

A LOOK AT WEEK TWO

ORMOND JUST FAIL — COLLEGIANS AGAIN — IVANHOE TOO STRONG

University Blues just managed to hold off Ormond and score by one point in an even and entertaining game at the Beaurepaire oval. Naylor gave the visitors a great last quarter in a game they should have won, but its two out of two for Blues and their match today against Old Scotch will be another significant test for both sides.

Collegians continued on their winning way against De La Salle. After an even first half the "Lions" proved too pacy and skilful for their visitors and now loom as one of the main threats in A Section.

Ivanhoe were too strong. North have got to break the ice and coach Terry Scanlon will be as worried as his rival Gerrard Shally in today's big game against Old Xaverians who are also without a win.

Old Scotch showing great desire and relishing the width of the Seven at Ovals showed some of the form expected of them, and as a very even combination led the Xavs all day.

Marcellin opened their account at the expense of a pathetic display by Old Melburnians who are sure to have paid for it on the training track this week. The win, a personal triumph for replacement coach, Mick Butler will lift the confidence of the 'Eagles' and give them a real chance today against Ormond.

In B Section Bulleen Templestowe brought Alphington back to the field with a fine win in a high scoring game. Old Paradians had ten goals to spare against Monash, whilst Kew came from behind to record its second win — this time against the Blacks. Old Camberwell bounced back well from their drubbing last week and repeated their C Section Grand Final win against Coburg who have now lost both games.

St. Bernard's surprised A.J.A.X. and ran out comfortable winners.

Caulfield Grammarians moved to top place in C Section with a big win over Old Brighton, due in no small way to full forward David Matthews who kicked 12 goals. St. Pius opened up a 5 goal break on St. Kevin's and clung on tenaciously for the 4 points which sees them as the only other undefeated side. Old Brighton and Melbourne High School are yet to break the ice.

In 'D' Section, Old Ivanhoe Grammarians and North Brunswick registered the first drawn match of the season whilst Therry is the clear leader as Fawkner have had the advantage of the Bye.

In U.19 Premier Division Old Scotch recorded a rather worthy win finishing too strongly for the students and St. Bernard's headed North O.B. all day winning by two goals in an inaccurate display.

In Zone 2 Old Melburnians had a huge win over Old Brighton who are possibly short of a run, having received a forfeit in round one. Old Xavs. kicked the sweep against Melbourne High, Hampton Rovers came from behind to down Monash Blues and St. Kilda CBCOC moved to top spot after defeating Old Camberwell by more than 23 goals.

Full marks to John Pierdue and Collegians for their endeavours in fielding an U.19 side in Zone 2 last week. Collegians have replaced Caulfield Grammarians, a late withdrawal, and even though defeated, put in a creditable performance. John was coach, goal-umpire, time keeper and team manager and hopefully will have a trifle more "off" field support this week.

Michael "Tommy" Butler has been appointed coach of Marcellin O.C. replacing Peter O'Donohue who has retired on Doctor's advice. Peter has been an ornament to the Amateur game and has coached Uni. Blacks (1974 A Section Premiers), Old Melburnians, Marcellin and the State. All associated with Amateur football wish Peter the very best in his "enforced retirement".

Michael Butler is a fine choice as his replacement. He holds the record of games played at Marcellin (207) and has had experience coaching the Reserves and Thomastown High in the Herald Shield. A player who as Captain led by example, Michael will bring discipline, dedication and devotion to football at Marcellin.

Umpires come in for plenty of criticism each week, however coach John Moss is urging the clubs to invite umpires to attend training each week. This is an ideal opportunity for the players and coaching staff to get to know the "men in white".






