

HIGHLIGHTS OF OPENING ROUND COBURG THRASH RESERVOIR

De La Salle's Good Win Over Ormond

By GEORGE McTAGGART

There were a few sensations in the opening round of matches last Saturday, not the least of which was the number of high scores recorded.

Altogether 57 teams kicked century scores, 33 in the Seniors, 10 in the Juniors and 14 in the Reserves. Seven losing teams reached the century mark.

Highest score of the day went to Reservoir Old Boys Juniors, who amassed the huge score of 55-37 (367 points) against one of the new teams, Kew.

This is a record for the Junior Section, the previous highest being Commonwealth Bank's 52-29 (341) against Army Apprentices School on June 18, 1966

Thomastown scored 43-25 (283) against another of the newcomers, De La Salle. West Brunswick kicked 40-23 (263) against Glenroy in F Section

Strangely enough, Reservoir's percentage is not as high as Thomastown's, which is 2581.8 to Reservoir's 2446.7, yet there was only a difference of four points in the number of points kicked against the two sides — Reservoir had 15 points kicked against them and Thomastown 11.

The other new team, Alphington Juniors, although well beaten, did rather better, kicking 8-5 (53) against West Brunswick's 28-21 (189).

Coburg scored a runaway win over Reservoir Old Boys, who finished third in A Section last season. Coburg gained an early break and just kept going.

The two promoted teams, De La Salle and University Blues, started well — "De La" finishing over Ormond to win by 45 points after an even three quarters, and the Blues showing good early season form with an all-

the-way win against Old Trinity.

Most of the teams which came up to a higher section started well, eight of the 12 being winners.

of the 12 being winners.

Melbourne High ran Ivanhoe to 9 points in a high-scoring game, but St. Kilda CBC, (C Section premiers), were well beaten by Caulfield Grammar.

Hampton Rovers, Fawkner, AJAX, Elsternwick and Monash Whites were winners and Heatherton went down by 15 points after kicking 18-11.

North Old Boys, premiers in Junior Section 2, caused a shock upset. They thrashed University Blues who were premiers of Section 1 last year.

But there were two sour notes to the opening of the 1976 season — NO LESS THAN 13 PLAYERS WERE RE-PORTED — A RECORD FOR AN OPENING ROUND — and secondly two teams were unable to field the required number of players and had to forfeit their matches.

UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Kevin McKay

NEW LAWS

RULE 18(iii) If a player, taking his kick from outside the boundary line — after having been awarded a mark or free kick — falls to take awarded a mark or free kick — fails to take the ball into play OR attempts to play on outside the boundary line, the ball MUST BE BROUGHT into play by the BOUNDARY UMPIRE from the spot where the original mark or free kick took place.

Note — The ball shall be deemed to be brought "into' play when any portion of it is on or above the boundary line.

Any official, runner or trainer who DE-LIBERATELY interferes with the ball, or a player of the opposing team, during the course of the game, SHALL cause the FIELD UMPIRE to award a free kick to the nearest player of the team offended against at the spot of the infringement, or where the ball is at the time, whichever would be the greater penalty to the offending club.

RULE 17D If a player unduly interferes with the bouncing of the ball by the field umplre or deliberately interferes with an umplre during the progress of the match a free

kick shall be awarded to the nearest opponent.
"WHEN DOES THE FIELD UMPIRE CALL

PLAY-ON?" The field umpire shall call "play-on" and the ball shall immediately be or remain in

play in any of the following circumstances.

A. When an umpire is struck by the ball while it is in play. This would also apply to a trainer on his way to attend or attending an injured player, or to the official runner.

When the ball, having been kicked, is touched while still in transit.
When the ball is caught directly from

a kick of another player less than 10 metres distant

When a player who has taken a mark or been given a free kick attempts to run, handball, or kick otherwise than over his mark.

When the field umpire cancels a free

The call "play-on" by the field umpire must be loud and clear and given instantly. If a free kick has been awarded to a player the ball must be returned to that player quickly and thrown back on the full otherwise a penalty of 15 metres shall be incurred.

It is worth noting that a 15-metre penalty can be applied after the siren or bell has gone to signify the end of a quarter. If a player is taking a kick after the bell has gone, he must kick over his mark.

NORTH PRESIDENT ADDRESSES V.A.F.A. GATHEERING By JIM FIDGE

North Melbourne (V.F.L.) President, DR. ALLEN AYLETT held an audience of Association Presidents and Secretaries spellbound for more than an hour in an inspiring address at The Southern Cross Hotel last Wednesday week.

Dr. Aylett in his address, included many aspects of modern day football but featured illustrations of the meteoric rise of North Melbourne which was last in 1970 to its pre-miership win of 1975.

He emphasised strongly the changes made in traditional administration that were implemented to make the North "machine" work effectively. He highlighted the effectiveness that was created by the introduction of "breakfast meetings" as against the routine evening compilers meetings. the routine evening committee meetings, and the structural changes of throwing out more responsibility on the various sub-committees.

While Dr. Aylett himself believes that professionalism in football creates more discipline and that the upsurge of his club has brought about a change of era in V.F.L. football, he still believes that OUR Association should continue to defend its right to Amateurism if for no other better reason than its long-established successful principle and for uniqueness sake.

He does not beleive that football is doomed but that all aspects of the code should

unite for the sake of football.

On a lighter note, Dr. Aylett spoke of the five stages of a top footballer from being purely a boyhood amateur, through to a final retirement behind a television microphone!
