EDITORIAL

CLOSE RESULTS EQUAL CHANCES LOST

Last week's round of matches could probably best be described as the day of missed opportunities — particularly in A Section. Old Melburnians and University Blacks could have been sharing equal fourth place ahead of Ormond instead of being two and four points behind them. The Blacks were defeated by Ormond by three points and Old Melburnians could only manage a draw with North Old Boys — despite both teams having led at three-quarter time.

Similarly Marcellin and North Old Boys could have thrown down a more serious challenge for that fourth spot if they had been able to sustain their final quarter revivals for just one scoring shot more.

The opportunists of the Section were University Blues who came from nine points behind at the last change to record a thirteen point win over De La Salle. This win enabled the Blues to retain the second spot on percentage from St. Bernard's, who must consider themselves a little lucky to have escaped with the points against A.J.A.X.

In B Section Old Xaverians missed

In B Section Old Xaverians missed their chance to move into second position with a fairly dismal performance against the holder of that placing: Kew. Old Xav's were never in the game after the first quarter. Old Scotch did not miss their chance however and after a slow beginning against Monash Blues went on to a nine goal win and a four point break over Old Xaverians.

Fawkner and Old Paradians both recorded wins to keep their hopes alive — though it is hard to imagine either side making it as they still trail by three games.

Old Haileyburians missed another opportunity to stay with Bulleen when they lost by seven points to C Section leader Old Brighton after having led by three points at the last change. Melbourne High Old Boys keep their hopes alive with avengeance, at the expense of those of St. Kevin's.

In D Section last quarter inaccuracy

cost Old Carey the game against Power House and second place on the ladder which they relinquished to a somewhat fortunate St. Bede's, who trailed Beverley Hills virtually all day before emerging with the narrowest of wins. Alphington avenged their only loss of the season to date when they soundly defeated fourth placed State Bank.

Elsternwick lost the top spot in E Section when they were led all day by A.N.Z. Bank, who only four weeks ago looked relegation certainties. A scoreless first term cost Mentone the chance to stay close to the leaders and only a desperate last quarter enabled Old Geelong to consolidate their position in the four. They had trailed bottom side Bulleen United by two points at the last change.

Peninsula Old Boys appear to be making a determined bid for the second spot in **F Section** if their three point win over Thomastown is any guide. They were nearly six goals down at three-quarter time against a side that had lost only two matches prior to last Saturday. Brunswick, Therry C.C.O.B. and Footscray I.T.O.B. all stayed within striking distance of Coolaroo Rovers and the fourth place when they recorded good wins — as too did Coolaroo, however.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

The match of the round is at Elsternwick Park between Ormond and De La Salle O.C. Ormond went on their winning way last week and now are in the four by two points. This will be a hard one for them against the section leaders and they will be looking towards the continuing good form of Crump and Mehrten. 'De La' has had problems on their home ground in their last two appearances and today on neutral territory things should suit them better. The aura of optimism which has been prevalent among Old Paradians' supporters throughout their four week winning sequence will end abruptly today. At home, Monash Blues will have sufficient skill to defeat the Paradians. The Blues know their tricky and wind swept oval better than do their visitors. Architects of the Monash victory will be captain Olds, the consistently good Lindeman (named in 6 games), and McKenzie (9 games) as well as Sist (5 games). (Thanks to Jim Fidge on 3LO for this fact.) Today's question is: can their experience overcome Kew's vigour and dependable play? For the home side, "Munro" Walker will be determined to outruck dependable Tom Mason. This advantage would assist Kew "runners", namely Haralambopolous, Smith, Hayes and the Zerbi brothers, against whom will be Tallent, Bubb, Marx and Anderson. 
