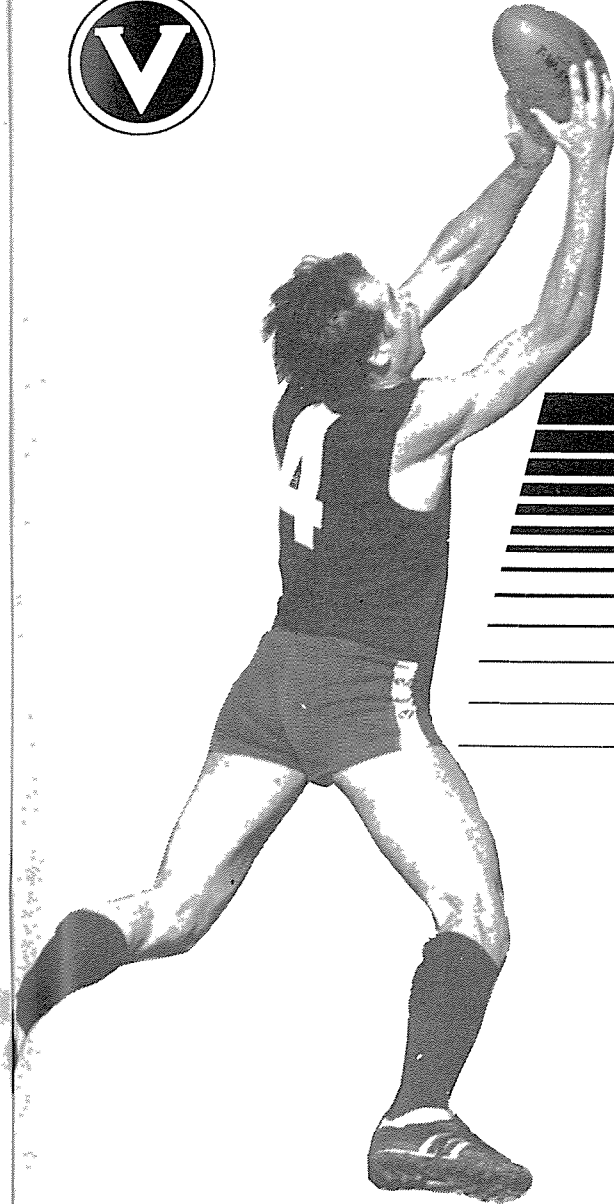

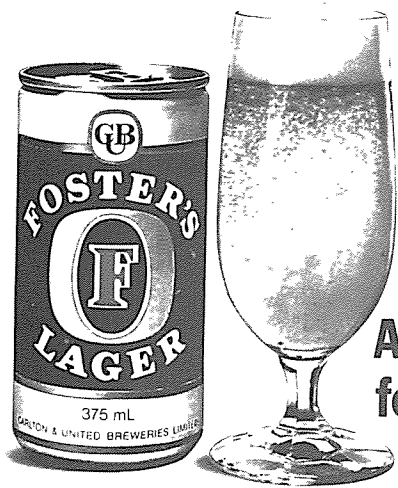

A Section Review

Scotch's place in the four is in danger as De La have moved up to be level on points but have a slightly inferior percentage. These two meet today.

Ormond and De La Salle were level at half time, but De La Salle were more desperate in the third quarter when they added 4 goal to one. Phil Kerin at full forward kicked three goals. Despite a fierce Ormond comeback the De La defence stood firm and they hung on to win well. Rovers Maher, Vitacca and Connolly revelled in the heavy going and Greene was supreme in the ruck.

Old Scotch was well placed at half time in its match against Collegians mainly due to the superb display from rover Ric Senior. However, Collegians lifted in the second half and in a low scoring game fell in by just 6 points.

University Blues were never in the game against Ivanhoe and could only manage 2 goals for the day. The conditions were terrible and Ivanhoe can thank key defenders Gittos and Simondson for their victory.

The Whisper Looks at Last Week and Previews Today's Games

The A section four will be settled by 5 p.m. tonight, although positions may vary by semi-final time. B Section will not alter due to **Old Paradians** fine win over **Uni. Blacks**. The **Blacks** have only themselves to blame but can at least spend the summer believing they were the best side out of the four. Between you and me, I've a hunch **Caulfield**, **Marcellin** and **Parkside** will have secretly been delighted with Old Paradians victory! In C Section 4 Clubs, **Old Camberwell**, **Thomastown**, **St. Kevins** and even **Old Haileybury** have in vality an opportunity of appearing in the finals and so today and next week have very special significance.

D Section is a replica of the situation in A Section where 4th and 5th sides, in this case **West Brunswick** and **Balaclava**, clash today to decide their season's fate. In E Section, technically, **Williamstown** can make it, but its my view that the four is settled, whilst in F Section we've a 3 way battle between **Brunswick**, **O. Essendon** and **Uni. High School Old Boys**.

It semi final time for the U.19s and in zone 1 **Thomastown** and the **University** meet in the first semi at **Fawkner** and **Bulleen Temp.** play **North OB** in the second semi at Kew.

I'm going for **Thomastown** in the first semi. They're a close knit outfit with great team spirit and will handle the conditions for better than the students. The 2nd semi is more difficult. **Bulleen Temp.** finished on top a win in front of **North** and during the year in the only game played between the sides, won a high standard affair by 10 points. At Kew which like most grounds will be heavy, I've a hunch **North** can reverse the earlier result and move into the Grand Final.

The Zone 2 1st semi will be played at Brighton between **Ormond** and **Old Xaverians**. During the season both sides had a home win and this match will undoubtedly prove worthy of a final. **Ormond** were a trifle unlucky to drop from second to fourth as a result of last week's 1 goal loss to De La Salle. Well I'm afraid it will be unlucky again today as **Old Xaverians** are playing at the top of their form and will win this one.

The second semi is at Old Scotch between **MHSOB** and **De La Salle**. De La had a great year and remain undefeated thus far. With this record behind them I'm confident they'll win their 19th game on end and progress to the Grand Final.

Looking at the A Section fixtures — there are 3 magnificent games and depending on your club allegiance, its 'Life and Death' for them all. At the bottom of the ladder **Old Xaverians** meet **St. Bernards** at Flinders Park and as the game represents Xavs only hope of a reprieve its found to be a 'no holds barred' affair. **St. Bernards** fully realize the importance of winning and with the current good form of **Cory Klaaysen** and **Paul 'The Chief' Smith** can be expected to control the ruck. **Gary McAllister** has been a fine skipper and he will worry Xavs with his on ball play. I don't doubt the desperation of either side as the incentive certainly exists for them both. It boils down to who gets the breaks, makes the best use of the ball and gets the most from its 'stars' and Xavs will be looking for big games from its captain **Bill Denton**, **Nick Wilton**, **Nick Bourke**, **Steve**

and **Paul Curtain** and **Geoff Greetham**. I doubt that home ground advantage will mean much however I'm selecting **Old Xaverians** as its form of the past 2 weeks is probably its best for the year.

To switch now to the top of the table where **North OB** is a surprising new leader having replaced **Ormond** who have held the position since 5 p.m. on June 15th, Ormond's loss to **De La Salle** last Saturday has seen the club slip to third and for the first time in many weeks it will start as the underdog in the game against North. I doubt that will worry the Ormond match committee or players for that matter. Their main concern is the club's injury list and sudden drop of form. The Brens oval like Ormond's, is in very poor condition and having seen Ormond for a while last week I query the ability of some replacements, their overall skill and surprisingly their desperation particularly up forward where the goal scoring is done. North is doing everything right and old stagers like **Geoff Dillon**, **Gus Carroll**, **Paul Considine** and **Jerome Griffin** are all in top form. This game is virtually the start of North's Premiership drive as it meets **Collegians** next week and the finals kick off after that. In their present frame of mind North Will win today although they should be warned that to underate Ormond has proved fatal in the past.

The really big game in A Section is surely the match between **De La Salle** and **Old Scotch**. The winner will play in the first semi, the loser can start cricket practice or whatever. De La were rightly thrilled with their win over Ormond. Their desperation plus the form of big ruckman **Mick Greene**, skipper **Paddy Maher**, full back **Peter Leonard** and forwards **Phil Kerin** and **Shane Murphy** has been welcomed with delight by the staunch and knowledgeable supporters at De La. Conditions will favour them in this game and the fact that **Trevor Read** has yet to coach Old Scotch to a win over De La suggests to me that the reigning Premier will tip Scotch out of the few for the first time since April 20th. Unbelievable you might say and how could this have happened? Arguably the Cardinals have the most talented side in the V.A.F.A. and yet today it must win to figure in the finals which tragically for the club it is quite capable of winning. The game promises everything.

Individual clashes — the doer **Maher** versus the brilliance of **Hodge**. The dash of **Leonard** against the strength of **Mason**, the experiences of **Deveson** and the youthful zest of **Matthews** and the sheer talent of **Murphy** against the Old Scotch skipper **Kiel**. One could go on. Both sides have plenty of experience and Scotch has the great football challenge of beating De La Salle and appearing in its first A Section finals since the late 1978s. It will be a fantastic game and there is bound to be a very good crowd but the bottom line is a De La win.

In other games **Bulleen-Templestowe** will beat the **Blues** in spite of the Blues good record at home and **Collegians** is unlikely to slip up against a rejuvenated **Ivanhoe**.

Now that the B Section four is settled and Kew and Ajax are bound for C Section today's matches have little significance. My selections are **Old Paradians** over **Old Brighton**, **Caulfield** to beat **St. Kilda**, **Parkside** against **Kew**, **Marcellin** over **AJAX** (tomorrow at Elsternwick Park) and **Univ. Blacks** to upset **Old Melburnians**.

In C Section **Old Camberwell** must beat **Old Haileybury** or it will lose 4th spot to **Thomastown**

who will surely beat **Coburg** or to **St. Kevins** who should account for **Monash Blues**.

Fawkner will continue on its winning way at the expense of **Banyule** and although **Hampton Rovers** is bound to give a good account of itself, **Therrys** class will show out and they'll win. At the other end of the table the sides to be relegated will not be known until after the final home and away match.

In D Section **Balaclava** and **West Brunswick** meet at Elsternwick park. For the winner a place in the finals is assured and I'm going for **Balaclava** who've shown greater goal scoring ability throughout the season. Other winners will be **MHSOB**, **Nth. Brunswick**, **Old Trinity**, although **Old Mentonians** is bound to push the leader all the way, and **Power House**.

E Section winners **Peninsula OB**, **Preston** even though the 'wicks are keyed up for this one, **Old Geelong**, **Heatherston**, and **Bulleen United**.

F Section winners **Clayton**, **Doveton**, **Old Essendon** and **Brunswick**.

Looking Back

5 YEARS AGO — 1980

Old Brighton wingman **Owen Millis** celebrated his 200th game by again patrolling the wings of the Beach Oval where he has reigned for the past twelve years — noted for his characteristic wide turn and long left foot torpedoes spearing into the forward line.

Peter Gartner became the first Marcellin player to reach the "200". A former captain, best and fairest (twice), long serving member of the Social Committee, Peter had achieved it all with the help of his patient wife, Denise.

Old Melburnians were surprised and delighted that the most popular member of the club, **Archie Salek**, holder of countless clubman trophies, had reached the milestone of 50 games.

Ormond, 36 points, and Old Melburnians, 34 points, met in the last game to decide who would finish in fourth position, Ormond having scraped home in the previous round by 2 pts from U. Blues in a high scoring game, 17.18 to 18.10. After an even first half, Ormond were far too strong for Old Melburnians, kicking 14.9 to 4.4 in the last quarter. **Parisi, Barnes, Pearse (Ormond)** and **Pisarski, Trumble, Waddington (O. Melb.)** were best.

In 'C' Hampton Rovers and Old Haileyburians played off for fourth place with Hampton Rovers much the better team, 22.12(144) to 11.11.(77). **Malone, McPherson and Bird** starred for the victors.

150 games to **Ivanhoe** ruckman, **Brendan O'Brien** and **A.N.Z.'s** courageous wingman-rover, **Steve May**.

10 YEARS AGO — 1975

U. Blacks were beaten by 10 points by **St. Bernard's** in the final round but held on to fourth position as **Ormond** who finished level on points, did not win by a big enough margin against **Monash Blues** to overcome their percentage lag. It will be the first time for 10 years that Ormond have missed out in the final four.

Umpires' Association elected **Alan Bishop** and **Ken Jorgensen** to life membership. At a champagne and chicken dinner at **Ray Mullar's** home, **'Fred Gribb**, a new boy entertained with his A Jolson numbers and was in good voice". (How we have suffered since — N.R.)

Geelong congratulated evergreen rover turned wingman **Mick Alden** on 150 games. Mick played in two premierships teams (C. 1966), (B. 1972), won three club best and fairest and represented the state in Hobart in 1969.

150 games also to **Len Belcher (Alph.) John Rojo (Ivanhoe)** and **Peter D'Ambrosia (Old Carey)**.

Geelong (A) was the only team in the Association to go through the season without a win. **Heatherton (F)** had the best record of wins, 17. Top goalkickers for the year: (A) **Thompson (St. Bern)** 80, (B) **Hughes (Ivan.)** 88, (C) **Calleja (St. Kilda)** 62, (D) **Combe (H. Rovers)** 71, (E) **Dancer (ANZ)** 70, (F) **Meeking (Heath.)** 114.

15 YEARS AGO — 1970

University Blacks and **St. Bernard's** met with the loser almost certain to go out of the 'B' Section four, St. Bernards 12.6 trailed Blacks, 12.15 at the last change and then kicked 2.5 to Blacks' 3 behinds to win by 5 points. **Daffey, M. Perrott** and **Ginnivan** were best.

Old Paradians in the second last round, kept their hopes of avoiding relegation alive, by a surprise 10-point win over **Ormond**. However, they went down to **Ivanhoe** in the last round and were relegated to 'B' Section for 1971 with that team.

25 YEARS AGO — 1960

150 games to **Alphington's Ted Whitfield**, 100 to **Kew's Noel Stokes** and **Roy Millist**.

Collegians (1st) and **Old Xaverians (5th)** met — a victory to O.X. and a loss to either Blues or Blacks and O.X. would be in the four. O.X. were not up to it and were convincingly beaten, 12.13 to 8.8.

Best were **Sanders, Powell, Rush (6 goals)**, (Coll.) and **Malone, Slatery, Edmonds (Old X.)**.

'A' Section four was **Collegians, Old Melb., U. Blues** and **U. Blacks**.

In 'B' section **UHSOB** finished strongly, winning the last 7 games to gain top place, while **De La Salle**, after winning the first 8, lost 3 of the last 4 games, but still held on to second place on percentage from **Power House** and **Kew**.

35 YEARS AGO — 1950

Old Melburnians went down by 5 points in the last game to **Ivanhoe**. **Hampton Rovers**, level on point with O.M.'s, needed a win against **Ormond** on the leaders' home ground to get into the finals. Rovers played well, leading by a point at three-quarter time, but went down by 13 points in a hard slogging finish.

The artillery show band at half-time and Red Cross Collection, made it a big day at Ormond.

Duncan Anderson finished on top of 'A' Section goalkickers with 75 goals.

MILESTONES GALORE AT NORTH

Steve O'Rourke, Anthony O'Donnell, Grant Pearse and **Ian Turnbull** have all recently reached the important milestone of 100 games with North O.B. **Steve O'Rourke** started his career with the club in the Under 19s as a fifteen year old in 1977, however he missed seasons 1978 and 79 due to crippling knee injuries. **Steve** fought back in 1980 and quickly made his mark in senior football under **John Jordan**. **Steven** has been a regular member of the 1st XVIII since that time and featured prominently in the clubs last A grade premiership in 1982 being best on the ground. **Rourke** is having a fine season in 1985, a fact overlooked by the State Selectors, in his capacity to win the hard ball around the packs. **Anthony O'Donnell** or **AFF** has taken a while to reach this milestone with several interruptions in his fine career. Whether playing in the centre, wing or on the ball, **AFF** has always been a strong and quick player. Having started in 1974 in the Under 19s, **AFF** has featured in the 1977 and 83 A reserve premierships and the 1976 A grade flag. **AFF** is currently having a fine season and could add further to his already

distinguished career. **Grant Pearse** notched up his 100th early in the season and has been a decorated player in his time with the club. **Grant** has won the club best and fairest in 1978 and 1981, he also won the Junior section 1 V.A.F.A. B & F in season 1979. After a short stay at **Therry** in season 1983 and 84, **Grant** has returned to the club and is displaying consistent form despite work commitments. **Pearse** was also captain of a Premiership team, that being the junior section one in 1978. **Grant** is eagerly awaiting another crack at a flag, hopefully he'll get his chance in 1985. **Ian Turnbull** commenced his career in 1980 with the Under nineteens and displayed his honest and unselfish ruckwork at an early age. The next three year's saw **Ian** play mainly in the reserves for two runner-up in 81 & 82 and a Premiership in 1983. The success of this run by the reserves had a large part to do with **Ian's** great ruckwork and aerial strength around the ground. The current season see's **Ian** or **Jan** as he is known, really revelling in his first chance at being No. 1 ruckman in the club. His form at the moment is impeccable and has given the club a real lift. The club thanks the above players and wishes them the best in their respective futures.

FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Attention is drawn to Rules 11, 13 & 15.

Rule 11

The first and second rounds of the Senior Grades shall be open to all eligible and registered players to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit.

Rule 13

The second round of the U.19 Grade shall be open to all eligible and registered players within the age limits prescribed in Rule 16 to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit provided that a player who has represented a Club in an aggregate of more than five matches in the Senior Grade and Reserve Grade in the first round in any season shall not be eligible unless he has represented such Club in more than five matches in the first round of the U.19 Grade in the same season unless such Club shall be represented in a match in the second round of the U.19 Grade all players who took part in the drawn game shall be eligible to take part in the game to be replayed.

Rule 15

The second round of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all players who:

- (i) are eligible and registered to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit;
- (ii) have registered such Club in at least two matches of the Reserve Grade in the first round in the same season; and
- (iii) if they have represented such Club in the Senior Grade in the first round in the same season, have participated in not more than eight matches in the said first round.

Provided that if such Club is represented in a match in the second round of both the Reserve Grade and Senior Grade on the same day the second round match of the Reserve Grade shall be open to all players who:

- (i) are eligible and registered to represent the Club with which they have been granted a permit; and
- (ii) have represented such Club in a total of at least two matches of the Senior or Reserve Grade in the same season.

In the event of a draw taking place in a match in the second round of the Reserve Game all players who were eligible to take part in the drawn game shall be eligible to take part in the game to be replayed.
