A Section Review

At the half way mark of the season, it looks very difficult to predict the four. Any of the top six could make it but **De La** appear to be losing touch and even though the **Blues** are playing well they have a lot of ground to make up.

Scotch took over top position when they beat **Collegians** by 9 points at Harry Trott. **Collegians** started well and led by 16 points at quarter time, but **Scotch** kicked the first 5 goals in the second quarter and led by 14 points at one stage though **Collegians** fought back to trail by just 1 point at half time. Both sides added 5 goals in a good third quarter and **Collegians** regained the lead three quarter time, by 3 points. It was nip and tuck in the last quarter but 2 goals in the last few minutes gave **Scotch** victory. **Andy Smith** had a good day in the centre for **Scotch** and **Fergus Kiel** had the better of **Tim Bennett**, even though **Bennett** got three goals. I thought **Scotch's** best player was possibly **Ric Senior**; the **Lions** are missing rover **Keith Parsons**. **Collegians** best were defenders **Greg Parsons**, who played a great game, and **Andrew Wright**. Another good player was tall wingman **Jeremy Schmidt**. It was a very enjoyable game to watch and could have gone either way. Both had players missing; **Collegians** were missing **Herman** and **Keith Parsons** with injury and **Scotch** were without **Sherwen** and **Thompson**, Marx did his hamstring and **Mason** was unavailable. Another significant return was that of **Scotch** forward **Scott Nelson** — he could be a big asset for them.

In the replay of last year's grand final at Elsternwick, **Ormond** tuned the tables on **De La Salle** by 41 points. **Mark McDonald** had the better of **Mick Deveson** and finished with 4 goals. **Geoff Singleton** got 6 at full forward and was given his opportunities by **Boyanton**, **Sutherland** and **Eishold**, all on-ball players. **Ritchie** and **Beard** defended well. **Shane Murphy** starred for **De La** and kicked 5 goals and **Mick Green** continued his good comeback in the ruck. **Hill** and **McDonnell** were steady across the centre but overall **De La** were quite disappointing.

The upset of the day was up at the University where the **Blues** trounced third placed **Ivanhoe** by 69 points. Full forward **Mary Tyquin** starred with 9 goals and the **Blues** had other good half forwards in **Roger Curnow** and **Don McInnes**. **Grutzner** continues to impress in the ruck and **Tim Carey** was solid in defence. **Alan Salter** would not have enjoyed the return to the University but he was gracious in defeat and told the **Blues** that he could not understand their lowly position on the ladder. His better players were ruckman **Wally Dulevskis**, wingman **Tim Donohue** and half backs **Greg Cameron** and **Tony Course**.

Old Xaverians ran out of time and failed by just 3 points to upset **Bulleen-Templestowe**. **Bulleen's** greater accuracy and earlier ascendancy proved just enough. Bullants **Stephen Pace** was again on target with six goals and **Steve Curtain** got 4, all in the desperate last quarter. **Kazuro, Delanty** and **Gilmore** were impassable for three quarters for **Bulleen** and for the **Xavs** **Ry an** and **Barry** were great triers.

At the Brens Oval, **North's** seven goal burst in the thir quarter was the main difference in their 49 point win over **St. Bernards**. The experienced players at **North**, **Borcich**, **Griffin** and **O'Rourke** did well as did newcomer **Ball**. For the **Saints** their best was again captain **Gary McAllister**, and **Grbac** and **Wood** were good contributors too.

VAFA v VFA

The VAFA was defeated by 9 points by the VFA in the fourth annual Victorian Football Cup clash: a game in which football was the winner.

The crowd at Preston was estimated at 5,000. Everyone left feeling that the game was a thoroughly absorbing and worthwhile affair, in spite of the very cold, blustery conditions.

The VAFA's original squad of 25 was badly depleted. Six players were unavailable: **Kiel** (thigh), **Gilmore** (knee), **De Marte** (thigh), **Spillane** (ankle), **Mike**

McDonald (virus) and **Peter Gittos** for family reasons. That left 19 players, so three more got their chance: **James Garde** (Blacks ruckman), **Tim Cooke** (De La Salle utility) and **Rick Garde** (Blacks ruckman), **Tim Cooke** (De La Salle utility) and **Rick Van Den Driest** (Bulleen-Temp halfback). **Ormond's** **Alan Naylor** was the unlucky player to miss the 21.

The VAFA lined up a little differently from the selected side. **Considine** was in the forward pocket, and **Deveson** in the back pocket. But changes had to

be made fairly quickly as the VFA got off to a good start kicking with the breeze. **O Riley** looked very dangerous up forward so **Mike Green** moved **Considine** on to him and **Deveson** to the back flank where he became a good player.

The VFA kicked 7 goals in the first term, but the Amateurs did well to kick 4 goals into the stiff breeze, and trailed by 22 points at quarter time.

The VAFA attacked for the first part of the second term, but it was the VFA who increased their lead to 31 points early in the second term. The VAFA was struggling. **Van Den Driest** came on to the back flank and he provided a lift and the Amateurs slammed on 5 goals, with the busy **Eishold** levelling the scores at the 29 minute mark. Centreman **Andy Smy** had been instrumental in lifting the VAFA.

The VFA supporters behind me were pleased that it was a close game, that the VAFA were making a game of it. But, as the third quarter were on and the VAFA got on top with more desperate play they weren't so impressed and voiced their disapproval of the men in white. It was a great quarter by the Amateurs as they increased their lead to 20 points into the breeze. It was a much better game in the second half and the crowd had come to life. **Mark McDonald** was coming into it at centre half forward and **Rohan Brown** was on top in the ruck. **Mark McDonald** was on top on his wing and **Stephen Clark** was a desperate rover. But at the 23rd minute mark of the third quarter, **Gary Brice** made two moves which probably changed the course of the match. The effect of **Ian Rickman** coming onto the forward flank was obvious; he provided a big lift. But the departure of **Neil Jordan** from the back pocket did not mean the end of his contribution. The VFA clawed their way back to trail by 13 points at the final change, but the Amateurs had the breeze in the last term.

Eishold kicked the first goal at the 3 minute mark and the lead increased to 19 points. But it was to be our last goal. **Brice** brought **Jordan** on and put him on the ball, and he began to take over as **Brown** had run himself into the ground. **Ian Rickman** continued to be a focal point for the VFA and with **Considine** off the ground, **O Riley** began to come into it. The VAFA battled hard but they didn't have the legs to go on with it and the VFA hit the front at the 18 minute mark. There were still chances to win but **Lumicisi** sealed it for the VFA with a goal just before the siren. The VFA supporters behind me were relieved, but they had great admiration for the spirited display by our players and a healthy respect for the Victorian Amateur Football Association. Well done! The game was played in the right spirit — a credit to both competitions. Perhaps Blues fullback **Pat Salinger** typified the effort — he kept full forward **Mark Fotheringham** to just one goal. They deserve your support in future matches.
