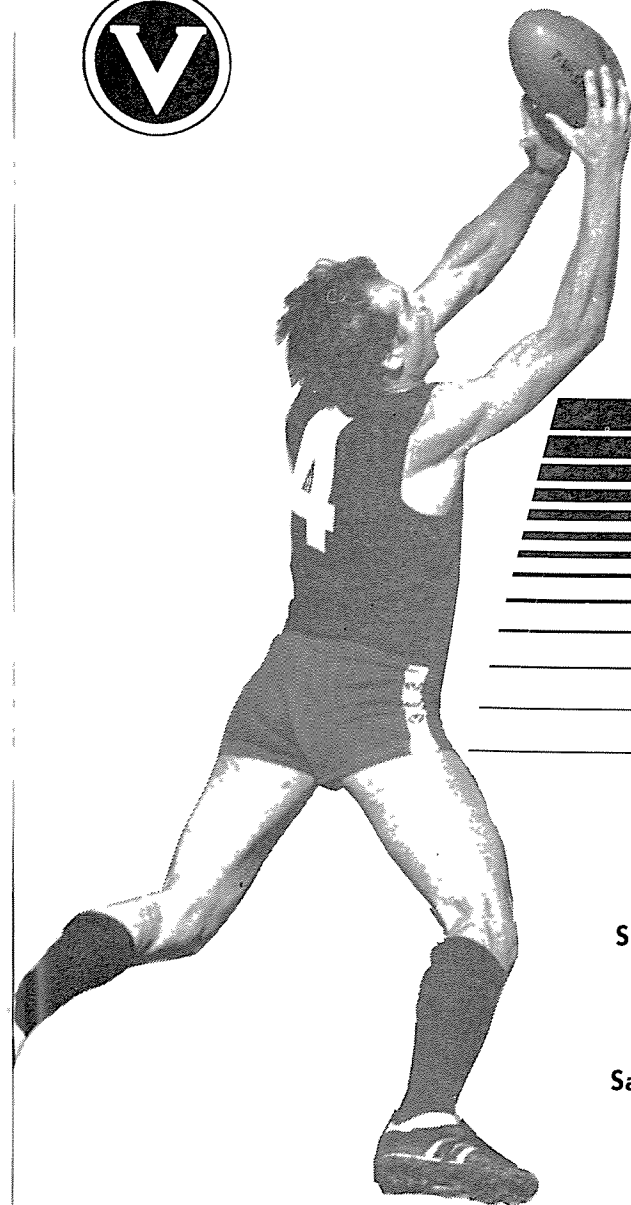

A Section Review

Ormond convincingly accounted for Collegians by 43 points in the A Section second semi-final last week.

The light breeze favoured the northern end for a change and Collegians started on fire with 4 goals in the first 10 minutes, and despite the early injury to backman Greg Parsons the Lions defence was able to hold out Ormond in that first quarter — Ormond kicked just 7 points and trailed by 22 points at the first break.

But in the second term Ormond took over, kicking 8 goals 2 for the quarter to Collegians solitary point to convert their deficit into a 27 point lead at half time. Forward pocket Phil Mehrten who had missed recent weeks with a eye injury, was in brilliant touch and kicked 3 goals in this quarter and finished with 6 goals for the day.

The Ormond defence led by half backs Chris McAsey and Russel Barnes and backed up by a chubby but highly effective Steve McCooke in the back pocket blanketed the Collegians forwards and set up many opportunities with great rebound football. Paul Sutherland on the wing had a sensational quarter and had the better of Collegians Jeremy Schmidt on the day.

Collegians tried hard to get back into the game in the second half but their confidence had been shattered by Ormond's second term burst.

Simon Williams, moved out to centre half back battled hard to lift the side and Ian Herman provided some inspiration with 4 goals. Young Chris Polloch in the ruck was another to perform creditably.

Collegians lack of depth showed and they will be looking to include Hoyle and Eason this week. I think we've seen the worst of Collegians and possibly the best of Ormond in what great surprises to see Mehrten and McCooke not only play but perform such vital roles!

This week Collegians must forget their nightmare and face proven finals specialists De La Salle for the right to meet flag favourites Ormond next Sunday. De La Salle will be the popular pick even though they lost both encounters during the year. Mind you, De La were without state representatives in the last clash. I think it will be close and it is more on faith than logic that I go for COLLEGIANS v De La Salle.

And now to the Grand Finals. Its the one day in September from C to F Section and as a result of a direction from my Boss the 'G.M.', I've got to give the Reserves a bit of a go this week. Alas I don't see many Reserves games but looking at F Section I reckon Uni. High can win back to backs and in E Section I'm going for Williamstown who should benefit from having some senior players available. I'm confident Old Trinity rezzies will get the first leg of the D Section double but have no idea in C Section. After tossing a coin its Therry! In B Section Blacks and Old Paradians have forced a replay and there's no way known I'm going for Blacks who surrendered a 6 goal lead in the last 10 minutes. Go to it O.P.'s.

The A Section reserves preliminary features Ivanhoe and De la Salle. Ivanhoe was desperately unlucky to go down last week and I believe they'll bounce back to beat De La and gain another shot at Ormond.

Clayton will go into the F Section Grand Final as favourites which is not always the best. Brunswick has made it, through from fourth place which is a fine performance and as they do not rely on one or two 'stars' are bound to give Clayton a real run for its money. In fact both sides are evenly matched and in selecting the 'Dragons' (Clayton) I do so bearing in mind the heartbreaks of recent seasons.

E Section will possibly produce the closest game as Heatherton and Preston are quite well matched. E Section leading goalkicker **Steve Reigar** had a quiet day last week and still Heatherton won easily. Should he fire today Preston could be in trouble and much will depend on the performances from the 'old heads' like **Shane Ryles** for example. Its easy to panic in finals if you get behind and the frees start going against you, but finals especially Grand Finals, are a real test of character and persistence and

as both sides possess these qualities a close game is assured. The Old Xavs oval will suit Preston's running game and I feel they will win due to their consistency but I repeat its bound to be oh so close! (P.S. Please don't draw!)

D Section sees Old Trinity closing that elusive title of 'Premiers and Champions' on the season's efforts they should attain it and top off a great year for the Green and Gold. They were both D Section finalists last year and have met 3 times this season. No matter how **Alan Quaffe** alters his side or charges up his side it still points to an Old Trinity Premiership, although Andrew Disney had better watch out if MHS sneak a couple of its U.19s into the side because let me tell you these kids can really play!

Like Old Trinity in D Section Fawkner will also be chasing the 'Premiers & Champions' title when it meets Therry at Elsternwick Park. The navy blues have carried all before them all season and have played far more disciplined football in 1985 than we've seen from previous Fawkner sides. The club is confident of success and having beaten Therry on 4 occasions during the season is entitled to be so. I suppose the big hope for Therry is a windy day win the toss pile up a big score and bottle Fawkner up. I'll bet **Bernie Dunn** has thought of that too, for being a former De La man that club has employed those tactics most successfully in the past. Still there are too many ifs and buts for me and common sense says its Fawkner.

The B Section Preliminary will be, as all B Section Prelims are, a hard slogging affair because the winner's prize is so great. Marcellin's poor showing last week suggests they can only improve. They let themselves and their club down badly and have suffered cruel injuries to **Waishe and Cullinan**. Where do you find a full back and centre half back at this stage of the season? Again Marcellin faces the problem of to few (have they got any?) "old heads" whereas Parkside certainly do not lack in this area. The big plus for the 'Red Devils' is the incentive of a first ever appearance in the 'Big Time' — A Section, although Marcellin will also be keen to leave B Section.

Comparing the sides Parkside will hold sway in the ruck where **Yoksich and Franklin** will be too big for Marcellins **Matt Getson**. **Marcellin** failed badly up forward last week and once again faces a tough defence. Parkside are underated in this area and with **Sansonetti** is brilliant form supported by **Coleman & Shaw** its hard to see Marcellin kicking a winning score. Three players Marcellin must hold are **Freeman, Williams and King**. This trio are very dangerous around goals and have the ability to really lift Parkside when all is not going well.

I must go for Parkside — their experience and determination to each A Section will be too much for Marcellin who are reportedly still shell shocked after last weeks big loss.

In A Section Collegians face the moment of truth. All the talk of a more determined and disciplined side went right out the window last Saturday as Ormond applied the pressure. Well today they meet the only other side in A Section who run at the ball as hard as Ormond — De La Salle. De La is renowned for its fighting spirit and really hit finals form at the right time. Ask Old Scotch and North OB. Besides De La matches Collegians in all departments. Up forward **Kerin & Murphy** will worry two of Collegians better players **Williams and Hinchin** although the clash between **Shane Murphy** De La and **Stuart Hinchin** Collegians will be a real highlight. **Michael Greene** poses a big problem for Collegians. Last week they were forced to use **Geoff English** in the ruck and sadly missed his strength and marking power up forward. They will need big efforts today from **Chris Pollock & Tim Bennett**. In addition apart from **Ian Herman** last week the Collegians small brigade were unsighted and certainly **Irvine** who has had a great year will be happy with the chance to show his true form. **Keith Parsons, Lawssen, Tregear, Wolff, & Daff** must all do more and the inclusion of **Eason** (if he's fit!) will lift the running scene. For De La **Greg McHenry, Peter Leonard and Wal Hollier** are key players in their ability to not run but race the ball out of defence and with **Brian Bourke** who from all accounts played his best game for the season in the semi, supported by **Deveson & Hanrahan** the De La defense appears impenetrable. We shall see. Across the centre **Gasparini** will pick up **Schmidt** who had a poor game last week and was shifted. **Herman** will be dangerous but De La skipper **Paddy Maher** in his own way will prove just as effective. The shift of **Harrington** from wing to forward line has worked as the De La leftfooter has been among the goals. He will need to be watched closely. **Tony Vitacca** surprised me with his game in the 1st semi. He was an aggressive and clever forward whose only blemish was to give away too many free kicks. Like **Harrington**, he will need to be watched. The more one looks at the game the more I'm convinced De La will win and will well for that matter. With the experience in the side I do not expect complacency from De La rather respect for its opponent as the old agage that all games are different is sure to be well known out at East Malvern.

C SECTION

KEVIN MORRISON (FAWKNER): "If we play to our potential and the players produce the disciplined football that's required we should go into B Section as Premiers. I'm a low key coach and have great respect for Therry and wish them all the best."

BERNIE DUNN (THERRY): "We'll win because one of the great things about the game is that we've really nothing to lose and can go into the game and give it our best shot. All the pressure is on Fawkner as they're undefeated and this gives us the chance to try things we might not have if we were in their position. Its the 5th time this season we'll have met and on the law of averages, we're bound to win one out of five. Our boys are pretty keen as you'd expect."

ANDREW DISNEY (OLD TRINITY): "We'll win because of our record and what we've achieved this season. The youth in the side a large percentage of whom have never played in a Premiership team before, are all very determined for success."

ALAN QUAIFF (M.H.S.O.B.): "We'll win because after 3 losses during the season we'll be more determined and the players are dedicated to arresting that situation. Basically Trinity are a very disciplined side but man to man I have great faith in our players who I believe are just as skilful, but being younger are less experienced and have learnt team discipline week by week and are all set for victory today."

A SECTION SECOND SEMI-FINAL

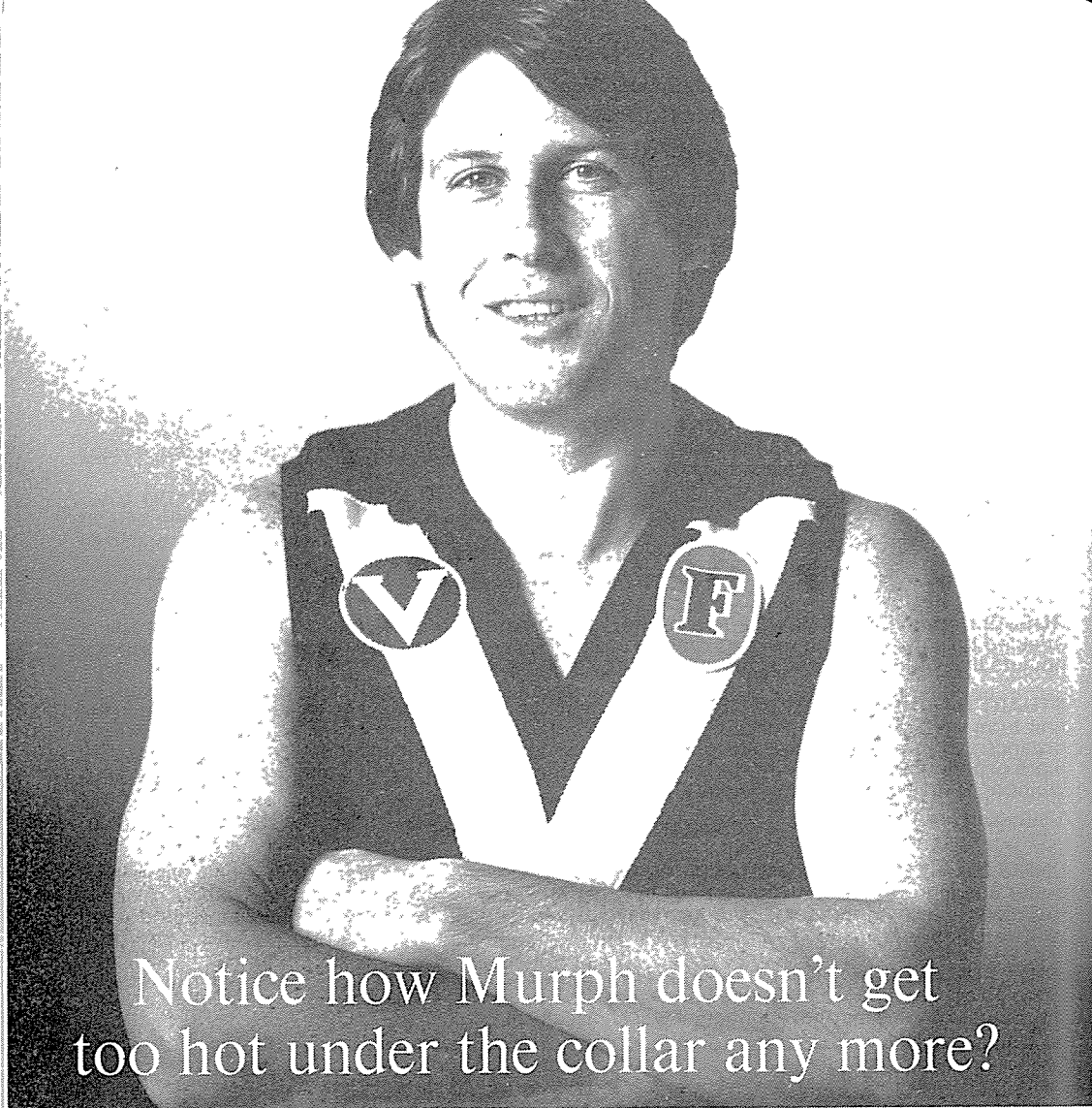

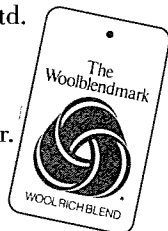

10 YEARS AGO — 1975

CLAYTON APPEAR IN FIRST SENIOR GRAND FINAL

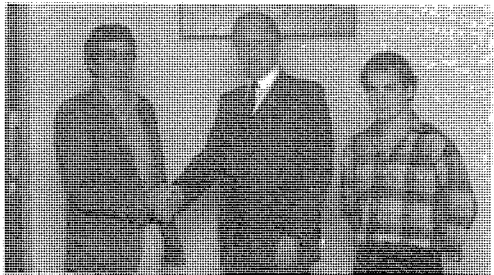
