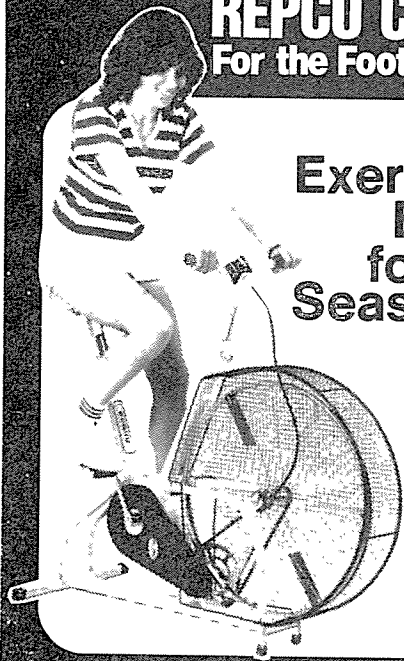

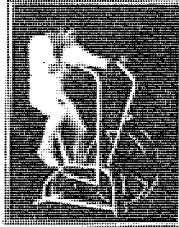

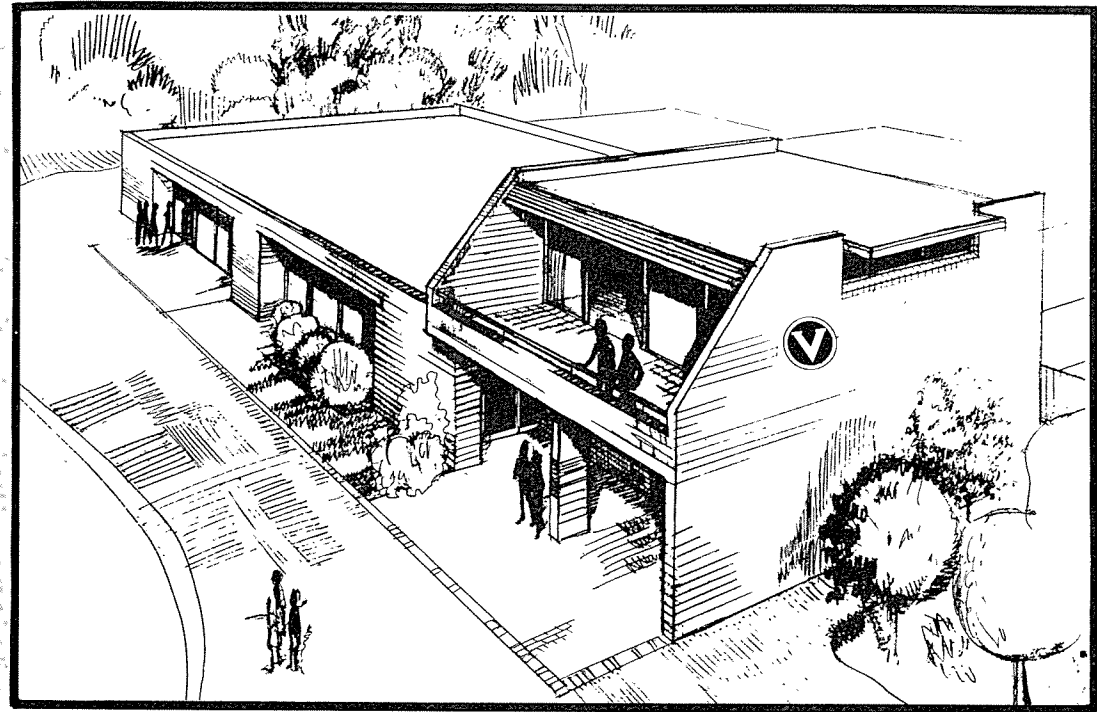

## IN THE GOAL SQUARE

COLLEGIANS TO PRELIM AS NORTH OB FADE  
KEW BEAT ALPHINGTON BY A POINT  
PARKSIDE TO MEET ST. PIUS AND  
CAULFIELD GRAM. RETURN TO B SECTION  
BANYULE INTO C, THOMASTOWN D  
AND F.I.T.O.B.E  
IN U.19's ORMOND, MARCELLIN & ST. KILDA  
REACH GRAND FINAL

After a slow start **Collegians** found its early season running form and were able to outpace and outplay their slower moving opponents to record a 29 point win over the defending premiers and thus eliminate North O.B. from the 1983 premiership race.

In B Section, **Kew** fought back gallantly to beat Alphington by a point in the last thirty seconds of their 1st semi final and so proceeded to the Preliminary final next week at **Harry Trott**.

In C Section **St. Pius** disappointed against Caulfield Grammar whose 8 goal first quarter proved the key to the match. In the 1st semi at Kew, **Parkside**

ended Hampton Rovers' season and are quietly confident of upsetting St. Pius today.

In D Section **Banyule** and **Therry** staged a close and exciting 2nd semi before Banyule pulled clear and upset the favourites by three goals. A point behind at half time, Fawknor piled on 10 goals to North Brunswick's 5 in the second half and predictably move into today's Preliminary final against arch rivals Therry.

**Thomastown's** win over Balaclava brought it one step away from the perfect season whilst Old Trinity end Peninsula O.B.'s hopes of moving into D Section.

**U.H.S.O.B.** caused somewhat of a boil over by ousting Commonwealth Bank. Uni. High only made the four after the last home & home match and could well earn promotion to E Section as it appears to have Old Geelong's measure judging from the season's results.

In the U.19s **Ormond** thrashed Banyule to the tune of 15 goals and **Marcellin** also surprised by beating Fawknor. Predictably **St. Kilda CBC** proved too strong for Monash Blues after an even first half.

### TWO 50's AT COLLEGIANS

**Andrew Daff** carried on a magnificent family tradition when he played his first game for **Collegians F.C.** in 1980 while still a school-boy. In donning the purple and gold Collegians jumper, Andrew followed in the proud footsteps of his grandfather **Charles Daff** (who, along with brother **Laurie** played with the Lions between 1906 and 1920), his father **Graham Daff** (who played 254 Senior games and was a Victorian Representative) and uncle **Russell Daff**

(180 games and a Victorian and All-Australian player). Both Graham and Russell were members of the Collegians sides which won 5 premierships in 6 years between 1957 and 1961.

Faced with the daunting task of living up to his famous forebearers, Andrew commenced in the best possible fashion — with 4 goals and a 'Best on Ground' performance in his debut. Fifty games on Andrew has already taken the club Best and Fairest (in 1982), has attained regular state representation and established himself as a footballer of rare talent. He is a key to Collegians A Grade Premiership chances and all Collegians firstly congratulate him on his 50th game played against Old Scotch in Round 16 and wish him well in this years' Finals.

Another classic Collegian played his 50th game two weeks prior to Andrew — against University Blues in Round 14. **Stuart Hinchin**, or 'Dereck' to his friends, first played for the Lions in 1981 after being asked down by his older brother **Clint Hinchin** (otherwise known as 'Clive'). It was not long before Clint began to regret the presence of his young brother as Stuart, with a great deal of unbrotherly relish, quickly assumed his ageing brothers senior berth. A raw-boned and rugged defender with surprising pace, Stuart soon came to the attention of the state selectors. He played at full back for the Victorian U/18 team in his first season, then captained the state U/19 team against the V.F.A. the following year. Senior state selection is only a matter of time. Stuart is currently enjoying a fine year — so much so that he has been shifted from defence to ruck-roving and is the writer's tip for the Best & Fairest.

Congratulations Stuart on your 50th game, and congratulations too on your recent goal kicking exploits. We all look forward to a continuation of your good form in the Finals — and a few more goals to boot. All Collegians are very proud of both you and Andrew.
