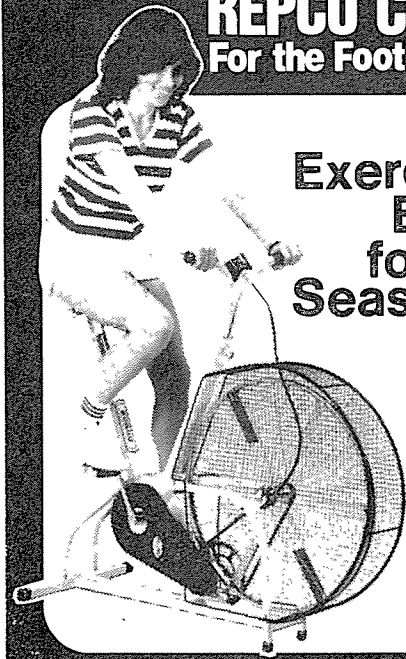

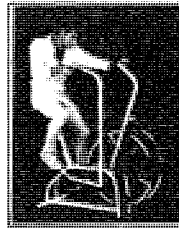

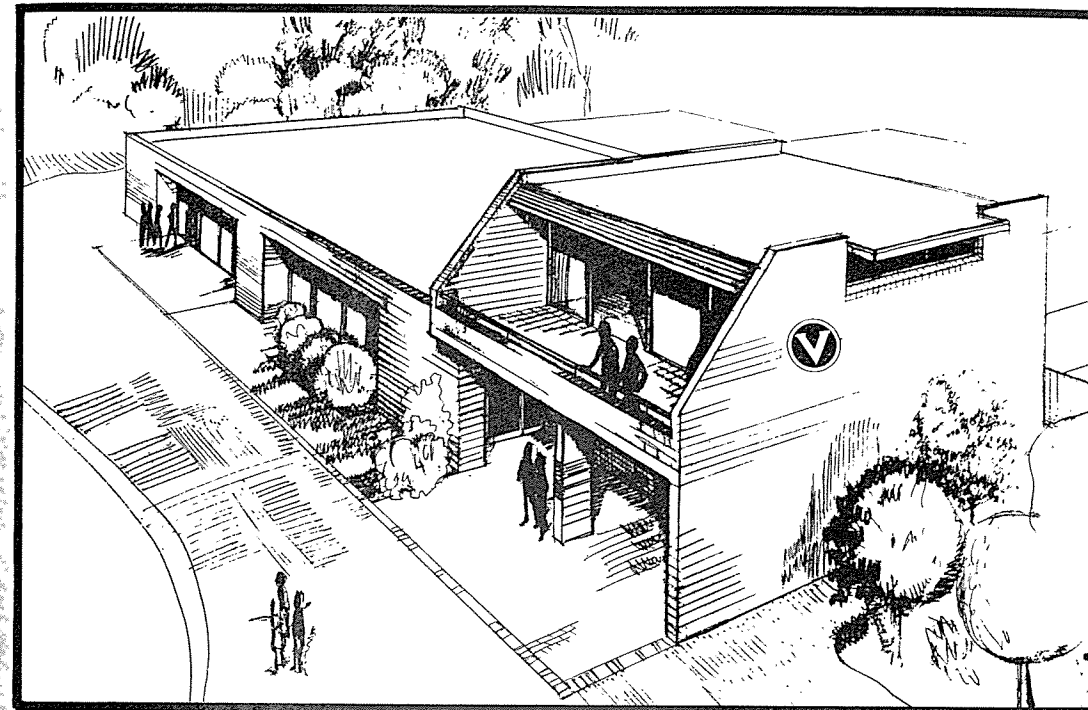

IN THE GOAL SQUARE

BIG WEEKEND FOR DE LA — SENIORS IN GRAND FINAL AND MICK DEVERSON WINS A SECTION B & F OLD PARADIANS FALTER ALLOWING BULLEEN-TEMPLESTOWE INTO A SECTION PARKSIDE, FAWKNER, OLD TRINITY & U.H.S.O.B. EARN PROMOTION MONASH BLUES, FAWKNER & ST. BERNARD'S MOVE INTO U.19 GRAND FINALS

De La Salle surprised many A Section followers with their victory over the more fancied Univ. Blues who must now beat Collegians to earn a rematch. The Blues and Old Paradians would do well to reflect on the fate of second-semi losers in other sections.

St. Pius, Therry, Balaclava, Old Geelong and Banyule U.19's all 2nd semi losers, tragically for them and their supporters repeated the performance in the preliminary final, so the double chance was not as vital as in other seasons.

The Blues began well in the opening senior game at Elsternwick Park for 1983. However halfway through the 2nd term De La's persistence began to pay off and they hit the front at half time. Blues made little use of the wind during the 3rd quarter and De La matched them goal for goal and bump for bump.

De La sensed victory at 3/4 time and even though the Blues fought it right out De La looked winners. Mike Greene gave the victors a lion hearted performance in the ruck and received grand support from De La's little men. A Section Best and Fairest winner Mick Deveson was another of De La's star players and as usual Shane Murphy saved his better form for the "big" games.

Sid Myers offered no excuses after the game and has not pressed the panic button. Blues had a number of players below form and today's game and the condition of Elsternwick Park will suit the running and skilful players in both sides.

On a heavy ground at Camberwell, Bulleen-Templestowe outplayed Old Paradians for a deserved win and will now play in A Section for the first time in 1984.

Kew and Old Paradians prelim. final at Harry Trott will be a do or die affair and a game well worth attending.

St. Pius' inaccuracy cost them dearly in the vital 2nd quarter against Parkside and had no answer to the Parkside onslaught in the third. It was a most disappointing end to what had been a good season for St. Pius and coach Bill McWhinnie.

In D Section Fawkner proved too strong for old rivals Therry who must line up in D Section again next year.

A similar fate befell Balaclava and Old Geelong in the E & F Section preliminary final. Ken Laker runner-up in the F Section Best and Fairest is now only one step away from 'icing the Uni. High cake'. He has proven a fine player and successful coach of UHSOB.

LOOKING BACK

5 YEARS AGO — 1978

Graeme Simpson, appointed to 'F' section grand final between **Thornbury** and **Bulleen United**, chalked up his 300th game — including 31 finals (8 grand finals), 1970 'A' Grade Grand Final, and 1978's Victoria v Tasmania game.

In a magnificent high-scoring game North Old Boys came from 24 points down at the last change to kick 9.3 to Blues 2.3 and go on to meet Old Scotch in 'A' section Grand Final. Best were **S. Maguire**, **Dillon** (6 gls), **Horan** (NOB) and **Dobbie**, **Holt**, **Tyquin** (Blues). Parkside (B) went down 19.14 to Old Paradians 20.15 with **Howell**, **P. Johnston**, **Nankervis** (Parkside) and **S. Assetta**, **C. Hughes**, **DiPaola** (Old Paradians) stars.

Premierships were won by 'C' Old Xaverians (from fourth place) 'D' Old Camberwell (also from fourth place) 'E' Bulleen-Templestowe (finished on top) 'F' Thornbury (also on top) J1 North Old Boys J2 Old Haileyburians. Old Brighton's **Graeme Templeton** played his 250th game in 'C' Reserve Grand Final — against St. Kilda CBCOC and it was a draw, 8.5 apiece.

V.A.F.A. innovations for the season: "two umpire" system and the introduction of the interchange rule to replace the old nineteenth and twentieth man concept. Social successes were the Presidents' and Secretaries Annual Dinner at Chaucer's when presentations were made to retiring secretary **Jack Fullerton** and his wife, **Norma**, the sympathetic listener over years to club's grievances; and the Best and Fairest Vote Count at Collingwood.

10 YEARS AGO — 1973

What a thriller! **St. Bernard's** won their way into the 'A' section Grand Final when they beat **Ormond** with a goal kicked after the siren. Ormond led by 28 points at three-quarter time, but with the wind still blowing strongly, St. Bernard's plugged away until they were only 4 points behind with about five minutes to play. Ormond rallied to score a goal and it looked all over, but St. Bernard's got another and then from a free kick, given only seconds before the siren, goaled to win by 3 points. Best were **G. Mahoney**, **Ginnivan**, **Burgin**, **K. Phegan**, **Schwarzenberg**, **King** (St. Bernard's) and **R. Cameron**, **Rob Curtis**, **I. Cameron** (4 goals), **Logan**, **Kozlowski**, **Slerakowski** (Ormond).

Marcellin held off a strong finish by **State Bank** to win 8.9.57 to 7.11.53 and ensure promotion to 'C'. Stars were **Wilson**, **Power**, **Allen** (Marcellin O.C.) and **Collis**, **Roberts**, **Jeffrey** (State Bank).

Monash Whites kicked victory away in 'F' section Final — 8.21.69 to **St. Bede's** 11.4.70. Mentions were given to **Bradbury**, **P. Ryan**, **Campbell** (St. Bede's) and **Tooley**, **Roth**, **Woolf** (Monash).

15 YEARS AGO — 1968

'C' section Best and Fairest was **Richard Mannix** (Footscray Tech) with 22 points from **L. Smith** (Hampton Rovers) runner-up with 21 points.

Caulfield Grammarians were too strong for **U. Blues** 16.11 to 13.15 and gained the chance to have another 'go' at Old Paradians. **Atchison** was again **Caulfield's** star, well supported by **J. & P. Hore**, and **G. Tootell**, **Sykes**, **Stewart**, **Collett** were best for Blues.

U.H.S.O.B.'s inaccuracy, 4.13, cost them victory against **Monash's** 7.9. Best **Wettenhall**, **McMaster**, **Rattray** (M. Blues) and **Smith**, **Joslin**, **McCartney** (U.H.S.O.B.).

F.I.T.O.B. won the 'C' section premiership, 11.8 to **St. Bernard's** 7.9.

25 YEARS AGO — 1958

Old Scotch knocked **Old Xaverians** out of finals when a great second half enabled them to win by 3 goals and earn the right to play Collegians in 'A' section Grand Final.

Old Paradians were far too good for Commonwealth Bank in 'B' and would meet U. Blacks in Grand Final.

U. Reds run of narrow finals losses continued when A.N.Z. beat them by 4 points.

Hampton Scouts in Junior section second semi caused a major upset when they beat leaders Alphongeton, who had lost only one game previously and that by a narrow margin.

University then defeated Alphongeton in Prelim, Final and lined up against Hampton Scouts in the Grand Final.

35 YEARS AGO — 1948

Univ. Blacks were outplayed by **Old Melburnians** in the second half to lose the final by 17 points; Blacks had the right of challenge and the two teams would play off again in the Grand Final at St. Kevin's Oval.

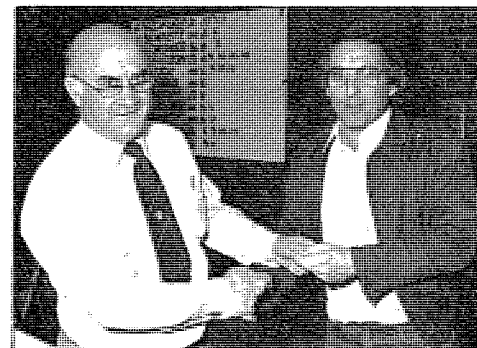

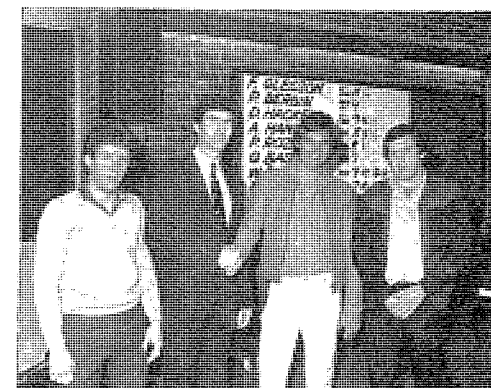
