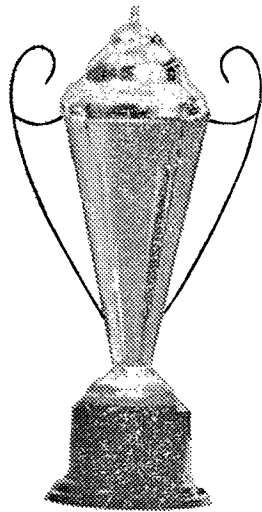
COOLAROO ROVER'S AWARD WINNER REACHES 150

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

De La Salle O.C. play host to **St. Bernard's O.C.** today. De La had a solid win last week over the then fourth place holder — Ormond. Their last two home games have not been morale boosters and I am sure they will be looking for a more forward showing today. If there is not too much rain during the week then their ground will pick up a bit and so will the side. **St. Bernard's** on the other hand went down at home surprisingly and will now want to regain their composure. They are good ball-getters and the ground may suit them. Last week's defeat may shock them into action today. In a very close game with less than a straight kick separating them in the end I will go for De La Salle.

Another most interesting game will be held at Elsterweg Park — that is the game between **University Blacks** and **North Old Boys**. Both sides were strong winners last week and each have aspirations of getting that vital fourth position. **University Blacks** have the strength in the air with **Chris** and **Ed Gardner** and **Llewellyn** up front of goals while **North** look to **Shane Maguire** for strength and drive from **Robertson** while **Dillon** is still getting amongst the goals at full forward. In a close tactical battle, the winner moving towards the four, I will go for the students — **University Blacks**.

Ormond travel out to **Marcellin O.C.** this afternoon. **Marcellin** were given a football lesson last week by Uni. Blues and will be looking to make amends today. Four is the word on all lips this week. Four represents the number of remaining games and the rewards ahead for the leading sides. Today's round should tell us who the final four will be.

Leaders **Collegians** await the disappointing **Monash Blues** who now face relegation to C Section from which they graduated in 1967. **Collegians'** players will not let this game slip from their grasp. **Williams**, **Hoyle** and **Wagstaff** can be expected to put pressure on **Monash** players while **Bennett**, **Hibbins** and **Lausson** have regularly converted their scoring opportunities. **Monash** players have not followed the consistently good example set by **Olds**, **Rodger** and **McKenzie**. Suggested!!! **Kew** should win as my analysis reveals they have more talented players than do the **Paradians**.

Parkside at home to **Caulfield Grammarians** hope for their second victory this season. In their favour is their home ground. **Caulfield** do not like heavy grounds and consequently have not won since June 21. Despite my prenomination of a **Parkside** victory, the score on the board does favour **Caulfield Grammarians** due mainly to their star players like **Wakeham**, **Griffiths** and **Cooney**. Also **Mafthews** has shown himself to be capable of

In their favour is **Fawkner** players run tall, **Crumb** gatherers **Mark Stapleton** and **Arthur Deans** have done well recently while **Saggers** and **Allan** have continued to supply drive. In this clash of the "two cultures" there will be many highlights in talented players. **Mason** and **Noonan**; **Corcland** the personal duels of numerous **coran** and **Duke**; **Vale** and **Bubb**. Added to these is the potential of the rural forwards **Curtain (O.X.)** as well as **Cox** and the returned **Sherwen**, whose experience has aided **Old Scotch**.

Both sides are capable of fine football and today the winner will be the side able to gain the early breaks. From what I have seen and heard I lean towards the **Old Xaverians** to take the points.

MILESTONES AT CAULFIELD

Caulfield Grammarians pay tribute this week to three of its players, Glen Fletcher, Ian Hood and Doug Lyte who have each served the club for several years. Glen, 100 games, commenced in 1973 and being a big lump of a chap went straight from school into the seniors where his ability to take "the big mark" and cover long distances with either foot made him a valuable player in key positions mainly on the forward lines. Supporters will remember the kick which won the V.A.F.A. longest kick competition held during the interval of an interstate game some years ago. Unfortunately he has had knee problems over the years which has made him a week to week proposition in recent seasons.

Ian, 50 games, whilst still at school in 1976 commenced with the Juniors and is now the Seniors Deputy Vice Captain. Whilst his style of play is deceptive, he appears to be a slow mover, he can hold down a position on the wing or half forward flank very effectively and is regarded as a valuable member of the team. A serious car accident early last year sidelined him for the best part of the season but he is certainly not showing any effect of that now.

Doug, has spread his 50 games over several years after first appearing with the Juniors in 1976. A bit on the light side (weight wise) he is fast to the ball, is elusive when in possession and usually gets his kick. Early in his career with the club he played some games with the Seniors either on a forward flank or roving but in recent times when available he has given the Reserves Team valuable service as he can be played effectively in most positions on the field. All three players are good club men and we look forward to the benefit of their services to the club for several years to come.
