# VICS SPARKLE TO HOLD WEST END CUP

With a wonderful team performance the Victorians retained the West End Cup played for annually against South Australia — 16.10 to 12.8 The selectors, John Miles (chairman), Jock Nelson, Jack Clancy, Peter O'Donohue, Jim Hawkins, and coach John Fisher deserve congratulations for selecting such a well-balanced team particularly with the loss, due to injuries during the preceding week, of Ian Cordner, Ian Rice, and Mike Sleeman.

S.A. won the toss and chose to kick with a reasonably strong wind. Victoria won the game in the first quarter when all the elements of play that a coach asks for were present — first to the ball, determination, straight through, scouting, talking, running, tackling, smothering, leading — and all shown by every player. Cooper and Dobbie were already well on top on the wings and with Davies and Costello showing great strength in the packs to get the ball out, the half forward line, with Blay always in the play, was constantly driving the ball forward. When S.A. went forward, Lockie was superb in the back pocket, with brilliant clearing dashes and driving kicks to position. S.A.'s style was surprising as they continued to drive the ball forward with long kicks, only to be outmarked by Burne and Cordner. This change of style was mainly due to Victoria's strength, tackling, and backing-up which never let S.A. get balanced. At the first change Victoria led 6.4 to 2.1.

The Vics. soon put another goal on the board with a snap by Kauffman, then strong shepherding by Blay allowed Murphy to run through and drive forward a long kick which bounced

through an open goal. Priestley who was playing well at f.f. but not getting value from his kicks, handpassed to Kauffman who goaled. S.A. began to show more determination and with their rucks playing strong football they often drove the ball forward only to see the superb defence led by Pisarski, repel the attacks. Victoria had relaxed in the last ten minutes and at half time scores were 10.8 to 3.2.

S.A. goaled within 30 seconds of the start of the third quarter as a result of two strong marks, then good handball and they had another. S.A.'s captain, veteran Ross Haslam, then goaled from the pack. The S.A. defence with Ian Harrison, all Australian in 1976 & 1979, now at c.h.b., and Thomas on the flank, had tightened. Victoria came back with an exciting chain of handballs to allow an unattended Priestley to goal from the square. Gedye marked, handballed to Cooper, Priestley marked in the pocket and goaled for Victoria to lead 12.9 to 6.4. Cooper then featured in some magnificent handball along the wing. Victoria were running again and Dobbie down the ground fought his way Murphy, and all the rest for a solid strong team game.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

**North Old Boys meet Ormond** at North this afternoon. North found the power of the Blues too much last week and are out against the giant killers of last week today. The good form of Galvin and Butera will have to continue if they are to have any chance at all. However their home ground advantage will be of assistance. Ormond last week doubled St. Bernard's score to win impressively. The break mid-season seems to have suited them and they will be out to go on with it today. Coach Peter Murphy will certainly keep his boys' minds on the job and Ormond should triumph.

**De La Salle O.C. play host to Marcellin Old Collegians.** De La showed what A section leaders are all about by trouncing OM's last week in a most disciplined, business-like manner. Although they may get bogged down at their very heavy home ground I think that their backing up and combining will rule the day. Around the ground the Scotch linkmen Bubb, Marx, Tallent as well as veterans Morgan and Anderson should win the ball often enough to thwart the Saints. However Laurie Aghan will have to insure his players cover the Saints' stars Dynon, Crottie and Delaney each of whom showed against Scotch in Round 2. Scotch stirred by last week's defeat will win.

**Old Paradians**, anxious to move out of the relegation region, await a buoyant Fawkner. Despite Fawkner's great home form they have trouble winning away games. The Paradians have experienced problems in winning at home and away this season. Deciding factors today could well be the small Paradian defenders attempting to nullify Chard and the other Fawkner forwards. The Paradians will be hoping for another great defenders' game by veterans Tony Johnson and Mark Tellefson to thwart Fawkner. Statistically these sides have named the greatest totals of best players in nine rounds. (Paradians 22 and Fawkner 25). This indicates neither really has many star players. On the other hand Parade has had the greatest number of B Section goalkickers (31 players have shared their 118 goals in the first half of the season). This lack of a focal point in attack should enable the Fawkner defenders to hold Parade to a losing score at the conclusion of a physically hard game.

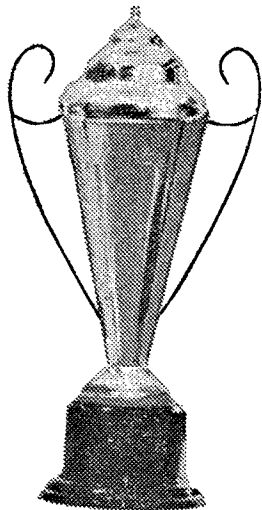

## ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

A reminder to club secretaries of the V.A.F.A. Rules governing player eligibility for first and second round matches. Note carefully Rules 17 and 19.

15. The first and second rounds for the Senior Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit.

16. The first round of the Junior Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players who have not attained the age of 19 years on or before the 31st December of the preceding year.

17. The second round of the Junior Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players within the age limits prescribed in Rule 16 to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit provided that a player who has represented a Club in an aggregate of more than five matches in the Senior Grade and Reserve Grade in the first round in any season shall not be eligible unless he has represented such Club in more than five matches in the first round of the Junior Grade in the same season.

18. The first round of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit.

19. The second round of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit provided that no player shall be eligible to represent a Club unless such player shall have represented such Club in at least two matches of the Reserve Grade in the first round in the same season and further provided that no player shall be eligible to represent a Club after having represented such Club in more than eight matches of the Senior Grade in the first round in the same season unless such Club shall be represented in a match of the second round of the Senior Grade on the same day. In the event of a draw taking place in a match in the second round of the Reserve Grade, all players who took part in the drawn game shall be eligible to take part in the game to be replayed.

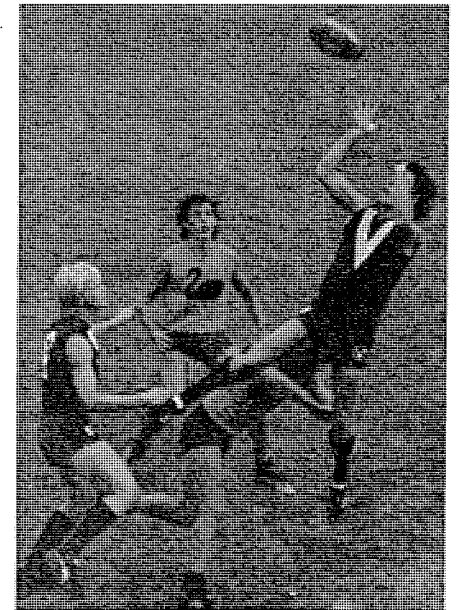
