A Section Review

De La Salle moved into the four at the expense of Old Scotch when they beat them by 9 points. It was a hard, slogging game. Scotch were kept in it till half time by **Jim Marx** who contributed two goals. De La's forwards did better in the third term, **Shane Murphy** getting two goals. Scotch tried hard to get back into it but the De La defence was too strong, especially **Deveson, Leonard and Bourke**. **Andy Smith** was Scotch's best but it is an ominous sight to see De La's good players coming on at the right end of the season.

Ormond's 10 point win over top side **North O.B.** has taken them into 2nd place and forced North back to third. It was a low scoring game with scores level at half time. But Ormond deserved their win as they were more desperate in the second half. **Ross Tonkin** and **Phil Kingston** were best for the 'Monds.

Collegians had a lucky 4 point win over **Ivanhoe**, but the win has taken them into top spot. **Collegians** led at every change but Ivanhoe came home strongly in the final term but kicked 2.6. Ivanhoe wingman **Tony Loton** had a running shot with seconds to go but missed. Ivanhoe ruckman **Gary Dwyer** and rovers **Sedgwick and Clements** did particularly well, but it was **Collegians** defenders **Hinchen** and **Greg Parsons** who kept Ivanhoe out.

University Blues had a comfortable 32 point win over **Bulleen-Templestowe** to keep themselves out of the relegation zone. Blues jumped Bulleen in the first term and using the ball as if it were a dry day added 6 goals 2. **Mark Tyquin** kicked 5 goals and **Andy Wallis** got 4. **Angel, Curnow** and **Salinger** were all good players for the Blues. **Delantey** and **Lockhart** were better players for **Bulleen-Templestowe**.

St. Bernards had a comfortable 39 point win over **Old Xaverians** but with Blues winning still lie in 9th position on percentage. Old Xaverians will be relegated in 1986. St. Bernards full forward **Darren Looker** kicked 5 goals in a best on ground display.

St. Bernards jumped the Xavs in the first quarter and with speed and determination added 7 goals. Schoolboy ruckman **Paul Visentini** played a solid game in the ruck for the Old Xaverians.

The Whisper Looks at the Final Round of Home and Away Matches

It's hard to believe that today is the last game for the majority of players and that most precious of persons known as the 'team official'. Some of you will lament on the year that might have been and for others much work needs to be done over the Summer to regroup and recruit the players needed 'to bounce back'. For the rest there are the finals and the faint but everlasting hope of the finals. Clubs in the latter category are **Old Scotch (A section), Thomstown & St. Kevins (C Section), Williamstown (E Section) and Old Essendon (F Section)**. Reserves teams on the fringe are **Bulleen-Templestowe & North OB (A Section), St. Kilda & O. Melburnians (B Section), Balaclava & West Brunswick (D Section)**.

Whilst in a philosophical mood readers of the amateur footballer who, like Australian football fans everywhere, have in 1985 read and heard a host of comment from all sections of the media on the ills of the game, should spare a thought for the games as conducted by the VAFA and played by its member clubs. Last weekend is a case in point. The venue Saturday & Sunday Elsternwick Park. On Saturday we had a classic football situation. Fifth team versus fourth, chocolates (and a place in the finals) for the winner and boiled lollies for the loser. Consider the teams. **West Brunswick and Balaclava**. West had been relegated from C in 1984, had changed President and lost the driving force both on and off field of **Rick Brockwell** at the end of 1983. Balaclava had won E Section last year, and were anxious to join **Old Melburnians** who were also promoted from E in this year's finals. Balaclava had been finalists in E Section in 1983 and 1982 but had bombed out twice and was thus well aware of the disappointment football can bring. The game was close all day, the West Brunswick timekeeper rode every bump, kicked every goal, Secretary **Brian Fletcher** sat with the interchange steward for one quarter, roamed the grandstand for another and was obviously churning inside whilst new president **Stephen Fyffe** has been around amateur football long enough to know that there is only one sort of President needed in our footy — a working one! Stephen was team manager and motivator. Balaclava whose support quite surprised me both in numbers and wit, (they could never seem to agree with umpire Smith's decisions) always seemed like it would win but alas suffered in the accuracy department and despite having 4 more scoring shots failed by 11 points. West Brunswick so VAFA caterer **Chris House** informs me was easily the most excited side he'd seen at Elsternwick Park for the season. In fact the walls are still ringing with the sound of the Club's theme song and to cap it off both sides replayed every mark and kick in the bar after the game.

Move now to Sunday. **Marcellin** versus **AJAX**. Nine years ago when these two clubs met in the B Grade Grand Final, a conservative view

is that 5000 turned up of which 4000 followed **AJAX**, 500 **Marcellin** and 500 came from the other clubs. **Noel Rundle** still smiles when reminded of that day. It was a far cry from that on Sunday with possibly 250 in attendance. **AJAX** last and already doomed for C Section against **Marcellin** second determined to return to A Section in the shortest possible time. Despite the ladder difference both sides had all the officials necessary. **AJAX** secretary **Stephen Pinch** goal umpired the reserves, **Marcellin** member and former secretary **Tim Naughton** timekeeping the seniors. **AJAX** member **David Segal** playing in the Reserves to provide some experience for the young 'Jackers' and vice president **Ron Salter** acting as team manager. **Marcellin** committee man, explayers and current players looked great in the smart new maroon tops. Even **Johnay Jones** and **Frank Marchesani** were in them!

I guess the whole point of this piece is to recognize that these 2 matches and 4 clubs represent a fair cross-section of our competition and that its strength over many years has been and will always be the selfless devotion and willing work that the **Stephen Fyffe, John Breslin's, Tim Naughton's and Steve Pinch's** give week in week out. All clubs have got them and yet you're never mentioned in any articles yet you keep the games going and in the VAFA we congratulate you. Australian Rules is a great game for young men, don't let it die!

Turning now to the Under 19 preliminary finals and by golly I dip me lid to Melbourne High who certainly stopped De La's hopes for a championship. De La led by 6 goals early but wilted badly under the High School's second half onslaught and must now face Ormond who have a fine record of U19 successes. On the **Caulfield Grammarians** ground at Albert Park I'm selecting Ormond to topple the competition leaders and move onto the Grand final.

In Zone 1 I got one right — **Thomstown**, whilst **North OB** let me down in the second-semi. North was far from disgraced and will beat **Thomstown** today and earn another crack at **Bulleen-Temp**. North is a better balanced side and although it may not find the Melbourne High School Ground to its liking, has the class to overcome a determined **Thomstown**.

Well it happened as predicted, **Old Scotch** slipped out of the four and as it would take a miracle for the Cardinals to return the A Section 4 is now settled for 1985. I might be prepared to concede that Uni. Blues, whose home and away record against **De La Salle** in recent years has been outstanding, is capable of upsetting De La especially as victory would ensure it remaining in A Section. However they've dropped their bundle completely at Scotch from the committee down through the players to the doorman and I don't reckon that they'll get within a bull's roar of **Bulleen-Templestowe** who will be keen to end a frustrating season with a win.

Despite the Blues record **De La Salle** is now back to the form which has seen it a **Power House** in Amateur football and I can assure **Messrs. Ferguson, McArthur-Allan and Durnan** they'll take some stopping.

The big game in A Section is between **Collegians** and **North OB**. Top spot has a bit of a hoodoo about it at present as we've had 3 different sides there in the past 3 weeks! The big prize for the winner today is the double chance so both sides will certainly not be just going through the motions. With no reason other than a hunch I'm going for North OB. Actually I do have a reason. **Collegians** have played the equivalent of 3 semi's in the last 3 weeks and have not dropped a game. As amateur football is not based on consistency, **Collegians** are, I believe, due to put in an ordinary one and North who were brought back to earth last week is just the side to capitalise on the Lions having a day off.

North President **Steve Maule** is on record as saying he believes North prefer hard day conditions. Well they're more than likely to experience them at Harry Trott than at Brens so I'll be keen to see how they fare. So by final siren time North to be in front but remember its just a hunch.

There's not a hunch that Ormond will beat **St. Bernards**. Its a fact for 2 reasons. Firstly Ormond need that double chance and secondly my spies tell me that Ormond would rather a short trip to Parkville to play Uni. Blues on a decent oval, than a long one to St. Bernards to play on a poor one. St. Bernards did of course surprise the 'Mons with a 1 point victory earlier this year but there's far more at stake today and even with relegation staring them in the face St. Bernards must return to B Section.

In the remaining match **Ivanhoe** at home should end the season on a winning note against a ragged **Old Xaverians**.

In B Section Old Brighton will finish the season with a win by beating **AJAX** and St. Kilda will pull out all stops to ensure 'Ox' White goes out in winning style by beating Kew. O.M.'s meet Parkside at Elsternwick Park and both sides are likely to rest key players as they're all set to meet again at Northcote next week. On form Parkside will win. Uni. Blacks play Caulfield at Uni. at will be keen to prove they're the best

side out of the 4. They don't have to prove it — they are and they're bound to give the 'fields a real test. At home I'm confident they can win, despite the return of **Kanis** to the Caulfield lineup. **Marcellin** will also be well tested by the rapidly improving **O. Paradians** who defeated the Eagles in the early game. With this as a spur and the opportunity of being minor premiers **Marcellin** should end what has been a very good team re-building season.

In C Section **O. Camberwell** needs only to beat **Monash** to ensure 4th spot, and despite the fact that a Monash victory would keep the club in C Section, as there's no way Hampton Rovers will beat Fawkner, Old Camberwell has the greater incentive and will win. **Old Halleybury** and **St. Kevins** friendly rivals over the years, will battle it out to decide who will finish 5th as I expect Banyule to return to the winning list at the expense of Thomastown. Finally **Therry** is not likely to step up against **Coburg**. The matches in D Section have no bearing on either the four or relegation which is now all decided. Winners today will be **Melbourne High over Old Mentonians** in the match of the day, **North Brunswick** will do **Balaclava, West Brunswick over Power House, St. Bedes** might upset **Old Ivanhoe** and **Old Trinity** are odds on against **State Bank**.

In E section all interest rests on the **Heatherton versus Williamstown** match, for a Heatherton lose, a real possibility then Brunswick who will crush Uni. Reds would move into second place. Williamstown are a better side than their 5th position indicates and I believe they'll get up and beat Heatherton. Even though FITOB need to beat Preston to remain in E Section its just not on and FITOB are F Grade bound. Other winners, **Peninsula OB and Bulleen United**.

What a game Brunswick must play and win if it is to remain in the four and feature in the finals. The wicks meet **Doveton** who are second (12 points ahead) and know that **Old Essendon** (who has the Bye), will automatically replace them in the finals if they lose. I stuck with Brunswick 3 weeks ago against Uni. High and I'm confident they can do it again. I'm also confident that **Commonwealth Bank, Uni. High and Clayton** will all win and win well.

5 Years ago — 1980

Fred Grubb umpired his 100th game — noted for his sense of humour, **Fred** was a late entrant to V.A.F.A. ranks.

Frank Henegan retired as boundary umpire for **University Blues** after 270 games.

Peninsula Old Boys congratulated **Bret Sullivan** on winning club best and fairest — "an outstanding player all year and a terrific clubman".

AJAX, although being relegated from 'A' to 'B' finished the season on a good note with a 7 goal victory over 7th placed **Marcellin**, 20.18 (138) to 13.17 (95). Best were **Rozen, H. Ritterman, S. Marks (Ajax)** and **Price, Denning, T. Aloisio (Marc.)**.

Mentone Old Boys secured their place in 'E' section four when they defeated second team **West Brunswick** 14.14 (98) to 10.7 (67), with a ton of drive coming from **Norton, Jester, O'Toole (M.O.B.)**.

150 games to **State Bank's Neville 'Bones' Evans**.

Highscoring was the order of the day with 16 out of 20 A and B teams scoring more than 100 points.

10 Years ago — 1975

O'Sullivan (Glen) 19, D. Cowen (Thorn) 19 (2nd on countback), Junior 1, N. McAuliffe (Cob.) 17, S. Morris (Orm) 13, Junior 2, A. Nigro (W. Bruns.).

22 year old **U. Blues** star, **Chris Maxwell**, fourth in 'B' section best and fairest was selected as Victorian Rhodes Scholar for 1975, and was leaving for Oxford at the end of September.

North O. Boys, 6.16 at the last change in 'A' first semi kicked 8.1 in the final term to convert a 19 point deficit into an 11 point victory over **U. Blacks**. Best were **Butera, Carroll, Wigney (N.O.B.)** and **Moffatt** (6 gls.) **Clarke, Perrett (U. Blacks)**.

Caulfield Grammar (B) defeated **Ivanhoe** 17.11 to 9.9 in the first semi. Best were **Griffiths, Dickson, Clark, Butcher** (8 gls.), **C. Greene, Gillin, Dean, Rojo (Ivanhoe)**.

15 Years ago — 1970

Melbourne High showing their best form for weeks, led **Caulfield Grammarians** by a point at half-time, but **Caulfield** were much too strong in the second half, kicking 8.12 to **High's** 3.4. **Atchison** (5 goals), **Morphet** and **Pickering (Caulfield)** and **M. Ritterman, Needham** and **Malone (M.H.S.)** were best.

Old Trinity turned on a great performance in the 'D' section second semi to defeat **Fairfield** by 8 goals and win their way into 'C' section in 1971.

Best and Fairest winners were **N. Beattie (Coburg), 'A' Section; M. McKenzie (Old Xaverians) 'B' section; P. Gadsden (Old Haileybury) 'C' section; T. Allen (West Brunswick) 'D' section; K. Weybury (Brunswick) 'E' section; D. Flett (Monash Uni) Junior Section 1; and S. McLaughlin (Caul. Gram.) Junior Section 2.**

25 YEARS AGO — 1960

A Section best and fairest saw a tie between **Ian Hayden (U. Blues)** and **Barry Kerr (Old Melb.)** on 20 votes. Both went on to play league football. Ian with Richmond and Barry with Footscray. **Ian Merrick (Coburg) Jock Nelson (MHSOB), F. Clarke (Malvern), P. Sellars (E'wick)** won B, C, D, and E while in the junior section **Ross Smith (H. Rovers)** 33 points, later a Brownlow medalist and St. Kilda coach, defeated **David Parkin (MHSOB)**, Carlton coach 1985.

U. Blues with a strong second half won their semi-final against the **Blacks** by 23 points.

Kew beat **Power House** in 'B' first semi and **UHSOB** won their way into 'A' Section with a crushing defeat of De La Salle in 'B' second semi.

35 YEARS AGO — 1950

'A' Section was the meeting of **University Blues** and **Blacks** in the first semi with one victory each during the season to their credit. The game was played in ideal conditions at St. Kilda Cricket Ground with **Blacks** in control for the first three quarters, kicking 9.4 to 1.1 in the first quarter and leading by 8 goals at the final change. **Blues** staged a magnificent last quarter, kicking 7.2 to **Blacks'** 1.2, and went down by 10 points, final scores being **Blacks** 13.17 to **Blues** 13.7. Best for **Blacks** were **Lionel King, Pat Cash** and **Ken Melville**.

'B' Section semi-finals were won by **Commonwealth Bank** and **Collegians**. Best and fairest winners were 'A' Section — **Manson Russell (Old Scotch)**, 'B' Section — **Phil McLaughlin (Old Paradians)**, 'C' Section — **Alec Castle (Kew)**, 'D' Section — **Alan McFarlane (Moreland)**, and **Robbie Orrmon (Ormond)** in the Junior Section.

Q. Kevin, what is the outstanding memory you have after 19 years of Amateur Football?

A. I would have to say that captaining St. Kilda to the C Section flag last season and winning both my clubs and the Association's Best and Fairest awards.

Q. And other highlights?

A. Being a member of the victorious Victorian team in the 1979 Carnival in Hobart.

Q. Who were your most difficult opponents?

A. Rohan Brown from Old Melburnians, Alan Handley of Coburg and Big Bruce Ivey of West Brunswick. We had a bit of fun Bruce and I.

Q. Which is the best side you with at St. Kilda CBOC?

A. For all round ability I would have to say last years side.

Q. Who are the best sides you played against?

A. Reservoir OB of 1977 and Bulleen-Templestowe 1981.

Q. Any humorous incidents during your career?

A. Oh yes, we wer playing against Parkside and I had become pretty good mates with a Parkside bloke called Ken Howell. Ken was a rough and tough opponent and we'd had plenty of rucking duels. Anyway on this day, they had another fellow against me who didn't seem to like me and at one throw in he went for me and started pulling my hair out — not that I had much left anyway. Well Kenny raced in pulled the bloke off me and wacked his team mate which really confused the umpire who had no idea what to do!

Q. What are your impressions of Amateur football over the years?

A. Oh, the mates and friendships made. On a couple of occasions I was offered good money to play in other comps., but I could never have played elsewhere. Amateur footy offered me exactly what I wanted from football. I hang my hat on the thought that the ball player is given every chance as the competition is so well administered and policed that the whacker sare weeded out.

Q. Have you a desire to coach in the Vafa?

A. Not at senior level but I'd like to coach under-age where the kids are just starting to learn their footy.

Q. Do you see yourself playing any other role in football?

A. I'm not sure. I'm going to have a complete break from football next year and in the short term it would be in under age coaching.

Q. Who do you favour for the B Section Best and Fairest from what you've seen and heard?

A. Andrew Grant (O. Brighton), Yoksich (Parkside) and Slattery (Marcellin).

Q. Who will win promotion and the B Section Flag?

A. Marcellin and Caulfield and if its dry Caulfield but if the grounds remain heavy, Marcellin.

Q. What does Dad think of your retirement?

A. Mum and Dad are pretty pleased I've decided to retire and that I've gotten this far without being hurt. They were worried when I had my face "arranged" a couple of months back, although I don't know that the club is too happy about my decision.

Q. Finally Ox, any other thoughts?

A. I think it has been an excellent move of the Vafa to play other comps, notably the VFA and Country. The encouragement to all players in the amateurs to win a state guernsey has been a great move and matches against Tassie and New South Wales can only promote the Association. It may be for all I know part of a greater plan but it certainly has been a great idea and has lifted the amateur's profile.

Thankyou Kevin you've been an ornament to the game and you'll certainly be missed and remembered!

The senior experienced members of the list have been very supportive in educating the new umpires, and combined with our theme this season of 'communication' not 'confrontation' it has been a very rewarding season, both on and off the field, and I am sure this has been a big reason for bringing us all closer together and respecting each others positions.

From the umpiring point of view this year has been a bonus due to our involvement with the Carnival, and representatives games with the V.A.F.A. and V.C.F.L. where an exchange of ideas between our umpires and fellow umpires has been beneficial and many friendships were made that will be longlasting.

Our umpires are looking forward to the final series as they have worked extremely hard since commencing pre-season training early in January this year and the finals will be a culmination of a year's blood, sweat and tears.






