# "NEW" SIDES MEET WITH INDIFFERENT SUCCESS

# SOME FINE INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM EFFORTS RECORDED

Whilst the farming community may despair at the unseasonable weather over the past several weeks, these were certainly a boon for the opening matches of the 1980 V.A.F.A. Season. Hard dry grounds were definitely conducive to some very high scoring and accurate goalshooting. (They also contributed to some badly-blistered feet as many players were heard to lament!)

Scoring honours for the day must surely go to newcomers Thomastown (F and Junior 3). The three teams amassed over 500 points between them. A grand way to begin in a new Association. Peninsula Old Boys also burst into the V.A.F.A. with their two sides totalling over 360 points.

Three particularly noteworthy individual performances were also recorded. University Blues' full-forward Peter Karvelis booted 15 goals and Marcellin's Frazer 12 in A Section, whilst Old Geelong's (E Section) "recruit" John Butcher put through 11 of his side's 20.

The "new" sides to the various sections met with chequered success. In A Section Marcellin just went down to Uni. Blacks in a cliff-hanging match-of-the-day at Elsternwick Park.

These two sides have set a very high standard and it is to be hoped that future matches at E.P. can emulate this performance.

Other newcomer, A.J.A.X, fulfilled their wildest imaginings with a 13 goal win over Ivanhoe to mark their entry into 'A'.

Old Paradians and Old Scotch (B Section) showed from the outset that they are both keen to reverse their form of 1979, whilst Kew fought back after half-time to account for their ex-C Section compatriots, St. Kilda.

C Section saw only one of the "newies" successful. Old Haileyburians scored convincingly over St. Kevin's and are obviously keen to regain their lost position. Old Trinity and Melbourne High Old Boys were both comfortably beaten, but Bulleen-Templestowe made up considerable ground in the last-quarter

before finally being defeated by three points.

Similarly in **D Section** was only one new side victorious. Alphington recorded their first win for over a season with a third-quarter burst that left Country Colleges too far behind to bridge the gap. The other three — Old Ivanhoe, A.M.P. Society, and Beverley Hills — all played at home and were all defeated easily, by Heatherton, State Bank and Old Carey respectively.

Elsternwick and St. Pius both won in E Section, though the latter appeared to wilt badly in the last quarter. West Brunswick had halved their three-quarter time deficit at the final siren. Princes Hill trailed one of the Section's stronger '79 teams — North Brunswick — all day and were 5 goals down at full time.

Coolaroo Rovers, Peninsula O.B. and Thomastown each started its V.A.F.A. career well in **F Section** whilst St. John's O. C. and Banyule appear to be needing a little more time to settle in. Today's matches should give a better idea of the potential of each of these new teams.

#### Editorial (continued)

Both Coburg and Kew found the Junior Section One competition far stiffer than that of 1979, when they went down to Old Haileyburians and North Old Boys respectively. The 'new' Melbourne University side seems to have benefited from the decision to field only one representative Junior team as they scored by 22 goals over Ivanhoe.

The late withdrawal of University Blacks and Geelong from Junior Section Two has caused what could best be described as major chaos. But this did not worry Marcellin who registered a 12 goal victory over their unexpected opponents in M.H.S.O.B. Bulleen-

Templestowe were not so fortunate in their encounter with Monash Blues, as were Old Scotch who again started the season with a disappointing performance.

The even later withdrawal of Beverley Hills from Junior Section Three virtually left Parkside without an opponent but it is expected that St. Bernard's will field a Second Junior team to maintain this Section "in toto". The three other newcomers to the Junior ranks - St. Kilda, St. Kevin's and Thomastown all started successfully and are obviously looking for big things from this season. Old Brighton proved they are determined to be a force this year as too did Banyule both of whom inflicted crushing defeats on their opposition.

#### A SECTION
