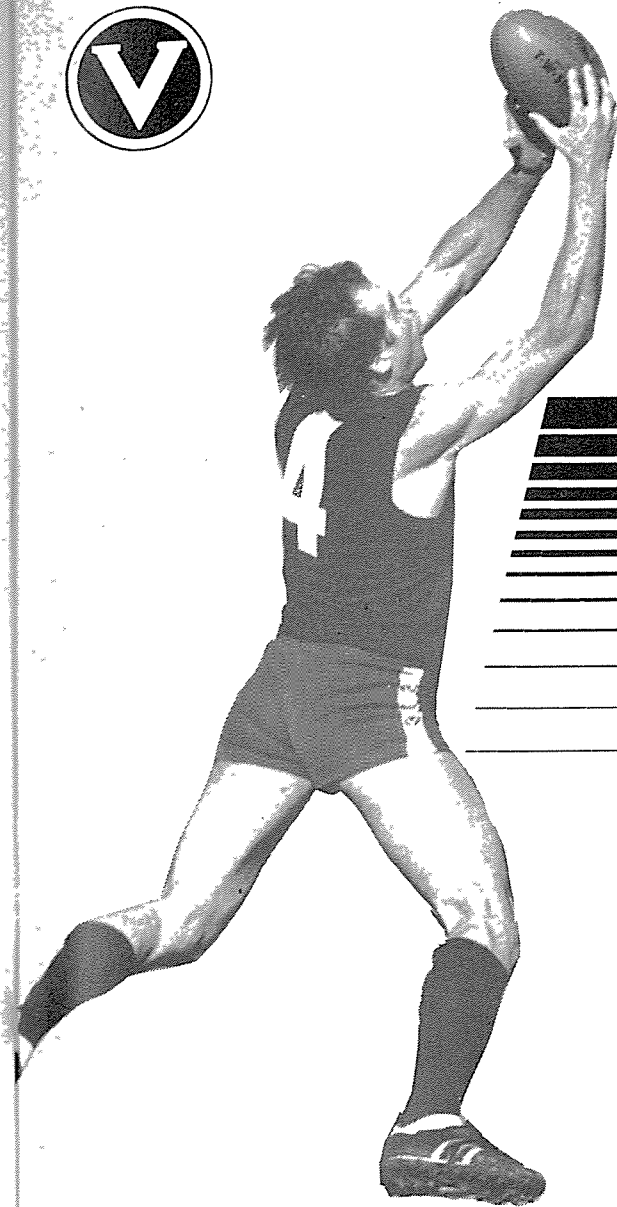

## Six Amateur Coaches Preview Round Five as we say BYE BYE to the WHISPER

The Whisper's big mouth (see last week's copy) has opened the door for COACHES PREVIEWS for the next four weeks and looking at the 6 Sections today are NORTH OB's JIM DURMAN, KEW'S RAY SLEETH, OLD HAILEBURY'S ANDREW LANGFORD-JONES, MHSOB's ALAN QUAIFFE, OLD GEELONG'S MIKE PERRY and ANZ BANK's IAN CAVE.

To refresh your memory the Whisper promised to disappear for a month if UNI BLUES beat ORMOND and the Blues did just that staging a great recovery to inflict a 5 point defeat on the home side. Mike McArthur-Allen has his worries at the moment and one wonders of the 1985 future for last years finalists ORMOND and DE LA SALLE.

I put the following questions to the coaches whose comments provide interesting reading.

### PETER FRENCH WITH JIM DURMAN

- P.F. What is your impression of Amateur football after a career at League level both in Victoria and W.A.?  
J.D. Most impressed with the loyalty - a lot of people put in a terrific amount of time for the love of football which is admirable.  
P.F. Three wins from 5 games and the fact that Blues have now broken the ice how many games will be necessary to make the 4?  
J.D. 14 to 15.  
P.F. Are you happy with the commitment at North?  
J.D. Yes, very happy.  
P.F. Who is the best side you've met to date? and why?  
J.D. Old Scotch - They combine well and have an even spread of talent.  
P.F. Is the standard better or worse than you expected?  
J.D. Better than I expected.  
P.F. Your thought on the umpires?  
J.D. I believe they are doing O.K. and are doing their job adequately without coming under notice.  
P.F. Finally besides North to beat Blues, who are your selections in the remaining games and your final 4.  
J.D. Bulleen-Temp., Ivanhoe, Ormond, De La Salle. - North OB, Bulleen-Temp. De La Salle, O. Scotch.

### PETER FRENCH WITH RAY SLEETH

- P.F. Before your surprise and mammoth win over Old Paradians the Club appeared to be struggling. Have you now turned the corner?  
R.S. We definitely have. We've put our house in order. We're there to play hard constructive play on football and to produce the skills of the game.  
P.F. Both wins have come at home. How important is Victoria Park to your style of play?  
R.S. We really should be producing the same style on opposition grounds. It is a ground that you have to know and is I suppose an advantage to us.  
P.F. What sort of player do you require to return to A Section and is that return a definite possibility this season?  
R.S. Our ultimate goal is the B Section Flag and we are worthy of being in A Section which is going to take a lot of hard work. We need a couple of rovers and are fortunate to have mobility.  
P.F. Having umpired for much of your career what prompted you to take on coaching?  
R.S. It's always been a burning ambition plus the fact that I've played, umpired, been an umpire's advisor, administrator and worked with the media. I'm thoroughly enjoying it.  
P.F. As a former umpire how do you view the standard of umpiring in B Section?  
R.S. As long as the umpires encourage and protect the ball player and are consistent with the interpretations then I've no complaints. I'd like to see the return of one umpire as the two umpire system is too inconsistent.  
P.F. You meet Ajax today and must start favourites, your selection in other games please Ray - Old Brighton, St. Kilda C.B.C., Marcellin, Old Paradians and your Final Four - Kew, St. Kilda C.B.C., Caulfield Grammarians, Parkside.

### PETER FRENCH TALKS TO ANDREW LANGFORD-JONES

- P.F. After two good wins you went down to the bottom side Coburg. Why?  
A.L.J. I under-estimated them - They had played two good sides in their three losses and certainly are not as bad as the bottom side. They were down to 17 men and with no height out ran us. As with all sides low down once they had their sniff of victory they proved too hard to beat. Finally it didn't help that 10 or 12 of the B's turned up to the Book Launch on Friday night.  
P.F. Does C Section appear to be more even than last season.  
A.L.J. Very much so - I reckon 10 wins will bolt in the four especially if Therry and Fawcner keep winning.  
P.F. You're played a side up from D in '84 (Thomastown) and won and one down from B in Coburg and lost. How can you rate B and D Section?  
A.L.J. My own belief is that Thomastown will finish above Coburg and that there's not much difference between the top sides in one grade and the bottom in the next. For example look at Marcellin who were almost in the four last year and where they are now.  
P.F. What's the spirit like at McKinnon this season?  
A.L.J. Fantastic. Best its ever been. The atmosphere is superb.

- P.F. Have you picked up any outstanding recruits?  
 A.L.J. Yes — Mike Garland from the Swans plus Haughton and Paul from retirement and Darren Seccul from Melbourne Under-19s.  
 P.F. What do you need to get up to B Section?  
 A.L.J. We need a centre half back and a dynamic ruck rover.  
 P.F. Finally Andres what are your selections for today's round.  
 A.L.J. Fawkner, Coburg, Old Haileybury, Thomastown and Monash Blues, and my final four are: Therry, Fawkner, Thomastown, Old Haileybury.

#### PETER FRENCH SPEAKS WITH ALAN QUAIPE

- P.F. Alan you've had a long involvement with Amateur Football, for whom have you played and coached?  
 A.Q. Parkside, Bulleen-Temp., Bulleen-Utd., and M.H.S.O.B.  
 P.F. Third in 1984 what do you have to do to gain promotion in 1985?  
 A.Q. We've got to win at least 15 games to ensure second post and then treat the finals as another round.  
 P.F. Have you styled the side's game to suit the school oval.  
 A.Q. Yes — we've got two game plans and interchange our players and game plan on the larger grounds.  
 P.F. How do you rate Balaclava and Old Mentonians who were promoted this season?  
 A.Q. Balaclava are a very good side as are Old Mentonians — Balaclava are stronger and I believe they've both a good chance of making the final four.  
 P.F. Have you any new recruits besides Stephen Quaife Jun. for 1985 and how many of last years U.19's have graduated to Senior ranks?  
 A.Q. No we've kept onto our youngsters who've come thru the school U.15s and U17s and we've about 6-7 of last years U19's playing presently.  
 P.F. Your selections for today and the final four — State Bank, Old Trinity, Old Mentonians, Balaclava, MHSOB, and the final four MHSOB, Old Trinity, W. Brunswick, Balaclava.

#### PETER FRENCH TALKS WITH MIKE PERRY

- P.F. Mike is this the year for the OGGs?  
 M.P. Well I hope so despite an indifferent start. We're yet to have a full complement.  
 P.F. You appear to be almost unbeatable at home but fare poorly away — Why?  
 M.P. We've been down on numbers for both away games.  
 P.F. Are you confident of making the finals?  
 M.P. Yes. Very confident. We've got more depth than ever due to having a Third XVIII and boast about 50 — 60 on the track.  
 P.F. Have you a comment on the standard and spirit of play in E Section?  
 M.P. Yes. I am pretty happy but the key players in most sides come under plenty of attention as do the young guys. I would like to congratulate Bulleen United on their approach to the game.  
 P.F. Is recruiting a big problem for the OGGs?  
 M.P. It has been but we've got into the schools and the peer group pressure from some of our key players is starting to pay off.  
 P.F. What about the umpiring?  
 M.P. We've been more than happy with the senior guys and even the practice matches were excellent. Its a bloody shame you haven't got the answer though the umpires would seem to be the best area for recruiting umpires.  
 P.F. Finally Mike today's winners and your final four.  
 M.P. Peninsula O.B., Elsternwick, Old Carey, Preston MBOB, Old Geelong. Final four (not in order) Preston Old Geelong, Elsternwick Williamstown.

#### PETER FRENCH TALKS TO IAN CAVE

- P.F. Ian as a former Hampton Rovers player who have been a traditional C Section Club what is the main difference in F Section?  
 I.C. Not a lot of difference in fact 8 or 9 of my players would walk straight into the Rovers. Its mainly a less "Professional" approach to their football — largely a social attitude. I have been impressed with the ability of a number of our opponents, however sides without Under 19s are really going to struggle to get up the grades.  
 P.F. How have the players reacted to your style of coaching?  
 I.C. I think they've found it a refreshing change. I used the Captain of the Bank's athletic club pre-season and Wayne Bevan for his experience under John Kennedy.  
 P.F. Are recruits a problem for the Bank sides? and where can ANZ go from here?  
 I.C. Recruits are not the problem. They are mainly 17 and 18 with little senior experience and I'm the first bank employee to coach ANZ for some time. Actually there are plans a foot for the Bank and we have a very exciting future ahead. We had 17 new players in Round 1.  
 P.F. Which side has impressed you most so far and why?  
 I.C. University High School because even though they were relegated they prove the difference between E and F and they certainly played Elsternwick Park to perfection.  
 P.F. What did ANZ do on the day they had the Bye?  
 I.C. Nothing, we tried Eltham O.C. but they couldn't field two teams so after a pretty torid week they watched U.H.S.O.B. v Commonwealth Bank.  
 P.F. Do you have an ambition of coaching an A Section Club?  
 I.C. My ambition is to coach a certain C Club and also to coach under age football as the youngsters today are more skilful than in my day and I see the gain in bringing the kids along.  
 P.F. Finally Ian, winners today in F Section and your final four.  
 I.C. Commonwealth Bank, ANZ Bank, U.H.S.O.B., Clayton, Doveton has the bye.  
 Final Four — Clayton, Doveton, Commonwealth Bank and ANZ Bank.

### 5 YEARS AGO — 1980

**De La Salle** continued merrily on their undefeated way, when, one point down at half time, they kicked 10.12 to **Ormond's** 1.5 in the second half. **Calley**, **M. Greene**, **McHenry** (DE LA) and **Crump**, **Mehrten**, **Pearce** (Ormond) were best.

200 games to **David Urquhart** (Old Melb.) — "the most popular and celebrated player at the club presently playing", "Turk" had captained the firsts, won the best and fairest, topped the section's goalkicking and was the chairman of the match committee.

**Barry Hamilton** became only the fourth **Old Brighton Grammarian** to have reached the 200 club — started with the U.19's and in the 12 years since a regular and valuable member of the senior side. Club secretary for 1976 to 1979, all at Brighton congratulated Barry on his great achievement.

**Fawkner** gained a place in 'B' section four when they trampled on **Old Xaverians** in a high standard high scoring games by 18 points, 19.17 to 17.11. Best were **Chard** (9 gls.), **B. Saggors**, **Mills** (Fawk.), and **Carmody**, **Noonan**, **Vale** (Old Xavs.).

**Therry** continued their rise in F Section when they outlasted **Commonwealth Bank's** strong last quarter finish to win by 7 points, 11.8 to 9.13, with the stars **Taylor**, **Clifford**, **Broomfield**, **Rogerson**, **White**, **McIntyre**, (Therry) and **P. Barclay**, **Ellis**, **I. McGrimmon** (C'wealth Bank).

### 10 YEARS AGO — 1975

**Caulfield Grammarians** (B) stopped **Old Carey's** run with a jolt winning by 10 goals. Best were **Griffiths**, **Morphett**, **Tootell** (C.G.) and **Yeo**, **Kelagher**, **Thomas** (Old Carey).

**Commonwealth Bank** (D) opened their account with a win at the expense of **National Bank**. **Reid** (6 gls.), **Eales** and **Petrynik** were best for C'wealth Bank.

After 5 games **U. Blues** (B), **St. Kilda CBC** (C), **Hampton Rovers** (D), **E'wick** (E) and **Monash Whites** (F) were undefeated.

**Beverley Hills** (F) had an easy 79 point win over **F.I.T. Allan**, **Mark**, **Browning**, and **Discombe** (6) were stars for Beverley Hills.

### 15 YEARS AGO — 1970

**Coburg** jumped into top place in 'A' Section with a 63 point win over **Melbourne High**. It was High's first defeat. **McFarlane** (9 goals) **Norm Beattie** (3), and **King** were Coburg's best.

The Umpires' Association officials were proud to announce that with one week to go the total money donated to the **Alan Thorpe Appeal** was \$2,470.

**Leigh** ('Curly') **Grant** came out of retirement — after 7 years — to kick 4 goals for **Power House Reserves** against **National Bank**.

Boom recruit, **Des 'Friar' Tuck**, turned it on in his first game for **Assumption** to kick 5 goals against **Hampton Rovers** and be best afield.

**St. Kilda CBOC's** veteran **Warren Pipkorn** had been transferred to Sydney and announced his retirement after 206 games, spanning the 13 years the club has been in existence.

**St. Kilda** has had no finer clubman than 'Pippy' who has been a member of premierships teams and has taken the field injured when the Reserves were struggling to field a team.

### 25 YEARS AGO — 1960

Bad conditions for fifth week in a row and **Old Paradians** (A) (3.10.28) went down to **U. Blacks** (5.6.36) to record their first loss.

All at **Parkside** congratulated **Brian Lauder** on reaching his century and on his captaincy. Brian was the sixth member of the unbeaten 1954 premierships side to notch the 100.

Other 'C' Section captains were **Geoff Paul** (MHSOB), **Bill Keenan** (FTSOB), **Alan Dick** (National Bank), **David Merkel** (AJAX). Who captained **Brunswick**?

200 games to **Alan** (Walta) **Kirby**.

**Graham Rowe** was the star at **Ormond's** monster tennis day with help from **Max Brock**.

100 games to **Dave Moran** (Old Scotch) and 50 games to **John Tindley** and **Toby Pearson**, both of De La Salle.

### 35 YEARS AGO — 1950

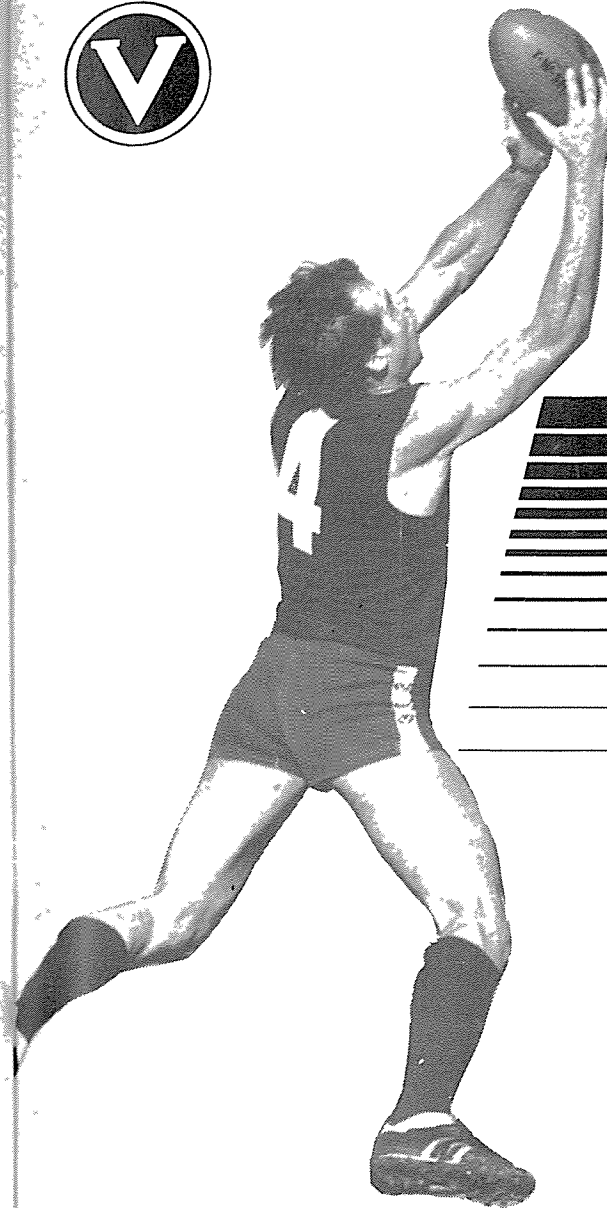
