Carnival Review

South Australia won the 16th A AFC Carnival at Elsternwick last week. The final standings were:

South Australia	12
Western Australia	8
Victoria	4
Tasmania	0

The carnival began on Sunday June 30 with South Australia overcoming a determined Tasmania by 54 points. South Australia looked far from impressive in that match.

In the main game Victoria beat W.A. by 29 points in an exciting game. W.A. started slowly with the breeze and led by just 20 points at quarter time. Victoria had a good second term and with 8 goals went to an 18 point lead at half time. The Victorians still led at the final break by 2 points but had the wind advantage in the final quarter. But Victoria struggled to shake off a determined W.A. who took the lead and did not surrender it until half way through the last term. It was perhaps a sign of things to come and the 5 quick goals the Victorians kicked probably camouflaged their lack of physical strength up forward. Notwithstanding the above, **Sherwen** kicked 6 goals and **Murphy** was brilliant on the flank and kicked 4.

Afterwards it was discovered that **Andrew Smythe (Bulleen-Templestowe)** had played for Melbourne Reserves on the previous Saturday and in failing to inform the V.A.F.A. became an ineligible player as no new permit form had been lodged. The V.A.F.A. had unwittingly played **Smythe** and on discovery informed the other States and the matter was referred to the A.A.F.C. for decision.

Victoria subsequently lost the 4 points from that match, so the S.A.-W.A. match immediately took on a new significance. S.A. beat W.A. by 47 points after W.A. again made poor use of the breeze in the first quarter. W.A. appeared to have suffered a let down after their good performance against Victoria on Sunday.

Victoria cruised to a comfortable 77 point victory over Tasmania kicking 9 goals in each

quarter they had the breeze. **Sherwen** got another 6 and this time so too did **Mark McDonald**.

On Saturday W.A. thrashed Tasmania by 107 points in the early game with 9 of their goals coming in the last term.

Victoria needed to beat S.A. by about a goal to win the carnival but such was not to be. Victoria started reasonably under ideal conditions and led by 10 points at quarter time. Scores were level at half time but S.A. started to gain the ascendancy in the third term and led by 12 points at the last break. We all expected a dour struggle in the last stanza but instead S.A. unleashed a barrage of goals — 11 in all to Victoria's measly 3 late in the term, to go on to a thoroughly deserved and convincing win.

S.A. had too much physical strength and marking power. Victoria's forwards were kept well in check and the Victorians in the end were even outrun by the South Australians. **Nick Wilton** and **Guy Ritchie** were resilient in defence.

The carnival win is S.A.'s fifth and a repeat of their success in the last carnival in Melbourne in 1973 on the M.C.G.

The winner of the A.A.F.C. Medal for Best and Fairest in the carnival was **Rob Thomas** from Tasmania.

Seven Victorian players were named in the All-Australian side. They are: **Rohan Brown**, Deputy Vice-Captain (Old Melburnians), **Mick Deveson** (De La Salle), **Simon Eishold** (Ormond), **Peter Gittos** (Ivanhoe), **John Kanis** (Caulfield Gammarians), **Peter Sherwen** (Old Scotch) and **Nick Wilton** (Old Xaverians).

Whether you call him The Fean, Mumbles, Morph, Bazza, Sir Barry or just plain old Barry, when Barry Morphet runs out against **Caulfield** on Saturday with the Old Melburnians, he will notch his 310th game (something even mortels in league football would bow to as an extremely precious moment in any footballer's career). Another chapter of history will be created as was the first Saturday when **Barry** played with **Caulfield** in '67. He played a total of 175 games with **Caulfield**, 122 games with the **OM's** and 13 State Games. With more accolades than you can poke a stick at, he has achieved nearly everything in Amateur Football, winning 3 Best and Fairest at **Caulfield**, 1969, '73 and '75, playing in 3 winning Grand Finals, one with **Caulfield** in a winning A Grade team in 1970, and 2 with the **OM's**, B Grade in 1978 and '82. Barry tells me one of his greatest highlights was coaching the **OM's** to victory against **S.P.O.C.** in 1983. One of his biggest idols in Amateur Football was **Jock Nelson** (a stalwart of the amateurs) and being coached by him at school when they won 2 premierships.

At 35, it's incredible to believe when **Barry** runs out on Saturday, half the Under 19's weren't even born when **Bazza** was playing his first and second years of Amateur Footy, but then again, with the great season he's having, **Barry** seems to have found the solution to eternal youth and could be classified (in the Bernie Quinlan bracket), as not just a footballer but as a true athlete, with undoubtedly many more years to come.

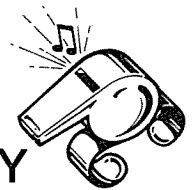

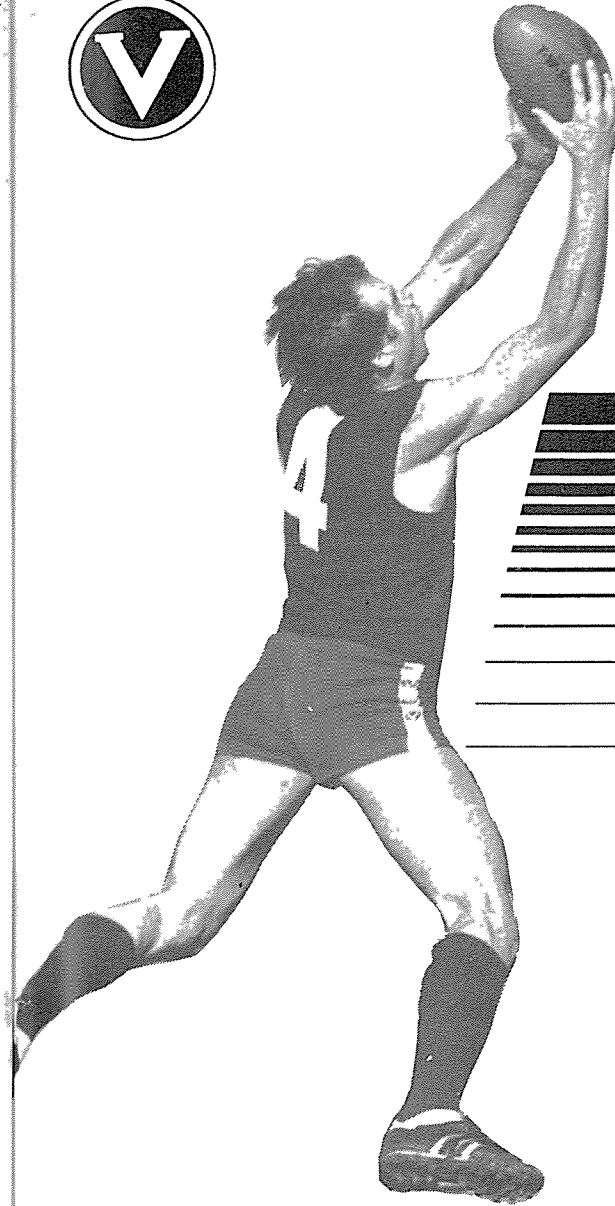
