LOOKING BACK

5 YEARS AGO — 1978

Only undefeated teams after 9 rounds were "B" Old Melburnians "F" Thornbury, "J.I" North Old Boys.

St. Kilda C.B.C.O.C., on top in "C" trailed "winless" Old Carey by 29 points at the last change but stormed home in the final term to kick 8.7 to 1.1. Old Carey were well served by **Bryan, Laidlaw, Williams** while **Smith, Carroll, Dynon** and **Robinson** (6 gls.) starred for St. Kilda.

100 games to St. Kevin's **Bobby "Boom Boom" Hawkins** — consecutive; Heatherton's spearhead **Peter Meeking**, Fawkner's **Arthur Dean** and foundation member **Peter Ferguson**, State Bank's **Mick "Spike" Scott**.

Distinction of the round went to **Bruce Ferrall** who ran out for his 300th game for A.M.P. Popularly known as "Ferret", in his heyday he had no peer as a rover, and along the way, besides a continuing interest as a club administrator, had won 2 best and fairest awards and 2 senior goalkicking trophies.

De La Salle, third in "A", led Ivanhoe, fourth, by 37 points at the last change, and **Tony O'Callaghan** was giving 10 goals in. Ivanhoe stormed home, kicking 7.1 to 0.3 to win by 3 points. **Shepherd, Jones** (6 gls.) **Adley** (Ivan.) and **Groves** (7 gls.) **Maher** and **Nugent** (De La) were best in a high class game.

10 YEARS AGO — 1973

North lost to **Coburg** in a rather scramble game and slipped from top place down to third, a game below **Ormond** and **Coburg**.

Old Scotch staged a complete reversal of form in beating **Reservoir Old Boys** for they had been soundly beaten the week before by second bottom team, **De La Salle**.

Scotch's straight kicking, 14.9 to R.O.B.'s 12.16 won the game. In the battle of top 'D' Section teams, **Marcellin**, 11.7 defeated **Alphington**, 10.10. Stars were **J. Gartner, Dwyer, Wilson** (Marc.) and **Alsop, Shaw, Wayman**, (Alph.).

Amateur football followers were shocked to hear of the sudden death of life member, umpire **Don Malcolm**, who had played 140 senior games from 1949 to 1959 with **Commonwealth Bank** in their great days in 'A' and 'B' sections.

150 to **Rod Thompson** (Common. Bank — despite breaking his leg twice during his career), **Tim Alder** (Old Melb.), **Barry Hecker** (Ivanhoe) and **Graeme Craven** (Caul. Gram.).

U.H.S.O.B. saluted **Jack Pemberton** who in his 14 years as medico-runner-trainer had attended well over 500 games. Jack was also well known as Clerk of Course on Saturday nights at the Showgrounds trots.

15 YEARS AGO — 1968

Caulfield Grammarians trailed **Coburg** by 17 points at three-quarter time, but kicked 6.3 to 2.2 in the final quarter to win by 8 points.

Ormond kept **Geelong** goal-less until the last quarter, when **Marshall** posted the team's only major for the day.

Melbourne High, battling to stay in 'A' Section, had a 6 goal victory over **North Old Boys**, **Rick Harley** (7 goals) starred for the victors who kicked 6 goals in the third quarter. **North Old Boys'** foundation member, **John Adams**, played his 100th game.

Old Trinity paid tribute on the passing of their president, **John Weatherston**, who had been with the club since its inception.

Executive Committee viewed with concern that two players had been ordered off the ground — more than the previous five years combined.

Commonwealth Bank, ninth in 'B' Section, overwhelmed **Old Xaverians**, eighth (13.6 to 6.5). **Borrack, Pretty** (4 gls.) and **Dick** starred.

25 YEARS AGO — 1958

Old Scotch, one game outside "A" section four, relentlessly thrashed U. Blues, kicking 21.16 to 3.18. Best were **Maughan** (10), **Parry** and **Moran** (O.S.) and **Shaw, Rush, Fraser** (Blues).

Veteran wingman, **Max Smyth** of M.H.S.O.B. announced his retirement.

Alphington, undefeated Junior Section leader, continued their winning run with an 11 goal win over **Ormond**. **Humphries, Horman, McCormick, Kuhnell** (5 gls.) for **Alphington** and **Swann, Marks, Edmondson** (**Ormond**) were best.

Old Geelong Grammarians went to third position in "B" Section when they held on to defeat **Hampton Rovers** by 9 points. Former Olympic hurdler, **John Chittick** dominated the centre for **Old Geelong** and was well supported by

persistent and courageous rover, **Rob Fenner**. Veteran **Bill Morrison** coolly kicked 3 goals for O.G.C.

Undefeated "C" Section leader, **Parkside** trailed U.H.S.O.B. (7th) by 4 points at the final change but kicked 7.3 to 1.2 in the last quarter. **Parkside** were best served by **Kiff, Perry, Barry** and **Brian Lauder** whose 5 goals kept him on top of "C" Section goalkickers.

30 YEARS AGO — 1948

Len Scott of **Parkside** was appointed coach of the carnival team.

"C" Section captains were **Jack Lamb** (**Geelong**), **Bill Rochford** (**Footscray Tech.**), **Murray Johnstone** (**Caulfield Gram.**), **Ed Fitzpatrick** (**Old Paradians**), **Dave Rene** (**Alphington**) and **Les Garrick** (**Glenhuntingly**).

"A" Section leaders were **Old Melburnians** (36 points), **U. Blacks** (32), **Hampton Rovers** (28), **Coburg** (28), **Old Scotch** (26).

Geelong "C" Section and **Hampton Scouts** (Juniors) were the only undefeated teams.

150 GAMES AT ORMOND

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Recently I received the following letter from a V.A.F.A. umpire and after reading it felt it warranted circulation throughout Amateur ranks, especially when you consider the lack of umpires existing at present.

"Dear Peter,

I have been umpiring with the Amateurs for a number of years and this year, more so than in previous years, have become disillusioned with the never-ending questioning/commentary/re-action by players to decisions I may have made/or they believe I should have made.

In recent weeks I have seriously questioned whether my normal umpiring performance has slipped to the extent that it is directly responsible for reactions previously referred to.

Accordingly, I have two alternatives; the first will be to attempt to ensure that my own performance is the best I can do. If the disillusionment continues to the extent that it has happened this year, then the remaining alternative will be to withdraw my services as an umpire with the V.A.F.A. for I am not prepared to be subjected to the continual on-field commentary of players.

I have spoken to two other more experienced senior umpires who have recently officiated in games in the D to F grade section, and now re-call comments made by senior A and B grade umpires who have officiated in D to F section finals games in previous years. The latter have mentioned the disputation of

umpires decisions, and their concern for home and away game umpires during the year whilst the former have noticed a significant increase in verbosity in recent games.

The purpose of this letter is not for my own regard, but for the regard of less experienced umpires in all grades as well as maintaining the standard of amateur football.

The V.A.F.A. needs to retain all the umpires they have as well as entice others to become umpires. In talking with players after the game, a most frequent comment is 'I wouldn't be an umpire with all the abuse they have to take'.

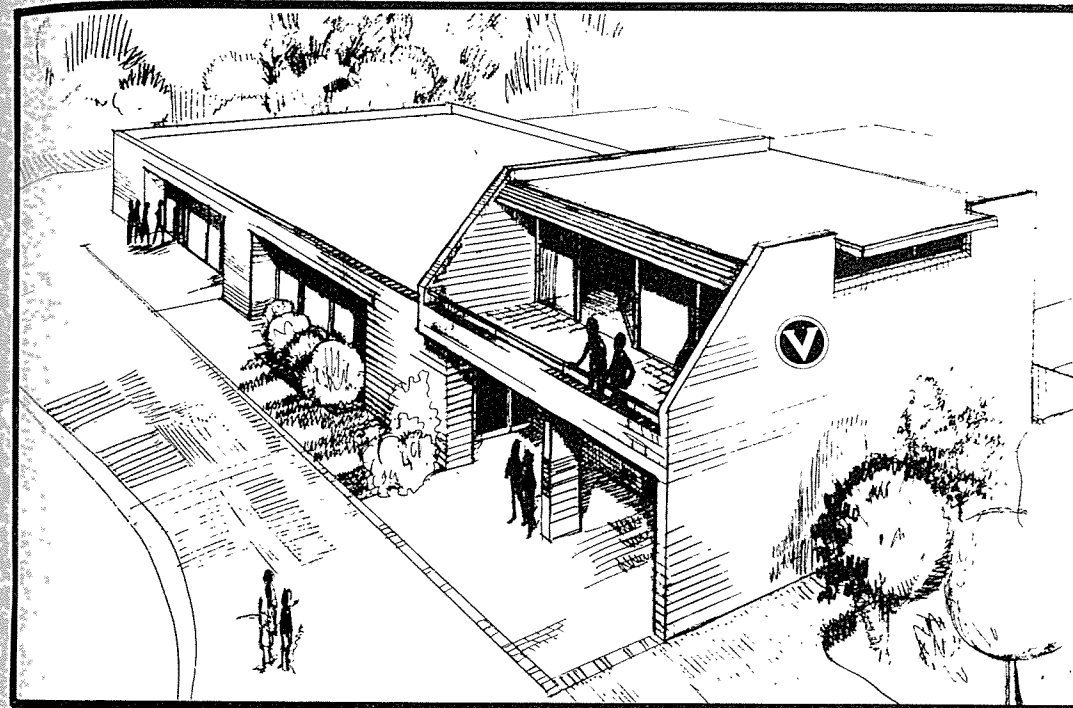
Continual disputation of umpires decisions must have some effect on his concentration and accordingly his performance. It also has a direct effect on the performance of players. For example, in one match this year the coach of one of the teams mentioned to me just prior to the commencement of the third quarter that he had instructed his players that he would remove them from the field if they continued to dispute my decisions. I believe that his team's attitude in the second half was directly attributable to them winning by 14 goals, by kicking 12 goals to 2 goals in the second half.

Maybe I have been remiss in not taking more positive action myself (reporting the players for misconduct), but the problem is more widespread than individualistic. Although I do appreciate the onerous task undertaken by your Executive in resolving off-field difficulties with Clubs in the current year, I do request that Clubs again be reminded of their on-field responsibilities as well.
