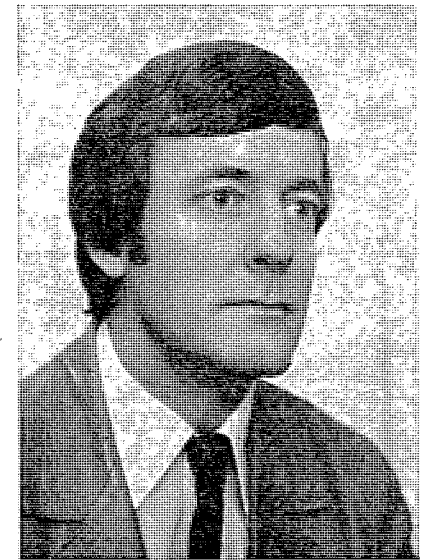

The "Amateur Footballer" has three new tipsters for this season: **Peter Roberson** from Old Melburnians, **Ray Irving**, from St. Pius, and **Willy Pickham**, from somewhat hazy origins. These gentlemen replace **Peter Brukner** (overseas); **Brian Lauder**, and **Tim Naughton**, who has been forced, by business pressures, to prematurely terminate a promising tipping career.

The rest of the '79 team remains the same for this year with the exception of **Norm Nugent**, who has "graduated" to B Section (from D).

The increased number of teams in E, F, Junior 2 and Junior 3 will necessitate an alteration to the point-scoring system for 1980, but more of this in next week's issue.

Best wishes for a successful season are extended to all tipsters.

A SECTION

It is with a certain amount of trepidation that I take up A Grade tipping for this year. Our V.A.F.A. President, with a good needle from our Golfing Secretary, appointed "yours truly" to take over from last year's very capable tipster, **Peter Brukner**. I hope I can maintain his obvious talent in this direction.

1980 kicks off at Elsternwick Park with **University Blacks** playing "newcomers" **Marcellin O.C.** Uni. Blacks' pre-season form has not been encouraging, but as they start late, this may not be a true guide. They will feel the loss of **Rod Lewis** (Fitzroy), but, with the experience of **Perrett**, **Chris** and **Ted Corder**, **Costello** and, if fit, "Birchey", and new in-form player **Bruce Cameron**, should acquit themselves well. Marcellin, also, has found pre-season wins hard to come by and may be a worry for coach **John Russell**. The loss of **Marchesani** may be overcome by the form of **Bernard Cooper** and a boost could come from former player **Cliff Price**. I feel that Marcellin may find the pace a little warm until they settle into A Grade again. Blacks to win.

St. Bernard's O.C. play host to **Ormond**, and coach **Gus Mitchell** will be looking forward to an improvement from the "Saints". They are building up their experience and, from what I have heard, good youth is being blooded into the side. Ormond, notoriously slow starters, are on the same line. The return of **Peter Murphy** and the strength of **Bruce Bourne** may not be enough to topple St. Bernard's at home. Ormond, however, have the knack of winning the unlikely games. Once the linament starts to flow in earnest down Ormond way they seem to gain inspiration. The Saints to win — as they are fitter and playing in front of their home crowd.

North Old Boys and **University Blues** play near the Zoo gates. North have a very big side and in each of their practice matches have been coming home well. **Geoff Dillon** is

firing and young chaps **Mick Bevando** and **Christ Hibbert** are playing well. Uni. Blues have had a very successful series of practice matches and with former V.F.L. player **Graham Wilson** and V.F.A. men **Simon McDonald** and **Paul Cleary**, will again be a threat to the A Grade flag. The Blues' speed will run the big Northerners off their feet. Uni. Blues comfortably.

AJAX will unfurl their B Grade flag in front of **Ivanhoe** this afternoon. AJAX have done well since last year, and, with the **Rittermans**, tall **Ray Lisner**, ex-Hawthorn player **Zenski** and centre half-forward **Mark Schulberg**, could prove quite a handful for the 'Hoes. Ivanhoe coach **Kevin Morrison**, on the other hand, has been training his boys very hard since the two sides met in an early practice match, and with **Don Cowan** in the ruck for Ivanhoe today, may not be the cake-walk AJAX might think, but their overall strength should triumph.

The match of the day may be the game between last year's A Grade premiers, **De La Salle O.C.** and **Old Melburnians**. De La, under new coach **Gavin White**, have played well in their practice matches although they have not been extended. They have lost **Nugent** and **Beddoe** to Richmond but have moulded together a team to carry on from last year. The O.M.'s have picked up quite a few good new recruits and now have a combination of experience and youth — but they will have to play four quarters of football to win today against the very polished opposition. In a very close game, I will go for the home-ground advantage only. De La Salle.

Today Old Scotch will prove too talented for Fawknor, who disappointed their supporters in 1979.

Long-standing rivals **Collegians** and **Old Xaverians** meet at the Harry Trott Oval. While Collegians have remained in B Section since 1965, Old Xaverians, recently up from C Section, narrowly missed regaining the promised land of A Section for 1980. New **Xaverian coach, Michael Green**, will be anxious to test his coaching theories in competition. His brief should prove successful today, as the "Red and Blacks" have the talent to be in front as the final siren sounds.

'A' Section coaches were **Graham Warfe** (Coburg), **Bill Harding** (Monash Blues), **Shane Maguire** (North Old Boys), **Denis Dalton** (Old Paradians), **Ted Farrell** (Ormond) **Brian King** (Reservoir O. B.), **Gus Mitchell** (St. Bernards O. C.), **Peter O'Donohue** (U. Blacks), **Ray Wookey** (Geelong), **Alec Gardiner** (Old Trinity).

100 games to **Mich. (Lungs) Fernon** (St. Kevins O.B., best and fairest 1970 and committeeman since 1971).

Ormond avenged their 1974 grand final defeat when they scored a 29 point win over **U. Blacks**. Only 4 points separated the teams at half-time but Ormond's phenomenal accuracy (13.1) in the second half was too much for Blacks' 8 goals.

10 Years Ago — 1970

The V.A.F.A. welcomed three new clubs for season 1970 — **Old Essendon Grammarians**, **La Trobe University**, and **Dookie** and **Longerenong Old Coll.**

M.H.O.S.B. congratulated their 1970 coaches, **Keith Marshall** and **George Inkster**, on their appointments.

15 Years Ago — 1965

1965 opened up with the acquisition of **St. Kilda Cricket Ground** as the Association's headquarters, with the match of the day being played there.

Feature game for the opening day was the meeting of 1964 premiers, (**Old Paradians**) and **Collegians**, with **Collegians** leading all day to win convincingly, 10.12 (72) to 5.5 (35).

Max Barker and **Harry Nance** were umpires' coach and assistant respectively.

Advertisers were **Recco**, **TAA**, **Gifford Goaler**, **Channel O**, **Volkswagon**, **Victoria Discount House**, **National Bank**, **Arena**, **Sherin**, **Mount Catering** and **Ansett ANA**.

AJAX's first club captain, **Lionel Rosenberg**, had been appointed senior coach for 1965.

20 Years Ago — 1960

After two years of unofficial operation the curtain-raiser section became officially part of the Association to be known as the **Reserve Section**.

This brought the strength of the Association to 74 teams. Teams represented were **Old Melburnians**, **Old Xaverians**, **AJAX**, **Ivanhoe**, **Bellfield**, **Old Brighton Grammarians**, **Ormond**, **Old Scotch Collegians**, **Old Paradians**, **St. Kilda C.B.O.C.**, **State Savings Bank**, **University**, **Caulfield Grammarians**, **De La Salle O.C.**

At the annual general meeting of **Collegians**, **Jack McCann** was made the first patron of the club. **Keith Lewis** succeeded **Jack** as president, the fourth since the club's inception in 1891.

'A' Section umpires for the day were **Barker**, **H. Roberts**, **Lee**, **Amey**, and **Hinton**. Tribunal members were **G. Barnett**, **C. Crosskell**, **D. Fraser**, **A. L. Hassett**, **I. W. Johnson**, **G. T. Moore**, **F. Northcott**.

The season opened in bad conditions after seven inches of rain in the previous three days. **Old Xaverians** was the only 'A' team to score over 100 points, with seven 'A' Section teams scoring less than 50 points.

Ormond 4.7, beat **U. Blacks** 3.4.

30 Years Ago — 1950

Thirty-nine senior and eight junior teams lined up for start of the season on April 22, 1950. Only 25 of the senior teams were still there in 1975.

Ormond turned the tables on their 1949 grand final conquerors, **University Blacks** when they held on at **University** to beat the home side by 15 points. **John Backhouse**, state full-forward, who transferred from **M.H.S.O.B.** starred for Blacks with 7 out of their 10 goals.

University Blues, runners up to **Geelong** in 'B' Section in 1949, also reversed the result when they defeated the home side, 15.12 to 12.8. **Geelong's** ground was **Corio Oval**.
