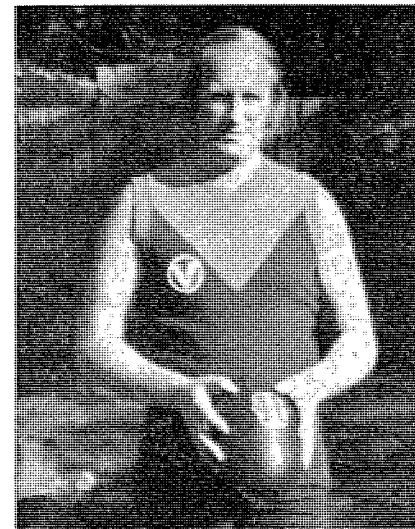
SUNDAY MORNINGS COMING UP

V.A.F.A. GAMES RECORD TUMBLES



Twenty-two years ago a blond young man donned his **Alphington** guernsey for the first time. Today the same player will run onto the ground to represent **Alphington** again — for the 366th time. The player, who has been variously described as having a "blue and gold" heart and as being a living legend is **Peter Harris**. Today's game will see him surpass the highest number of **V.A.F.A.** games played. This record was previously held by former **Power House** champion **Les Gordon**.

During his career, Peter has notched many achievements including Club best and fairest and other awards. He has played in several premierships and has tasted success as a coach. He is a life member of his Club and the recipient of a **V.A.F.A.** Merit Award.

Perhaps one of the best examples of Peter's loyalty to **Alphington** (and dedication to the game generally) was seen last season when the Club struck hard times. PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

St. Bernard's OC meet AJAX out at Essendon this afternoon. St. Bernard's had, to me, a surprise defeat last week and will be looking to make amends this week. They are real warriors at home and knowledge of their home ground will be most beneficial. AJAX lost last week against a determined Ormond, who the 'Saints' beat well in the first round. Logically the Saints should win easily but it will certainly be very close as AJAX will be out to prove they have not slipped that much. St. Bernard's to win on their home ground.

University Blacks go to the E. E. Gunn Reserve, Ormond to play Ormond. Ormond are riding on the crest of a wave after two successive wins following their first round defeat. Their style of play suits their small home ground and they will certainly be hard to beat again. Blacks came up against Blues last week and found it very hard to convert their scoring opportunities. They will have to play better today to tip out the improving Ormond. Ormond to sneak home.

The match of the day is last year's Grand Final replay at Elsternwick Park between University Blues and De La Salle O.C. Uni. Blues have taken all before them this year. Yeo, Tyquin and Karvelis have been playing well but the whole team will again have to prove themselves to turn the tide against the polished De La Salle. De La Salle have also been impressive this year although they have not been tested so far. This could be the day, however, and they will have to pull out all stops to win. M. Greene, P. Greene, Bourke and Halasa have been showing their form but De La will need these boys and more to repeat the result of their last 1979 encounter. In a most intriguing game, the flip of the coin may decide the winner; I will go for Uni. Blues for their overall strength, in a very close game.

Ivanhoe play Marcellin OC at home today. Ivanhoe have found wins very hard to come by. Along with Kilpatrick and Balcombe the 'Hoes' will have to play a far more desperate game if they are to succeed. They are slow starters and if they are to show the home crowd what they can do they will have to start at the beginning of the first quarter. Marcellin, on the other hand, have not won a game yet either, although they have shown that they can be up with the best of the other teams. If they can concentrate for four quarters of football then I feel they will win this one comfortably.

North OB venture down to Fawkner Park today to take on Old Melburnians. The OM's were very lucky last week to snatch victory in the closing minutes and coach Barry Morphett will certainly be looking for a more desperate first half than was shown last week. North OB opened their 1980 account last week with a good win over St. Bernard's. John Jordan, North's coach, has been building up to this and will be expecting a continuation of this form today. The vast spaces of OM's ground may find North OB struggling for pace and for this reason I am swayed to the OM's.

B SECTION

Despite the consistent play of Olds and Ludeman, the solid ruck-work of Anderson and Rodger's activity around goal, Monash Blues are still without a win. Conversely, Old Scotch has three victories on the board. So far, the strong play of veteran Morgan, rover Marx and Mason has been a telling factor in the Old Scotch victories. Today the Cardinals have the chance to build percentage and with it consolidate their top position. I predict a big win by Old Scotch.

Collegians are being well served by Bennett and Hibbins whose fathers starred for the side a generation ago. St. Kilda's style of play may upset Collegians who prefer fast open football. For St. Kilda solid ruckman White and nippy "Dino" Dynon have been effective players. Following their win over Parade last Saturday I have no hesitation in selecting St. Kilda to defeat Collegians today.

Long-standing rivals Fawkner and Parkside clash at the Mutton Reserve. My predecessor as B Section Tipster used to write enthusiastically about these games. Unfortunately the power of the pen has lessened — like the Parkside power. Unfortunately for the section and the VAFA the "Red Devils" are only a shadow of their former selves. Fawkner play their ground very well and today I foresee Mark Stapleton, Peter Smith and their fellow little men turning in another match-winning effort for the "Two Blues".

Old Xaverians, despite injury and internal change, broke the ice last Saturday. Their visitors today, Kew, are at the top of the ladder after three weeks and I wonder who can dispute their claim? The Xaverians have active forwards in Vale and Curtain, while for Kew, Blay and Haralambopolous have proven reliable avenues to goal. It is difficult to see the depleted Xaverians overcoming the strong Kew side, who have been served by Bruce Smith, Burden and the Zerbi brothers. Another telling victory should come Kew's way today.
