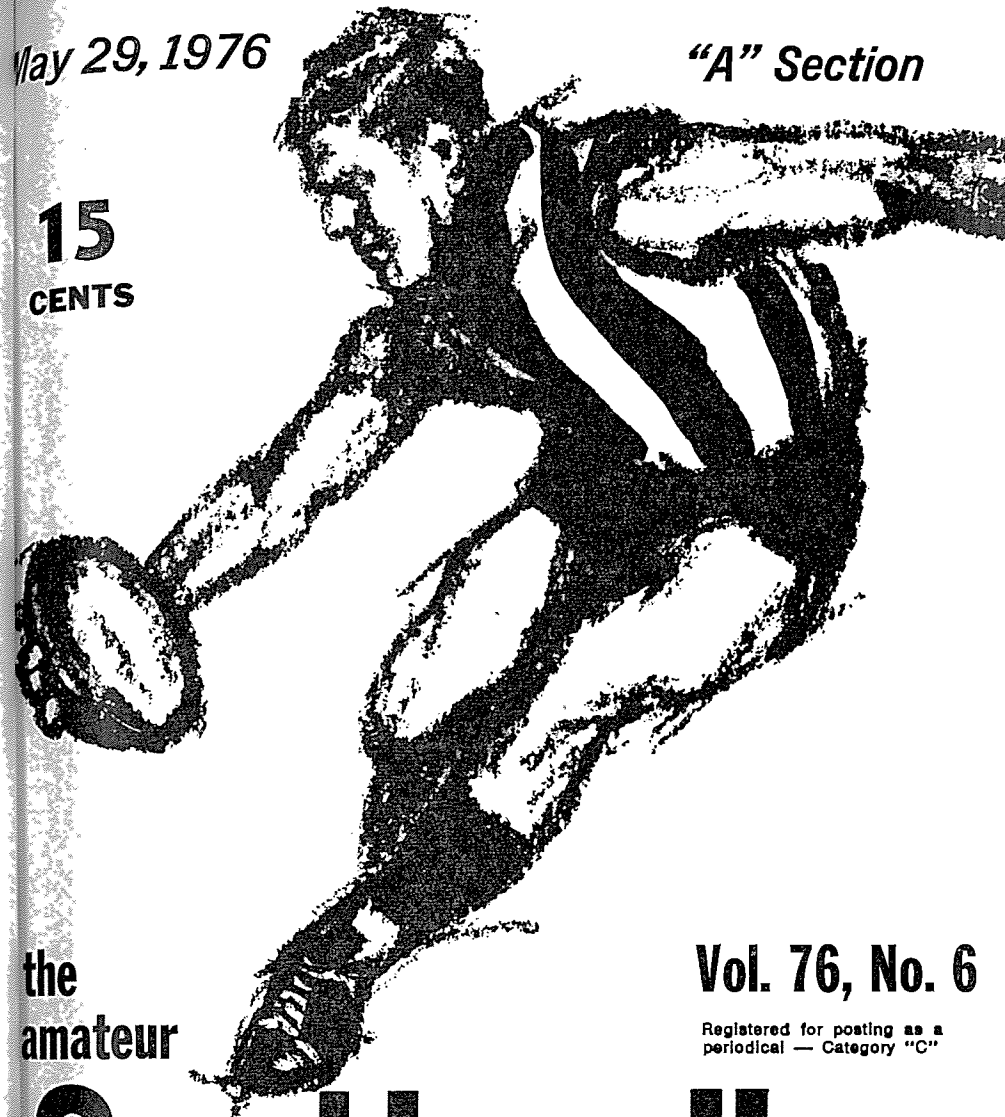

LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS FIRST DEFEAT FOR DE LA SALLE

Now Share Top With St. Bernard's, North

Last season's B Section premiers, De La Salle, suffered their first defeat for 1976 when they went down to Old Trinity last Saturday.

There are now three teams level at the top of the list — De La Salle, St. Bernard's and North Old Boys — the last two being premiers and runners-up respectively in A Section last year.

Three other leading teams went down in last week's round, and in each case it was their first loss for the season.

LaTrobe Blacks were beaten by Monash Whites, who had only one previous win to their credit, while in the Reserves Hampton Rovers crashed against Fawkner and Elsternwick failed by 17 points against Old Brighton.

Old Trinity, whose only other win was at the expense of North Old Boys in the second round, adapted themselves to the wet conditions better than "De La", and were too strong on the day winning by 9 points. And it wasn't the "home ground advantage" either, for the game was on De La Salle's ground.

Reservoir Old Boys rocked Ormond by kicking 8-6 to one point in the first quarter but Ormond gradually pegged them back and Reservoir had to fight to hold the opposition off and win by 9 points.

Melbourne High started well against Collegians with four goals in the first term, but Collegians had made up all but three points of their leeway by the interval. Then five goals early in the third quarter settled High's chances and Collegians won easily.

Old Melburnians (third) overpowered Parkside (second) and lowly-placed Hampton Rovers surprised Fawkner (fourth), who were beaten by 5 points.

Old Xaverians had a struggle to beat State Bank by 8 points and ANZ

Bank caused an upset by beating second-placed St. Pat's-Monivae by more than 5 goals. It was ANZ Bank's first win.

West Brunswick finished 3 goals in front of St. Bede's to become clear leaders in F Section.

Junior leaders, North Old Boys, easily accounted for Ivanhoe, and in Section 2, unbeaten Thomastown and Caulfield Grammar continued on their merry way with wins over West Brunswick and Reservoir Old Boys respectively.

JIM FIDGE — OUR LEADING TIPSTER
Jim Fidge, who is previewing D Section games, has proved our most successful tipster so far — that is from the second round of matches on May 1st.

The first week has not been included in the totals as B Section and the two Junior Sections were previewed by the Editor that week.

After four rounds, Jim (with 16½ winners) is 2½ ahead of John Byrne and Alex Johnson.

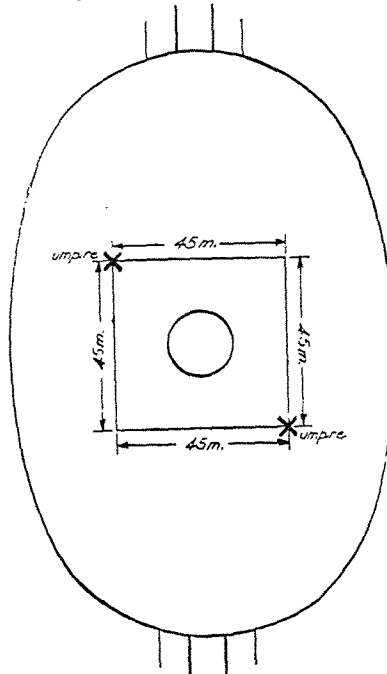

UMPIRE'S CORNER — By Kevin Mckay

THE CENTRE SQUARE



Field Umpires **MUST WAIT** until the boundary umpires are in position before proceeding to bounce the ball.

When a player has infringed by being on or over the line of the "Square" the boundary umpire shall sound his whistle and call to the field umpire "against number —" and name the club, and then run in the direction of the intended kick.

If the boundary umpire is unable to see the number of the player offending, he will simply call the name of the club.

The field umpire shall award a free kick to the player of the opposing team, nearest to him in the centre of the ground, such free kick to be taken at the centre circle.

The field umpire is the sole judge as to who takes the free kick.

In the event of both boundary umpire's sounding their whistles simultaneously — if the offenders are from the same team, the free kick shall be given to an opponent.

If however; the offenders are from opposing teams the field umpire shall then proceed to bounce the ball after allowing players time to take up their positions out

of the square, in accordance with the provision of the centre square.

In the event of a scrimmage which requires the field umpire to once again bounce the ball, then the centre square law does not apply.

In the event of a breach of the laws being detected by the field umpire prior to, or during his moving in to bounce the ball, he shall award a free kick to the player offended against, **BUT** at the spot where the incident occurred, provided such free kick does not penalise the side offended against.

If a boundary umpire should observe an incident where a player was forced over the line, he would not sound his whistle but at the first opportunity censure the offender and advise him it is a reportable offence. He must also inform the field umpire of any action he has taken.

Only **Four** players of either side are permitted to be inside the centre square, — if there are more than that number who do not move when instructed by the field umpire a free kick will immediately be given to the opposing team at the centre circle.

The spirit of this law is to enable the game to be free of congestion at the centre bounces, thus allowing for the skills of Australian Football to be further exemplified.

Boundary umpires will stand on diagonally opposite corners at the points of the square (as illustrated) so they can see both ways for any infringement.

TIME ON

The field umpire shall instruct the timekeepers to add "time-on".

1. If there is any undue delay in getting the ball back when it is out of play.
2. If a player wilfully wastes time.
3. If a player goes over an opponents mark and does not go back immediately when told to do so.
4. When more than one opponent stands on the mark of a player.
5. When a player who has been given a free kick, plays or kicks without going back to the spot where the free kick was given.
6. In all other cases when play is unduly delayed.

The field umpire shall instruct the timekeepers to add "time-on" or to stop adding "time-on" by sounding his whistle and raising his arm high above his head.

UMPIRES are instructed to **SOUND THEIR WHISTLES** loudly and raise their arms **QUICKLY** and to the fullest extent.

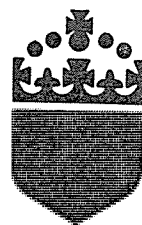

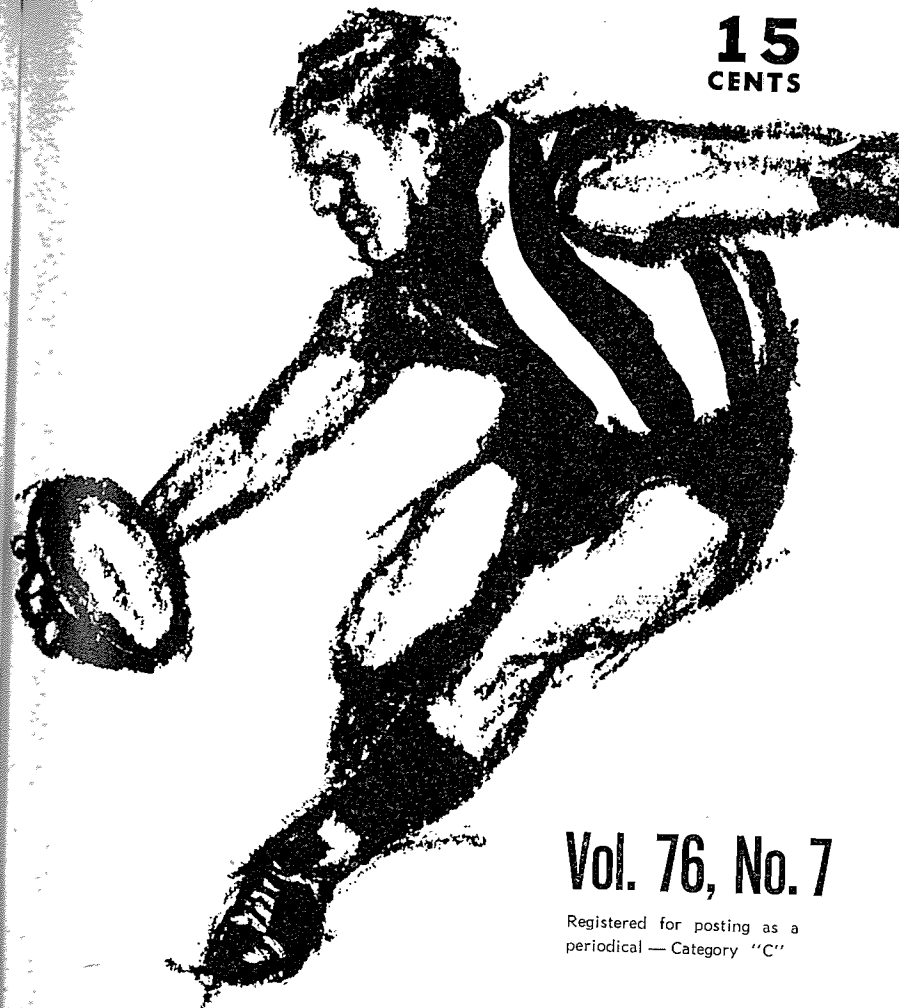
