



UMPIRE'S CORNER

By Kevin McKay

BOUNDARY UMPIRES

Boundary umpires form a most important part of the umpire's team, they cover more territory than field umpires, therefore they must be physically equipped for their task.

I am assuming that they all are in training and will always be up with the

play. Boundary umpires must always keep their eyes on the play and players, and the field and goal umpires.

They must keep out of the way of players when following the play they may "cut the line" by moving alongside the boundary line, but when up with the play they must keep "on the line". The Ball is not out of bounds until it has completely crossed the line. If any

portion of the ball is on the line it is still in play.

Do not be influenced by players or spectators. The position for the "throwin" is on the boundary line, not 4 or 5 metres inside the line.

Balance yourself by placing both feet on the line, and take the ball in either your right or left hand and swing over the opposite shoulder toward the centre of the ground, allowing body swing.

This takes the strain off the stomach muscles, and helps conserve stamina. The ball must be thrown towards the centre of the ground, and from the boundary line.

Always aim for an even "throw-in" when near the goal posts do not "throwin" too far as it may give an advantage to a team if the ball lands in front of the goals.

When inexperienced umpires in Junior competitions are throwing into a breeze, they tend to stand a metre or so inside the boundary line.

However this is wrong in practice and

should not be done.

If the wind is behind you, show judgment with your throw so that you do not leave the players "high and dry" if they are in position.

However, immediately you get the ball throw it in.

Don't wait for the rucks to get into position.

That's their worry-yours is to put the ball into play.

When a player is kicking for goal take up a position at the behind post in line with the flight of the ball. You then command a view to give an accurate decision.

If, when moving towards the goal there is a doubt as to whether a behind has been scored or it is out of bounds. withhold your signal until the goal umpire has made a decision.

In short, have an understanding with your goal umpires and co-operate with each other.

After a goal has been scored get the ball and rush it to the centre, then quickly make for your position at the centre square.

After a behind has been scored run backwards along the boundary line until you reach the spot from where you will watch the ball being kicked-off; then follow the play from there.

If the field umpire fails to note the signal from the boundary umpire, his attention must immediately be called by the boundary umpire following him on to the playing field.

Once you start, do not weaken go on with it.

In conclusion, to all our club boundary umpires who each week give their best - thank you for your efforts and keen up the good work.


