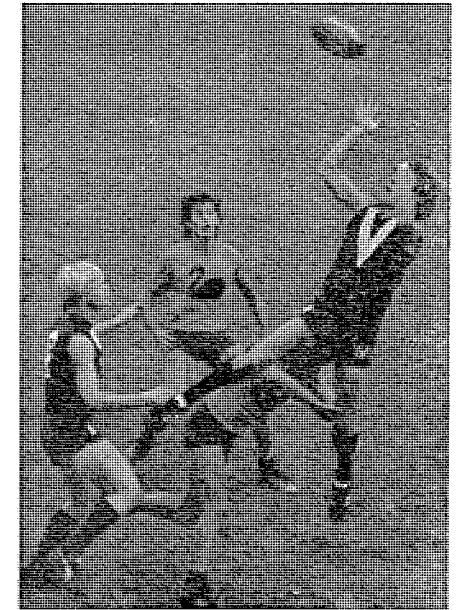

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

A most interesting fight for that vital fourth position on the ladder has evolved. Four teams have a chance of obtaining it. Both Marcellin and North Old Boys have "easy" last round games so today's match will see the winner with the only chance of continuing towards the four. The other two teams are Ormond and Old Melburnians who both have hard roads to hoe and if they get through this round today they meet at Ormond next week.

Ivanhoe play host to St. Bernard's O.C. today. Ivanhoe faced the full force of Ormond at home last week and I am sure that they will want to finish off the last home game for 1980 with a win. They will want their most consistent players of the last few weeks in, **Morcom, Woolfe, Simpson, Renshaw and Balcombe** to come up trumps for the home crowd. St. Bernard's on the other hand have had a run of outs and will be looking towards Captain Wade and Vice Captain Aughton to show them the way, with good support from **A. Sullivan and Rackman**. The finals are coming all too quickly and the Saints will have to put their act together very shortly. I think they will today and return to the winning list.

Marcellin O.C. take on North Old Boys this week at making the four, but as results have turned out they still have a very remote chance. They continued their good form to beat third place holders St. Bernard's last week and will be looking towards **Hesse, F. Aloisio, and Price** to show them the way in their contest for the four. North Old Boys on the other hand are in exactly the same position, with a remote chance of making the four. They will be out to counter the big guns of Marcellin and allow **Weir, Borcich and Carroll** to break away and do some damage. In a most intriguing game with the loser to fall away completely from finals contention, I will go for Marcellin.

De La Salle O.C. are at home to AJAX this afternoon. De La showed how the game is to be played in blustery conditions last week against North Old Boys. They are full of confidence at the moment and I think their disciplined side will again be too strong for the opposition as they are playing with a lot of purpose and team work. AJAX showed they are not down and out yet, by defeating the Blacks last week. They are keen to show that they will be back in a year's time and want to finish these last couple of games on high notes. They will be thwarted today, as De La Salle will be too strong in the air and will draw out easy winners.

University Blues await the arrival of Ormond. Uni. Blues went on their winning way last week with a good win over O.M's on the moist University ground. They played well in the conditions and as I think the ground will be drier this week they will be even harder to catch their small men — **Bedford, Macaulay, Kauffman, Sturges and Dobbie** are giving them great drive and these boys will be a handful for the Ormond defence. Ormond came back

with a vengeance a week ago having realized their capabilities and rectifying their concentration lapses. They crushed Ivanhoe, to again put themselves in the running for the four. However, they must win today so as not to let either North or Marcellin ahead of them on the ladder. In a very vigorous and hard game I can't see Ormond quite being up to the all-round capabilities of the Blues.

Old Melburnians meet University Blacks at Elsternwick Park today. Old Melburnians need to win this game to keep the fourth spot, because if they don't then they could be overhauled by two sides. They will have to show a lot more enthusiasm and endeavour against their old rivals Blacks than they did against Blues last week. **Brown** is doing a magnificent job in the ruck, but he will be up against a strong opponent in the ageless **Chris Cordner**. **Andy Cameron** and **Lester** have been getting their fair share of kicks and the lead can be taken from these three. University Blacks on the other hand were disinterested last week and beaten by AJAX.

Christie, Lockie and **Captain Perrett** have been doing their bit and if given a bit of support then the Blacks could do better on the bigger 'headquarters' ground. I feel the O.M's will have too much to lose if this game passes them by so in a close and tough game I select O.M's to win.

B SECTION

Two of this season's potentially well-equipped but practically disappointing teams **Fawknor** and **Monash Blues** clash at Mutton Reserve. As relegation is still a reality for each side no quarter will be given. For the students their "Long March" north will end in defeat. The locals, led by in-form **McMahon, Flavel, Peter Deans** and **Wayne Ayres** are adept at doing well on their own terrain. **Dennis Groves**, on the other hand, must advise his players to closely check **Moore, Rodger, Lovell** and ex Kilmore star **Michael Connop** to prevent Monash snatching victory.

Can Parkside bid farewell to B Section with a bang and not a whimper? **Kew**, who are their visitors today need victory to maintain any hope of the double chance. Pitcher Park is not the best ground on which to polish and demonstrate skills. However, **Terry Hayes** will be anxious for his new link men **Bruce Smith, Rocco Zerbi, Joey Busuttil** and **Chris Haralambopoulos** to move the ball forward quickly to **Wayne Blay** and his fellow forwards. Parkside will not meekly surrender and **Captain Jones, Ware** and **Wiseman** will again give their utmost. Nevertheless **Kew** should be untroubled to win.

The big game between Collegians and Old Scotch will have all the attributes of a final.

Today I believe Old Scotch will be troubled by Collegians' mobility. The third coming of the bespectacled **Mike Bates** via Ivanhoe has

changed the balance of the Scotch side. In fact 1980 match winning ruckman **Tom Mason** languished at full forward for much of last week's game. Results alone will vindicate the wisdom of this move. Scotch defenders **Bob Drummond** and **Alexander** will have their hands full as Collegians' forwards **Parsons**, **Bennett** and **Baum** as well as **Hibbins** and **Laussen** force the ball forward. In their May 31 game I favoured Collegians but Scotch won by 19 points. On that occasion the Cardinals were well served by **Morgan** and **Meadows**. Can they repeat the effort today? Many astute judges favour Scotch but I am yet to be convinced of their power and consistency. At home I favour Collegians.

C.B.C. St. Kilda, desperate to remain in B Section, await **Caulfield Grammarians** whose 1981 Section is as yet undecided. **Caulfield** had a convincing win in the May 31 game. However, they will find the **Coghlan Oval** conditions far different from **Oval 3**. I favour the home side to take the points largely through drive generated by ruckmen **Coates** and **White**, **Tony Dyncn** starred around the ground in the last encounter and forwards **Collins** and **Jennings** should continue to score.

For **Caulfield**, **Buchanan** could again do well up forward. **Matthews**, **Hood** and the reliable **Wakeham** will all endeavour to lift **Caulfield**. However, I believe **St. Kilda** will triumph.

The old adage "a good big man will outplay a good little man" will again bear fruit today when the undersized **Old Paradians** return to their former ground to play **Old Xaverians**. Although less than half the **Parade** players have played on this ground, their supporters can be excused for reliving their halcyon days of the 'sixties. I have no doubt the **Old Xaverians** will play a prominent role in the finals. Today I do not expect the **Paradians** to be able to outplay **Curtain** (11 goals on May 31). **Corcoran**, **Caleo**, **Sierakowski**, **Noonan**, **Burne**, **Vale**, **Adgemis**, **Blake**, **Stanley**, **Tiernan** and their nine team mates enough to kick a winning score. **Sam Assetta**, **Chris Hughes** plus youngsters like **Alex Morelli**, **Phillip Hammond** and **Stephen Watson** will strive hard for the **Paradians** before they succumb to superior opposition.

C SECTION

My consistency continues with another three wins. An examination of the premiership lists reveals that this is the only Section where all sides are either involved in the battle for the four (the top seven) or the fight to avoid relegation (the bottom three).

Geelong scraped in by the narrowest of margins last week against bottom side **Coburg** and today they await the arrival of **St. Kevin's O.B.**, whose form reads like Melbourne weather — unpredictable! While it is do or die for the visitors, they will be lost on the big expanse of **Queen's Park**. However, the **Geelong** forwards will need to improve on their performances of the last two weeks.

Old Camberwell Grammarians fell into a hole last week and while they will have little

chance of beating their hosts **Old Brighton Grammarians**, they will surely be watching for the results of the **Coburg v M.H.S.** game. If **Coburg** win today and **Camberwell** lose, next week's game between these two will be the "grand final" of the relegation stakes. The only interest in today's game will be how many goals "Jumping" **John Priestley** kicks and whether he can make the "ton".

The **Coburg** machine must be feeling happy with their form but disappointed with the results of the last few weeks. They are at home for the second consecutive week and there is no doubt that this is worth two or three goals. **M.H.S.O.B.** must win to have a chance for the finals, albeit remote. For the last seven weeks the students have been on a lose/win sequence and if this continues they are due to win today. Nevertheless I am going for **Coburg**, probably because of their good form against **Geelong** last week.

Old Haileyburians kept their chances alive last week and should be a natural against **Old Trinity Grammarians**. D SECTION

Most sides have struggled to win at **Zerbies Oval** this season and **Country Colleges** will have to be at their top to win and I will go for them to produce the goodies today.

Last week, **St. Bede's O.C.** came back well from their thrashing by **Alphington** the previous week to defeat **Old Carey** by sixteen points in a low scoring game. Today, on their home ground again, they play **Heatherston**, who, last week were beaten by **Alphington** in another low-scoring affair. If **Heatherston** win today they may go up a rung on the ladder, but **St. Bede's** have the extra incentive to win as a lapse in form will see them surrender second spot to the **State Bank**. **St. Bede's** will repeat their seven-goal win of the first round.

UMPIRES' CORNER

HANDBALL

One of the distinctive features of Australian Rules football is handball. Modern coaching techniques have brought handball into even greater prominence in recent years to the point where there are some games in which there are more hand passes than kicks. Good handball contributes to the speed and spectacle of our game. It is sometimes forgotten that the rules of the game make clear provision for what is and what is not legitimate handball.

Rule 11 provides that:

"A player may handball by holding the ball in one hand and hitting it with the clenched fist of the other hand. If the ball is not handballed correctly, a free kick shall be given to the nearest opponent."

So handball is clearly holding the ball with one hand and striking it with the CLENCHED FIST of the other hand.

The hand holding the ball must not deliver or propel the ball. The ball must be despatched by the force of the clenched fist.

It is not compulsory for the hand holding the ball to be still — it may move in any direction. The ball must be held on one hand. It must not be juggled or thrown, nor should the hand holding the ball be pulled away before the ball is propelled with the clenched fist of the other hand.

A player may not hand or throw the ball to a team mate. A free kick would be awarded to the nearest opponent. However, if a player deliberately grabs or pulls the ball from another player the umpire should call "play on".

A player is permitted to hit the ball with the open hand provided he is not holding the ball with the other hand at the time. Should the ball be on the ground or in the air a player can legitimately hit the ball with the open hand ("palm"). Players may legitimately tap the ball out in front of them to assist them in gaining possession.

Scooping the ball is a form of throwing and as such, using one hand or two hands, is a breach of the rules. Whilst the ball is in play, no player is permitted to throw the ball in any circumstances.
