EDITORIAL

ABYSMAL CONDITIONS KEEP SCORES DOWN, OVERALL FINE DISPLAY BY COLLEGIANS' RESERVES

Anybody who stood on the boundary-line to watch last Saturday's round of football could certainly be excused for thinking that the reported snow-falls were not confined to the Highland regions of the State. Many a player was to be seen shivering at the non-scoring end of the ground for two quarters of their match as howling south-westerly winds made scoring basically a "one-ended" affair. The results of last Saturday's round generally reflect this marked change in playing conditions — with low scores and high "behinds" tallies being the order of the day. The most notable exception to this "rule" was to be seen in the performance of B Reserve side Collegians, who scored consistently all day and with remarkable accuracy — even for a dry day. Their final score: 27 goals 6 behinds.

A Section leader's De La Salle did not adapt to the conditions as well as Marcellin who, despite a goalless second half, were able to score an upset, four point win. The leader's supporters will be waiting anxiously for today's game to ally suspicions that they may only be a "dry-weather" side. In the other close match, North Old Boys held on in the last term to win by three points over Ormond. A scoreless third term cost Ivanhoe any chance they had of beating the Blacks, whilst first quarter inaccuracy set the pattern for Old Melburnians defeat by St. Bernard's. The Blues were never really troubled by A.J.A.X. — even at Albert Park.

The top four in B Section all recorded wins last week, though Kew have now snatched the top spot from Collegians, whose percentage could cause them some problems if they do not maintain their one game margin over Old Xaverians and Old Scotch Collegians. Fawkner's defeat by Old Paradians would seem to have cost them any chance they had of a final's appearance.

In C Section, Old Haileyburians continued their surge towards the four when they defeated Bulleen-Templestowe by six points, thus inflicting the combine's fourth consecutive loss. Only percentage is keeping them in the four at present. The other three teams at the top each recorded good wins though

section leader Old Brighton only managed to assert itself over St. Kevin's after half-time.

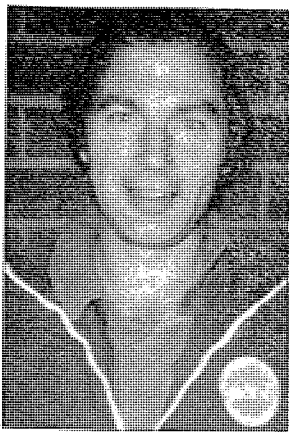
Another leader who experienced some anxious moments was Alphington in D Section. It was only in the final term that they were able to steal a march on a determined A.M.P. Society. Second-placed Old Carey Grammarians were similarly troubled in the first half of their encounter with Old Ivanhoe Grammarians.

Only two points separated 'E' leaders Elsternwick and fourth placed Old Geelong at three-quarter time, but Elsternwick had the better of a low scoring final term to win by eight points. St. Pius rallied from their recent slump with a sound win over their 1979 protagonists Princes Hill. West Brunswick led by only one point at half-time but were able to withstand a last term flurry from Thornbury and record an eleven point win. At the bottom of the ladder — both A.N.Z. Bank and Bulleen United registered good victories.

F. Section leaders Thomastown and University Reds both won comfortably last week, thus setting the stage for a great tussle between them today. The closest match in this section was that between Coolaroo Rovers and Therry C.C.O.B., where the lead see-sawed before the Rovers emerged victorious by a mere two points.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

Ivanhoe play host to De La Salle Old Collegians this afternoon. Ivanhoe, last week, found Blacks too good, but will be happy to be back on their home ground after four weeks. They are better playing on their ground and will really want to win this one to "knock off" the Section leaders. De La Salle must have got bogged down last week to lose to the determined Marcellin. Two weeks ago De La looked unbeatable, and may have taken last week too easily. Coach Gavin White will get their minds back on the job today and I think will see them victorious.

The battle of the University sides will be held today when University Blues meet University Blacks. Uni. Blues want to keep winning to give themselves at least second position for the double chance. St. Bernard's are breathing down their neck so a loss today could see them tumble. They had a solid win last week under trying conditions and will look forward to continuing in this fashion today. Blacks also had a good win last week and "knocked off" Ivanhoe by 21 points, which with the heavy grounds was quite meritorious. To slip into the four today they have to win and will be looking for their match winners in Mark Lockie, Chris Corder and Simon Costello to perform well. have to change their attitude in the heavy going and knuckle down. Marcellin, on the other hand, showed De La Salle what playing in wet conditions is all about and will be looking to follow on from last week. In a most interesting match where O.M.'s are looking to retain their position in the four and Marcellin to staving off any chance of relegation, I will go for O.M.'s by the narrowest of margins.
