PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

1st SEMI-FINAL:

The 1st Semi-Final is at Elsternwick Park between St. Bernard's O.C. and Ormond this afternoon. St. Bernard's, after a glorious run during the mid-season, have tailed off a little towards the end of the year, losing four out of their five last games. Ormond on the other hand over the last three weeks have gone from strength to strength culminating with wins over University Blues and Old Melburnians.

A battle royale will be between the opposing tall men in the ruck with Captain of Ormond, Alan Naylor and "The Chief" Smith of St. Bernard's. This duel may well determine who gets first use of the ball, out of the good small men both sides have. The small men being Brian Hughes, Greg Wade, Gary McAllister, with support from Peter Aughton, all for the Saints, while the opposing players from Ormond, will be Greg Pearce, Terry Ellinson, Stephen McCooke, Glen Casey and in the centre Mark Lockwood.

Another of the interesting tussles will be between John Pearson at full-back for St. Bernard's and the elusive Shane Dove of Ormond. Young Ian Brand will also have his hands full for Ormond as he has to look after Whelan — "The Dealer", who likes a look at the goals for the Saints. Wayne Crump has the task of taking out "O'Bee" O'Brien, who is centre half-forward for the Saints, but he will be backed up by the consistent play of Phillip Mehrtens on the back flank. Mehrtens however will have to keep a close eye on Henry Nadzielski who is creating many opportunities for the Essendon-siders.

At the other end of the ground Maurie and Tony Sullivan will have their work cut out to keep Ormond's Tony Boyanton down. Probably the most interesting duel will be between the solid defence man of the Saints Peter Rackman, backed up by Eugene Grbac against the strong forward movement instigator for Ormond, their centre half-forward, Bruce Bourne. This encounter could determine the outcome of this match.

I can see the final scores being very close, and the team to get the first break may steal the day. There won't be many changes down at the Ormond camp this week and I think they will sneak in, to go on to the preliminary final in a hard fought and even game.

B SECTION

1st SEMI-FINAL:

Interest in the section remained until the posting of the final results last week. Scotch snatched second place by a minimum margin while C.B.C. St. Kilda were relegated only one season after being promoted from C Section.

Collegians and Kew have each scored a decisive victory over each other at home during the season. Today's match should provide a good spectacle as each side has a depth of proven talent.

Ruck duels will be all important. It is significant that numbered among Collegians' best

players were ruckmen Glen Cook and Balsille. Today these two will be opposed by the consistent "Mums" Walker and his second string "big Tony" Peric. Of the four ruckmen the form of Walker has been the most outstanding in 1980. Along with champion Kew ruck-rover Bruce Smith, big "Mums" has been named twelve times as among the Kew players, Smith will need careful attention by Collegians to prevent him becoming a match winner.

Roving duels will be tense. For Collegians Mark Hibbins and Laussen have repeatedly done well, while for Kew, Rocco Zerbi and Joey Busuttil are always dangerous opponents around the ground and in front of goal.

Pivot duels between Don Fletcher (Kew) and Ian Rice will be vital to the match result. Each of these players has represented the V.A.F.A. interstate and is a potential match winner. The wide expanses of the University Oval will be more familiar to Rice. It would not surprise me if each coach instructed a ruckman to oppose the centre players whenever possible.

Forwards win games and in Wayne Blay (Kew) and Tim Bennett, each side has a capable centre forward. Significantly for Kew, their star full-back Ken Rowlands was among their best last Saturday. Today his skill will again be tested. Other Kew defenders will need to mind Parsons, Baum and Hoyle each of whom has kicked many goals during the season.

Conversely Kew forwards Chris, Haralambopoulos, a chastened Brett Burden, Varney and Jackomos have all demonstrated their goal-kicking ability throughout the season. Today the Collegians' defenders may be forced into sacrificing their running game to closely check their Kew opponents.

Final's football is different from that played in minor round matches. Kew has last year's C Section premiership behind them while Collegians lost the first semi to Old Xaverians in 1979. The University Oval will assist Collegians more than Kew because of its similar size to the Harry Trot Oval. Maybe last Saturday's win has prompted a Collegian's revival — I will select Collegians largely on the premise that their lithe running players will receive sufficient opportunities to kick a winning score.

C SECTION

All sides in the four had convincing wins last week. A quick review of the year's results reveal that each side has won their respective home game.

1st SEMI-FINAL:

Bulleen-Templestowe probably have the most difficult task as they have their Seniors playing at Monash and their Reserves playing at Geelong. On the other hand Hampton Rovers have both sides playing at Monash. The B-T's won one more game during the season but had a bad mid-season slump and lost five in a row. The Rovers have been a bit on and off having beaten Geelong in the first round but going down to bottom side Old Trinity in the

second round. The B-T's are receiving plenty of drive from **Hammer, Murphy and Bird** while the Rovers rely heavily on **Mick Malone** in the ruck and **Alan Morecroft** around the ground. Both sides are very even and because the Monash ground is more akin to the Rovers plot I am selecting Hampton.

2nd SEMI-FINAL:

The preview of the Grand Final will see **Old Brighton Grammarians** playing **Geelong**. Brighton regained top position last week and that must be a boost to their confidence. Last year there was not one goal kicker to make the "ton" whereas this year we could have five, including **Jumping John Priestley**, who is starring for Brighton. Geelong is well represented with a goal kicker in **Graeme Linke**.

Don Nicholson has been roving well for Brighton and Taylor and Pearce continue to keep Geelong in the game each week. I fancy that Geelong will have a mixed day with their Reserves going down and their Seniors winning, which decision is probably influenced by the game being at Geelong.

D SECTION

1st SEMI-FINAL:

Today at the Harry Trot Oval **State Bank** will be looking for a repeat of their semi-final win of last year.

Their opponents **Old Carey Grammarians** looked like certain Grand Finalists until about six weeks ago, when they lost form, and consequently were behind at the final bell in their games against the other final four sides.

In the first of the home-and-away games between today's opponents, **Old Carey** kicked eleven goals in the last quarter to run out easy winners, whilst in the second encounter **State Bank** came from behind to win by five points at Bulleen.

Since then both sides have shown indifferent form which was highlighted last Saturday when they both struggled to defeat sides that just managed to avoid relegation.

The large **Harry Trot Oval** will give **Old Carey** the chance to get their running game going, and if they can they will be hard to beat, but I think **State Bank** will get first use of the ball, and thus put **Old Carey** out of the race for the 1980 flag.

2nd SEMI-FINAL:

This game at **Old Scotch Oval** is between contrasting teams.

Alphington have scored many easy wins due to their great goal-scoring ability; they have had at least ten players scoring goals nearly every week.

St. Bede's O.C. on the other hand have won half a dozen close games due to their ability to keep on going until the final bell, and this is a handy facet of football to develop especially in finals.

Alphington have only lost one game this year, and they had a ten-goal win over **Power House** last week which was a good workout after their "rest" the previous week.

St. Bede's produced their typical last quarter effort last week, which was enough to overhaul **Old Ivanhoe** and win by ten points.

Today **St. Bede's** will not want to give **Alphington** an early lead, or otherwise they will cop a hiding as they did last time these sides met when they lost by the unbelievable margin of thirty goals.

When you take that win of **Alphington's** into account it is hard to see **St. Bede's** winning. Though final games are a different proposition altogether, I do not think **St. Bede's** have the players to hold the free scoring **Alphington** to a losing score.

E SECTION

First Semi-Final:

One cannot anticipate that the first semi will be too close, with **Old Geelong** meeting **Mentone Old Boys** at **Albert Park**. Each club recorded narrow home-ground wins against the other during the year and it is significant that both have performed much better at home; **Old Geelong** in particular have a reputation for 'going walkabout' when not playing at **Como Park** — last week it appears they left the country — and should the day dawn wet or windy they will be in big trouble. I saw these teams when they met two weeks ago; despite the result (which was mainly the result of **Mentone's** inaccuracy), it was clear that **Geelong** rely heavily on a small number of key players rather than any allround depth. Their full forward **Butcher** was well held, and few of their other forwards kick goals. **Mentone** seem to have strong followers, better rovers, greater pace and an effective centre-line. **Old Geelong** looked to be too suspect when subjected to the sort of pressure that they will meet in finals, they can't dispose of the ball effectively, and just don't look like being good enough.

2nd Semi-Final: St. Pius v West Brunswick.

St. Pius finished the home-and-away season on top of the ladder, one game clear of today's opponents, **West Brunswick**, and will go in to today's game with plenty of confidence. On the only occasion these teams met this year, in the first game of the year, **St. Pius** recorded a three goal win, and the result today is likely to be much the same. Both sides have few big men, and their strength, particularly that of **St. Pius**, has been a fast play on game with accurate disposal. Up to the last two weeks, **West** could have boasted the most effective backline in the V.A.F.A. With good backing up and disciplined football they had had fewer points kicked against than any other senior team in any section. In the last fortnight however the situation has changed; certainly they could not miss the double chance, but the fact remains they have lost two matches and appear to have been soft-peddling. On the other hand, **St. Pius**, equally safe, continued to demolish the opposition — a sign of what they call 'mental toughness'. **West** can be expected to give much more today, but in what will be a close finish, I expect **St. Pius** to have the better mental approach and to hold them out.

1st Semi: Peninsula O.B. v Brunswick at Oval 2.

JUNIOR SECTION ONE

1st Semi-Final:

In their first encounter (May 3), **Ormond** inflicted **Melbourne University's** first defeat for the season, when they were victorious by ten points. The second meeting however saw the students reverse the result, with a much bigger margin in their favour. As each won on the other's ground, during the year it is hard to imagine that the neutral **Footscray I.T.O.B. Oval** will provide a significant deterrent to either side. Both won last week, though the **University's** win over the top side, was possibly the better indication of the form of the two. I think that today will see a continuation of the good form displayed by the **Melbourne University** side since June 7th, and they will progress to next week's Preliminary Final.

2nd Semi-Final:

Although they faltered last week, **St. Bernard's (A)** have played consistently since the beginning of the return round, whilst **Old Haileyburians** have developed the "wobbles" over the past few weeks. Their only win in August was by virtue of a forfeit two weeks ago. These facts would suggest that **St. Bernard's** should have no trouble in progressing directly into the Section Grand Final. Eight wins on end suggest that they are undaunted by "unknown" territory (in fact last week's defeat was on their home ground) thus the **Old Xaverians Oval** should hold no fears for them. Whilst it is frequently stated "that finals are a whole different ball game" I can't see that the difference will be sufficient to enable **Old Haileyburians** to turn the "underdog" image to their advantage.

JUNIOR SECTION 2

At last we come to the business end of the season. The four finalists, **Therry, Old Paradians, Fawkner** and **Bulleen-Templestowe** (along with **Monash** who finished fifth) have been the dominant sides all season and naturally enough deserve to enjoy the fruits of finals participation.

There does not appear to be a great deal between the four finalists as most have scored wins against each other at various stages of the season. However **OP's** and **Therry** do have an inherent advantage by finishing in the top two.

In the first semi-final: **Fawkner** and **Bulleen-Templestowe** clash with the loser being eliminated. At their first encounter **B-T** won a high scoring game 22-17 to 20-13 and repeated their success at their next encounter 7-10 to 4-1 when the conditions were heavy. This suggests that **B-T** may have **Fawkner's** measure in any conditions and consequently I'll stick with **Bulleen-Templestowe**.

In the second semi-final the combatants appear more evenly matched. **Therry** won their first encounter easily 16-12 to 8-8 at home but slipped in the reverse mixture 18-9 to 13-8. I can imagine **Therry** being very hard to beat at home, from first hand experience some consideration must be given to their losses away from home. I believe **Old Paradians** are a more versatile combination and should prevail in any conditions.

JUNIOR SECTION THREE

1st Semi-Final:

Good wins last Saturday enabled **St. Kevin's Old Boys** and **St. Kilda C.B.O.C.** to retain their positions in the four (at the expense of **Old Brighton Grammarians**, who also won convincingly) the two semi-finalists have only met once before this season — on April 19. On that occasion **St. Kevin's**, playing at home, were the victors — by one goal. Today they meet on the **M.H.S.O.B. Oval** in **South Yarra**, a ground which probably more closely approximates that of **St. Kevin's** rather than **St. Kilda** and this could give **St. Kevin's** sufficient edge to allow them to take the match away from **St. Kilda**. Both teams have performed creditably in their first season in Junior ranks but today's honours will go to **St. Kevin's Old Boys**.

2nd Semi-Final:

Banyule and **Thomastown** also have only met once to date — at **Banyule**. The winner on that occasion was **Banyule** — by seven goals. In fact **Banyule** have not lost a match since May 3rd (when they were defeated by **St. Kilda**). Recent form indicates that today's game at **Oval 3, Albert Park**, will be a much more closely-contested affair than the June 28 encounter, but I think that **Banyule** will have the upper hand at the final bell and will move straight into the Grand Final (and Junior Section Two in 1981).

10 YEARS AGO — 1970

Melbourne High showing their best form for weeks, led Caulfield Grammarians by a point at half-time, but Caulfield were much too strong in the second half, kicking 8.12 to High's 3.4. Atchison (5 goals), Morphet and Pickering (Caulfield) and M. Ritterman, Needham and Malone (M.H.S.) were best.

Ian Merrick (Coburg) Jock Nelson (M.H.S.O.B.), F. Clarke (Malvern), P. Sellars (E'wick) won B, C, D, and E while in the Junior section Ross Smith (H. Rovers) 33 points, later a Brownlow meadallist and St. Kilda coach, defeated David Parkin (M.H.S.O.B.) — coach of Hawthorn in 1979 and 1980.

U. Blues with a strong second half won their semi-final against the Blacks by 23 points.

Kew beat Power House in 'B' first semi and U.H.S.O.B. won their way into 'A' Section with a crushing defeat of De La Salle in 'B' Second semi.

30 YEARS AGO — 1950

'A' Section was the meeting of University Blues and Blacks in the first semi with one victory each during the season to their credit. The game was played in ideal conditions at St. Kilda Cricket Ground with Blacks in control for the first three quarters, kicking 9.4 to 1.1 in the first quarter and leading by 8 goals at the final change. Blues staged a magnificent last quarter, kicking 7.2 to Black's 1.2, and went down by 10 points, final scores being Blacks 13.17 to Blues 13.7. Best for Blacks were Lionel King, Pat Cash and Ken McIlvlie.

'B' Section semi-finals were won by Commonwealth Bank and Collegians. Best and fairest winners were 'A' Section — Manson Russel (Old Scotch), 'B' Section — Phil McLaughlin (Old Paradians), 'C' Section — Alec Castle (Kew), 'D' Section — Alan McFarlane (Moreland) and Robbie Orrmon (Ormond) in the Junior Section.

UMPIRES' CORNER

Today we record two important events which occurred last Saturday. Two great characters of V.A.F.A. football, Fred Grubb and Frank Henegan reached important stages of their careers.

FRED GRUBB

Last Saturday's Looking Back column reported that five years ago a new umpire "Fred Grubb" had featured as a star performer at an umpires' social. The recollection was timely because it coincided with Fred's 100th V.A.F.A. game. After many years of umpiring in other competitions Fred decided, in 1975, to see out his days with the V.A.F.A. at a time when most umpires have hung up their boots. The fact that more than half of his 100 games have been in 'A' grade can be attributed to his level of fitness.

Last summer Fred had a most successful season in athletics winning four 1600 metre races including the Echuca "mile" — one of the prestige races on the pro calendar.

Fred says that the highlight of his V.A.F.A. career is having had the honour of running with great umpires like Philip Rowell and Rob Croxford and he is hoping to be able to pass on some of his experience by running with the younger "up and comers" for many years to come.

Fred is noted for his sense of humour and has become a true successor to Dick Lee and Alan Duckworth in this department. Umpires' Corner had to limit him to two stories for today's column. He recalls an incident at Ormond in front of the old grandstand on a "swampy" day when some flying mud lodged in his windpipe. For once he was speechless. When he stopped the crowd and went for a gargle he reckons the crowd's comments would have filled a book.
