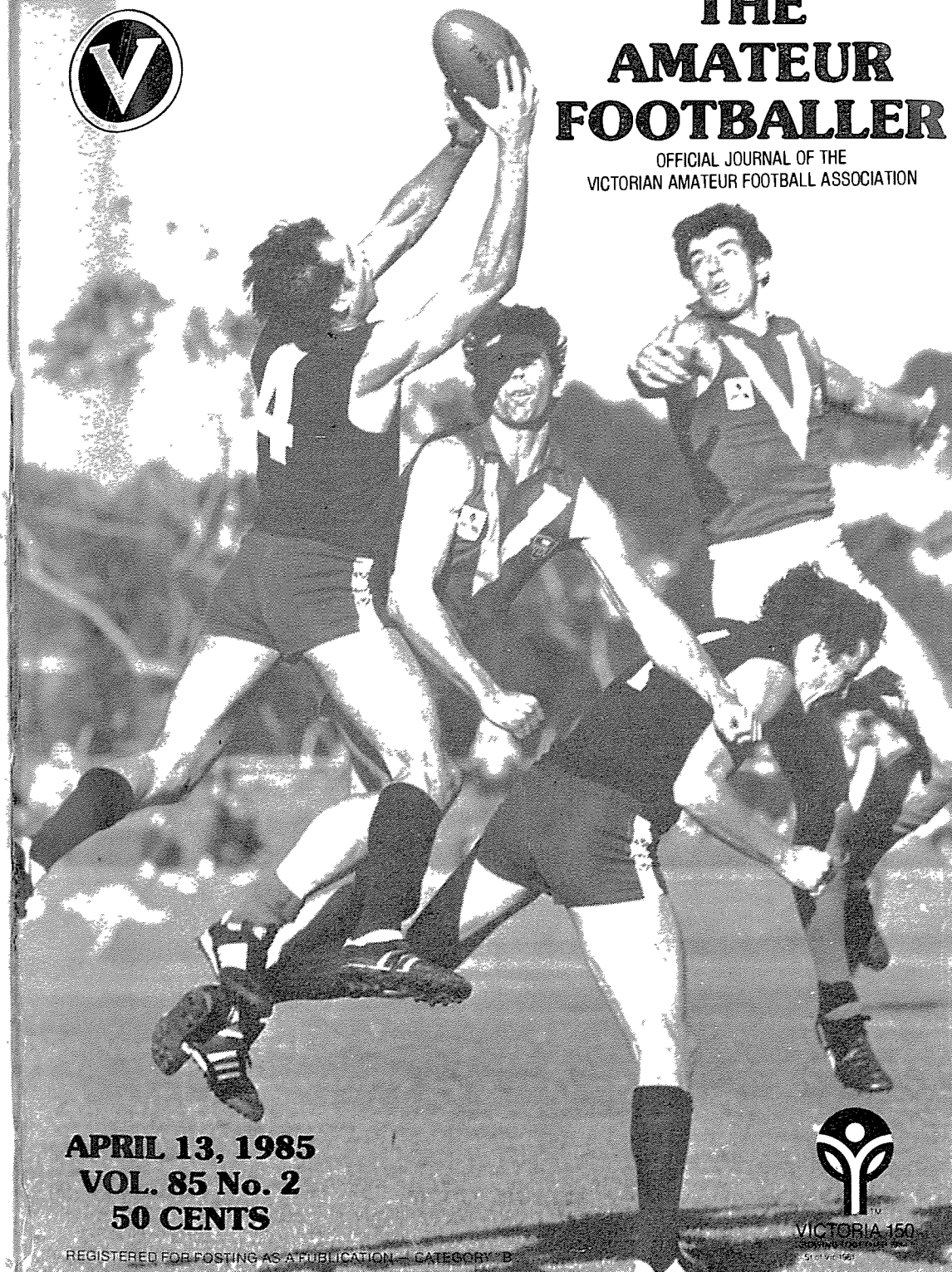

A Section Review by Ross Booth

Easter Saturday's round of A Section matches curiously enough produced no close results: the lowest winning margin was that of **Old Scotch** in their win over **St. Bernard's** by nearly 7 goals.

North Old Boys scored a decisive win over last year's premiers **De La Salle**. De La wasted many opportunities in the first quarter and North led at half time by more than 4 goals. North held De La in the 3rd quarter and stormed home in an otherwise low-scoring game with 5 goals in the final term. A big contributor to North's win was big ruckman **Paul Considine**, who kicked 4 goals. North must have been pleased with the form of former Kew rover **Joey Busuñill**, though the conditions would certainly have been to his liking. North looked to have improved on last year when they finished 8th and coach **Jim Durman** had his team 'fired up' for the last quarter. They look set for a good season and I must admit I probably underrated their win over **Northcote** last week.

De La Salle looked dismal. They only kicked four goals for the day. Had it not been for centre half back **Mick Deveson** and centreman **Tim Cooke**, De La might have lost by more. De La have been notoriously bad starters in recent times. Coach, **John Pollard**, told me that they had not been impressive in their practice matches, in spite of winning them all. The De La hierarchy appeared very concerned at the end of the match. I am sure they will improve: they simply looked underdone. It was agonising to watch former De La Salle captain and president and Sydney Swans general manager **Barry Lyons** watching his old club go down to traditional rivals North, whilst trying to listen to the Swans hang on against Richmond on his tiny transistor.

State coach **Mike Green** was witness to Ormond comfortably accounting for the **Blues** by 42 points at the University. He must have been impressed with what he saw. Ormond won the game in the 2nd quarter and led the Blues by 8 goals at half time. The Blues matched Ormond in the second half but I think it was more a case of Ormond only playing as well as it had to combined with a deterioration in conditions. **Mark McDonald** was an asset at centre half forward: the **Mehrten** brothers were busy and each kicked

three goals. **Boyanon** revelled in the wet and a player to catch the eye was centreline player **Simon Eishold** who had a good duel with the **Blues** new country recruit, **Grant Williams**. It is not hard to see why Melbourne might be interested in the youngster.

The Blues have some good players still injured, including key forwards **Don McInnes** and **Roger Curnow**, plus backman **Tim Carey**. The Blues lacked something up forward and former Under 19 rover **David Lam** and **Richard Polkinghorne** were left to kick goals for the Blues (2 each). Captain and stalwart **Mark 'Nails' Tyquin** was a great trier for the Blues.

Ivanhoe, runner's up in B Section last year caused a mild surprise with their win over **Bulleen-Templestowe** (3rd last year) by 42 points. Ivanhoe were considered by many to be the best side in B Section last year so they might be a side to watch this season. They are a fast running side and in true Ivanhoe tradition are a strong physical side, though coach **Alan Salter** has their aggression tightly controlled. Ivanhoe jumped Bulleen-Temp. with 4 quick goals and then proceeded to kick another 6 goals into the wind in the 2nd quarter. **Gittos** was a good player for the Magpies and it is interesting to see **Morcom** popping up in the goalkickers. Bulleen-Temp. captain **Andy Smythe** has struck early season form as has fellow back line player **Gilmore** at full back.

Scotch beat last year's premiers in B Section. **St. Bernard's**, by 40 points out at West Essendon. St. Bernard's began well but Scotch's high marking and good running game quickly took the game away from St. Bernard's. In the 2nd and 3rd quarters Scotch added 6 and 7 goals respectively. Veteran **Simon Tallent** did well for the Cardinals. Is. and so too did State representative **Brian Hodge** and big man **John Moir**. **Eugene Grbac** did well on his return to the back line as did full back **Kevin Mahady** but the Saints best player was wingman **Gary Wood**.

Old Xaverians were trounced by **Collegians** to the tune of 85 points. On this showing it looks like it might be a long season for new coach **Jack Clarke**, but with the loss of top players to League clubs it is not hard to understand why. Xaverians were sluggish and could not counter Collegians rebound from half back. **Godsell** in the ruck made a welcome return as did **Brendan Ryan** whilst **Terry Stanley** made his presence felt. For the Lions captain **Stuart Hinchin** did well along with evergreen ruckman **Glen Cook**. Twelve Collegians players kicked goals; that says something about their victory.

The Whisper Previews Today's Games

The match of the day in A Section will be played at Elsternwick Park between a new look **North O.B.** and a quietly confident **Old Scotch**. Both clubs were and a disappointingly lost season but started 1985 on a winning note at the expense of reigning Premiers **De La Salle** and B Grade Premiers **St. Bernard's** respectively.

North were delighted with the form of former Kew rover **Joey Busuñill** whilst **Considine** (4 goals) gave promise of a good year.

Scotch on the other hand were well below full strength and can be well pleased with its first up win over **St. Bernard's** at Essendon.

Smith either in the centre or roaming wide was a fine player for the **Cardinals** and the youngster **Matthews** (3 goals) was a dangerous forward.

The key to this game could well be the centre line duets and as **Scotch** have the height to match it with **North** plus a fine winners record of Elsternwick Park I select them to momentarily upset their hosts.

At Waverley oval **De La Salle** will unfurl their 1984 Pennant before a confident and physical **Ivanhoe**. **Alan Salter** has the 'hoe' on the boil and a pre-match ceremony is unlikely to unsettle either their concentration or confidence and they'll make it two out two today.

Ormond look as good as their runner-up and minor premiership honor of 84 suggest and after a convincing win last Saturday should have little trouble in accounting for those notorious slow starters — **Old Xavs**.

Bulleen-Temp. was shocked by its opening loss but playing on the wide-open spaces at Koonung Park for a second week should settle down and return to its good practice match form and account for **St. Bernard's** who will quickly need to appreciate the difference between A & B Section football.

On Sunday **Uni. Blues** and **Collegians** meet at Headquarters to complete the round and Collegians who also appreciate the wide open spaces at Elsternwick Park will further add to **Robert Lamb's** problems by defeating the Blues.

In B Section newcomers **Old Brighton** and **St. Kilda CBC** clash at the Beach oval and I expect the home side to reverse that seasons's Grand Final loss and account for the Saints. **Marcellin** despite the loss of some well known players should handle the **Blacks** out at **Bulleen** and **Parkside** will be too strong for a fleet footed **AJAX**.

Old Paradians should give new coach **Gerard Sholly** a first up win by accounting for **Old Melburnians** whilst **Caulfield Grammarians** may have too much working power for **Kew** who will worry the home side with its tenacity. In a close game **Caulfield** to win.

In C Section my selections are **Thomastown** over **Therry**, **St. Kevins** to beat **Coburg**, **Monash** against **Fawkner**, **Hampton Rovers** over **Old Haileybury** whilst **Old Camberwell** at home are the tip against **Banyule**.

Likely D Section winners are **MHSOB** over the newly promoted **Balaclava**. The high schools experience should see them through in what promises to be a tight game. **North Brunswicks** good practice match form should give it the edge over old rivals **West Brunswick** and I believe **St. Bede's** can surprise **Old Mentonians** who are full of hope for further promotion. **Old Trinity** will be untroubled by **Power House** and **Old Ivanhoe** has what it takes to beat **State Bank**.

In E Section **Peninsula OB** will beat Elsternwick who will not relish the trip to Mt. Eliza and **Preston** should celebrate its first match in the Section with a win over **Uni Reds**. **Old Geelong** has too much form for **Old Carey** and **Heatherton** at home will beat **F.I.T.O.B. Williamstown CYMS** will unfurl its 1984 Premiership Flag before a "who's who" of the City and should then go on and account for **Bulleen United**.

IN F Section **Commonwealth Bank** to win over old rivals **ANZ Bank** and **Clayton** to account for relegated **UHSOB**.

Monash Whites under former Clayton star **Leigh Swann** will beat **Doveton SIOC** (formerly St. Johns) whilst **Old Essendon** at home look winners against **La Trobe**.

Looking Back by Noel Rundle

5 YEARS AGO — 1980

The Association welcomed five new clubs — Banyule, Coolaroo, Rovers, Peninsula Old Boys, St. John's Old Collegians and Thomastown. It was a big day for AJAX with the unfurling of its B Grade flag and the club's first appearance in A Grade since its formation in 1957. The club was also opening the Godfrey Cohen Pavilion, as an extension to the existing clubrooms.

The Executive appointed former Kew Amateurs captain, John Fisher, as State Coach. John represented V.A.F.A. on six occasions and captained the successful 1967 carnival team in Launceston. John left Kew to further his football career with Hawthorn V.F.L. and later returned to Kew as coach from 1970 to 1974.

Well-known senior umpires who had retired were Philip Rowell, Norman Sharpe and David Hindle.

Umpires' Association officials were Don Hillier, president, John Peters, vice-president, Richard Tracey, Secretary and Michael Woodruff treasurer.

1979 'A' Section premiers, De La Salle, under new coach, Gavin White, overwhelmed Old Melburnians, 22.17 to 9.16. Best were: Greene, Connolly, P. Greene (De La Salle) and P. Thompson, Koren, Waddington (Old Melb.).

10 YEARS AGO — 1975

New teams admitted to the Association were Bulleen United and Heatherton (F Section) and Thomastown (Junior Section 2). Bulleen-Templestowe who competed in Junior Section in 1974 also fielded a team in F Section.

'A' Section coaches were Graham Warfe (Coburg), Bill Harding (Monash Blues), Shane Maguire (North Old Boys), Denis Dalton (Old Paradians), Ted Farrell (Ormond), Brian King (Reservoir O.B.), Gus Mitchell (St. Bernards O.C.), Peter O'Donoghue (U. Blacks), Ray Wookey (Geelong), Alec Gardiner (Old Trinity). 100 games to Mich. (Lungs) Fernon (St. Kevins O.B., best and fairest 1970 and committeeman since 1971.

Ormond avenged their 1974 grand final defeat when they scored a 29 point win over U. Blacks. Only 4 points separated the teams at half-time but Ormond's phenomenal accuracy (13.1) in the second half was too much for Blacks' 8 goals.

15 YEARS AGO — 1970

The V.A.F.A. welcomed three new clubs for season 1970 — Old Essendon Grammarians, La Trobe University, and Dookie and Longerenong Old Coll.

A highlight of the season was the A.A.F.C. carnival to be staged in Perth. Previous Perth carnivals had been in 1948 (won by South Australia) and 1959 (won by Victoria).

Umpires in 'A' Section for opening day were Gavin Marshall, Graeme Simpson, Geoff Thomas, Darryl George and Bill Mason.

Ivanhoe and De La Salle made reappearances in 'A' Section.

Coburg 'A' Section premiers for 1969, unfurled their flag in the presence of Caulfield Grammarians. They had many anxious moments and it was only in the last 10 minutes that they gained control and won by 16 points.

'B' Section grand finalists in 1969, Ivanhoe and De La Salle provided a real upset with De La Salle, after kicking 10.3 to 2.2 in the first quarter, defeating Ivanhoe by 53 points to reverse the 1969 Grand Final result.

M.H.S.O.B. congratulated their 1970 coaches, Keith Marshall and George Inkster, on their appointments.

20 YEARS AGO — 1965

1965 opened up with the acquisition of St. Kilda Cricket Ground as the Association's headquarters, with the match of the day being played there.

Feature game for the opening day was the meeting of 1964 premiers Old Paradians and Collegians, with Collegians leading all day to win convincingly, 10.12(72) to 5.5(35).

Max Barker and Harry Nance were umpires' coach and assistant respectively.

Advertisers were Repco, TAA, Gifford Goaler, Channel 0, Volkswagon, Victoria Discount House, National Bank, Arena, Sherrin, Mount Catering and Ansett ANA.

AJAX's first club captain, Lionel Rosenberg, had been appointed senior coach for 1965.

25 YEARS AGO — 1960

After two years of unofficial operation the curtain-raiser section became officially part of the Association to be known as the Reserve Section.

This brought the strength of the Association to 74 teams. Teams represented were Old Melburnians, Old Xaverians, AJAX, Ivanhoe, Bellfield, Old Brighton Grammarians, Ormond, Old Scotch Collegians, Old Paradians, St. Kilda C.B.O.C., State Savings Bank, University, Caulfield Grammarians, De La Salle O.C.

At the annual general meeting of Collegians, Jack McCann was made the first patron of the club. Keith Lewis succeeded Jack as president, the fourth since the club's inception in 1891.

'A' Section umpires for the day were Barker, H. Roberts, Lee, Amey, and Hinton.

Tribunal members were G. Barnett, C. Crosskell, D. Fraser, A.L. Hassett, I.W. Johnson, G.T. Moore and F. Northcott.

The season opened in bad conditions after seven inches of rain in the previous three days. Old Xaverians was the only 'A' team to score over 100 points, with seven 'A' Section teams scoring less than 50 points.

Ormond 4.7, beat U. Blacks 3.4.

35 YEARS AGO — 1950

Thirty-nine senior and eight junior teams lined up for start of the season on April 22, 1950.

Ormond turned the tables on their 1949 grand final conquerors, University Blacks when they held on at University to beat the home side by 15 points. John Backhouse, state full-forward, who transferred from M.H.S.O.B. starred for Blacks with 7 out of their 10 goals.

University Blues, runners up to Geelong in 'B' Section in 1949, also reversed the result when they defeated the home side, 15.12 to 12.8. Geelong's ground was Corio Oval.

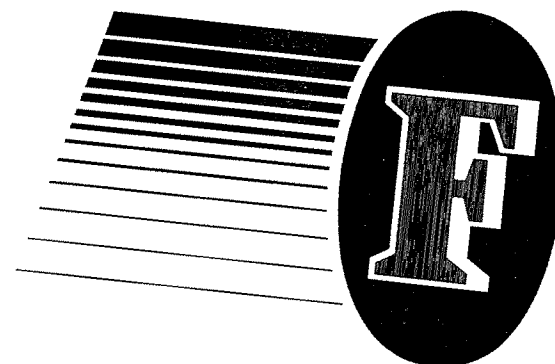
