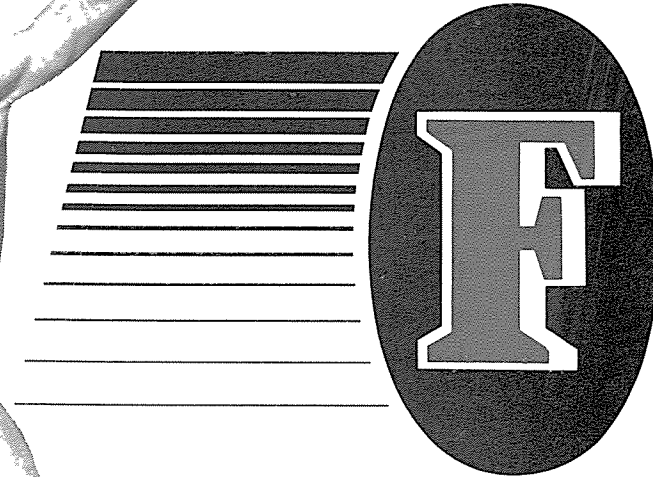
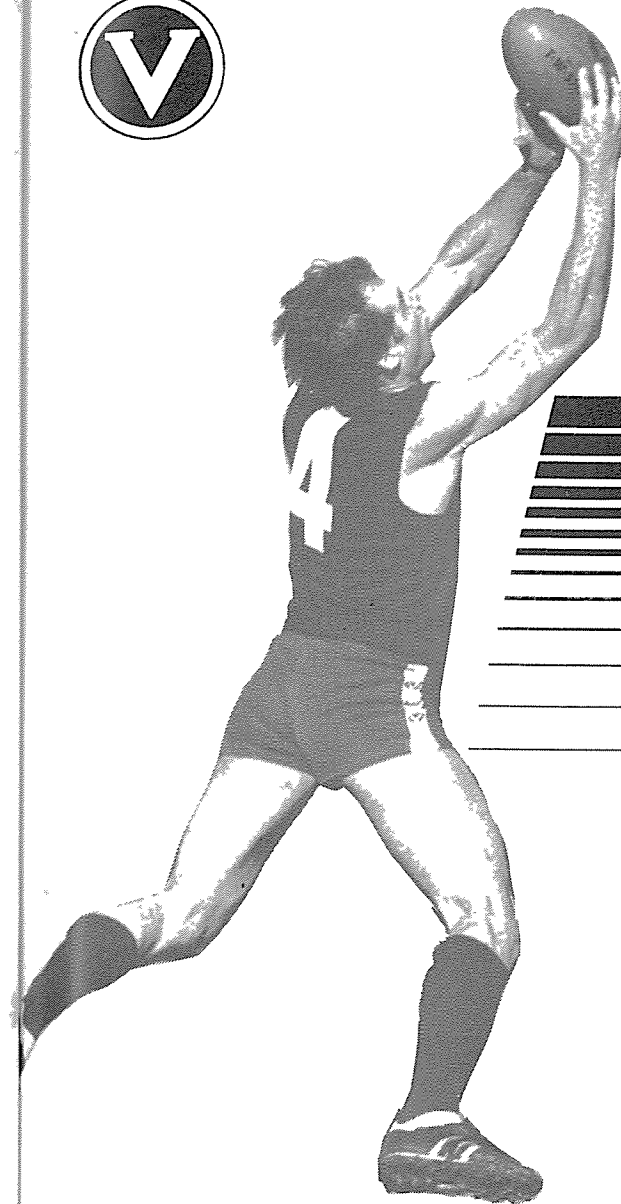

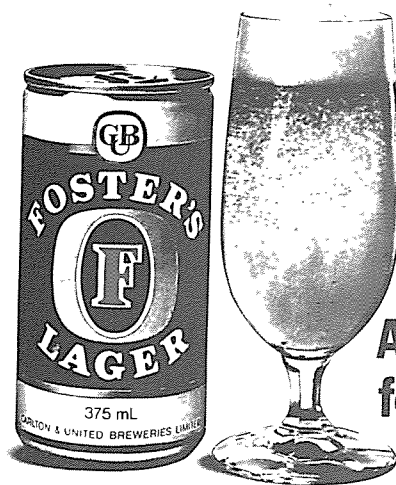

A Section Review

Ormond's winning run of 6 matches was ended by **Old Scotch** when they inflicted an 8 point defeat on the 'Monds'. Scotch stamped themselves as a premiership threat with the win over the section leader in a closely contested and low-scoring game. **John Moir** marked strongly around the ground for the Cardinals and **Brian Hodge** was elusive on the half forward flank. Ormond's best were **Paul Sutherland** on the wing and ruck-rover **Phil Mehrten**.

St. Bernards scored an upset win over **Ivanhoe** by 35 points and in so doing moved back out of the relegation zone. The loss puts Ivanhoe down to 6th place. The Saints were very much more desperate and effectively won the game in the second quarter with a 10 goal burst. Ivanhoe fought back in the last term but it was far too late. **Greg Lane** kicked 4 goals for the Saints, but their best was giant ruckman **Paul Smith**.

Collegians scored a comfortable 39 point win over **Bulleen-Templestowe** which effectively ends the Bullants chances of playing in the finals. Collegians won the game in the third quarter after an even first half when they outscored Bulleen by 4 goals to 3 into the breeze. **Geoff English** kicked 4 goals and **Jeremy Schmidt** dominated in the air on his wing. Bulleen-Temp have been weakened by the loss of **Andy Smythe** to Melbourne and **Stephen Clark** to Essendon. Even coach **Mike Zemski's** 1 goal was not enough to lift the Bullants to victory!

North Old Boys had a good 23 point win over **University Blues** to take themselves back into the four. North had a good third quarter with the breeze but kicked inaccurately : 4.8, and their back line held Blues to a miserable 2 goals to three quarter time. Key defenders **Considine** and **Griffin** were grand defenders.

Blues best were new boy **Anthony Allen** in the centre and **Simon Macaulay** on the forward flank. Blues are now back in the hot seat facing relegation.

De La Salle humiliated **Old Xaverians** by 76 points. Xavs were held goalless till half time and kicked only 2 goals for the day, thanks to **Nick Wilton**. De La forward **Tony Vitacca** kicked 4 goals and he and **Pat Maher** were provided many opportunities by ruckman **Brian Hanrahan**. For Xavs **Peter Klein** battled hard against **Mick Deveson**, and **Geoff Greetham** held **Phil Kerin** to 2 goals.

The Whisper Looks at Last Week and Previews Today's Games

Ivanhoe Amateurs you blew it! A great chance to cement a place in the final 4 and seriously challenge for Premiership honors and you couldn't handle it. There is no doubting the value of relegation and promotion. What could well have been a meaningless match became a battle for survival for **St. Bernard's** and they responded magnificently. I couldn't for the life of me understand why **Alan Salter** left his best player and skipper **Peter Gittos** at full back for 3 quarters. Sure Gittos was there to mind **Greg Lane** but I'd have thought Gittos would have been better at say centre half back thus reducing the opportunities Lane had. When he was sent onto the ball in the last term he really had an input on the game but by then it was too late.

Although Ormond lowered its colours as I sort of pointed to Old Scotch last week, I won't hear of them losing 2 in a row especially as they meet amateur football's latest pretenders. Ormond are now only a game clear of the two big improvers in A Section, Old Scotch and Collegians and must ensure the double chance if it is to be the premier team this season. I doubt if Ivanhoe has the discipline, class or ability to match it with Ormond for whom **Michael Oaten** kicked 6 important goals in the Reserves last week.

As **De La Salle** is poised in 5th position and only 1 percent behind, **North O.B.** has more than enough incentive to pull out all stops against the Old Xaverians whose form of late is just woeful.

Xavs could only manage 2 goals last week whilst North as expected was an impressive winner against the Blues. The bottom has really fallen out of Old Xaverians for whom the next 5 weeks cannot pass quickly enough.

St. Bernards cock full of confidence after its upset win over **Ivanhoe** believe they can do Collegians and pull themselves well clear of relegation. I don't. Collegians has a pretty useful outfit at present and has even learnt the art of winning away from Harry Trott. Its small men will worry **St. Bernards** and with a dominant centre line led by young **Jeremy Schmidt** Collegians greater ability will give them the points.

Bulleen-Templestowe has one last remote chance and it must beat De La Salle to maintain it. De La has enjoyed having its back to the wall and has responded, as those who have followed amateur football in the past decade have come to expect, with deeds and actions on the field. With a place in the 4 beckoning, De La, even in its red guernsey, will have all the answers and by winning today will remind North, Collegians, and Old Scotch that it is far from a spent force.

Uni. Blues host **Old Scotch** who are still up in the air over the win against Ormond. Blues will be desperate following **St. Bernard's** surprise win and I've a hunch they'll catch the Cardinals on the hop and cause the upset of the season in winning today.

So its Ormond, De La Salle, North OB, Collegians and Uni. Blues.

AJAX won its second match of the season last week against a disappointing **Kew** who took the surprise decision of sacking coach **Ray Sleeth** in the week before the match. There's something wrong at Kew and even at home

where they produce by far their best football, they are simply not in the class of Uni. Blacks who are out to prove they're the best side out of the 4. It would be a fairy tale finish for the Blacks to play in the finals and I'm sure the current 4 who I believe will remain will be more than happy for the Blacks to finish fifth.

Old Paradians who put up a creditable performance against **Parkside** will need to be on their mettle for the vital match against **AJAX**. Success breeds success and if **AJAX** get the sniff of another victory, they'll prove hard to toss, even at Bundoora. However having taken the Blues as a long shot in A section I must go for the Old Paradians whose victory will give them a very handy 6 point lead over Kew in the battle for relegation.

Caulfield Grammarians finds itself in the match of the day for the second week in a row. They were disgraceful last week against **Marcellin** and did not look like a top side. This game will be a ripper and Parkside will relish the small Albert Park oval and with the big man strength to match Caulfield, I think by Saturday night we'll have a 3way tie at the head of B section and the "fields" may fall from first to third.

St. Kilda has its last chance to stay in the B section finals race with a home game against 4th placed **Old Melburnians**. O.M.'s hold a handy 6 point margin and will be hard pressed to keep it. The Saints will literally throw everything into this last effort and O.M.'s may be found wanting. I think that at home **St. Kilda** can win and keep the interest in 4th spot wide open. You can be sure the Blacks will be sweating on the result.

In the remaining match in B Section **Marcellin** take the trip south to meet **Old Brighton** whose record at home compares favourably with that of its visitor. **Old Brighton** has done well in B section and had **Peter Grant** and others remained injury free and available on a regular basis, then the bay side lads would be higher up the B section ladder. With the possibility of top place as the prize I can't see **Neil LeLievre** allowing any of those young eagles to go into this game with swollen heads and its a **Marcellin** victory for mine.

What a competition C Section is turning out to be. A draw in a desperate finish between **Monash** and **Hampton Rovers**, predictable wins by **Fawkner** and **Therry** and **Thomastown** vital away win at **Old Camberwell** means that 4th place is still wide open and there is no shortage of challengers.

Today **Therry** meet **Banyule** at **Therry** and the home side are mighty firm favourites. The battle of the coaches, both amateur football legends in their own lifetime, **Bernie Dunn** and **Rick Brockwell** will decide the game — Dunn is seen as the cool tactician whilst 'Brocky' is a great on field leader and deep thinker on the game. As **Banyule's** form has been hot and cold I'll stick with the more consistent **Therry**.

St. Kevins are at home to **Old Camberwell** and despite its loss to **Fawkner** is still in with a chance. A win today will bring **St. Kevins** equal with their opponents and surely that is enough incentive, plus the home ground advantage of **Righetti Oval** to score a win.

Thomastown who were in the horrors have rallied and their important victory last Saturday over **Old Camberwell** lifted them temporarily out of relegation worries. At home they should beat **Hampton Rovers** and move even further clear and it wouldn't surprise me if they were to sneak 4th spot before its all over.

Old Haileybury has that quality which committee and supporters love but doesn't win matches — potential. They might use it today to beat and stay within striking distance and at the same time drive a big nail into **Monash**.

No one would pick **Coburg** to beat **Fawkner**. Its last versus first so that enough said.

Match of the round in D Section will be played at Melbourne High between the home side and the undefeated leaders, **Old Trinity**. In what promises to be a great game I'm confident that the High school at home can inflict the first loss of the season on **Trinity** and really hot up the battle for premiership honors. **Trinity** will not enjoy the small ground which would probably fit twice into their own and **Alan Quaife** is bound to have his charges fired up.

Balaclava should restore some lost ground by beating an erratic **Old Ivanhoe** and **North Brunswick** who went down narrowly to **Old Mentonians** last Saturday are the selection over old rivals **Power House**. Its hard to see **State Bank** worrying **Old Mentonians** who are quietly

confident of promotion, and **West Brunswick** will return to the winning list at the expense of poor old **St. Bedes**.

Old Geelong journey to **Preston** where they will confront a side determined to avenge its loss last week. The Oggs face a third loss in a row and couldn't have drawn **Preston** at a worse time.

The big game of course will be played at Mt. Eliza between **Peninsula** and **Heatherton**. **Heatherton** played well last Saturday to beat **Preston** as did the **Pirates** who beat **Bulleen United**. With 4th spot a little more secure I think the **Pirates** will win this match although I agree that **Heatherton** are favourites.

Williamstown cymys will move a step closer and boost its percentage by accounting for **Old Carey** and **Uni. Reds** at home should make it two in a row by beating **Footscray Tech**.

The other match is between **Elsternwick** and **Bulleen United** and in a real test of strength **Elsternwick** has both the form, enthusiasm and superior knowledge of the No. 2 oval to carry the day.

Commonwealth Bank who survived a strong Challenge last Saturday from **Brunswick** will be in the right form and be far too slick for **Old Essendon**. The Dons let **Clayton** kick 8 goals in the last quarter and threw away a golden chance to cement 4th spot.

Brunswick as mentioned was far from disgraced last Saturday and today will carry all before them against **ANZ Bank. Uni. High** who are a bit like **Old Haileybury** — full of potential will also be able to use it today at **Latrobe** and I'm sure they'll win well.

The big match is between two of "far eastern" clubs **Clayton** and **Doveton**. **Clayton** came from behind to beat **Old Essendon** whilst **Doveton** had the bye. The let off may not have been the ideal way to prepare for such a big game at **Clayton** its the Dragons for me.

I went pretty well last Saturday picking 22 winners. How many did you get?

5 Years Ago — 1980

200 games to **M.H.S.O.B.'s** great clubman and boundary umpire **Don Pritchard**.

Caulfield Grammarians saluted **Glen Fletcher's** 100th game — "being a big lump of a chap went straight from school into the seniors where his ability to take 'the big mark' and cover long distances with either foot made him a valuable player in key positions mainly on the forward lines".

No. 32 guernsey and White Ankle Bandages — **Old Brighton Grammarians Mark Dobbie** ran on to the ground for his 150th game.

Umpire **Kevin McMahon** whistled up his 150th game after joining the V.A.F.A. in 1972.

De La Salle O.C. (A) held on to top position when they withstood a strong challenge from fifth place, **Ormond**, 20.12 (132) to 15.15 (105). Best were **Donegan**, **Ruffolo** (6 goals), **Hanrahan** (**De La Salle**) and **Bourne** (9 goals), **McCooke**, **Naylor** (**Ormond**).

Top goalkickers for the season were: — 'A' **Karvalis** (**U. Blues**) 63, 'B' **Curtain** (**O.Xav**) 79, 'C' **J. Priestley** (**O. Brighton**) 77, 'D' **I. Henderson** (**A.M.P.**) 52, 'E' **J. Butcher** (**O Geel**) 86, 'F' **Peter Hille** (**U.Reds**) 83.

10 Years ago — 1975

Ormond remained in the fight for fourth place with their win over **North Old Boys** (4th) kicking 7 goals in the second term to lead by 31 points at half time. Final scores were 16.15 (111) to 9.21 (75). Best were **Jenkins**, **Bourne**, **Cameron** (**Orm**) and **O'Connor**, **Wilson**, **Borch** (**N.O.B.O.**).

St Kilda C.B.C.O.B. (C Section) confirmed their top position when they doubled **Power House's** score, 15.10 (100) to 6.11 (47). Best were **Kay**, **White**, **Sherman** (**St.Kil.**) and **Cross**, **Newton**, **Daniel** (**Power House**).

Fawkner congratulated their runner **Peter Best** on 10 years and over 200 games as runner. 100 games to **St. Kevin's Old Boys** president **Michael O'Kelly** — a fearless player, and since 1968 a mainstay as the club's administrator, social secretary, secretary, captain, and now president. 150 games to **Ormond's Kevin Ladd**, 10 years at the club, leading 'B' section goalkicker for 3 years, 4 Vic. jumpers, club best and fairest in 1968.

15 Years ago — 1970

Well, it finally happened, **Coburg**, wit five players in the Carnival side, suffered their first defeat for the year when they went down to **De La Salle** by 31 points. The side played without confidence, and fumbled badly all day.

Monash stayed close to the four when, after being inaccurate early, they hit the target in the last term to kick 8.1 to **Melbourne High's** 3.4 and win by 16 points.

Alphington, trying to avoid relegation in 'B' section were unlucky to go down to **St. Bernard's** (4th) in a high-scoring game, 18.9 (127) to 17.10 (122) **Johannsen** (5), **Hartigan** and **Skerry** were Alphington's best. With **Footscray Tech**, yet to win, almost certain of relegation, the other 'hot seat' was shared by **Old Xaverians**, **C'wealth Bank**, and **Alphington** all level on 12 points.

150 games to **Ian Job** who had given great service to **Kew** both as player and committee-man.

25 Years ago — 1960

In shocking condition **U.Blacks** (A) continued their march to the four in beating **Old Paradians** by 5 points — and **Old Melburnians** (4th) went down to **Collegians**.

Ian Hayden (**U.Blues**) and **John Sanders** (**Old Xav**) were selected in the Australian Amateurs team to play V.F.A. at Canberra, in place of **Leigh Grant** (unavailable) and **Ian Law** (with Hawthorn).

Veteran **Ormond** back pocket star, **Norman Pert** was missing a game "as he walked down the aisle to that goal of all women — the alter".

200 games to **Coburg's Robbie Dugdale**, 100 games to **Collegians Captain-Coach Max Rush**.

St. Kilda C.B.O.C. (D) was he only undefeated team. **M.H.S.O.B.** was having a successful season on top in 'C' and Juniors — one loss in each section.


25 Years ago — 1950

"We understand **Freddie Dawson** is looking for a sparring partner, so if **Linton McLeod** applies, he's a moral for the job". (**Freddie Dawson** was a devastating U.S. negro light-weight boxer fighting in Australia in 1950). **Linton McLeod** was at the time playing for **Parkside**. Must be a story there, **Linton**!

Again among **Parkside** notes, "that model of consistency again gave a lion-hearted display. Whether half-back, ruck, rover or forward, hats off to **Harry Nance** and he reckons he's 4 yards too slow". (**Harry** was assistant umpire's coach until retiring in 1973).

V.A.F.A. — A Twist of Fate?

It is perhaps an interesting note to start on the background of L.A. Adamson, father and guiding figure of the Victorian Amateur Football Association, during the first 40 years of its now 93 years of existence.

Perhaps it was a twist of fate that really inspired him to create the V.A.F.A.

Adamson, born 125 years ago on the Isle of Man, was educated at Rugby School, and after graduating in Law at Oxford University, came to Australia in 1887. While waiting to be admitted to the Victorian Bar, he accepted a position as senior house master at Wesley College. His law career was shelved and there followed an outstanding career of community involvement. His base was Wesley, the club he founded was Collegians and that club has remained the only club to be part of the V.A.F.A. throughout its entire existence.

History tells us that the V.A.F.A. (originally the Metropolitan Junior Football Association until Geelong joined in 1927 and the title change was introduced) was formed before the V.F.A. breakaway that saw the creation of the Victorian Football League. The V.A.F.A. enjoyed a healthy relationship with the V.F.L. in the early years. Amateur finals games were played as curtain-raisers to V.F.L. final games at the M.C.G. However, the V.F.L. were attempting to build the Amateur clubs into their own zones and Adamson and his supporters saw this as a definite threat to the concept of amateurism. Adamson had a strong commitment to retain sport as sport.

It was along this concept that the V.A.F.A. was moulded and developed to become the largest individual football competition in the country.

The V.A.F.A. has always retained its early principles while going through enormous expansion and development of new innovations to the game. All was not smooth sailing — there were set backs, for example two World Wars that necessitated disbandment.

SOUND ADMINISTRATION

A dedicated and innovative administration has always provided a sound basis for V.A.F.A. progress. There have been only eight Presidents: **W.H. Davis** (1894-95 No records for 1892-3); **L.A. Adamson** (1896-1915; 1920-32); **H.J. Stewart** (1933-1940; 1946; **E.F. Atkins** (1947-1969); **L.S. Zachariah** (1970-77); **M.G. Russel** (1978-80); **T.A. Johnson** (1981-83) and **J.F.X. Dillon** (1984-85). This has provided a firm leadership base and included in the long serving feature of the V.A.F.A. have been such long serving personalities as **Jack Fullerton**, Secretary from 1952-1977, the late **Jack McCann**, a former Secretary who served the V.A.F.A. with distinction for over 50 years, and the still serving Vice-President, **Fred Coldrey**, who had completed 50 years as a member of the Executive Committee. **George McTaggart** became an institution with the **Amateur Footballer**, while **Noel Rundle** has guided the financial affairs for the past 20 years. **Lou Zachariah**, **Manson Russel**, **Alex Johnson** and **John Dillon** all went on to become President, but always the administration had a fine blend of experience with youth.

MILESTONES

Over the years the V.A.F.A. has progressed to a number of headquarters in an attempt to establish a permanent identity and venue for finals matches. The first was the old Amateur Sports Ground (Olympic Park — which became the topic of a wrangle over professional use in the 1930's) the other Olympic Park oval, the Junction Oval, St. Kilda, and then by the mid-1960's, Elsternwick Park.

No man worked harder for the development of Elsternwick Park into the now outstanding headquarters it is for the V.A.F.A. than **Alex Johnson**. As a fitting reward for his tireless endeavours to see the long awaited "dream" of a pavilion materialise, the Brighton City Council opted to name it "**The Alex. Johnson Pavilion**". It was opened by councillor **Len Coysh** Mayor of Brighton in 1983, Our Paton-in-chief, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, Sir Brian Murray, was a guest at the luncheon. The latest development as part of the Elsternwick Park progress is a new electronic scoreboard, up to date and more in keeping with modern trends. This could be in operation for the Carnival and has been made possible by financial assistance from the State Bank of Victoria.

There have been several significant innovations to Australian football which have originated through the V.A.F.A. These include 19th and 20th men, white shorts worn by visiting clubs, and Independent Tribunal, fenced playing arenas, the final four and four interchange players for Reserve and Under 19 grades. On a sadder note a couple of our proposals have not been accepted with the same amount of enthusiasm. I refer to the Order off Rule and the banning of alcohol dringing around the ground.

FULL TIME ADMINISTRATION

For 25 years (1952-1977) the every day administration of the V.A.F.A. was done in the Fullerton household at 5 Correa Avenue, Cheltenham. Jack's wife, Norma, was an extremely diligent Assistant Secretary, and their contribution during a fast-growing era did not go unnoticed.

The V.A.F.A. has now 8000 registered players spread over 59 senior teams in 6 sections, graded A to F, and 25 junior teams. All senior teams field reserve grade teams.

Following 1977 and the Fullerton retirement, **Aif Keam** took over as Secretary at a difficult time when change through sponsorship and on-field appearance was very much the future image. The V.A.F.A. quickly formed a Marketing Section. The administrative duties continued to grow and in 1982 **Peter French** was appointed the V.A.F.A.'s first full time General Manager. While **Peter** may qualify as "full time" by salary, the honorary workers certainly could claim similar recognition. Presidents, Executive Committee chairmen, Committee chairmen and of course club members all carry out time consuming duties.

And further more (how could I forget them) the V.A.F.A. boasts its own Umpires Association complete with their own office-bearers.

PLAYERS

Players... and that is what this Amateur Football is really all about.

And what a galaxy of champions have come from our V.A.F.A.

Seven V.F.L. Brownlow Medals have been won by former amateur stars who proved what a wonderful stepping ground the V.A.F.A. was to league football. The household Brownlow names: **Ivor Warne-Smith** (Collegians-Melbourne) won two; **Bill Morris** (Old Scotch-Richmond); **Dr. Don Corder** (University Blacks-Melbourne); **Neil Roberts** (MHS Old Boys-St. Kilda); **Ross Smith** (Hampton Rovers-St. Kilda); and **Gary Dempsey** (Footscray Tech O.B.-Footscray and North Melbourne).

I could put together another article just with names from amateur ranks who went on to outstanding league careers. For example more than 20 players that fought out the 1964 Collingwood-Melbourne Grand Final were recruited from our ranks. Remember, and they still talk about it, the goal **Neil Crompton**

MILESTONES AT COLLEGIANS

Because of the widespread critical acclaim of this writers first article, he has again been encouraged to put pen to paper to clear the backlog of milestones left unrecognised by the previous writer. One of those is **Chris "CJ" Warner** who played his 100th game for Collegians in the first game of this season. Joining the club in 1979 from Wesley "CJ" quickly established himself as a player of unparalleled courage in his desire to get in and win the hard ball, as indicated by one most courageous award and two most determined awards. Despite fluctuating between the seniors and reserves and suffering from a receding hairline "CJ" has accepted the mixed fortunes of football with good grace playing well in the grade in which selected. Despite missing selection in the 1981 B grade grand final CJ's spirit and determination were epitomized by the fine game he played in the reserves grand final in helping Collegians overrun the dreaded enemy University Blues. And of the many who stayed back with us. To mention just a few — the great MHS Old Boys multi-best and fairest award winner, **Jocka Nelson**, **Ormond's Bruce Bourne**, **Footscray's VFL President, Tony Capes** (Old Xaverians), **Test cricketer Ian Redpath** (Geelong), **Ian Turnbull** (MHSOB) **Lex Hibbins** (Collegians, who unknowingly has helped put together this article) and **Manson Russel**, 250 games with Old Scotch, selected in four Carnival sides and went on to be V.A.F.A. President.

Which draws me to a conclusion, although the tale could go on; that perhaps the most exciting feature of our Amateur football code is the rivalry between the states which peaks with a Carnival every three years.

Another milestone reached at Collegians even before "CJ's" was that of 50 games to **Robert Oliphant** reached in the 1984 A grade 1st semi final. Ollie joined Collegians in 1982 from that productive recruiting ground of Geelong Grammar where the denizens are typically short and slow and thus nearly always back pocket players. This after brief flirtations with other positions Ollie eventually found himself banished to the back pocket with the implied warning "your on your last chance son". However, this position must have been Ollie's niche for not only did he become a useful player but he also started to bring full back **Stuart Hinchin** into the game and make him a good player. Probably the only mistake Ollie has made was in 1983 when he recruited **Andrew Wright** down to Collegians and who has now secured the coveted back pocket position with a vice like grip. Congratulations Ollie on your first 50 games.

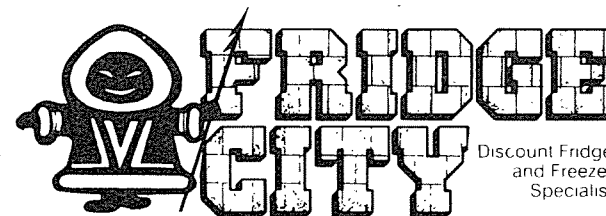
All these players have given the Banyule Amateur Football Club great service over the years and we hope that they all play many more games with the club.

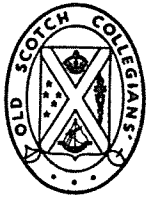

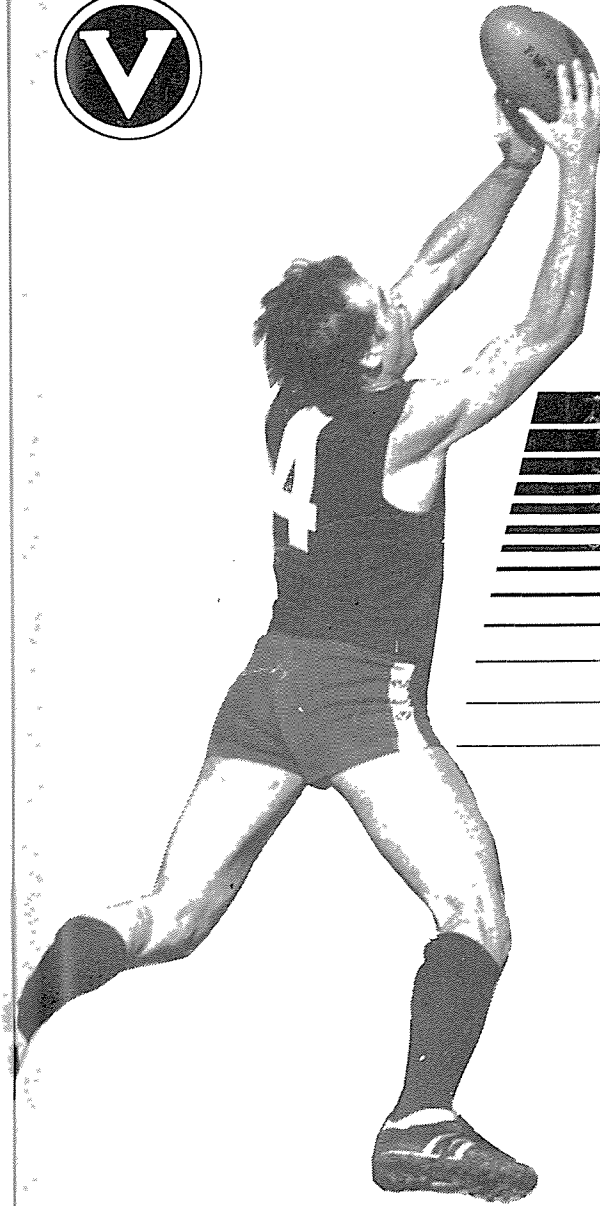
