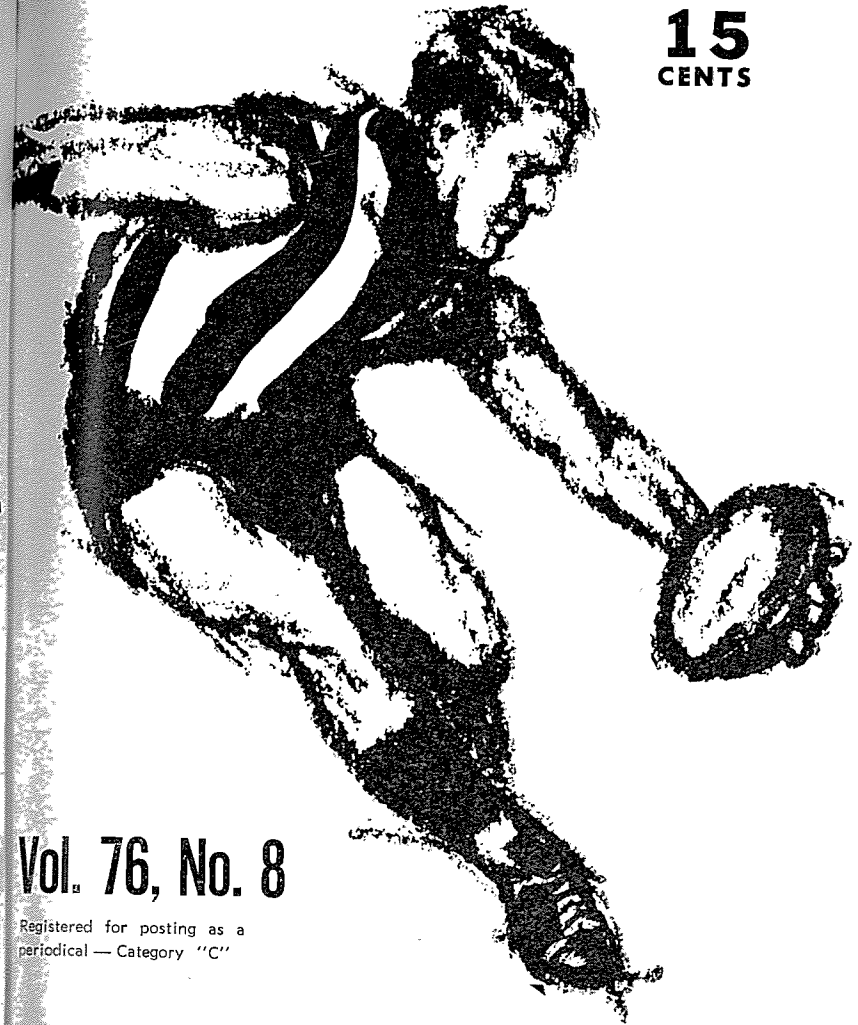

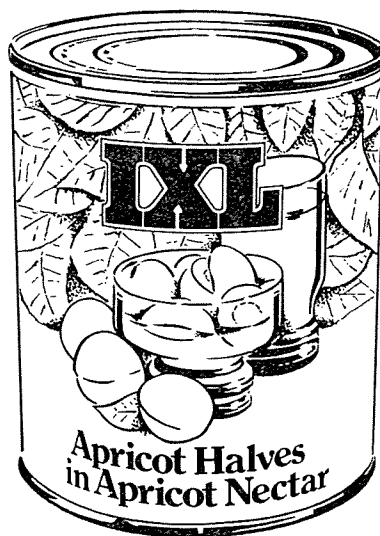

LAST WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS NORTH'S FINISH GAINS THEM TOP PLACE

Old Scotch downed by St. Kilda CBC

North Old Boys finished too strongly for De La Salle in last week's "battle for the leadership" and North are now clear leaders.

De La Salle dropped from first to third, behind St. Bernard's on percentage. (St. Bernard's and De La Salle meet at Elsternwick Park next Saturday).

The big surprise of the round was St. Kilda CBC's defeat of previously unbeaten Old Scotch. And St. Kilda had their first win for the season the week before.

Old Trinity made it three wins in a row when they scored over Reservoir Old Boys, and are now in the four.

Ormond climbed off the bottom rung with a resounding win against Monash Blues, who seemed to be well in it halfway through the third quarter, but then Ormond struck and the game was all over. Ormond kicked eight goals in the third term and another eight (against the wind) in the last.

It was "homer's" day in B Section with all five games going to the home side. Caulfield Grammar were much too strong for Marcellin and Old Paradians beat Ivanhoe by 22 points.

By contrast, Parkside was the only home team to win in C Sec-

tion, beating Fawkner by 21 points. There was high scoring at Alphington, where the home side kicked 16-13 (109) to Old Melburnians' 21-19 (145).

There was a draw in the Ivanhoe-Old Scotch game in Junior Section 1, each side kicking 18-19 (127). Highest score of the day went to De La Salle Juniors, who kicked 38-14 (242) against Kew.

Another example of good kicking was put up by Marcellin Reserves (14-3) and State Bank Reserves (19-8). But there was some poor shooting, too — Footscray Tech. (6-23), LaTrobe Reds (6-18) and Hampton Rovers (9-22), Hampton scraping home by a point from Kew (10-15).

UMPIRE'S CORNER

"Top umpires come from hard work and concentration."

You must be keen to hit the top as a football umpire.

By "keen" I mean a lot more than the mere desire to umpire a game.

There has to be ambition to succeed, determination to overcome the many disappointments.

There's got to be plenty of "natural guts" to absorb the setbacks that will come the way of every umpire.

It takes a tremendous amount of "sand" to accept the back slaps and hand shakes one day and perhaps the next Saturday just plain nobody.

One day you umpire well — they flock around — you get the natural feeling of elation — "it's good."

The next week nothing will go right, you feel like handing in your whistle — "you could be a leper" — the way you're shunned.

If you battle over all the setbacks, all the disappointments that will come your way, and stick to it, you have the first essential to become a top "whistle-blower."

Next test of an umpire's character comes with the monotony of training. It can be monotonous — I know all about it — I've been through it.

It's mighty easy to think about skipping training, particularly if it's wet and cold.

"Don't do it." Boys come to us straight out of school who are just about right for development into field umpires (there's always a few rough edges).

Perhaps one boy is not aware of the importance of the position of a field umpire; maybe another doesn't realise his time-on signals are not right.

There are always a lot of men around ready to impart advice to young umpires.

But they are what I call "false prophets" — they don't know nearly as much as they profess.

250 UP TO ST. KILDA VETERAN

Today, Tony Sherman becomes only the second player to reach the fantastic milestone of 250 games for St. Kilda CBOC. He began in 1963, going straight to the seniors, and was equal best first-year player. He has played in a number of positions, including half-back, half-forward, full-back and full-forward. He was deputy vice-captain and has had occasion to lead the side.

In less settled times, "Shermo" had a spell of 3-4 years in the Reserves but in keeping with his dedication has fought back to be a top liner with the Seniors once more. A winner of the club's most consistent player award more than once, "Shermo's" consistency, dedication and fitness is truly remarkable. His attitude and ability is reflected in polling his highest Best and Fairest tally only last year. Married with four children, the name "Sherman" seems destined to remain at St. Kilda

Some boys have a natural ability to be an umpire, others have to work really hard at it. Many times I have seen the hard-working hack athlete outstrip the junior champion or, shall I say, "the natural."

He has to start a long way behind, but by dint of hard work, and a lot of sweat and determination, "he has made it".

I think the "natural umpire" starts a long way out in front, but he can also fall a long way in arrears unless he battles on to make himself even better.

This all leads to the crux of the position — you must have the will to be a top umpire.

You must have the determination to pick yourself up when the setbacks have knocked you down.

It takes character — it's the will to win, despite everything.

Remember that you only umpire as well as you are fit.

The "three quarters" umpire lacks the will to get to the top. If he's finished physically he can't go on with the job in that vital last quarter when the call is the greatest.

So again I say — "never slack your training." It's hard to come up fighting Saturday after Saturday. I've been through it — I can sympathise.

There's only one remedy. Get up with the field. The field won't come back to you.

So it's back to the old grind, training, development work and more training.

John Posetti and myself are there to help and advise you — we will do just that — don't be afraid to ask.

DO YOU KNOW?

All umpires are instructed that if a player raises the elbow, HE WILL BE FREE-KICKED — If the elbow STRIKES an opponent — the offender WILL BE REPORTED.

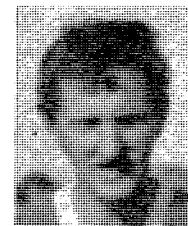
As a clubman Peter has always been ready to accept any job asked of him. Last year he was treasurer and this year is assistant secretary and a very active member of the recruiting committee.

He was also adjudged the Club's most consistent player in 1972 and best player in the finals in 1973, the year in which he became the first Marcellin player to reach the 100-game mark.

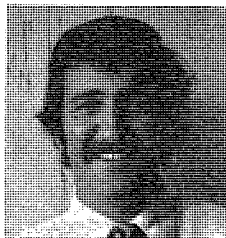
Michael, captain since 1974, has not restricted his activities to the playing side of the club.

5 Years Ago — 1971

La Trobe Blacks had a 99-point win over AJAX with best for the winners, Hall, Witte and White and 4 goals each from Lamont, Cox and Hall.

Clash of the Reserve round was between Melbourne High's "Uncle Barry" ("Billard Ball") Macdonald and nephew Bob "Chrome Dome" Macdonald with Caulfield Grammarians — honors were even with 3 goals each!

A.N.Z. Bank surprised top "E" Section team State Bank to win by 19 points. Don Clipper made a good debut with 3 goals, while Jackson, Hewins and McGregor were among the best.

Dave Burgin scored a timely goal in the closing moments to give St. Bernard's a 3-point win over Monash Blues with the final scores being 15.9 to 15.6.

Hanneberry (5 goals), Rackham and J. Harvey starred for the victors, and Watsford, Galbraith and Lane were best for Monash.

10 Years Ago — 1966

In the Interstate match at St. Kilda Cricket Ground, Victoria won the game against Tasmania by 49 points.

Best for Victoria against Tasmania were: Fisher (Kew), Lucas (Collegians), Taylor (Kew), Wilcox (Univ. Blues), Dick (M.H.S.) and P. Cohen (Univ. Blues).

Victoria also defeated South Australia at the Adelaide Oval by 26 points. Best were: Cayzer (Caul. Gramm.), Warfe (Coburg), Edwards (C'wealth Bank), Thompson (Old Melb.), D. Williams (Caul. Gramm.) and Chaffey (Caul. Gramm.).

100 games to Barrie Kerr (Old Melbourne) — their scribe called him "our most colorful player for a long time" — Terry "Cuppa" Carman (Caul. Grammar) and Ron Wilson (Hampton Rovers).

To quote "Young Norm Beattie showed outstanding ability in his first game with Coburg Reserves. Although only 17, he moved like a veteran and will be a star of the future." (Norm went on to win two "A" Section Best and Fairest and represent Victoria many times.)

25 Years Ago — 1951

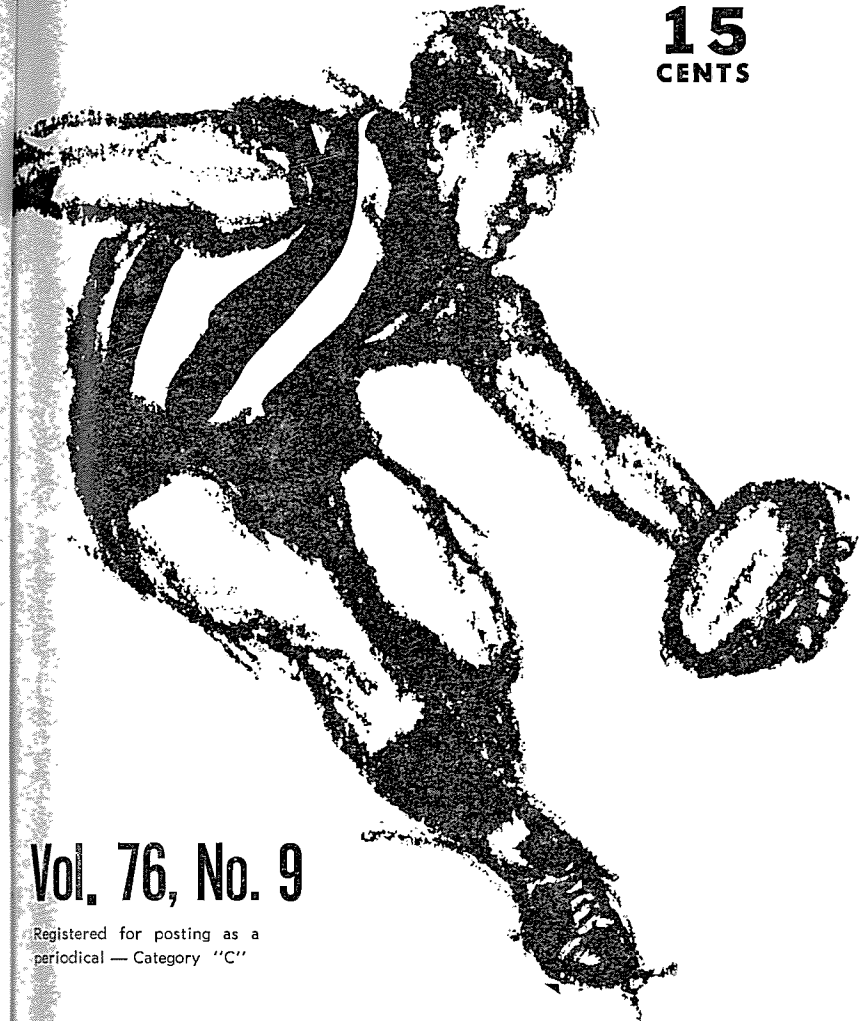
