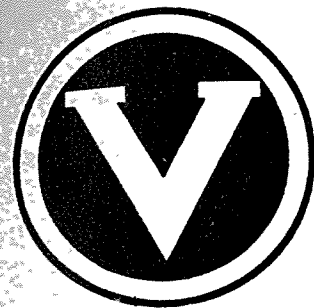

EDITORIAL

"A" SECTION LEADER TOPPLED AGAIN POSITIONAL CHANGES IN MOST SECTION FOURS

Top of the ladder is certainly not the place to be in A Section at the moment. The last two weeks have seen the holder of this position toppled and today A.J.A.X. will be endeavouring to complete the hat trick when they take on De La Salle, who regained the spot by virtue of their win over North Old Boys and University Blues defeat by Old Melburnians. A.J.A.X. will have the task in front of them however as they succumbed to University Blacks last Saturday.

Other matches last week saw St. Bernard's consolidate with a win over Marcellin and Ormond return to the winning list at the expense of a slightly unfortunate Ivanhoe.

The North Old Boys v Marcellin game today is important to each as the winner will, temporarily at least, move away from the relegation zone.

Collegians had the upper hand all day in their clash with Kew last Saturday and maintained their supremacy in B Section. Kew failed to handle the Albert Park conditions, which certainly seem give the sides based around the lake a decider home-ground advantage. Old Paradians inflicted Old Scotch's second loss in three weeks when their three-quarter time lead of eight goals provided big enough for them to "hang-on". Parkside opened their account with an eleven point win over Monash Blues after a close-fought tussle. The lead see-sawed before Fawkner were able to overcome Caulfield but Old Xaverians led all day to defeat St. Kilda.

The only one of the C Section top four to be beaten was Hampton Rovers who trailed St. Kevin's all day. They were finally defeated by ten goals. The other three: Bulleen-Templestowe, Old Brighton and Geelong each won convincingly — from Old Trinity, Melbourne High School and Coburg respectively. Old Haileyburian's win over Old Camberwell at least keeps them somewhere within touch of the leaders. Today's matches — Hampton Rovers v Bulleen-Templestowe and St. Kevin's O.B. v Geelong could well ring some positional changes in next week's ladder.

Last Saturday's results in D Section rang chances to the top four due to the defeats of third and fourth place holders — St. Bede's and Old Ivanhoe. Both Old Carey and State Bank (Albert Park again!) led all day, thus Old Carey retained second spot and State Bank moved into third spot — ahead of St. Bede's and Old Ivanhoe. Alphonington at home proved far too strong for Heatherston. Beverley Hills notched their second win for the season, this time against Power House and a struggling Country Colleges proved no match for an improving A.M.P. Society — who opened their account with a twelve goal victory.

Possibly last Saturday's excitement was provided by E Section. A highly inaccurate Old Geelong scraped home by the narrowest margin against West Brunswick and moved into Second place and Elsternwick came from three goals behind at the last change to win by two and snatch third place against Thornbury — both beaten sides were "at home" — so much for home-ground advantage in this Section! Princes Hill had only nine behinds to spare in their defeat of Latrobe University who dropped to sixth, but Mentone Old Boys, after leading by only eight points at three-quarter time over-ran University High School

in the final term to win by nearly seven goals. St. Pius and North Brunswick both proved too strong for their opponents — A.N.Z. Bank and Bulleen United however, both winning by more than ten goals.

Footscray I.T.O.B. dropped out of the F Section four after their defeat by Commonwealth Bank and Brunswick went in following their big win over St. John's. Peninsula O.B., though beaten by Coolaroo Rovers stayed in the four on percentage. The top two — Thomastown and University Reds maintained their ascendancy with wins over Clayton and Therry C.C.O.B. respectively. Banyule notched their second four points at the expense of Monash Whites. Today's "big clash" will be that between Thomastown and Brunswick.

PREVIEWING TODAY'S GAMES

A SECTION

St. Bernard's O.C. play host to Ivanhoe today. St. Bernard's finished on last week to hold out Marcellin in a very low-scoring game. This week they will be without Greg Wade (Interstate) but should have enough all-round strength to beat off the improving Ivanhoe. Ivanhoe nearly opened their account for the 80's last week when they just failed by three points to catch Ormond. New "best players" in Forristal, Course and McNamara show that the Hoos have quite a bit of depth and with their Reserve team on top of the ladder it won't be long before they break the ice. I will go for the Saints today, but only because it is on their home ground.

Marcellin O.C. travel out to North O.B. this week. These two teams were losers last week and are fighting for 8th and 9th positions on the ladder. It will be probable that neither team will lose players to the Interstate match as Bernard Cooper (Marcellin) may have trouble passing the fitness test. North Old Boys have disappointed over the last 3 weeks and will be relying on the continuing good form of the Carrollis, Brown and Griffin. Marcellin just failed last week and will be looking for a little revenge against the lower-order team. I think that they will find it at North's expense.

A.J.A.X. are at home to De La Salle O.C. A.J.A.X. missed out last week after a hard-fought match against Uni. Blacks. On their home ground they are goals better and may have only one representative in the State match. De La Salle on the other hand look like having at least 3 unavailable, through State selection and this will throw a lot of pressure onto the other players. Mike Greene, Bourke, Halasa and possibly Murphy may be called on for the State, and for this reason I think that A.J.A.X. with their home ground pressure will win in the boil-over of the round.

Ormond and University Blues meet at Ormond this afternoon. Ormond just scraped home last week against the bottom side and during this week will have had, no doubt, trained pretty hard at goal-kicking. Ormond look like losing Bourne and Naylor to Interstate and this will not help their cause. Uni. Blues were ousted from their one-week ladder lead last week and will be out for revenge this week. They may be without Sleeman and Tyquin for State duties and Dobbie and Kaufman may go also — if fit. Although depleted in their lineup I can't see Ormond improving enough to trouble the Blues.

Old Melburnians go to the University to play Blacks. Uni. Blacks, over the last 2 weeks, have shown that they are improving but look like losing Chris Cordner, Perrett and Lockie (all Interstate) and this will make a dent in their possessing-getting ability. The improving form of Simon Costello on the backline and the form of Llewellyn in front of goals is pleasing but they may have trouble

filling in the vacancies left by the Interstates. Old Melburnians, on the other hand, may lose only two — their captain Ian Cordner and possibly Simon Trumble. O.M.'s last week beat the ladder leaders — Blues, but will however have to overcome both Blacks and themselves to win today. All too often they "coast" along letting the game slip away. Against all my better judgement I will go for O.M.'s but they will have to concentrate if they are to win.

Chocolates to boiled lollies in one week has been my lot. Certainly the competition is becoming more even by the week and at this stage only Collegians can be assured of a Final series game.

Monash Blues await Fawkner who will be motivated to consolidate their position as a top side. The visitors will be reinforced by the return of Busst and with the continued good form being displayed by Marantellii, McMahon and B. Sagers, they will prove formidable opposition for the Students who have yet to establish a consistent pattern of play. Monash chances will rise if Anthony O'Donnell can reproduce his goalkicking assistance to Rodger. Other players who will trouble Fawkner include Anderson, Olds and McKenzie. Fawkner is my selection.

Kew, still smarting from Collegians' power play, will gain respite when they meet Parkside at Elsternwick Park. Parkside, despite its determination does not have the skill to match Kew. Kew's drive is generated by "Munro" Walker and his ruck rovers Terry Hayes and Bruce Smith whose absence last week must have been keenly felt. Parkside regularly rely on Jones, Chilcott and K. Howell, who however wilt under their weekly burden. Kew will emerge victorious today.

Old Scotch were humiliated last week when even coach Aghan shed his phlegmatic facade. Today some of the Scotch stars will have to prove their ability is as great under pressure as it is when the team is on top. Collegians, who have consistently demonstrated their talent, must win the ball in the air to thwart Marx and Bubb who generate much Scotch drive. Meadows is another agile player who has converted many Scotch opportunities. Conversely the Cardinals must nullify Etherington, Warner and Hibbins if they are to win. I suspect the Paradians may have shown Collegians the achilles heel of Old Scotch by their close checking and constantly applied pressure. Although Scotch will bounce back. I favour Collegians to take the point.

Caulfield Grammarians are host to C.B.C. St. Kilda today. The Caulfield players kicked themselves out of contention last week. However at Albert Park local knowledge should aid Caulfield accuracy. St. Kilda, who have yet to defeat a side higher on the ladder, will encounter trouble today, from Clark,
