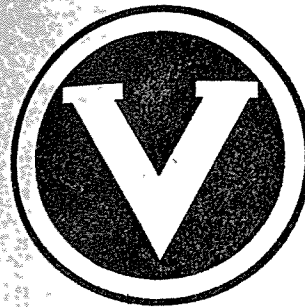

EDITORIAL

ONLY ONE SENIOR SIDE UNBEATEN

HOW THE NEW TEAMS IN EACH SECTION ARE FARING

With one-third of the 1980 Season completed, Collegians is the only undefeated Senior team. Last Saturday saw the first loss for the other two who had won five matches straight — De La Salle (A Section) were beaten by St. Bernard's O.C. and St. Pius (E Section) were beaten by Elsternwick.

Two Junior teams have not yet been defeated — Therry C.C.O.B. in Junior Two and Thomastown in Junior Three — and no less than six Reserve teams have yet to be conquered — Bulleen-Templestowe (C Reserve), St. Pius (E Reserve), University Reds (F Reserve) and three teams in D Reserve: Old Carey Gram., St. Bede's O.C. and Heatherston.

This point in the Season suggests itself as a good time to look at the positions of the newcomers to the various sections. After six matches some indication as to form should be available.

In A Section, newcomers A.J.A.X. after a timely win last Saturday now find themselves just outside the four on percentage — having won three matches. Marcellin, also winners last Saturday has not started so well with only two wins recorded. They are currently occupying eighth position on the ladder.

Kew have only lost one match so far (to Old Xaverians) and are second on the B Section ladder ahead of Old Scotch on percentage. It was, in fact, Kew who inflicted Old Scotch's only defeat. St. Kilda C.B.O.C. are lying sixth but only five per cent. out of fourth place. They have won three of their six 1980 encounters, though their losses have been to the top three sides. Old Paradians are not faring so well presently have recording only one win — against Parkside in the opening match. It is only percentage which is holding them in eighth spot at the moment.

Bulleen-Templestowe are certainly doing the best of the four new sides in C Section. Their only defeat was at the hands of Geelong in the first match and then the margin was only three points. M.H.S. Old Boys have won three

matches — all at home. Old Hailey-burians have won only two matches and Old Trinity Grammarians have recorded only one win — that against Old Camberwell Grammarians — who are just above them on percentage.

In D Section the new-comers are fairly well polarized. The two from C Section are in the four, the two up from E Section are ninth and tenth. Alphington have lost only one match (narrowly to State Bank) and Old Ivanhoe have won four of the six. Beverley Hills have won one game (from Heatherston) whilst A.M.P. Society have yet to record their first win.

St. Pius and West Brunswick are occupying the first two positions on the E Section ladder having lost one match each. Elsternwick (last week's "giant-killers") are fifth on percentage with two losses recorded — to West and North Brunswick. Princes Hill are finding it a little more difficult. at this stage having won only two matches.

The five new teams in F Section are enjoying mixed successes. Thomastown with five wins and one "error" are on top with Peninsula Old Boys (4 wins) in third spot. Coolaroo Rovers have two wins whilst Banyule and St. John's are each showing four points.

Coburg have won three matches in Junior Section One, whilst Kew have yet

to break through. They are seventh and ninth respectively.

Bulleen-Templestowe have won four matches in **Junior Section Two** as have Monash Blues and are holding third and fourth places on the ladder. Marcellin have won three whilst Old Scotch Collegians have managed only two wins.

In **Junior Section Three** the five new sides are well spread through the ladder. Thomastown are undefeated, St. Kilda C.B.O.C. have lost only once — to St. Kevin's who are fifth on percentage with four wins. Parkside have won three games whilst St. Bernard's (B) have yet to notch opening points.

UMPIRES' CORNER

In last week's Umpires' Corner the case for separate umpiring bodies (rather than one central organisation) was made. This does not mean however that there should not be co-operation between the various umpiring organisations to solve common problems.

This co-operation is taking place in a very meaningful way through the Victorian Federation of Australian Rules Football Umpires. All the major umpires' associations are represented.

Discussion between the representatives makes it clear that VAFA is extremely well-off compared with some other competitions. One other competition, for example, is using umpires three times each weekend to cover its commitments.

Apart from discussion, positive action is being taken in a number of areas to promote Australian Rules umpiring. Among the Federation's current projects are:

- A publicity campaign to encourage recruitment.
- Arrangement of an annual seminar for umpires from all bodies.
- Making representations for the appointment of a full-time umpiring promotions officer whose functions would include regular visits to schools, athletic clubs and other likely recruiting grounds.
- Making submissions to the government about the use of sales tax revenue to support recreation activities.

This type of co-operative activity can only benefit the game of Australian football.

A SECTION

Today Scotch veteran Ross Duke will be all out to show his former teammates at Parade that age has not dimmed his form. Old Scotch should win this game comfortably.

In what could prove a vital game in the final relegation analysis Monash Blues visit Parkside. Monash have played some good football of late but have only managed one victory. Olds, McKenzie and Ludeman regularly have been good players while Rodger has proven a regular goal scorer. Parkside have

As Fawknor meet Caulfield Grammarians at Home their winning Chances arise sharply.

The "Blues" double standard must give nightmares to Dennis Groves. Today Chard and Ward will need close checking by Caulfield defenders. Bob Macdonald will have a worrying afternoon trying to stop this pair booting their side to victory. Surprisingly Fawknor has named eighteen separate Best Players. This must indicate the team's lack of individual stars. Caulfield see victory today as their means of regaining the top four. Their leading players Watson, Cooney and Griffiths could well prove the architects of victory. Goal scoring for Caulfield will be a worry although Kanis, Fletcher and Matthews are all proven and reliable avenues to goal. At home Fawknor are my selection.

C.B.C. St. Kilda, with a splendid away from home record this season, visit Old Xaverians. The St. Kilda side has won on the ground before (1977). Victory today could carry either Side into the Four. For Xaverians,, Ace Ruckmen Noonan and Brimacombe will vie for aerial supremacy with St. Kilda stalwart "Ox" White. Vale and Curtain will present two big problems to St. Kilda defenders and if not closely checked they could kick the "Red and Blacks" to victory. St. Kilda's consistent players include "Dino" Dynon, Kellaway and Delaney. The key to this game may well be that the Saints have no reliable goalkicker to compare with the Xaverians Duo. To forecast the outcome is a real gamble — at home I select Old Xaverians to win narrowly.

Although captain Geoff Delaney will be trying to lift his side all round the ground by personal example he will find that the home side just has too many good players.

The question being asked around Corio Bay is whether the Geelong side has collapsed with two successive defeats. Today they await the arrival of their long standing friends and rivals Coburg.
