ORMOND (A) and THOMASTOWN "HOME" by ONE POINT BANYULE (Junior 3) and FAWKNER (Junior 2) SEMI-FINALS HIGH SCORERS

Last Saturday marked the beginning of the second round of the V.A.F.A. 1980 Season, or what is termed by many as "the business end of the Season. The weather was as near perfect as one could expect for a Melbourne August to be and the football generally was of a fine standard. The traditional ingredients of vigour, brilliant passages of ball handling and cliff-hanging results were all present but there were also a few run-away wins recorded.

The high scoring honours for the day went to Banyule the Junior Three 2nd Semifinal, who were closely followed by Fawkner in the Junior Two 1st semi. Banyule, despite their big score, only won by eleven points from Thomastown, though.

The A Section 1st semi-fiinal and the F Section 2nd semi-fiinal provided the greatest excitement on the day with the "underdog" in each case winning by the narrowest margins after their apponents both appeared to have winning breaks at the last change. Ormond trailed St. Bernard's by 25 points in the match at Elsternwick Park and needed to score more goals in the last quarter than they had in the previous three combined if they were to move on to the preliminary final which is exactly what they did. Thomastown trailed University Reds by 22 points but did know that they had the wind coming home - and they had scored 7 goals to 2 in the second quarter.

Almost as tight were the **E Section** 2d semi-final and the 1st semi-final in **Junior Section One.** Again it was Ormond figuring in a "grand-stand" finish, though perhaps they were a little lucky to move into the Junior One Preliminary Final as they had held a commanding three-quarter time lead over Melbourne University but won by only three points. Similarly St. Pius held a a five goals plus lead at the final change but were kept to only one scoring shot

in the last term, whilst West Brunswick rattled on five goals one — but still missed out by two points.

In **B Section**, the leader for most of the season — Collegians were defeated by Kew who led at each change. The winning margin was 23 points.

Likewise, Geelong led at each interval in the **C Section** 2nd semi-fiinal to record a nine goal victory over Old Brighton Grammarians. Bulleen-Templestowe did not have things all their own way in the 1st semi however but managed to draw away slightly in the fiinal term to win by ten points from Hampton Rovers.

In **D Section** State Bank (in the 1st semi) kept Old Carey Grammarians goalless until nearly three-quarter time and finally won by 40 points, whilst Alphington in the 2nd semi did not overhaul St. Bedes' early lead until well into the third stanza. But once in the lead they did not look back and recorded a 29 point victory.

Old Geelong (E — 1st semi) and Peninsula Old Boys (F — 1st semi) each established leads in the 1st quarter and went on from there. Old Geelong held sway over Mentone Old Boys by 59 points and Peninsula were twenty-three points ahead of Brunswick at the fiinal siren.

Congratulations must be extended to the **Umpire Association** for the creditable manner in which all the finals

SECOND SEMI-FINAL.

Today's second semi-final sees two of the long established "school" clubs within the V.A.F.A. battling for the right to direct pro-

motion to A Section. The Old Xaverians have been nurtured by Coach Michael Green to be in top form at final's time. They started the season slowly and have built momentum as the games have passed. **Old Scotch**, although a side of un-doubtedly deep talent, have not always played to their potential much to the consternation of coach Laurie Aghan.

Victory today will go to the side which gains the breaks during play. Therefore my preview must be based on observation, reports and journalistic licence.

Ruck duels are vital to the outcome of any Ruck duels are vital to the ourcome of any football match. Xaverian Captain Noonan is a sure match winner. To support him the Xaverians have the lithe **Burne** as well as the experienced **John Brimacombe**. Scotch rucks have been led for the season by **Tom Mason** (named twelve times within the Scotch best). To support him over past weeks has been former A Section Best and Fairest winner Michael Bates whose fitness and talent are well known. To support the Xaverian trio are Vale known. To support the Aaverian trio are value and Adgemis. Vale, in addition to his effective roving, has kicked 42 koals to be second to Curtain at Club level and to enable him to be within the top ten section goalkickers. Both sides have effective forward lines —

Curtain is the biggest single danger to Scotch as his 105 goals testify. Full back **Bob Drum-mond** will be struggling to nullify Curtain throughout the game. At centre half forward Sierakowski or Brimacombe will trouble Alexander. Other Xaverian forwards whose effectiveness has been proven are Stanley and Blake.

The Scotch full forward Tim Cox has the The Scotch full forward Tim Cox has the support of the very experienced John Morgan, John Anderson, Peter Sherwen and Polking-horne. These players will be forced to cover the loss of the suspended Meadows. The Xaverian defenders will be relying on the support of their rucks and rovers to help thwart Scotch forward activity. It cannot be forgotten here that this sexte has been the most effec-tive set of B Section defenders.

Across the centre Scotch veteran Ross Duke will be opposed to Concoran. Each in his own way will be an effective player who will take advantage of every possible opportunity.

My feeling is that Scotch can be vulnerable under pressure but devastating if allowed to dictate play. From what I have seen and heard the Xaverians have proven themselves the top side in the competition. I expect them to win today and justify this claim.
