



A Section Review

De La Salle advanced to the Preliminary Final with a comprehensive 46 point win over **North Old Boys** in last week's 1st semi-final.

De La Salle kicked with the breeze and mid way through the quarter slipped away to a handy lead thanks to 3 early goals from half forward **David Harrington**.

North trailed by 26 points at quarter time but by midway through the second quarter had fought back with 4 goals to trail by only 3 points. But this was the closest North got to De La Salle, and in fact North did not score another goal after this, adding just 2 pointed in the second half.

De La Salle led by 39 points at three-quarter time after a good 5 goal quarter with the breeze and then in a superb final term display of disciplined defensive running football into the breeze kicked a goal themselves and kept **North** scoreless.

A great part of **De La**'s drive came from ruckman **Mick Green**. He missed the early part of the season with a leg injury and **De La Salle's** revival is in a large part due to his presence. **Gasparin** was a creative winger, and **Shane Murphy** a dangerous forward kicking 4 goals. But, it was the **De La** defence led by **Deveson** and **Leonard** and supported by **Bourke** and **McHenry** whick repelled **North's** approach to goal and provided a springboard for attack.

North was terribly disappointing. The stage was set for them for a grandstand finish with the breeze but they folded in much the same fashion as the week before against top side Collegians.Conti,Dore,DuboisandGriffindefended as best they could but North's forwards were not to be found. Their main goal scorer was half back Bruno Conti with 2 goals. Rovers Brown and Busutill tried hard, even though they were changed off the bench!

North must now look to 1986 and De La Salle with all guns firing loom as a definite possibility for a crack at their 3rd successive flag.

The thought of playing **De La Salle** in the Preliminary Final will be an added incentive for both **Collegians** and **Ormond**.

I saw **Ormond** beat **Collegians** at the Gunn Reserve earlier in the year. **Mike McArthur-Allen** thought this was one of the best games he has seen. He has great respect for **Collegians** and so do I. I think the big ground will suit **Collegians**. They were the better side on the day in the recent draw at Harry Trott. I thought that day that I'd seen a warm up for the Grand Final. **COLLEGIANS v Ormond**

In B Section, both Caulfield and Marcellin won their home games. Elsternwick will suit Caulfield but I think they have lost their edge. Caulfield v MARCELLIN.

The Whisper's View of the Semis and Predictions for the Preliminary Finals

Congratulations to Clayton who after 3 years of trying have now made it to E Section as a result of their good win over Doveton. Also to Preston who have now moved up to D Section in only 2 seasons although they were hard pushed by Heaherton who put up a fine show. Old Trinity and Fawkner as expected were clear winners and will now paly in C and B Sections respectively in 1986.

It's mothballs for Commonwealth Bank whose form fell away at the wrong time of the season and Peninsula O.B. who again disappointed. Old Mentonians was not a match for West Brunswick and Banyule live to fight another day with a solid win over Old Camberwell. At the top of the tree North O.B. put in a poor performance against De La Salle and Old Melburnians was as unlucky as Parkside was lucky to be tumbled out of the B Section 1st semi which was in reality an excellent game and both sides are to be complimented on their performance.

Finally congratulations go to Under 19 Premiers Bulleen-Templestowe and Melbourne High School Old Boys who were respective Zone 1 and Zone 2 Premiers. Their clash on Sunday is being eagerly awaited and as both sides reached the semis of this competition last season it's perhaps appropriate that they are playing off today.

The winner presents me with a difficulty as Bulleen-Templestowe have had a great season and won its second semi and Grand final well despite spirited opposition from North Old Boys. On the other hand M.H.S.O.B. have clicked at the right time as the fine wins over the unbeated De La Salle in both the second semi and the Grand Final show, and as a result of having the spirit and ability to overcome De La's first round invincibility I'm going for the High School to beat Bulleen-Templestowe in what promises to be a high standard game.

Lookin now at the 4 Preliminary Finals -Brunswick will, in this scribe's opinion, start as favouritesagainst Doveton in FSection. Brunswick beat Doveton by 10 goals in Round 18 to hold its place in the 4 and followed up with a fighting win in the semi final against Commonwealth Bank. Doveton has lost confidence and appears to rely on a few stars whereas Brunswick, like Clayton, are a far more even combination and I believe that is a strength that will see the "Wicks" move into the Grand Final and back into E Section. After 5 years in the wilderness Doveton will have to be content with a great improvement and early favourites for 1986!

The E Section Preliminary Final will be a humdinger. Virtual newcomer Heatherton. established in 1975, against Elsternwick which with Collegians and the University are among the Association's longest serving clubs. Elsternwick was decidedly impressive in its win over

the Collingwood of E Section Peninsula Old Boys whilst Heatherton can be counted as unlucky to have gone down to Preston. During the season both clubs had away wins, the most significant perhaps being Elsternwick's 4 point win at Heatherton on August 3rd. Both sides have plenty of what it takes and Elsternwick will need to keep a tight rein on Steve Reiger the section's leading goal kicker. However "Lumpy" Rosewarne is a shrewd tactician and the Monash oval should suit the running game which Elsternwick have gradually developed over the season, and this fact plus a degree more of enthusiasm should see Elsternwick through to its first Grand Final since 1975.

Melbourne High has the job in front of it in the DSEction Preliminary. It faces West Brunswick for whom everything has gone right of late and the club is chock full of confidence and moreover playing strong disciplined football. There are some fine players at West and the High School will need to start well for if West get a sniff of victory they'll go right on with it. Alan Quaife will no doubt have spent many hours preparing both his players and a game plan but Graeme Weatherall his opposite number has imbued terrific spirit into West Brunswick and in the upset of the day I'm going for the Black and Whites!.

In C Section Therry as anticipated meet Banyule who I'll admit surprised me with its semi final performance in the cut throat of matches. B Section, and all the recognition and privilege that section provides is the coveted prize for the winner and Therry's record against Banyule over their years of competition suggest that "Brockwells' Banyule may have the edge! Let me elaborate. During this season Therry won by 7 points at home on July 27th and Banyule were victors by 29 points on May 18th. The clubs first met in F Section in 1980 and Therry was successful on both occasions, 1981 sawadrawanda Banyulewinbutmoresignificantly Banyule despite going down in the second semi won the "big one" and the F Section flag. In 1982 each side had a home win but this time roles were reversed and Banvule won the second semi and D Section whilst Therry had its revenige when the E SEction pennant was unfurled at Oak Park. In 1983 Therry won both home and away matches but slipped up in the second semi which saw banyule into C Section and this time Therry did not follow as Fawkner upset them in the Preliminary.

All these stats are history now and Bernie Dunn is fully aware that his off field decisions plus the performance of his players will decide the club's immediate future. After lying second all season it would be a further blow to the Therry hierarchy if the club had to spend 1986 in C Section. Make no mistake this game will be a ripper and I expect nothing in it for three

quarters. However Therry's form all season and good effort last week against Fawkner suggest to me that its little bit of extra class will just see it home in what will undoubtedly be a match to

In A and B Section it's Second Semi Day and in B Section there is of course 2 prizes for the winner. Caulfield Grammarians has not played in the top grade since 1978 whilst Marcellin of course has the unenviable record of having the greatest number of wins ever for a club deposed from A Section (8). During the season each recorded a home win and the two clubs have only met once before in a final, back in 1976 when Marcellin emerged victorious in the B Section Grand Final, Strangely both clubs were relegated from A Section in 1978 but where Marcellin bounced back to A Section in 1980. Caulfield slid further and went down to C Section in 1982 bouncing back to B in 1984 with the 1983 C Section flag.

The A Section second semi final promises to be everything a final should be as both sides Ormond and Collegians have very special reasons for succeeding and moving onto the major match of the season.

Collegians have not appeared in an A Section Grand Final in more than 20 years and Ormand has spent 12 months awaiting a chance to redeem its pride after the debacle against De La Salle of last season. Motivation will not be a worryforeither Bruce Ferguson or Mike McArthur-Allen although the Ormond man has not quite the full list of players that Collegians boast. There is doubt over wingman Paul Sutherland who tragically missed last years final series and I for one am hopeful he is OK for a return bout with the highly regarded Lion wingman Jeremy Schmidt. Their clash promises to be a highlight is a game that should produce all that is great is Australian football.

Collegians have a fine crop of young players many of whom have had finals experience in both 1983 and 84. I refer to Hermon, Roberts, Irvine, Baum, Tregear and Pollock, Back them up with skipper Hinchen, the Parsons Greg and Keith, Tim Bennett, Andrew Doff and Williams and Collegians have a more than useful blend of experience, youth, skill and doggedness the latter a quality which has enabled the side to finish the season as minor premiers. They have great pace and are easily the best side in the VAFA when it comes to ball disposal, either by foot or hand. On the wide open spaces of Elsternwick Park Collegians ability to move the ball quickly plus their even distribution of height suggests to me they're likely winners.

However experience has taught me that in finals the unexpected often happens and the unpopular or unlikely often wins. I do not for a moment suggest that Ormond is unpopular but I do think its form leading into the finals has not quite matched that of Collegians and hence my comment that its ithe unlikely winner or underdog. a situation that will not worry Ormond one little bit. Suppose Collegians do not get the ball moving because Andy Mehrten and Tony Bov-

anton (I hope he's fit!) get to it first. What if Kinston and Russell control the centre, a big factor at Elsternwick Park? Perhaps Michael Oaten will give Ormond the game of his life and Chris McAsey turns on a really big one. Surely Simon Eishold is better value team wise than Collegians Ian Hermon and Russell Barnes and Ross Tonkin are both hard working defenders who will not wilt under pressure. Alan Navior in possibly his last season is bound to have a big influence on the game and having watched the McDonald brothers in various representative matches this year has me thinking that either Stuart Hinchen or Greg Parsons will have his hands decidedly full with Mark McDonald whilst brother David will form the perfect limk with Barnes and McAsey to give Ormand a rebounding Barnes and McAsey to give Ormand a rebounding half back line. The more I write and dwell on this game the more I'm confused, as man for man, Ormond matches it with Collegians.

No the winner of this game will be the Team which functions as the name implies, and although there is plenty of team spirit and unity at Harry Trott I believe there is more at Molone Streett as they've survived on nothing else in some bleak years and for that reason I'm going for the 'Mons' and I could not recommend a game more to you all. "Going to Waverley? not on vour life mate. Get your car on the fence at Elsternwick Park and watch a really good game. They've even got an electronic scorebaord there now...

What Coaches Say

Peter French talks to Mike McArthur-Allen of Ormond:

Q. Having played in the second semi last season and been beated narrowly, are you a better side and better prepared this year?

A. We are a better side this year as there's more all round talent and we do not rely on 2 or 3 name players as in the past. We had 12 month's preparation and you can't have better preparation than being runners-up the previous season.

Q. Did the final composition of the four surprise you?

A. No - I didn't believe Scotch was the side others believed they were and the best four sides

Q. Looking now at the game how did you go against Collegians during the year and do you agree they play the same style as De La Salle?

A. We beat them at home and snatched a draw at Harry Trott. Actually the win at home was the best Amateur game I'd seen as it had everything. With regard to style they're guite different to De La Salle who rely on a possession style. Collegians have a style of their own and have a mobile forward line.

Q. Are you going into the game as the underdogs?

No its a line ball and the two best sides are playing.

Q. Ormond like most clubs has been hard hit by injury this season. What is the latest on Phil Mehrten, and have you the depth to cover the others?

A. We've got heaps of depth and it's no good having Reserves on top if they're not supplying players for the seniors. Mehrtens a 50/50 chance at this stage.

Q. Are the players happy and confident of playing at Elsternwick Park and do you think that the size of the Ormond oval is disruptive to establishing a style of play?

A. Yes, the players are delighted to play at Elsternwick Park, in fact two of our best performances this season were big wins over De La Salle and Ivanhoe. Yes, the size of the Ormond oval does present some difficulties.

Q. Finally, where will you beat Collegians?

A. I just think we're a better side and would never tip my hand in regards to strategy. It's our **Team** that will win it for us and I believe that's reflected in our Best and Fairest voting which I predict will be verv even.

Peter French talks with Bruce Ferguson of Collegians:

Q. Bruce the side has shown more consistency and devil this season. How has this come about?

The players have got older and with that has come experience.

The decision to field an Under 19 team seems to have paid dividends when one considers the performances of Schmidt, Roberts and Irvine. Are you worried by Ormond's greater finals experience?

A. No. I'm just worried by their ability.

Q. I asked Mike McArthur-Allen if he was surprised by the final composition of the four. Were you. and was the season as even as last year?

A. I was surprised Scotch didn't make it as in my opinion they had some talented players. No not quite as even.

Q. Has the loss of Cooke, Shimmen and Hibbins effected the side?

Yes. it's allowed some younger blokes to have more of a go, one door opens another closes.

Q. For years you've had the reputation of being a poor wet weather side. Will a wet and heavy ground worry you in these finals?

A. Not as much as in the past and I think against De La Salle and Ormond we've proved we're improved on heavy grounds.

Where can you beat Ormond?

We've got to pressure them around the ball so that our height can be of use to us.

I guess there's a real buzz about the Club at present?

Yes, it's the first time in 20 years we've finished on top and the Club is confident of playing in it's first A Section Grand Final since 1961.

Peter French talks to Peter Chisnall of Caulfield Grammarians:

Q. Peter you are well remembered as a Member of North Melbourne's first Premiership side but what is your coaching background?

A. After North I went to Tasmania and coached New Norfolk and was also made T.F.L. coach for two

vears where we had four wins and the only loss was to a V.F.L. side. At New Norfolk we were twice beaten in Preliminary finals. I then returned to my old Club Corowa who amalgamated with Rutherglen and reached the Preliminary in the first year and also coached the Ovens and Murray side. Since then I helped at Port Melbourne and been on the development side at North in Barassi's era.

Q. What then is your impression of Amateur Football?

A. I have a very high regard for it. I believe that the Amateur players and Amateur people — i.e. at club and Association level are well on the way to taking over from the V.F.A. The football is of a high standard and players I've seen have great talent.

Q. What conditions would you hope for on Sunday?

I think we'd prefer holding type conditions. We've lost a couple on boggy grounds but on those occasions it was an attitude problem and we didn't prepare ourselves well.

Q. Would you agree that you have more 'name' players than the opposition and that their experience will be the telling factor?

A. I think experience is going to be a telling factor. However, experience can come very quickly. With good young players, especially in finals where anything can happen.

Q. Where else will you win the game?

A. I think the areas we'll be working on are our forward line strength which is a big plus and the games we've played well we've only really put two good quarters together and our full back line who've been together all year is very tight. Our half back line is also a grea rebounding line.

Peter French talks to Neil Le Lievre of Marcellin:

Q. Neil, what is your background as a coach?

I was with St. Mary's in the Eastern Suburban Churches for five years and De La Salle for two vears.

Q. Was it a difficult decision to take on the Marcellin job, especially as they had been relegated from A Section and lost the services of experienced players such as John Jones, John Toomey, Dominic Simmonette, Bernie Cooper and Nick Bourke?

A. Yes it was a difficult decision but not for those reasons.

Having coached in A Section and successfully I might add, what then is the difference between A and B Section football?

A. The A Grade teams have far more depth.

Despite the last round loss to Old Paradians have you and the team any doubts that you won't emerge victorious?

A. No.

Q. Caulfield has been promotion and Premiership favourite for most of the year, is that a problem for your side who are really quite inexperienced by comparison? A. No I don't see that as being a problem, although we're all mindful of their good record this

season

Why will you win the game? If we're able to stop their star players and can run the ball we should emerge victorious. We've obviously got full respect for Caulfield and must approach the game positively.


