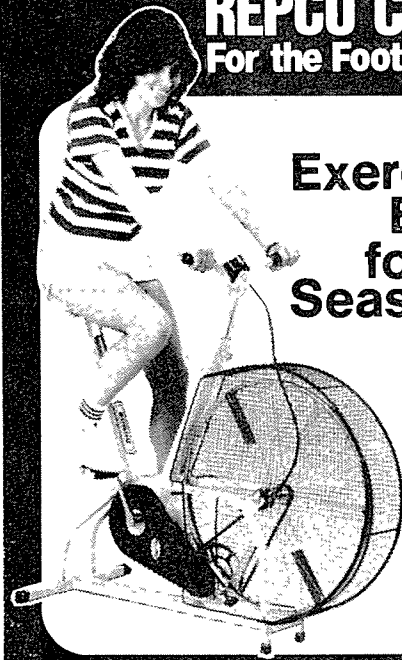

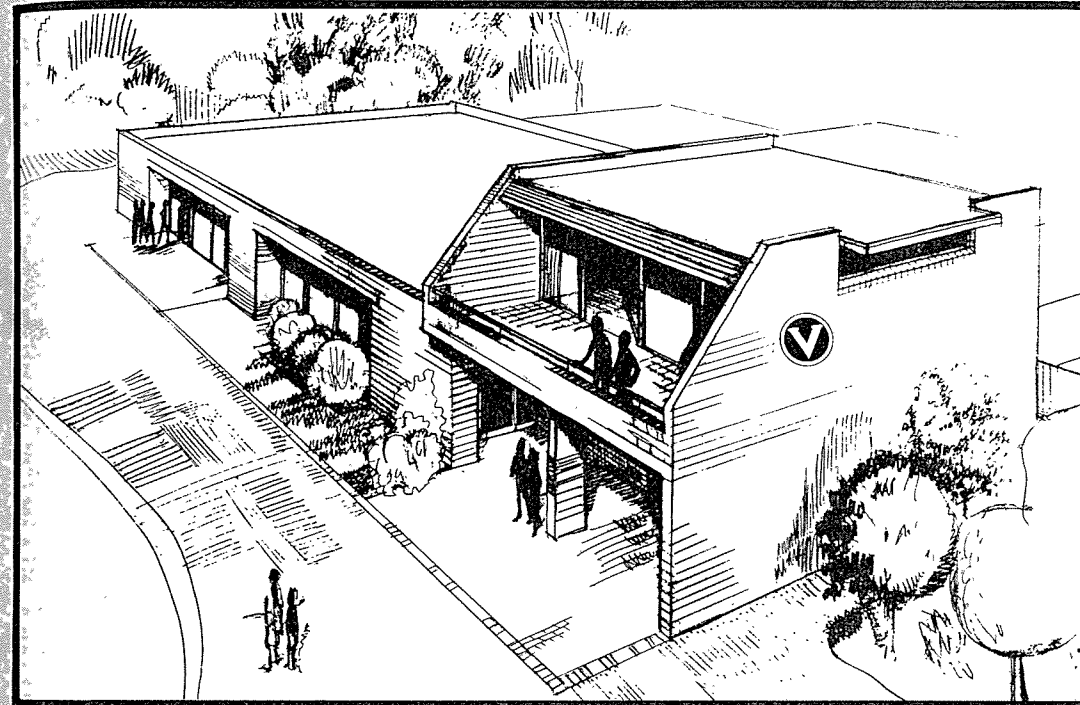

COLLEGIANS SLUMP CONTINUES — OLD XAVERIANS BRAVE RUN ENDS A.J.A.X. PROVE GIANT KILLERS AGAIN PARKSIDE IN C SECTION FOUR M.H.S.O.B. UPSET CAULFIELD GRAMMARIANS & A.N.Z. TOPPLES F.I.T.O.B. TO RECORD FIRST VICTORY

Two bottom sides provided the highlights in last Saturday's round. In C Section **Melbourne High School** accounted for a lifeless and lacklustre **Caulfield Grammarians** whilst in F Section **A.N.Z. Bank** who've come close on occasions, finally broke the draught to record a fine win over third placed **Footscray Tech. Old Boys**. The loss proved costly for Footscray — they're now fifth! In fact F Section is unbelievably tight with five sides on 9 wins and two on 8. It appears that only in E Section are the top 4 practically settled.

In A Section a one point win by **De La Salle** has ensured that club of second place and the vital double chance and at the same time halved **Old Xavs.** late run at the four. **De La Salle** are to be congratulated on its win, it kicked 4 goals in the last 15 mins, however I came away from the match thinking **Old Xavs.** had been robbed of the 4 points. But that's football.

Ormond has now beaten two of the top 4 in as many weeks and its clash today with arch rivals **Ivanhoe** who thrashed **Old Melbourneians** will be well worth going along to see. **Ormond** at Ormond with its strong tradition and long links with A Section should make it a hattrick and lift themselves clear of relegation — for the moment.

University Blues proved its class and cemented top place by downing **Marcellin** who have now lost successive home matches. The "eagles" must beat **Scotch** to stay in the Four and **Scotch** has plenty of incentive as Clubs below it are catching up. **Collegians** are also in the hot seat, due to poor form of late and will find no joy at the Beaurepaire oval against the Section leaders. Both **Marcellin** and **Collegians** may yet remain in the four as **North O.B.** only 4 points away have a tough task against **De La Salle** at De La.

O.M.'s have a most unenviable task against **Old Xavs.** although at least they'll be playing at home. A loss today and its B Grade next year. However the navy blues are bound to give everything in this last ditch hope of survival and may catch **Old Xavs** on the wrong foot. They still can't believe how they lost last week.

Old Paradians proved they're the side to beat by accounting for **Alphington** for the second time this season, whilst **Bulleen-Templestowe** were downed by a disciplined **A.J.A.X.**

St. Kevin's are out of the four for the first time this year and will be hard pressed to return, whilst **Parkside** is playing the sort of football that wins promotion. **M.H.S.O.B.** are quietly confident of avoiding relegation, and have certainly put the pressure on **Old Haileybury**.

Old Ivanhoe continues to mount its challenge for a finals berth but may have left its run too late as **Fawkner** are sure they're not going to make way for them, and **Therry & Banyule** appear safe enough.

Whoever misses out in F Section as three of the top seven must, will be most unfortunate as it is rare that so many teams are as even as scores this season suggest.

With only five rounds remaining interest in all Sections, Senior, U19s and Reserves is particularly high.

ANOTHER 'TON' TO CAMBERS

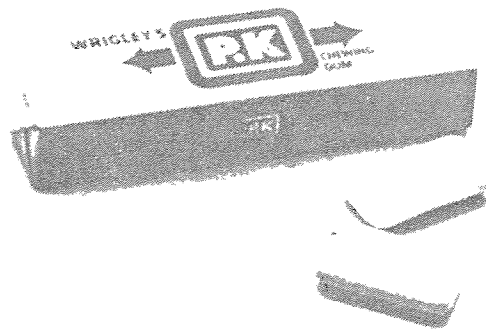
