WEST HEIDELBERG WHISPERS!

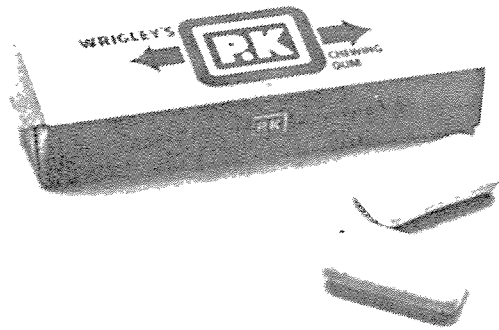

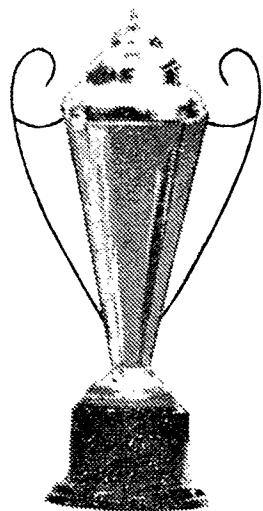
improved" player trophy for his efforts in 1982 with MHSOB.

Congratulations to 200 games AJAX Reserves player **Tony Robin**, a dedicated worker for the Club on and off the field. Life member of MUF, **Frank Henegan** boundary umpired his 200th game for University.

150 games to De La Salle's "Swivel Hips" **Chris Lofts**, State Bank's ex Portland boy **Alan Pitts**, Old Brighton's **John Barry**, Heatherton faredwell **Peter Schiller** on his transfer to the London office of his company — and thanked him for his magnificent coaching record, 3 premierships and a runner-up in 5 years.

De La Salle's inaccurate kicking 12.19 to **Kew** 14.10 left De La on the bottom of "B" Section after 5 games without a win.

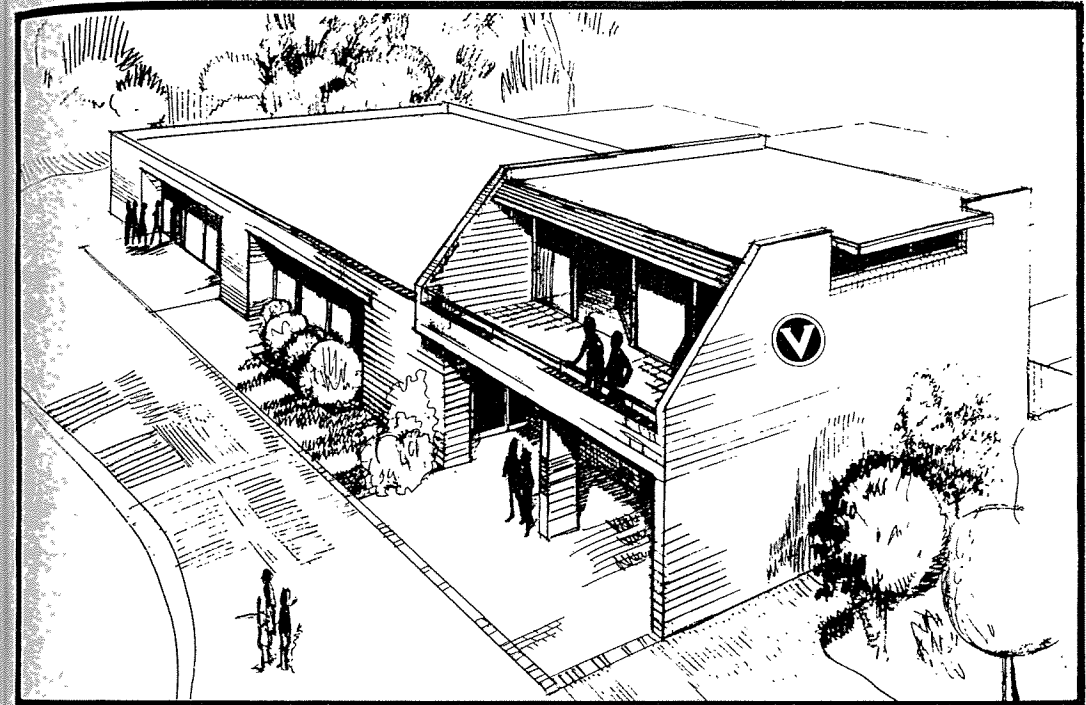

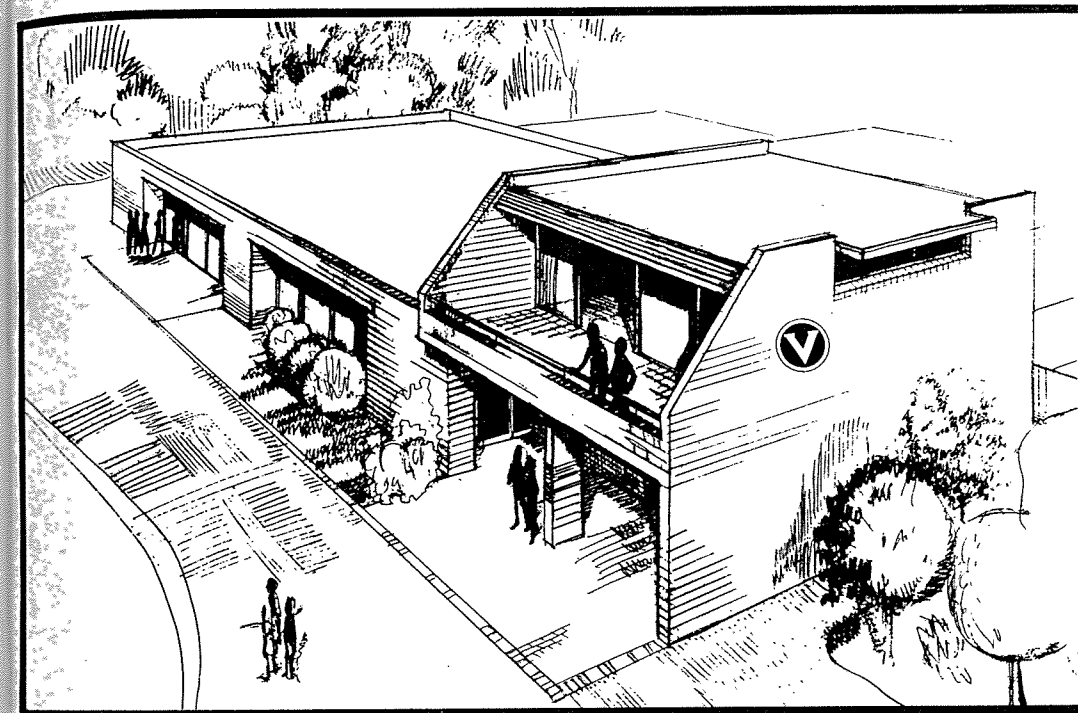
