## PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

### A SECTION

North O.B. and De La Salle O.C. play at Elsternwick Park today. North are making a concerted effort towards the four. Last week they beat equal fifth placeholders University Blacks, and have now slipped into outright fifth position themselves. Unlike last year, late in the year, they are progressing instead of slipping, towards the four with a vengeance. But today they take on De La Salle, who showed St. Bernard's a clean pair of heels last week. De La Salle have good consistent players in R. McHenry, Donegan and Hollier each week, and will be looking forward to them following up today with their good form. With the drier grounds, the "De's" are playing better, and I think they may halt the Northerners' advancement to the four.

AJAX play University Blacks down at Albert Park. AJAX show glimpses of good form but cannot sustain their flow and get overrun in the latter stages of each quarter. They SHOULD be good enough to hold off most attacks, but their fitness may be lacking. If they can get the ball up to Korn quickly I am sure he can do the rest. University Blacks, after a sparkling win two weeks ago, had their colours lowered last week against North O.B. They still have a chance of making the four and today I don't think they will let it pass. University Blacks to win.

St. Bernard's O.C. are host to Marcellin O.C. this afternoon. St. Bernard's have now lost two in a row, and their previous two games they won by only 2 and 8 points against 8th and 9th position holders respectively, and although not troubled in third position on the ladder, must be a worry to Gus Mitchell, their coach. At home today they will need to play well to regain a little lost prestige. Marcellin last week, on the other hand, showed Ormond (fifth) how to go and get the ball in the second half and the Saints will have to watch this onslaught. This has not been a pattern of Marcellin's play over the year, so finally they may have "come of age". Although Marcellin cannot make the four they can certainly vary its composition. In a close match I will go for St. Bernard's at home.

Ormond clash with Ivanhoe at Ormond today. Ormond appeared to be destined for the four, but have let their concentration slip over the past couple of weeks. Last week Marcellin got under their guard by their desperation and determination, and Ormond will want to take a leaf out of the "Maroon's" book if they are to win. Ivanhoe, although beaten by the high-scoring University Blues, still kicked 18 goals last week. They are capable of doing well and if they are on their mettle today then they could sneak this one to take their wins to two. I feel, however, that the loss to Ormond would put them out of the running for the four, so their incentive will be too great. Ormond to win.

Old Melburnians venture off to the University to play University Blues. University Blues are hard to hold at the moment, and rush forward to get goals through Karvelis, Macaulay, Wilson, D. Curnow and Sleeman. Even though they score heavily they perhaps let a few too many goals through, and this could be the only flaw in their armour at the moment. O.M.'s have played a little more consistently over the past two weeks, and with the drier grounds are looking a greater threat to the final contenders. If they are to maintain the edge in the four then they must win this one today and repeat the performance when they showed Blues what pressure football is all about earlier in the year. I think Blues, however, will be too strong on their home ground and win.

### B SECTION

What appeared to be a "fait accompli", namely, the final four, has been cast into doubt by the continued good form of the Old Paradians, who still believe they will play on August 23. Good luck to them!

Kew, who need a win to be sure of a final berth, await Collegians, whose performances indicate they will earn the double chance. Their lack of height is costing Kew dearly. On the other hand, Collegians, with six footers around the ground, are not as reliant on the efforts of Balsillie and Cook. Today the "Big W" players Williams, Wagstaff and Warner should contribute to Collegian's cause by turning Kew attacks into Collegians' attacks via their running game. Around the packs Mark Hibbins should do well for Collegians, while midfielder Ian Rice could dominate for the Lions. Who can lift Kew? Walker's season has been commendable. Rocco Zerbi, providing he concentrates fully on his game, could do well, while Toogood, Bruce Smith and Wayne Blay always need careful and complete attention. To win I select Collegians.

The enthusiastic and optimistic Old Paradians return to Yarra Park to engage Old Scotch, who wilted last week against Old Xaverian pressure. Parade have not failed since June 7, and their big man strength, Brian Grills, Ian Allen and Sam Assetta, has served Parade well recently. Terry McGough, with his uncanny judgment and reliable kicking, has given Parade a reliable forward of late. Paul Abrahams, Chas. Hughes and "March" di Paola are all doing well for the Paradians. Old Scotch is a star studded side. However, not all their stars shine simultaneously. Peter Sherwen and ex-Parade captain Ross Duke have done well recently, whereas early season stars like Marx, Morgan and Meadows have been subdued at the business end of the season. I select Old Scotch for three reasons: they have more overall talent; they are playing at home;

and coach **Laurie Aghan** will use their May 24 debacle at Bundoora to motivate his players.

**Parkside**, who will be relegated, defeated **Monash Blues** on May 24. At present the Blues are poised to join them in C Section in 1981. This factor will surely be used by **Stuart Schneider** to try to lift his Monash players out of their recent lethargy. Can the consistently good **Lovell, Higgins** and **P. Wood** lift their unpredictable team-mates to victory? **Rodger** can be a very reliable goalsneak if his team-mates play to him. What can one write about **Parkside**? Their optimism of 1978 has turned in two seasons to acceptance of the fact they do not have the talent to stay in B Section. Personal and club pride is being solvaged by **Clarke, Ware, Jones** and **Chenhall**, who weekly appear among the "Red Devil's" best. If only most Monash players contributed as much their supporters would be happy. Today, despite this pessimism, I believe Monash can score another victory.

Two of the season's disappointing sides, **Caulfield Grammarians** and **Fawkner**, meet on Oval 3. At home the Grammarians must be favoured to take the points. Additional evidence for this assertion is Fawkner's poor form away from home. **Hood, Griffiths, Matthews** and **Wakeham** should be in the vanguard of a Caulfield victory. Trying hard to win for Fawkner should be **Flavel, McMahon** and **Mark Stapleton**, who are among the few reliable players in the 1980 Fawkner side.

The **C.B.C. St. Kilda** players will need victory today to move from the threat of relegation. Their visitors, **Old Xaverians**, could cement the double chance with victory. So the stage is set for a tense struggle. The Xaverians will not relish the hard-hitting and close-checking St. Kilda style of play. **Coates** and **White** will fully test **Noonan** and **Burne**. However, once the ball hits the ground, **Vale, Ademis** and **Sierakowski** should dominate. Their play should generate enough chances for **Brimacombe** and **Curtain** to kick a winning score. Leading players for St. Kilda include **Croftie, Dynon, Jennings** and **Slatery**, who can be expected to make their Xaverian opponents earn every kick. Overall talent will ensure Old Xaverians win today.

### C SECTION

If there was a prize for consistency it would have to be mine, as I have now picked three winners in each of the last four weeks. Speaking about consistency, every time the B-T's are beaten, the sides below them consistently lose and leave the B-T's in the four.

**Old Trinity Grammarians** have beaten Old Camberwell twice and Camberwell cleaned up **Bulleen-Templestowe** last week to get away from the relegation zone. Two weeks ago Trinity cleaned up the Rovers in an endeavour to avoid relegation. Added to their home ground advantage this would indicate victory to Trinity. Furthermore, I think the sides trying to push the B-T's out of the four will

lose today, which means the B-T's can lose again and still be safe. Nevertheless I am selecting the B-T's to win because of their overall form.

The most difficult match to make a selection in sees **Old Camberwell Grammarians** playing host to **Old Haileyburians**. Both sides have beaten the B-T's in the home run. The "Bloods" have the better form but they seem to have an uncanny ability to lose important matches against lower sides, which has cost them a place in the four. Camberwell have won their last two and should make it three in a row.

Accurate kicking meant **Hampton Rovers** only went down by 18 points last week, after having had 13 less scoring shots. Trinity beat Hampton and **St. Kevin's O.B.** beat Trinity in the last two weeks, which would indicate victory to the visitors. However, prior to last week they lost five consecutive games. It may be that they do not like playing on heavy tracks. I feel that the Rovers will avenge their first round defeat and secure their place in the four.

I gave **M.H.S.O.B.** a bit of a "can" last week and they proved me wrong by fixing up the "Bloods" with accurate kicking. However, I cannot see them providing any real opposition to **Old Brighton Grammarians**, who should adjust to the small High School ground with ease.

**Coburg** coach **Rodney McFarlane** must have spent many hours over the last couple of weeks preparing his players to meet the top two sides, which is an unenviable task when you are at the bottom of the ladder. While they might lose to **Geelong** on the field, they will win the entertainment stakes, as their hospitality is second to none. I should take this opportunity of apologising to **Jim Fidge** for not making it to Geelong on July 19 when they had a good win over Old Brighton.

### D SECTION

Last Saturday, Alphington continued on their winning way by annihilating St. Bede's, while **Beverley Hills** and **Old Ivanhoe** played out a draw.

Today, **St. Bede's** will be trying to put the pieces back together after their thrashing by the huge margin of 168 points. They have the home ground advantage but they are playing **Old Carey Grammarians**, who showed that they are returning to their good early season form by easily defeating Country Colleges last week. Old Carey were only defeated by ten points the previous week by Alphington, so going on St. Bede's effort, it looks like an easy win to the visitors, but St. Bede's will not give up their second spot on the ladder without a fight.

**A.M.P. Society** today visit **Country Colleges** in a game that could well decide which of these sides will be relegated. When these sides last met, A.M.P. won their first game for the season by a convincing twelve goals. Since then, both sides have shown erratic form, and it looks like the winner of today's

game will be the one who can settle down first and score the early goals, thus applying the pressure on their opponents. Taking the home ground advantage into consideration, I will go for **Country Colleges** to win.

**Power House** finished too strongly for A.M.P. last week to win their third successive game. They play host to **Beverley Hills** today, who have had three heart-stopping finishes in their last three games, which culminated in a draw last week. If they had won those three games they would have been in a position now to avoid relegation. Unfortunately they have not, and with **Power House** at home and on a winning streak they look like missing out again.

**Old Ivanhoe Grammarians** found **Beverley Hills** tough opposition last week, and are at home today to **State Bank**, who showed the form expected of a top side by easily beating **Heatherton**. **State Bank** will be out to repeat their six goal defeat of Old Ivanhoe when they last met, but the home side will test them today. Old Ivanhoe have shown reasonable form lately, but **State Bank** have still an outside chance of taking second spot on the ladder, so I cannot see them giving their opponents any easy kicks today, and should therefore win.

**Heatherton** lost badly to **State Bank** last week, and though they are at home today, top side and hot favourite for the flag, **Alphington**, will provide a nightmare afternoon for them. Alphington have defeated all the other sides in the four in the past three weeks, and taking that form into account compared with the rather ordinary performances by **Heatherton**, it looks like an easy win to Alphington.

In what has been (and still is) an exciting career in football, "Renna" has shown outstanding dedication to Ivanhoe as a player and a supporter. In 1970 in the Juniors, his first year of football, he was runner-up in the club's Best and Fairest Award, under the guidance of another personality at Ivanhoe, Don Blackwood. Graduating to Senior football in 1971, he made up for his lack of height by his ability to leap to extraordinary heights. Bill McWhinnie took over as coach in 1974 and soon had "Renna" demonstrating the art of ruck work once again. This culminated with him winning the coach's Trophy for the most dedicated player in 1975. In 1977 "Renna" took out another Trophy in the finals series with the Best Player Award. One of the most memorable times with him was on a football trip to Tasmania — on the return flight he took over the microphone and entertained the crew and passengers with his Dudley Moore/Peter Cook Routines for the entire flight. A real comic at heart. On our presentation day in 1978 Graeme received his life membership badge — a day I'm sure he'll never forget, and now 1980 is upon us and he is still going as strong as ever, winning the knockouts, backing up the Rovers, shepherding, and taking that vital mark when needed. That's what a true champion is all about and Graeme Renshaw is just that. It's interesting to note that "Renna" has only missed two games through injury in his career — A very hardy fella. One of his most treasured ambitions is to win a flag for Ivanhoe, and as long as Ivanhoe have players with the dedication and team spirit which "Renna" stands for I'm sure it won't be too long in coming.

Congratulations Graeme on a fine contribution to Ivanhoe and football in general. Your spirit is infectious to all and shows how the game should be played. Well done Graeme Renshaw.

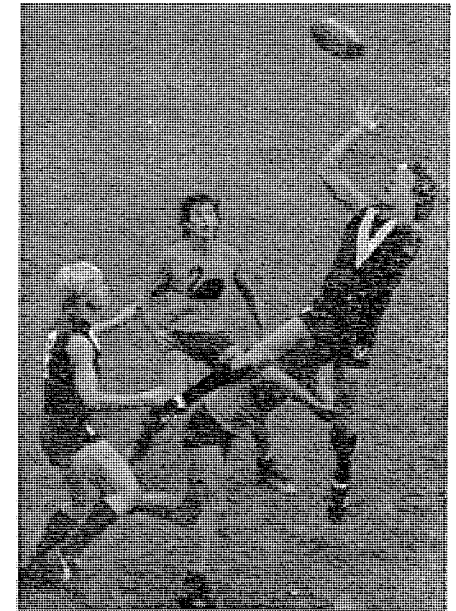

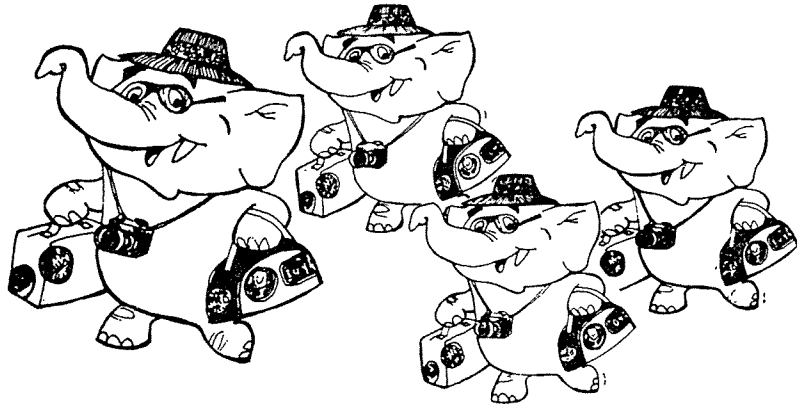
