A Section Review

Top side **Ormond** returned to the winning list in the main A section game at Elsternwick Park, beating **Ivanhoe** by 69 points. It was a low scoring first half but **Ormond** booted 9.9 in the third quarter to **Ivanhoe's** 2 points to seal the match. **Mark McDonald**, **Ormond's** centre half forward, kicked 6 goals and **Geoff Singleton** kicked three.

University Blues had a good 17 point win over 3rd placed **Old Scotch** at the University. **Blues** got away in the second quarter when they kicked 7 goals to go to a handy 23 point lead at the major break. **Scotch** could not peg the **Blues** back in the second half. **Don McInnes** kicked 5 goals and **Paul Douglas** 4.

De La Salles's chances of playing in the finals this year took a turn for the worse when **Bulleen/Templestowe** beat them by just 2 points. **Bulleen** kicked with the breeze but the **De La** defence led by **Mick Deveson** held them out. In the second term, **Bulleen** added 6 goals to **De La's** 3 against the breeze, in a large part due to the good play of coach **Mike Zemski** on the forward flank. **Bulleen/Templestowe** added another 4 goals in the third term to go to a useful lead but **De La Salle** hit back with 7 goals in the final term to go down by just 2 points.

Collegians had a close call when they beat **St. Bernard's** by just 9 points in a closely fought game. **St. Bernard's** started well with the breeze kicking 6 goals but **Collegians** struck back when their turn came with 5 goals and led by 6 points at half time. It was close thereafter with the **Saints** holding a narrow 3 point break at three quarter time. **Baum** and **Herman** each got 3 goals for the **Lions**. **Paul Williams** kicked four for the **Saints**, and ruck rovers **Ray Czajko** and **Gary McAllister** were prominent.

North Old Boys moved into 3rd place with a big 59 point win over **Old Xaverians**. **North** led by 6 goals at quarter time and the match was really over. **North** had their run-on game working and **Luke Morse** and **Geoff Dillon** each kicked 5 goals. Who should be best for the **Xavs** but reliable **Geoff Greetham**?

I think the final four is settled in A section. I have examined the draw and I think **Scotch** will win enough games to hold their place. **De La Salle** are not consistent enough, **Ivanhoe** is in a slump, and **Bulleen/Templestowe** have lost too many good players to be a threat. Will they prove me wrong? The relegation system is keeping things exciting at the bottom end of the table. **St. Bernard's** upset **Ivanhoe** the week

before last and the **Blues** upset **Scotch** last week. I think the **Blues** will do well enough to stay up. They have a slightly easier draw than the **Saints**, but one must not discount **St. Bernard's** just yet. Besides, the **Blues** have a sizeable percentage advantage.

Ormond will probably finish on top, because I think they will win at least their two home games against **De La Salle** and **St. Bernard's**. **Collegians** have quite a hard draw. They play **Ivanhoe** and the three other sides in the four. No one likes me saying this but I'll stick with them for the double chance. **North** might be the side to tip them out. It could well hinge on their meeting in the last round at Harry Trott.

My all important tips in A section are:

Old Xaverians v **UNIVERSITY BLUES**

A Section clubs should not feel too worried because I am averaging about 3 out of 5, that is, unless I have tipped you! Apologies Collegians!

But clubs in B Section had better take me more seriously. I have tipped 5 winners for the last two weeks, including a win to **Ajax** (that's courage!) and the defeat of **Caulfield Grammarians**. **O.M.'s** have the wobbles and **St. Kilda** is breathing down **O.M.'s** necks with **Blacks** an outside chance.

The Whisper Looks at Round 15

Had my best week for the season last Saturday picking 25 winners and am confident of tipping the card before the season's over.

What an inspired choice selecting **Uni Blues** over **Old Scotch**. The **Blues** jumped **Scotch** in the second term and looked winners all the way. **St. Bernard's** virtually had 2 losses as **Blues** win sees the **Uni** draw level and they were mighty unlucky to go down at home to **Collegians**. Just a quick word on the **Ormond/Ivanhoe** match. Billed as the match of the day the game turned out to be a fizzer as **Ormond's** 63 point third term put paid to **Ivanhoe's** hopes of a setback. Actually I was chastized by the Editor for not checking my fact of the **Ivanhoe** and **St. Bernard's** encounter. **Alan Salter** did not leave **Gittos** on **Lane** for 3 quarters so I in turn had a go at my informant.

Looking at today where the two leaders **Ormond** and **Collegians** clash at the Harry Trott in the undisputed match of the round, I must stick with **Ormond** after last weeks crushing win to remain the competition leader and yard stick for other challengers. I've no doubt that **Collegians** will provide more opposition than in the corresponding game played last season, but **Collegians** achilles hell is its lack of depth and confidence against its opponent. There will of course by some great personal duels. **Keith Parsons** will win kicks against both **Boyan-ton** and **Andy Mehrten** and **Tim Bennet** is capable of upsetting the Mons defence. His clash with **David McDonald** will be worth watching as both are skilled ball players. At the other end **Hinchen** and **Parsons** will match **Singleton** and **David McDonald**. A lot could rest on whether **Ormond** decide to include **Burke** and **Oaten**. **Burke** has not played for a month whilst **Oaten** is coming back to form and confidence via the Reserves. **McArthur-Allen** must use **Russel** to counter **Schmidt** and **Sutherland** is bound to win on the other wing. **Kingston** surprised many with his game in the centre last week and his form is another plus for the visitors. **Ormond** will be surprised by **Collegians** endeavour and if they allow the **Lions** to develop it's running game it may be in trouble. However the experience and solidity of **Ormond** plus it's greater on field discipline will give **Ormond** its 11th win.

NOrth Old Boys take on **Bulleen/Templestowe** at the Brens Oval and will face a desperate opposition. It's narrow 2 point win over **De La Salle** last Saturday has given the **Bullants** new hope and they are certainly capable of beating **North** of whom not much has been said of late and about whom not much has been written. They've slipped into 3rd spot almost unnoticed and are seen in some quarters as a real dark horse. **Bulleen/Templestowe** won the earlier game by more than 9 goals and as they're still a chance of making the four (a rough one) I've a hunch they can topple the home side today.

Another vital game will be played at Ivanhoe between the home side and **Old Scotch**. The 4 premierships points up for grabs in this match will be worth absolutely everything. Should **Scotch** lose I doubt that they'll make the four which stupidly enough would be a pity as they do have a side capable of winning the premiership! To be sure **Bulleen/Templestowe** and **De La Salle** will be sweating on the result and praying for an **Ivanhoe** victory. Should the 'Hoe lose and this is not as far fetched as it looks

here on paper it could see the club become a relegation candidate as **Blues** will certainly beat **Old Xaverians** and **St. Bernard's** can be expected to give **De La** a hell of a game. There's no doubt that the next month will see some desperately fought out matches.

My A Section selections **Ormond**, **Bulleen/Templestowe**, **Old Scotch**, **Uni Blues**, **De La Salle**.

In B Section **St. Kilda CBOC** whose big win over **O.M.'s** last Saturday caught many by surprise has a much tougher nut to crack this week. To stay a finals contender it must beat **Marcellin** at Bulleen. The task is not beyond it but it is hard to go against **Marcellin** whose only hiccup for weeks was a sleep in the final term and consequent loss to **Parkside**. Sadly for the **Saints** all the good work of last week will be undone as **O.M.'s** will surely bounce back for a win over **Kew** or will they?

Parkside and **Old Brighton** meet at Elsternwick Park. **Parkside** put in its worst effort of the season last Saturday and having lost the earlier match will not want to take **Old Brighton** easily. However **Old Brighton** at home are a 5 goal better side and without the **Grants**, **Kings** and **Shephers** a **Parkside** win is the logical conclusion, although the **Devils** will mist **Whitfield** and **Stretton** both of whom are injured.

O.M.'s as mentioned were as woeful against **St. Kilda** as **Parkside** was at Caulfield and with the **Blacks** bearing down on the four simply cannot afford a loss to **Kew** who had the call over **Mike O'Donnell's** boys for 3 quarters last week. t home and with a finals spot at stake **O.M.'s** to win.

Blacks will be looking to further increase it's percentage at the expense of **Ajax**. I may have put the wood on **Ajax** last week for suggesting they might upset **Old Paradians**. They were never in the hung and can only hope today to kick more goals than their measly 2 of last week.

Caulfield Grammarians meet **Old Paradians** at home and now that **O.P.'s** are relatively safe from relegation will I feel settle down and demonstrate their ability to match it with the better side. Whilst I cannot actually see them beat the **Fields** I do believe this will be a close encounter with **Caulfields** added class and skill factor the main difference between the sides.

The C Section match of the day will be played at McKinnon between **Old Haileybury** and **Banyule**. **Banyule** simply must win as it faces a

tough draw and could slip out of the 4. So too must **Old Haileybury** if it is to have a fairy tale end to the season, thus a big game awaits.

Thomastown should continue on its winning way of late by accounting for **Monash** whilst **Hampton Rovers** and **St. Kevin's** clash in a game that could well decide one of the relegation sides. At home **Hampton** will win.

Old Camberwell did well at Kooyong last Saturday but should not take **Coburg** lightly. **Coburg** play well on the big grounds and although last at present are not doomed by any stretch yet. In an upset I'm going for the **Burgers**.

In the really big game of the round **Fawkner** and **Therry** old rivals and section leaders meet at Fawkner. **Therry's** only hope according to those at other C section clubs, of beating **Fawkner** will be in the Grand Final at Elsternwick Park on September 14th. I'm not so sure about that, but I do agree they won't win today.

In D Section I can't see **Balaclava** upsetting **Old Trinity** at Bulleen and only a fool would select **St. Bede's** over **Melbourne High**. **Power House** can be expect to worry **Old Mentonians** for some of the match but the visitors will emerge victorious. **West Brunswick** will be untroubled by **State Bank** and **North Brunswick** will keep it's faintest of faint hopes of a finals berth alive with a win over **Old Ivanhoe**.

Preston and **Williamstown** meet at Preston in a vital game for the visitors. Poised outside the 4 and waiting for **Peninsula** to slip up **Town** can be expected to rush **Preston** all the way. How-

ever I'm of the opinion that the E Section 4 is settled and that **Preston** at home will win. **Peninsula** travel to Como Park for it's match with **Old Geelong** whose form of late has been hopeless. Well at home today **Mike Perry** Nad **Nuggett** I believe you will provide the upset in E Section and beat the **Pirates!**

F.I.T.O.B and **Old Carey** languishing at the bottom of the Section clast at Footscray. Both clubs are in the horrors and I've no idea who'll win. I'll go for the easy way out and pick the home side. **Uni Reds** travel to **Bulleen United** chock full of confidence after successive wins and I'll stick with them for the hatrick whilst in the match of the day **Heatherton** should repeat it's earlier round win and defeat **Elsternwick**.

In F Section **Doveton** and **Commonwealth Bank**, both losers last week meet at Doveton. The Bank may bounce back better and offset **Doveton's** home ground advantage. **The Bank** to win. **Old Essendon** surprised me with a splendid victory last Saturday and will be far too good for **ANZ Bank**. Whilst **Latrobe** should have the call over **Monash** in the battle of the Unis. The main game at Peacock Street between **Brunswick** and **Uni High**. For the loser I'm afraid it will be mothballs so the game has great significance. **Brunswick** at home is a tough task for any club, although **Uni High** has won there in the past. In a toss up it's the home side for me.

5 Years ago — 1980

Ivanhoe champion **Graeme Renshaw** played his 200th game — coach's trophy winner in 1975 for most dedicated player, in 1977 judged best player in the final series, **Graeme** had missed only two games through injury in his career. Off the field **Graeme** has been a real comic at heart, renowned for his Dudley Moore/Peter Cook routines.

Andrew Langford-Jones started his career with **Old Haileybury** in 1966 while a schoolboy, and had now reached the 200 game mark with the last couple of seasons in the reserves. A shrewd player around goals, **Andrew** had been an active worker in the social activities, as well as (Coach 1985).

'F' section coaches were **Bill Barnes (Ban-yule)**, **Bernie Bugden (B'wick)**, **Graham Templar (Clayton)**, **Robert Ellis (C'wealth Bank)**, **Max Lyon (Therry)**, **Arthur Jackson (T'Town)**, **Andrew McNair (U. Reds)**. Who coached F.I.T.O.B., Peninsula Old Boys and St. Johns O.C.?

Old Xaverians and **Old Scotch** battling for second place in 'B' section turned on a superb game of football with **O.X.** getting away to a good start with 7.3 to 4.2 in the first quarter and then, with **Old Scotch** coming back strongly in the second term, **O.X.** held on all day to win by 7 points. **Corcoran** 6 goals, **Gleeson, S. Curtain (O.X.)** and **Polkinghorne, Duke, Bates (O.S.)** were best.

200 games also to **Power House** veteran full back, **Tom Cross**, recruited from **Preston Amateurs** in 1950, and to cheeky **Bob 'Chaiky' Fletcher** of **Parkside**.

10 Years ago — 1975

Umpires held their annual golf day at Torquay. Dark horses **Don Dodds** and **Andrew Burrige** scooped the prizes. The boys finished up with a barbeque at **Don Dressing's** home.

200 games to **Old Brighton's "Big Joe" Roger Wilson** — "a mountain of a man with a dedication of similar proportion to the club". (Roger has been the celebrated roving correspondent for A.B.S Sport for some years. — N.R.).

St. Pat's-Monivae welcomed back from overseas former Victorian player **Paul Shannon** to play his 100th game.

Bill (Snow) McNamara played his 250th game with **Parkside** — only the second with the club to reach that milestone, a great clubman and worker for the club.

Old Scotch 8th in 'B' section, surprised **Ivanhoe** 3rd, with a 16 point win. Best were **Anderson Sloss, Hinrichson (Old S.)** and **Stredwick, R. Stewart, C. Stewart (Ivan)**.

Caulfield Grammarians, holding on to fourth position in 'B' scraped home by 2 points from **Marcellin (6th)** 14.11 to 14.9 with stars **Morphet, Watson, Clark (Caul)** and **C. Price, McDonald, C. Mahon (Marc.)**.

15 Years ago — 1970

South Australia won the Perth carnival when they beat the other three competing states, **West Australia, Victoria** and **Tasmania**, in turn. Victoria, trailing S.A. by 44 points at time, kicked 7.2 in the last quarter to 1.2 by S.A. to go down by 7 points.

Best for Victoria were **Barry Morphet, Terry Brown, Ian Turnbull, Tony Hunt, Peter McInerney, and Jeff Russ**.

Only 4 Victorians were named in the Australian team picked after the carnival, **McInerney (Half back flank)**, **Brown (wing)**, **Turnbull (centre half forward)** and **Morgan (emergency)**.

Eleven South Australian, four West Australian and 2 Tasmanian players made up the 20 with **Bob Newton (Tas.)** as captain.

Terry Brown (Old Geelong) won the medal for best and fairest.

Biggest upset for the round was the defeat of leaders in 'E' section **Reservoir Old Boys** who went down to **Ajax** by 17 points. **Rubenstein, Smorgon, and Herzfelt** were best for **Ajax**.

200 games to **Collegian's** youthful veteran **Bruce Ferguson** and **George Mehl (Ajax)** who had played 197 consecutive games.

25 Years ago — 1960

Australian Amateurs went down by 4 goals to V.F.A. Best players for A.A. were **Harkness, Peck, Jobling, Kerr, Nelson, Newthwaite**. Among the V.F.A. names was **Ray "Stug" Jordan** — scored one goal and scraped into the best players!

Two of **Ajax's** star footballers **Jack Davis** and **Trevor Cohen**, who had given great service to the club since its inception in 1957 announced their retirement.

Ormond, 7th, held off **Collegians 3rd**, to win by 7 points. Neither side goaled in a torrid last quarter. Best were **Colin McDonal, Courey, Moran (Ormond)** and **Farrell, G. Hibbins, Powell (Coll.)**

U.Blues' run of 10 wins in a row came to an end when they were beaten by **U.Blacks** whose remarkable accuracy was a big factor in their success, 10.4 to 7.13.

100 games to **Hampton Rovers** half-forward flanker, **Ted Scarlett** who also announced his engagement to **Pat Montgomery**.

As the scribe wrote "Who said Big Jim Hawkins was too old at **De La?** Five goals last week — a great effort. Keep it up!". (Jim is Executive Chairman in 1985).

35 Years ago — 1950

The A.N.F.C. Carnival was played in Brisbane in shocking conditions on a ground badly affected by rain. The **Australian Amateur** team (first of its kind) came through with distinction, winning the premiership in Division 2 by beating

New South Wales, Queensland and **A.C.T. (Canberra)**. **Sam Birtles (Hampton Rovers)** won the R.T. Rush trophy as best and fairest player in Division 2, while trophies for best players in each match were won by **Jack Quinn (S.A.)**, **Peter Cox (Old Melb.)** and **Alan Reid (Geelong)**.

Ormond were 3 games clear on top and were certain of the double chance.

Kew (C Section) and **Ormond Juniors** were the only teams still undefeated.

Junior Violence is a Bleeding Spot

Violence has once again cast its shadow across junior football. Much has been made of the fracas at the end of a junior match in the Frankston area last week and I am sure I speak for all junior football people when I say that we are ashamed of it.

However, let not junior football be branded across the board. What occurred was disgraceful and the offenders will, I trust, be severely dealt with. But what happened, is, thank God, extremely rare.

On that particular black week-end, 3,000 junior football matches were played involving 125,000 players and 6,000 coaches. Of these, by far the majority experienced not problems at all.

Whilst far from perfect since we do have problems like all other junior sports (more of this later), violence is not as widespread as the media reports indicate.

For example, in the Doncaster District J.F.L., where over 1,000 matches are played per season, only 1 player is sent off per 8 matches, and 1 player suspended per 31 matches — an admirable record but no of interest to the media unfortunately.

Most Junior Football Leagues work extremely hard to make their competitions safe and enjoyable.

Many have introduced coach education schemes on a wide scale — 3,000 coaches have attended courses this year.

Many vigorously promote a policy of fair play through the medium of President and Secretaries Meetings, and Parent Orientation Meetings.

Many have introduced very strict policy for behaviour and have supported their programs will comprehensive supervision.

But as mentioned earlier, we still have our problem areas. We still have a way to go.

Research indicates that the root causes of all junior football diseases are the following:-

1. The Win at all Costs Attitude

Displayed by many adults involved with junior sport, and the indoctrination of this self destructing attitude by these adults into their junior players (after all, junior players are not born that way).

2. The Totally Unacceptable Behaviour by Adults in junior football afflicted with this win at all costs attitude. These may be coaches, many of whom have avoided coach education courses, and who knew little or nothing of correct objectives and procedures with juniors, or parents, who insist upon producing loutish behaviour at games and are very difficult for officials to control.

Very largely blameless out of all this, are the junior players themselves. They simply follow examples — again research proven.

Also blameless is the sport itself. Competitive sport in itself, like the motor vehicle, is neither good nor bad. It is the use that the people in control put it to, that makes it either worthwhile or worthless.

The Junior Football Council calls upon all junior football bodies to adopt the following policy:-

1. Examine your objectives.
2. Establish a very strict policy for conduct of your programs in line with those objectives.
3. Educate all junior club administrators, coaches and parents in that policy, even providing the time necessary by cancelling games.
4. Supervise that policy stringently and come down hard on all adult offenders.

Violence in junior sport is a bleeding spot. Left unattended we will wither. Band-aids are better than nothing, but what we really need is the application of a tourniquet — and where adult offenders are concerned, preferably around the neck.

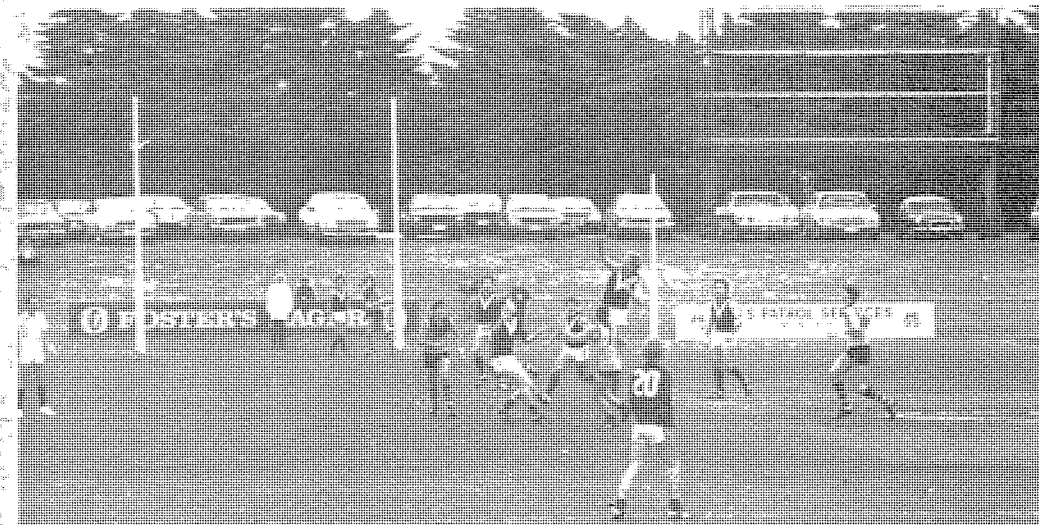
the National Trustees Goalkicking Medal for his zone.

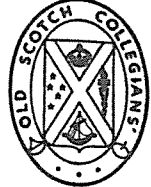

in the Preliminary Final against **Marcellin** in 1973. Apart from the value to the club on the field **Steve** has also been a very good clubman off the field as the following list indicates:

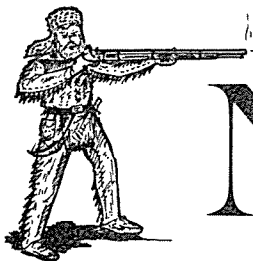
