## Editorial

### ORMOND (A) and THOMASTOWN "HOME" by ONE POINT BANYULE (Junior 3) and FAWKNER (Junior 2) SEMI-FINALS HIGH SCORERS

Last Saturday marked the beginning of the second round of the V.A.F.A. 1980 Season, or what is termed by many as "the business end of the Season. The weather was as near perfect as one could expect for a Melbourne August to be and the football generally was of a fine standard. The traditional ingredients of vigour, brilliant passages of ball handling and cliff-hanging results were all present but there were also a few run-away wins recorded.

The high scoring honours for the day went to Banyule the Junior Three 2nd Semifinal, who were closely followed by Fawkner in the Junior Two 1st semi. Banyule, despite their big score, only won by eleven points from Thomastown, though.

The **A Section** 1st semi-final and the **F Section** 2nd semi-final provided the greatest excitement on the day with the "underdog" in each case winning by the narrowest margins after their opponents both appeared to have winning breaks at the last change. Ormond trailed St. Bernard's by 25 points in the match at Elsternwick Park and needed to score more goals in the last quarter than they had in the previous three combined if they were to move on to the preliminary final — which is exactly what they did. Thomastown trailed University Reds by 22 points but did know that they had the wind coming home — and they had scored 7 goals to 2 in the second quarter.

Almost as tight were the **E Section** 2d semi-final and the 1st semi-final in **Junior Section One**. Again it was Ormond figuring in a "grand-stand" finish, though perhaps they were a little lucky to move into the Junior One Preliminary Final as they had held a commanding three-quarter time lead over Melbourne University but won by only three points. Similarly St. Pius held a five goals plus lead at the final change but were kept to only one scoring shot

in the last term, whilst West Brunswick rattled on five goals one — but still missed out by two points.

In **B Section**, the leader for most of the season — Collegians were defeated by Kew who led at each change. The winning margin was 23 points.

Likewise, Geelong led at each interval in the **C Section** 2nd semi-final to record a nine goal victory over Old Brighton Grammarians. Bulleen-Templestowe did not have things all their own way in the 1st semi however but managed to draw away slightly in the final term to win by ten points from Hampton Rovers.

In **D Section** State Bank (in the 1st semi) kept Old Carey Grammarians goalless until nearly three-quarter time and finally won by 40 points, whilst Alphington in the 2nd semi did not overhaul St. Bedes' early lead until well into the third stanza. But once in the lead they did not look back and recorded a 29 point victory.

Old Geelong (**E — 1st semi**) and Peninsula Old Boys (**F — 1st semi**) each established leads in the 1st quarter and went on from there. Old Geelong held sway over Mentone Old Boys by 59 points and Peninsula were twenty-three points ahead of Brunswick at the final siren.

Congratulations must be extended to the **Umpire Association** for the creditable manner in which all the finals

games last were conducted. The two field-umpire system certainly seemed to work effectively, especially when it is remembered that for many of the pairs it was their first experience in running as a duo — indeed their first experience in running under the two-umpire system at all.

In closing the Amateur Footballer would like to extend its commiserations to the Thomastown and Alphington

clubs — who were both remembering the death of persons important to their clubs last Saturday.

# PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

## A SECTION

### 2nd Semi-Final.

Today's second semi-final, down at Elsternwick Park will be between **De La Salle O.C.** and **University Blues**. Both teams have recorded a victory over each other — De La won the first encounter, also at Elsternwick Park, by 12 points and while playing away Uni. Blues won by 13 points to take the second first round game. The weather conditions leading up to this game could have a big bearing on the outcome.

University Blues have a large brigade of small men, with rovers **Simon Macaulay**, **Steve Kaufman** and will love it if the "sting" has been taken out of the ground, while De La may have a problem in the small-following division with **Pat Maher** doing the bulk of the work with **Bill Peers**. The ruck work could have a big bearing on the outcome of this game as the in-form ruckman for De La Salle, **Peter Donegan** will have to make his hit-outs very direct. His opposing number is **John Cortese** whose strength is renowned for the Blues and his long hand-balls will have to be checked.

The Uni. Blues forward line is among the first six senior sides for the highest tally of goals scored for the season. The spearhead is **Peter Karvelis**, who passed the "ton" at his last outing, followed by the forward flankers — **Mike Sleeman** and **Dave Kurnow** and to cap it off **Mike Yeo** at centre half forward. They will not, however, have it all their own way as De La Salle's backline is the fourth best excluding the Junior grades. Their task will be to keep the Blues out and heading this defence — at full back will be **Peter McDonnell** ably backed up by **Gary Connolly**. **Mike Greene** who has had a very good year is at centre half back with **Ric Halasa** and **Brian Bourke** on the flanks.

De La Salle also have striking power in **Brendan Green** at full forward (in the last three games he has kicked 17 goals) and **Robert Ruffolo** lurking around the goals, with **Paul Greene** at centre half forward and on the flank, **Shane Murphy**.

These De La Salle boys will be closely checked by **Roger Curnow** at full back for the students however, while **Tim Carey** keeps an eye on the opposition rovers with **Mark "Nails" Tyquin** taking out the big fellas. **John Devine** marshalls the Uni. at centre half back.

The game will be won and lost in the centre so the battle between **Rod Carne** for the Blues and **Ralph McHenry** for the Old Collegians will certainly play a big part, backed up by captain **Steve Dobbie** (Blues) having a big battle with nifty **Dave Hollier**, De La's winger.

I can see this game being very close with no quarter given and I wouldn't be surprised to see the winning margin less than the previous two encounters for 1980. De La Salle's back line will perform better under pressure than the Uni. Blues forward line and I don't feel the Blues can keep the De La forwards out of the game long enough to gain a win.

## B SECTION.

### SECOND SEMI-FINAL.

Today's second semi-final sees two of the long established "school" clubs within the V.A.F.A. battling for the right to direct promotion to A Section.

The **Old Xaverians** have been nurtured by Coach **Michael Green** to be in top form at final's time. They started the season slowly and have built momentum as the games have passed. **Old Scotch**, although a side of undoubtedly deep talent, have not always played to their potential much to the consternation of coach **Laurie Aghan**.

Victory today will go to the side which gains the breaks during play. Therefore my preview must be based on observation, reports and journalistic licence.

Ruck duels are vital to the outcome of any football match. Xaverian Captain **Noonan** is a sure match winner. To support him the Xaverians have the lithe **Burne** as well as the experienced **John Brimacombe**. Scotch rucks have been led for the season by **Tom Mason** (named twelve times within the Scotch best). To support him over past weeks has been former A Section Best and Fairest winner **Michael Bates** whose fitness and talent are well known. To support the Xaverian trio are **Vale** and **Adgemis**. Vale, in addition to his effective roving, has kicked 42 goals to be second to **Curtain** at Club level and to enable him to be within the top ten section goalkickers.

Both sides have effective forward lines — **Curtain** is the biggest single danger to Scotch as his 105 goals testify. Full back **Bob Drummond** will be struggling to nullify **Curtain** throughout the game. At centre half forward **Sierakowski** or **Brimacombe** will trouble **Alexander**. Other Xaverian forwards whose effectiveness has been proven are **Stanley** and **Blake**.

The Scotch full forward **Tim Cox** has the support of the very experienced **John Morgan**, **John Anderson**, **Peter Sherwen** and **Polkinghorne**. These players will be forced to cover the loss of the suspended **Meadows**. The Xaverian defenders will be relying on the support of their rucks and rovers to help thwart Scotch forward activity. It cannot be forgotten here that this sextet has been the most effective set of B Section defenders.

Across the centre Scotch veteran **Ross Duke** will be opposed to **Concoran**. Each in his own way will be an effective player who will take advantage of every possible opportunity.

My feeling is that Scotch can be vulnerable under pressure but devastating if allowed to dictate play. From what I have seen and heard the Xaverians have proven themselves the top side in the competition. I expect them to win today and justify this claim.

they only scraped in by 4 points against the Rovers. **Old Brighton Grammarians** must be reeling after their 54 point defeat and have probably called in the psychoanalyst to help find the reasons.

My success rate with the B-T's was 50% until last week. The return of **Dozzi, Clarke** and **Chard** saw the side back to full strength and these are the players who will pass the ball to **Hooper** and **Bird** whenever they get the chance. I thought **Quaife** was the only old timer in the side, but wingman **Barry Murphy**, who starred last week, is the same age as your scribe and I gave up football 10 years ago to take on running the boundary.

In 1978 Brighton won the flag from fourth position and last year finished second but failed in the finals and missed out on promotion. They have three players with interstate experience in "jumping" **John Priestley**, **Tony Gedye** and **David Shepherd** and in addition **Sheppard**, **Nicholson** and **Epstein** are proving to be very dangerous on the forward line.

This match could well be a battle of the back lines with the side first adjusting to the difficult winds around Monash gaining the upper hand. I fancy that Brighton have that little bit more class and will be fired up after last week's thrashing.

Today's Final at Old Scotch Oval is between **State Bank** and **St. Bede's O.C.**

Both these sides showed good finals form last week. State Bank allowed Old Carey only one goal in the first three quarters (and that late in the third) which gave them a comfortable forty-point win. Their bigger players in **Maher**, **Wynd**, **Cloke** and **Wright** all starred, which meant their smaller players were given an armchair ride. **Eacott**, despite the absence of his "cheer squad" from Country Colleges, also showed good form.

St. Bede's jumped Alphington and scored seven goals in the first quarter and they led by fifteen points at half-time. But they could not withstand the Alphington pressure in the second half and went down by twenty-nine points. I think that they will have learnt from the disappointment of that game and they will be ready to start "firing" at the first bounce — and with all their better players in form they should win the cut-throat game.

# LOOKING BACK
