



A Section Review

De La Salle staged a remarkable recovery to defeat **Collegians** by 44 points in the preliminary final. It was an amazing turnaround. Collegians led by 10 points at quarter time, 23 points at half time and 17 points at three quarter time, but succumbed in an amazing last quarter when De La kicked 11 goals to Collegians single major.

I did not give much chande to De La Salle at three quarter time. They had made a bit of a comeback after being something like 6 goals down half way through the third term. At that stage I was worrying about who I would select the following week — Collegians or Ormond. How wrong I was!

De La Salle have a never say die attitude. During that third quarter they kept plugging away, and when De La quickly hit the front in the last term Collegians fell apart at the seams as if they felt it was inevitable.

I wonder how much psychology will play in today's Grand Final? I suspect not as much as last week's Preliminary encounter. De La will be as determined as ever, will run, tackle and go low at the ball. They will believe they can win and will give it their best shot.

But what of Ormond? They will be much more mentally resilient than Collegians were last week. **Ormond** will fight to the end and will not become rattled if De La Salle even get a run-on.

Ormond will be prepared for De La Salle's defensive game and for De La to tag some of Ormond's prime movers. For example Paul Sutherland on the wing will have to be stopped. Who will get the job on him? Phil Mehrten is a danger at full forward but I think De La might get Peter Leonard to pick him up and get Hanrahan to work Oaten. Alan Naylor will provide more opposition for Mick Greene than he has had over the last two weeks. Mick has been a tower of strength even playing with a broken right thumb last week.

Shane Murphy missed last week with a broken rib but thinks he'll be back today, his replacement

Peter Barry did well last week with 4 goals. Ormond will have to watch De La half forward David Harrington and Peter Rennie. Both are quiet and skilful. The De La half forward line kicked 11 goals between them last week, and full forward Phil Kerin marked strongly and kicked truly for 9 goals. I doubt that he will be allowed to have the same influence on the game today. McAsey, McDonal and Barnes should cut out a lot of De La's forward thrust.

De La Salle's pace will worry Ormond. Players such as **McHenry** and **Hollier** are very quick compared with the slower but physically stronger **Russell**, **Forsyth** and **Kingston**. Ormond's on ball players of **Eishold**, **Gilmore** and **Boyanton** will match up with **Maher**, **Lowe**, **Connolly** and **Cooke**. **Simon Eishold** is a very dangerous player. It wouldn't surprise me to see **Connoly** asked to mind the ruck rover.

Then, of course, there will be the clash between **McDOnald** and **Deveson**. **McDonald** is better in the air-but **Deveson** is quicker and more physical. He's had a wonderful season.

I firmly believe this will be a close game. It would surprise me to see Ormond get the jitters — they will be very determined to make up for last year's loss. On balance, I think Ormond might have just a little bit too much strength and class and I think they will win narrowly, even though De La Salle will be quick and will play a disciplined, defensive, stopping game on Ormond's stars.

Good luck to both teams and let's hope for a good game of football.

The Whisper's Final Preview

It is hard to believe we're at the end of the season, and that this is my swansong. Like Richmond's axed coach I too am on a verbal agreement but would hope for a return in 1986. I must begin this preview with a brief look at last week and to the Players and Committee of **Fawkner** and **Old Trinity** congratulations on an outstanding season — *Premiers and Champions* — you can't do any better than that. To **Brunswick** and **Heatherton**, and I know I went against you, all I can do is apologize and wish you all the success in the higher grade next year. **Parkside was my other miss last week and from all accounts stopped to a walk in the second half and Marcellin** literally *ran* away with the game scoring 10 goals to one. Marcellin's record in Preliminary Finals is excellent. They've won E, D, C and 2 B's and lost only one — in A Section in 1982. It was a record I'd overlooked.

De La Salle's performance in turning a 37 point deficit at the 22 minute mark of the 3rd quarter into a resounding 44 point victory was nothing short of sensational. I doubt whether any other team in the V.A.F.A. would have won the game from that position and De La's effort certainly silenced many of the cryptic and smart comments that came from the Ormond section of the crowd in the first half.

The B Reserves Preliminary Final should see victory to the **Blacks**. They were the best side all season and were smarting after both allowing **Old Paradians** to draw and then beat them in the replay. **Marcellin** will be somewhat disadvantaged in that both sides are in action and so its the **Blacks** to win the right for another crack at Old Paradians.

In the A Reserves Section Grand Final I'm going for De La Salle to reverse last season's result which saw Ormond snatch an exciting win in a high standard game. I've no doubt the game will again be of high standard and close but De La's performance in beating Bulleen-Templestowe and Ivanhoe was most impressive. They have the discipline of their seniors and some very useful Reserve grade players in Darren O'Laughlin, Michael Knuppel (the hero of the Seniors win in 1983) and Roman Frenetic to mention but three. You can bet Ormond will prove worthy opponents but in 1985 it's De La — sorry Fish!

There's no doubt about Grand Final week. There's a real buzz in the air. For instance I popped into Elsternwick Park during the week to see V.A.F.A. General Manager Peter French and it was all go. **Max Lyons** was giving the rooms a final once-over, Council workers were mowing and cutting the arena and banks and the VAFA logo was being painted on the centre wing. Caterer **Chris House** and **Peter** were checking final details for the Marquee and official lunches and **Sue Anderson** had her hands full with telephones and typing instructions for gate keepers and marshails. The place was literally a hive of activity and Elsternwick Park was in tip top condition.

The **B Section Grand Final** is really a foregone conclusion. **Caulfield** quite rightly are favourites and having tasted Premiership success in 1983 know the joys a flag can bring. In spite of the motivation tactics that both coaches will employ Caulfield will win because it has better players in more positions. The side will have appreciated

the week's spell, especially Kanis, Fisher and Watson who I'm told have had minor injuries. Marcellin is bound to give a better account of itself than it did in the second semi, but the loss of vice-captain Tony Walshe is a cruel blow because they have no-one capable of holding Berzins who is a fine player and whose long kicking for goal alone can turn a game. The Eagles are hopeful that skipper Andy Cullinan will be fit. However although he fought hard against Matthews in the semi the Caulfield man had the call on the day and I just do not believe Marcellin has the replacements to match those two Caulfield stars. In the ruck Matt Getson will match Dick Fish but Caulfield have the added flexibility of being able to run Matthews on the ball and the two Caulfield big men will wear down Getson over the four quarters. If Marcellin can get on top across the centre where I expect Luke Getson and either Carr or Amad to at least break even, then Marcellin will have an alternative route to goal. However Elsternwick Park watchers realize that the way to win there is down the centre and Marcellin just does not have the key forwards capable of kicking a winning score. Steve Psoras and Petroff are up against the class of Cooney and Gregor both of whom are somewhat underrated, but believe me they're both fine players and what's more they're reliable. Caulfield willno doubt rely on its tried and true game plan of long and direct kicking, a style eminently suited to Elsternwick Park, whereas Marcellin will need big games from ALL of its runners especially Hellard who was quiet in the second semi but turned on a big one against Parkside, Slattery, Staffieri, Cooper, Caffry and the Carafa brothers. They will also need a big one from Ebert and trust that Tim Holmes who could be useful in defence or attack has had enough match practice. There's no doubting the talent in the Marcellin line up but you can't buy experience and Chisnall is certainly fortunate that in Stone, Kanis, Harlock and Roseman to mention just a few he has the players who'll know how to handle any crisis. Whatever way you look at it Caulfield will win.

The A Section Grand Final promises to be a real beauty and I for one eagerly await it. It's my belief that for the first time in many years there's no favourite this year and thus no underdog, a tag that both clubs would like. Both wanted a low key approach and apart from the odd supporter in each camp no rash statements or promises have come from either side. In reality both sides are very even. They won a game

each during the year with **Ormond's** win being more significant and impressive, for it was gained at Elsternwick Park in conditions similar to today's.

There is no doubting **De La Salle's** spirit which was never more put to the test than last week. In fact for the past 8 weeks it has been playing top pressure games and come through them all whilst its finals form speaks for itself.

It has been said that to win at Elsternwick Park control of the centre line is essential. Well. Ormond will win on Sutherland's wing and I expect Russell to at least break even with Gasparini. De La are likely to be on top in the pivot where Pollard has either Cooke, Connolly or Maher on whom to turn. His move last week when things were tight in that all important third term, of running Cooke and Connolly out of a back pocket was first class. Up forward Kerin is obviously Ormond's bogey man as I do not expect Murphy to play. He suffered a broken rib in the first semi and where I do not doubt that he will want to, the De La selection committee will agonize over whether to include him or not. They must have been pleased with stand in Peter Barry's effort last Saturday. Ormond, I believe, will start Ross Tonkin on Kerin and should he prove incapable McArthur-Allen has a number of players who could be used including Phil Mehrten who is no stranger to the full back position. In the pockets Forsyth will have his hands full with Williams and McCooke will need to watch rovers Lowe and Vitacca who are dangerous around goals. The Ormond man will win in the air and reads the game splendidly but the De La rovers will beat him for pace.

On the flanks Harrington and Rennie who is a great find and plays the position to perfection will meet much stiffer opposition this week. Ormond's captain Russell Barnes will beat either player in the air as will his partner McAsey and both defenders have the concentration, and ability to match their opponents on the ground. Actually the aerial contests between McAsey and Rennie are sure to provide many highlights.

At centre half back **David McDonald** is a no nonsense and close checking defender. He will beat **Barry** and worry **Murphy**, although if the De La champion is included **Pollard** may well use him either in a pocket or off the interchange bench. As both coaches are fine strategists and putmuchtimeandeffortintopre-matchpreparation all but the thinking spectator may miss the significance of the moves both coaches are bound to employ.

The Ormond forward line, in my opinion, is where I believe the Mons will win this game. Across the half forward line Mark McDonald will worry Deveson. He appreciates the extra room in which to move at Elsternwick Park and if he can take some early one grab marks Deveson may be in strife. On the flanks Gilmore who is also a useful on ball player will on occasions swap with either Eishold or rovers Andy Mehrten and Boyanton. This quartet will all kick goals and although Brian Bourke is a fine finals player who runs the De La Defence like a field marshall his work will be cut out today. Leonard will most likely start on Oaten. He wil beat him on the ground and in the run to

the ball, but **Oaten** will do many unseen things and will surprise by bobbing up with a goal when least expected. **Hanrahan** was well beaten by **Collegian's English** last week. He will struggle when **Naylor** is resting and either **Hollier**, although I tip he will be played on a wing, or **McHenry** will have his hands full with **Phil Mehrten**. The Ormond man's great strength and sheer desperation and desire for an Ormond flag will see him feature in more than one goal — you can bet on that.

In the ruck, although like many I have high regard for Alan Naylor, De La's Mick Greene, who is surely the most valuable club player in the Association, will win. Naylor's contribution to this win could come from a forward pocket, leaving Herkess to contest with the De La man for much of the game. It has been suggested that Connolly will tag Eishold. It won't be new to Eishold and both players will play important roles. Don't underestimate Connolly he may do some silly things but he is all heart and gained most De La possessions last week. Andy Mehrten is the best rover in both sides and De La will be looking to "Smakka" Lowe to lift his game as he was unusually quiet last Saturday.

This game, as I said at the outset, will be a great one. The teams are remarkably even but Ormond may just want success a trifle more and the other big thing going for them is their flexibility. McArthur-Allen like Sheedy has a number of players capable of performing in either defence or attack. As was said to me by on Amateur football follower during the week "If Ormond lose this year it'll kill the Club"—and he may be right!

It may be idealistic but was essential for the longterm success of the game. He expressed strong support for the promotion and relegation systems operating in both the V.F.A. and V.A.F.A.. and was hoping for a Brunswick victory in 2nd Division.



RUSSELL BARNES (Captain): Attacking H.B.F. who greatly inspires his team mates by his desperation and never beaten attitude. An unselfish team player who has settled into his captaincy role very well. Excellent second semi.

ANDREW MEHRTEN (Vice Captain): Very gutsy non stop rover, dangerous around goals, prepared to run all day and is always prepared to run into defence. V.A.F.A. Représentative.

PHIL MEHRTEN: Strong, adaptable forward/backman renowned for his strong tackling and ability to play explosive football. A great comeback game in the second semi after overcoming a serious eye injury.

ALLAN NAYLOR: Our old stalwart on the field and still one of the best top ruckman in the competition. Again won Victorian selection this year. Previous best and fairest winner and has played over 200 games.

DAVID McDONALD: Tall agile defender who has held down C.H.B. extremely well this year. Eventually was recognised by the Victorian selectors and was rewarded for a consistent year. Reads the play well and sets up many attacking moves.


