# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

Fourth spot on the ladder is still open to three teams today. Ormond can secure and retain fourth position if they win, Old Melbourneians if they beat Ormond by a reasonable margin could oust Ormond from fourth, while if this second alternative happens by only a slender margin then Marcellin O.C. can tip them both out by having a big winning margin to make up lost percentage.

De La Salle O.C. venture off to University Blacks. Uni. Blacks came back with a solid win last week and will be looking to finish off the season with a win against the "could be" premiers. Ted Farrell, I am sure will get his team together against the Blacks old rivals, and make a good account of themselves. De La Salle on the other hand want to finish on top of the ladder after the last home and home games and they will not let this one pass them by. "Ring in forward" B. Greene again last week showed how to get goals, and has accepted his chance in the first team, but he will be closely checked by Huntington of the Blacks. I can't see Blacks being quite strong enough to hold off De La Salle for four quarters — De La Salle to win.

AJAX play host to Marcellin O.C. down at Albert Park. AJAX after a disappointing year will be out to show their supporters what they can really do. Earlier in the year when these two teams met, Marks, Feldpicer, M. Ritterman, Zemski, Bluzer and Rosner were best for AJAX and these players will again show them the way. Marcellin O.C. on the other hand are still fighting with a chance of making the four if Old Melbourneians beat Ormond. They will be out to beat AJAX by more than ten goals to make up the lee-way percentage. I feel Marcellin will win, but will it be enough?

Could we be seeing the Preliminary final early this year with St. Bernard's O.C. and University Blues playing at Elsternwick Park? St. Bernard's returned to the winning list last week and will be out to assert their authority again with a win before the finals. Drive through Smith, Grbac and McAllister should get the ball moving to counteract the balance of the Blues. University Blues let Ormond get away from them last week and although they rallied, failed to catch the opposition. With the business end of the season upon us, I am sure Blues will want to show who should be top and beat the 'saints' in a fairly even match.

North O.B. play Ivanhoe at home today. North could not sustain their lunge to the four and were curtailed last week by Marcellin. It has been a frustrating year for them, as they have won some good games, and on the other hand lost the games they should have won. North should finish off with a win at home however, but Ivanhoe will be out to finish off on a high note also. As Ivanhoe say

good bye to A Section they were not disgraced last week and I can see Freeman, Robertson and Simmondson doing their best to win today. In a close game I will go for North to scrape home on their home ground.

Another big match of the final round is between Ormond (fourth) and Old Melbourneians (fifth). Ormond sneaked away from Blues last week to gain the four points and put themselves in the four. They have to win today to hold that position for a berth in the finals. McCooke, Bourne and Boynton are getting goals, while Dove, Lockwood and Crump are displaying great drive for Ormond. These six will be a worry for the O.M.'s, who will have to pull out all stops to defeat the determined Ormond. Old Melbourneians on their day could beat "the Monds" but will have to show a lot more endeavour and desire than last week. **Old Trinity Gr. v Old Brighton Gr.**

**Old Brighton Grammarians** have just lost top spot on the ladder to Geelong and although they still have the double chance they will see the trip to **Old Trinity Gr.** as a chance to regain that position. Theoretically if Trinity win by enough they can avoid relegation, but at this time of the year one must be practical. Brighton to win and regain top spot.

**M.H.S. Old Boys v Geelong.**

While **Jim Fidge** will not accept **Geelong** going to second, I feel that they need a big ground to play on and the **M.H.S.O.B.** is not one of our biggest. On the other hand the endeavour of **Old Geelong** has been good but their use and disposal of the ball was often inadequate in recent weeks, and the visitors could really struggle to take the points. With the **First Semi** coming up the following week, however, they'll be looking for a good performance, and on that basis I'm prepared to give them the nod.

The second half of the 1980 season has given **A.N.Z. Bank** a lot of heart, with the team registering a number of much improved performances. To-day they should end the year on a good note by defeating **Princes Hill** who have seldom been really able to get their game together.

**North Brunswick** can best be described as erratic: two weeks ago they could only manage a draw against the twelfth team; last week they defeated the top side. Today they have the chance to cause another upset win, this time against second-placed **St. Pius**, but I doubt that they'll be up to it. **St. Pius** have been consistently good performers all season, and I don't expect them to give any latitude to their opposition.

## UMPIRES' CORNER

Today a number of crucial games will be played to decide which teams will play in the finals and which teams will be relegated. Next week the finals games will commence. Proper time keeping is essential to ensure fairness to all sides. A mistake can make the difference between the winning or losing of a close game.

Over recent weeks a number of umpires have reported time keeping errors. Some time-keepers have made basic mistakes such as not stopping the clock after the flags have been waved for a score and blowing the siren during a period when "time on" has been signalled.

In order to ensure the highest standard of time keeping during the next few weeks Umpires' Corner today re-publishes the rules for time keeping.

### RULE 25. TIMEKEEPERS

Each club shall appoint a timekeeper, whose duties shall be —

(a) To keep the time of each quarter on time cards, complete same and forward to the Secretary of the Controlling Body.

(b) To sound a bell at the start and finish of each quarter, and to keep sounding it until the Field Umpire notifies them that he has heard it.

(c) To add time on to the playing time of the quarter whenever directed to do so by the Field Umpire, or when a goal or behind has been kicked. The time to be added on shall, in the case of a goal, be the time which elapses between the waving of the flags by the goal umpire and the bouncing of the ball in the centre by the Field Umpire; in the case of a behind the time which elapses between the waving of the flag by the goal umpire and the kick-off from behind.

### RULE 26. TIME ON

The Field Umpire shall instruct the timekeepers to add "Time On" —

(a) If there is any undue delay in getting the ball back when it is out of play.

(b) If a player wilfully wastes time.

(c) If a player goes over an opponent's mark and does not go back immediately when ordered to do so.

(d) When the ball is taken back pursuant to a notification by the boundary umpire to the Field Umpire under Law 21.

(e) When more than one opponent stands on the mark of a player.

(f) When a player who has been given a free kick plays or kicks the ball without going back to the spot where the free kick was given.

(g) In all other cases when play is unduly delayed.

Recruited from the school in 1976, Bob has played mainly in the seniors as a half-back or half-forward, using his large frame with telling effect in forcing his way through packs to win the ball. 150 games also to Len Belcher (Alph.), John Rojo (Ivanhoe) and Peter D'Ambrosia (Old Carey).

Geelong (A) was the only team in the Association to go through the season without a win. Heatherton (F) had the best record of wins, 17.

10 years ago — 1970

20 years ago — 1960

## ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

- A reminder of club secretaries of the V.A.F.A. Rules governing player eligibility for first and second round matches. Note carefully Rules 17 and 19.
- The first and second rounds for the Senior Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit.
  - The first round of the Junior Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players who have not attained the age of 19 years on or before the 31st December of the preceding year.
  - The second round of the Junior Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players within the age limits prescribed in Rule 16 to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit provided that a player who has represented a Club in an aggregate of more than five matches in the Senior Grade and Reserve Grade in the first round in any season shall not be eligible unless he has represented such Club in more than five matches in the first round of the Junior Grade in the same season.
  - The first round of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit.
  - The second round of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit provided that no player shall be eligible to represent a Club after having represented such Club in more than eight matches of the Senior Grade in the first round in the same season unless such Club shall be represented in a match of the second round of the Senior Grade on the same day. In the event of a draw taking place in a match in the second round of the Reserve Grade, all players who took part in the drawn game shall be eligible to take part in the game to be replayed.
- Rules as adopted at V.A.F.A. Members' Meeting — March 5th, 1979 and amended at May 7th, 1979 Members' Meeting.
