For St. Bernard's, it was the consistent Klaaysen, McAllister and Smith who held them together as best they could.

Bottom team **Old Xaverians** scored an upset 34 point win over **Uni Blues** and with form like that might have a faint hope of surviving in A Section.

Xavs led for most of the day **Nick Wilton** starred for them, firstly at centre half forward and then when he went into the ruck.

The relegation system certainly keeps the competition alive!

The Whisper Looks at Last Week and Previews Today's Games

With only 3 rounds remaining there is no doubt that the fight for the 4 is wide open in all sections. Only in the Under 19s have the fours been settled and their final series commences next week. Even the Reserve Grade fours are still to be finalized and so players, spectators, umpires and officials have an exciting time ahead.

Before looking at today's vital games I must take my hat off to St. Bedes on its shock defeat of MHSOB. St. Bedes broke the draught last Saturday and won its first game of the season against the High School who unwittingly have now left the door open for Old Mentonians to challenge strongly for the vital second spot.

Other highlights were the exciting draw in a dull game between A Section leaders **Ormond** and **Collegians**. An unlucky bounce cost Ormond victory but Collegians would have been entitled to feel hard done by. Similarly **Bulleen-Templestowe** were a bit stiff to go down to **North** and what about **Old Xavs** who won its first game since round 10.

In B Section **Old Melburnians** can thank accurate kicking for its win against a desparate **Kew** whilst in C Section **Old Camberwell** fell in by a goal against my dark horse selection **Coburg**.

In E Section **Elsternwick** had an exciting 4 point away win at **Heatherton** and in F Section **Commonwealth Bank** failed for the second time in as many weeks, going down to **Doveton** and losing the double chance. Three weeks ago the Bank was top of the Section and has now fallen from grace. The fight for promotion in F Section will be a ripper.

To turn now to today's all important games and from a finals viewpoint there are two beauties in A Section. Ormond v De La Salle at Ormond and Old Scotch and Collegians at Old Scotch. At the other end of the ladder the Ivanhoe v Uni Blues and Bulleen-Temp v Old Xaverians matches will also provide plenty of tease and hard fought football.

At Ormond I would nine times out of ten select the home side to win. However today "the kiss of death" falls on De La Salle. De La will win because it simply has to. A loss and a win to Old Scotch would see the Cardinals go two games clear and that would mean the end for De La as its percentage is poor by comparison. De La will therefore give this game "the works". It is a semi-final for them and they're the sorts of matches that left the Blue and Gold to great heights. The return of Greene will help nullify Naylor and the arrival of the acrobatic forward Peter Rennie has given the side another path to goal. Murphy appears to be recapturing his best form and being a big occasion player is bound to get his share of goals. When they last met, at Elsternwick Park, on June 1st Michael McDonald proved too good for Mick Deveson and set up many scoring opportunities, but since then McDonald has slipped, especially of late and I'm confident Devo can hold him. This will be a clash worthy of a final and one I'll be at for sure. I realise the Mons have a lot at stake too, but as I said earlier, De La has more and they'll win because of it.

Scotch almost fielded its very best side last week. Moir was absent injuring and Nelson was unavailable, the return at last of Polkinghorne plus the form of Jim Marks has Scotch on the boil and with the promising Matthews relishing his responsibility the Cardinals who don't mind playing Collegians are really eagerly awaiting the game.

Despite Old Scotch's genuine enthusiasm for today's game it would be foolish to write Collegians off. Their performance last Saturday was significant and my spies tell me it was Ormond that was grateful for the 2 points. Collegians will beat the Cardinals for pace and will match them for desire and skill but Scotch will get up due to the experience of the Morgans, Tallents, Browns and Marks, the onfield leadership of Kiel and the fact that its plight is a shade more desperate than its visitors.

Speaking of desparation, **Old Xaverians** can be expected to show plenty against **Bulleen-Templestowe**. Now that the Xavs have got the sniff of remaining in A Section in 1986 they're quite capable of upsetting the Bullants whose finals chances disappeared at Brens oval last week. With little to play for **Zemski** has a big 'motivational' job ahead of him and as Xavs need to win at least 2 of the remaining 3 games they're bound to produce a big one today.

St. Bernards clash wiht arch rivals North OB at home and North would not give 2 hoots in sending the Saints back to B Section. They have as much at stake as their hosts having worked their way into second place last week and can be expected to fight hard to keep it. St. Bernards will give this game a real go and keep the Pressure on early but I don't believe they can sustain it for 4 quarters and so its North OB for me.

Ivanhoe at home again meet **Uni Blues**. Both sides went down last week and as Blues need the win a bit more I believe they will come out on top. The Hoe have been very ordinary over the past month and have not won a game since June 29th. When looking at the remaining games this may well be its last chance, and as I said last week are they safe from relegation? Selections: De La Salle, Old Scotch, Old Xaverians, North OB and Uni. Blues.

There are no really big games in B Section today, although **St. Kilda** versus **Parkside** tops the bill. What a difference it would have been had the Saints got up last week. Although 6

points out St. Kilda believe they might just make it. However if you consider their draw its a pie in the sky and Parkside will continue on its winning way despite the vagaries of the North road oval.

In other matches Caulfield will be untroubled by Old Brighton. Old Melburnians will have the call over Ajax, Marcellin will beat Kew and Uni. Blacks in beating Old Paradians will keep its finals hopes alive.

Its a different story in C Section where either **St. Kevins** or **Thomastown** will drop out of the finals race after their match today. Given that **Therry** at home will beat **Old Camberwell**, **Thomastown** needs only to win to move into 4th spot and with a not unfavourable draw could well remain there. **St. Kevins** task is I believe too great as it must not only rely on a **Therry** victory but **Old Haileybury** as well. In any event **Thomastown's** form of late has been better and it will win.

Old Haileybury's slim finals hopes will also disappear after its loss to the favourite of favourites Fawkner and Banyule will consolidate a finals place with a win over Monash. The Coburg/Hampton Rovers game will be well worth watching as the loser will undoubtedly end up in D Section next season. As Hampton rarely win away from home I'm going for the Burgers (as I did last week) to lift themselves off the bottom.

Match of the day in D Section will be at Melbourne High between **MHSOB** and **West Brunswick**. West knows that victory will consolidate its position in the four and will take the game right up to the High School. However I'm sure the shock loss to St. Bedes' last Saturday will sting the home side into a reversal and at home they'll win and keep the D Section fight for the four open as the other contender **Balaclava** are unlikely to take **St. Bedes** lightly and will be hoping for a big win to boost their percentage.

The other big game will be at the Ross Gregory where **Power House** must beat **State**

Peter had left them on the counter and one wonders what his excuse was when pestered by St. Bernards players and officials for a copy of the Amateur Footballer!

FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Attention is drawn to Rules 11, 13 & 15. Rule 11

The first and second rounds of the Senior Grades shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit.

Rule 13

The second round of the U.19 Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players within the age limits prescribed in Rule 16 to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit provided that a player who has represented a Club in an aggregate of more than five matches in the Senior Grade and Reserve Grade in the first round in any season shall not be eligible unless he has represented such Club in more than five matches in the first round of the U.19 Grade in the same season unless such Club shall be represented in a match in the second round of the U.19 Grade all players who took part in the drawn game shall be eligible to take part in the game to be replayed.

Rule 15

The second round of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all players who:

(i) are eligible and registered to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit:

(ii) have registered such Club in at least two matches of the Reserve Grade in the first round in the same season; and

(iii) if they have represented such Club in the Senior Grade in the first round in the same season, have participated in not more than eight matches in the said first round.

Provided that if such Club is represented in a match in the second round of both the Reserve Grade and Senior Grade on the same day the second round match of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all players who:

(i) are eligible and registered to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit: and




