciting chain of handballs to allow an unattended Priestley to goal from the square. Gedye marked, handballed to Cooper, Priestley marked in the pocket and goaled for Victoria to lead 12.9 to 6.4. Cooper then featured in some magnificent handball along the wing. Victoria were running again and Dobbie down the ground fought his way Murphy, and all the rest for a solid strong team game.
