


A Section Review

Collegians finished top of A Section when they decisively accounted for North Old Boys by 26 points at Harry Trott. North were top just two weeks ago but have finished fourth as De La Salle's win over Blues was enough for De La to go ahead of North on percentage.

Collegians never looked like losing after their good start against North. Geoff English at full forward kicked 5 goals and at the other end the full back line of Wright, Williams and Irvine was rock-like in defence. Steve Laussen was a very damaging ruck-rover.

North did not look impressive, and even when coach Jim Durnan called on his players to do "anything", very few responded. John Dore in the ruck and at centre half forward was one to stand out. North overdid the handball and short game and Collegians had tackling brought it unstuck.

Ormond retained the double chance with its big 58 point win over St. Bernard's. The loss ended the Saints hopes of surviving in A Section. St. Bernard's started the match well, kicking 5 goals straight in the first quarter to lead by 14 points but Ormond slammed on 7 goals 5 in the second term to the Saints solitary point. Graeme Herkess had a good duel with Paul "Chief" Smith in the ruck. Mark McDonald and Michael Oaten each kicked 4 goals for Ormond. St. Bernard's Corey Klaaysen was once again a fine ruckrover and kicked 3 goals.

De La Salle did not have it all their own way against University Blues. They eventually won by 33 points but not after a very close contest until three quarter time when Blues led by 6 points. Blues began brilliantly, having 5 goals on the board before De La scored. But De La Salle fought their way back into the game and

early in the last quarter broke loose with 9 goals. For De La Salle Kerin got 6, Harrington 5 and Murphy 4 and for Blues McInnes got 6 and Wallis 5 goals. Harrington, the De La half forward was best and for Blues it was evergreen centreman Bernie Angel and wingman Dave Nugent who starred. It was a satisfactory day for both clubs — De La Salle into 3rd place and University Blues remain in A Section.

Old Scotch handsomely beat Bulleen-Templestowe by 43 points but their good form came too late as they finished fifth. Scotch got the early break through Smith, Hodge and Fuller and were never headed. Bedford, Kiel and Mason each got 4 goals. Bulleen full forward Stephen Pace kicked 6 goals and finished on top of the National Trustees goal kicking list with 59. Mal Palmer and Paul Lochhart were other triers for the Bullants.

In a game without great importance, Ivanhoe beat Old Xaverians by 49 points. Ivanhoe held an 8 goal lead at quarter time and that was the final margin. Centre half back Peter Gittos has a good day and beat Nick Wilton and Ivanhoe's smaller brigade of Course, Clements and Sedgewick gave it the necessary drive. Old Xavs defended desperately — without the good paly of Klein, Greetham, Trainor and Atkinson the margin would have been greater.

In A Section's 1st semi final between **De La Salle** and **North Old Boys** I fance **DE LA SALLE**. I picked 5 out of 5 last week — I wonder if I can keep it up.

In B Section **Old Paradians** upset of **Marcellin** stopped my clean sweep. In the Sunday 1st semi final I would be very surprised to see Old Melburnians upset **PARKSIDE**.

The Whisper Previews Today's Games

Its finals time. The time when the heart pumps a little faster, you nick off from work a bit early so as to star on the training track and impress the coach, the light is better, blokes seem to throw off injuries that have kept them out of recent games and there is a real buzz around the club. Those in the first semi work out all the reasons for winning, those in the second know that winning means promotion at least, except in A section where the prize is appearance in the BIG match of the season.

In A section old rivals De La Salle and North meet in the cut throat first semi, Since 1975 they've played in 5 finals of which De La has won 2 and North 3. Today De La will level the score as they're the form side at present having had 3 strong wins against Blues, Old Scotch and Ormond in the lead up, whereas North have lost to Collegians and Ormond and only beaten relegated side St. Bernards. However North does have in its favour its unbeaten record against De La this season. They won by 53 points at De La Salle in the opening round and by 48 points in the return game on May 4th. There are a good number of De La "experts" who do not relish the prospect of playing North today and I wonder if there are not a few players also. The "experts" would have preferred to meet Ormond or Collegians against whom they are more than confident. I suppose such arrogance is fair comment after all De La has won 5 of the last 8 A Section Grand Finals. Enough of statistics - let's look at the players. De La have match winners up forward in Phil Kerin and Shane Murphy both of whom are in fine form, in fact Murphy is playing as well at the moment as he ever has for De La and Gus Carroll has a big task ahead of him. Young Marchbank will no doubt line up on Kerin and give away height and weight to the De La spearhead. If Kerin gets on top early Durnan may be forced to play skipper Jerome Griffin at full back which could upset his game plan as Griffin has been a useful on ball player and also done well up forward. Another vital clash will be between respective ruckmen Greene (D.L.) and Paul Considine (Nth). Greene is stronger and a more consistent mark but the North man is more mobile has a better spring and kicks well. Conditions will suit Considine and his drive will worry the De La brains trust. although like many followers of A Section football I have the utmost respect for Greene. Around the packs. Busutill and Cahill should hold sway. They're stronger than Lawe and Vitacca who is rarely used on the ball and just as tough as the De La pair. Across the centre O'Rourke who is having a great season will beat Maher whose form has been patchy but De La should hold sway on the wings, although I note Harrington bobbed up with 5 goals last week which suggests he was used as a flanker or third rover than wingman. De La's defence has been led by the dashing Leonard and with the ever reliable Deveson and Bourke to support him, North's forwards will struggle.

Dillon may out mark Leonard but he lacks pace and is not good on the ground. He will need support especially from North's prime movers Egan and Hanlon. Besides De La's consistent and much improved form of late its big name players can be relied upon to put in and with the advantage of finals experience and more skill around the flanks, De La should put an end to North for 1985 and at the same time line itself up for the next step on the ladder of defending its title.

The B Section first semi looks a forgone conclusion and certainly Parkside are entitled to start favourites following their 55 point win over Old Melburnians last Saturday, and their 2 victories during the season. The Parkside players know thay can beat O.M.s and coach Peter Yeo has the huge football challenge of motivating his side, some of whom, I think agree with their opposition! O.Ms will welcome the return of John "China" Thompson but to have any hope will need a more disciplined approach. Last weekfor example there were countless occasions where Mattingly flew against Hec Thompson and vice versa. In addition Baglin a fine rover who has plenty of courage was never in cooee of either Freeman, who like Ormond's Eishold. is always where the ball is and the evergreen King who relished Elsternwick Park and was allowed to raom free. Witts Pattison and Davine were others who did not work hard enough on the defensive side of their play. Parkside's biggest worry is who to select. Coleman is available after a "4 week spell" and both Yoksich and Stretton have, Tom Johnston asures, recovered from injury. I don't know about Streeton who is tipped to play at full forward and his clash with Pisarski will certainly be worth watching, but Yoksich still had his broken middle finger well strapped last Saturday and the Club has to decide whether to risk him or not. Given Bradley's good form and the Parkside view that Rohan **Brown** is grossly overrated I shouldn't be surprised if Parksides' gentle giant is held back until the Preliminary. Parkside has so many players in top form, the brothers Shaw, Williams and Page that I can't see O.M.s getting close and it really wouldn't have mattered where they played this game Northcote or The Park" - Parkside will win it easily.

In C Section Fawkner should move into B Section and keep its unbeaten record intact by defeating Therry and I've a feeling that Old Camberwell who will really be playing their third semi in as many weeks can continue their winning form and upset Banyule. Old Camberwell has won its last 2 matches by less than a goal and will thus be used to the pressure.

In D Section **Old Trinity** who are also chasing a championship title are odds on against **Melbourne High School**. They've had a great year. **Chris Brent** won the goalkicking and skipper **Scott Cawley** the competition B & F. As

In the "all or nothing at all" first semi Old Mentonians had better not take West Brunswick lightly. There is tremendous spirit at West and they have two key forwards in Smith and Hall plus the dangerous Lawley who could easily spike the Old Mentonians plans for entry to C Section. However Old Mentonians ave have shown greater consistency and should win a good game.

The E Section second semi should be won by **Preston** who will use the big Bulleen ground better than **Heatherton** and I believe **Peninsula** cna overcome **Elsternwick** who will be weakened by the loss of ruckman **Errol Hill**.

Clayton should at last say goodbye to F Section after 3 years of disappointment thus forcing **Doveton** into the Preliminary next Saturday against **Brunswick** whom I believe can beat **Commonwealth Bank**. The Bank have lost the sarkle they showed early and mid season and may not have the character to match it with Brunswick.

The Under 19 Grand Finals should be won by **Bulleen-Templestowe** in Zone 1, although **North** can be expected to provide plenty of opposition. Bulleen are just a bit better. In Zone 2 **De La** made swift work of **Ormond** last Saturday and are really fired up for the return bout with **Melbourne High** today. The High school upset De La with its vigour in the semi and De La will be far more prepared this time and in what promises to be a great game should win narrowly.


